1. An Internet with no limits

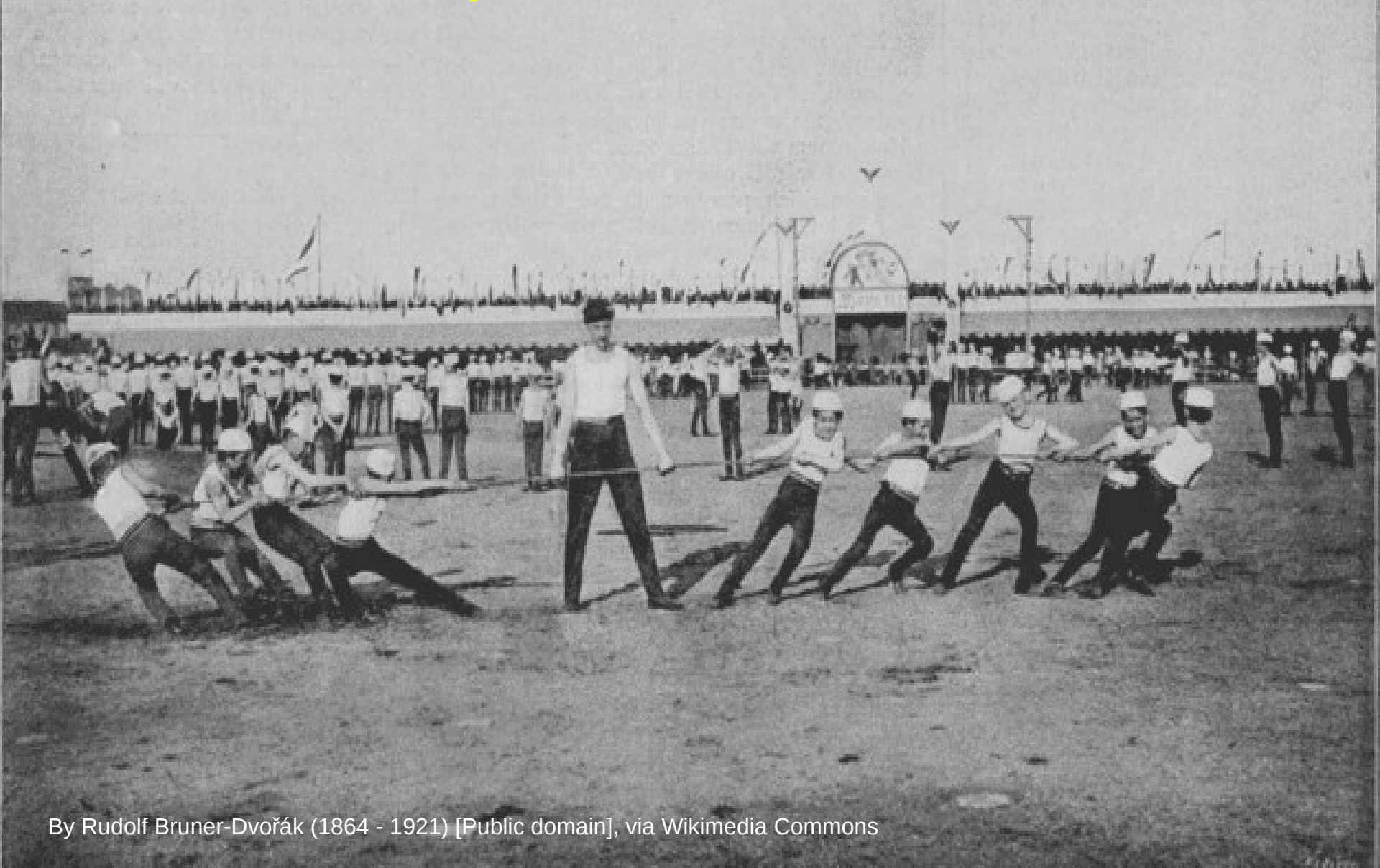

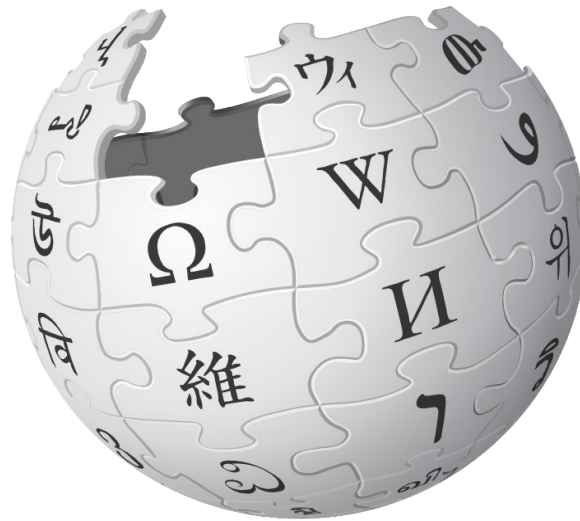
4. Free as in ice cream (with no ads)...and as in freedom

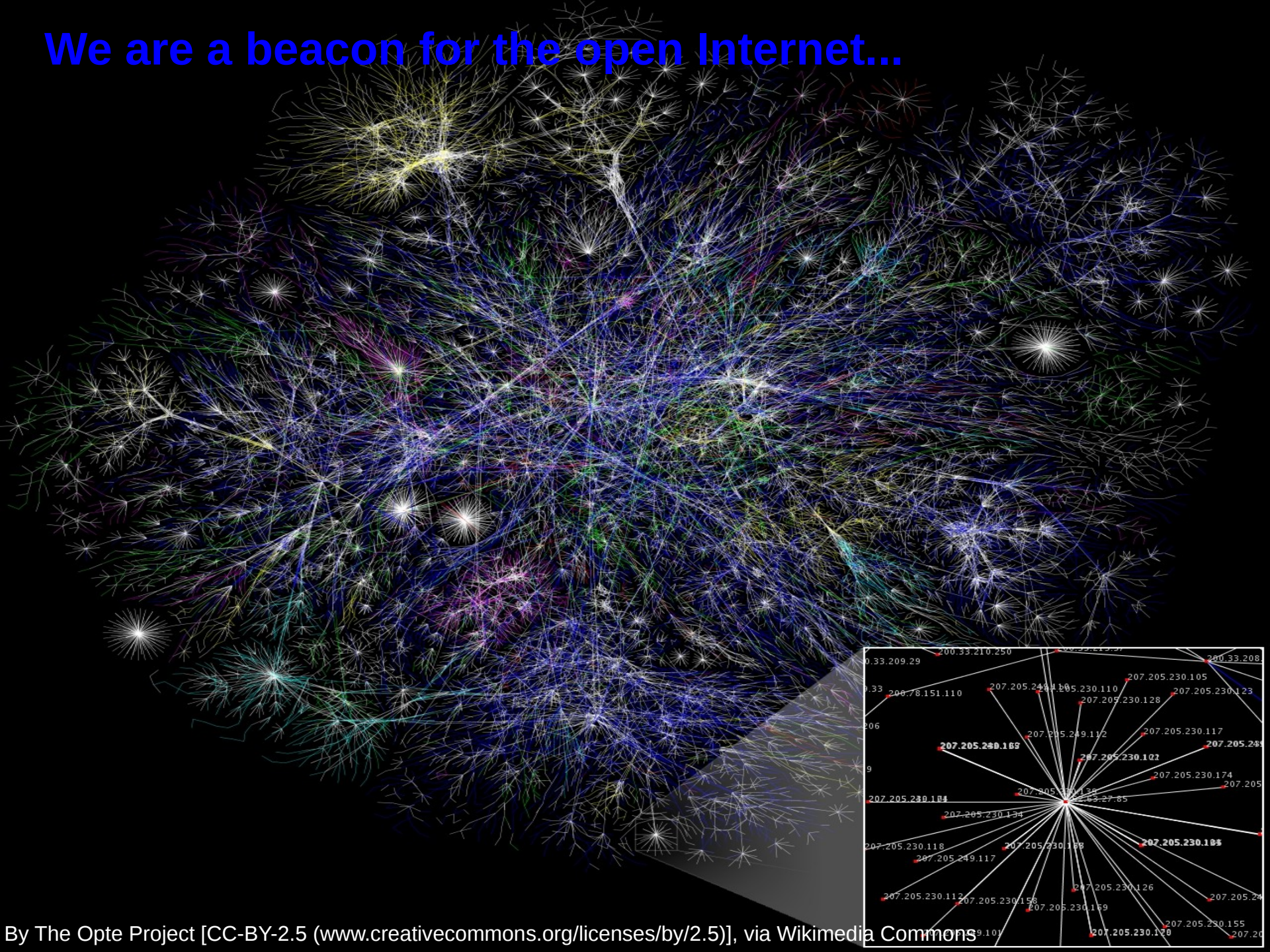

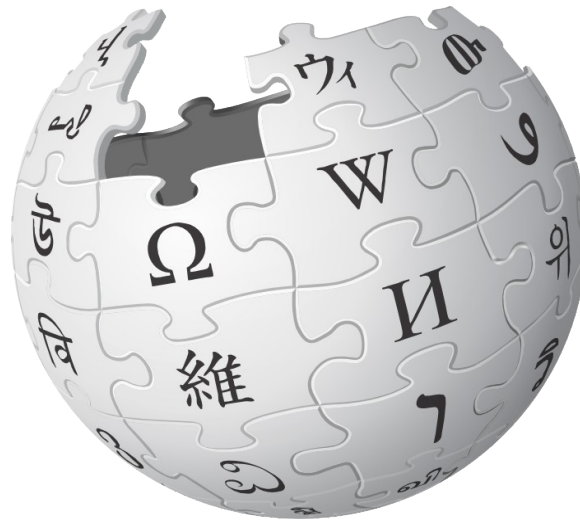

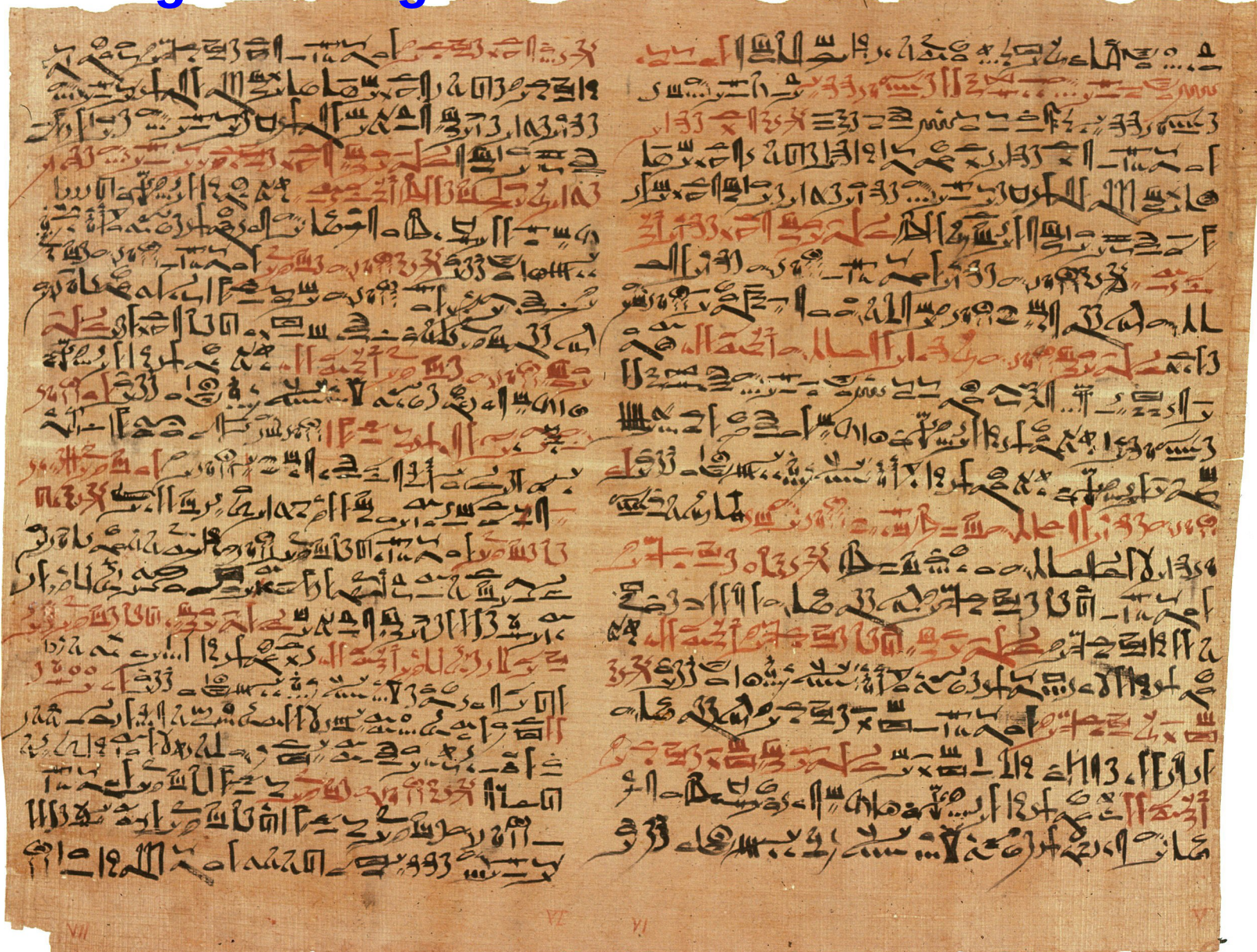
