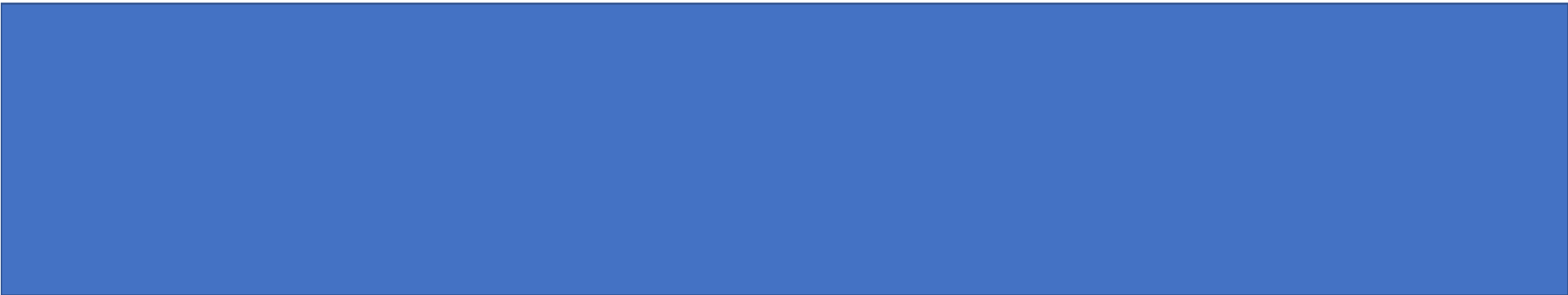

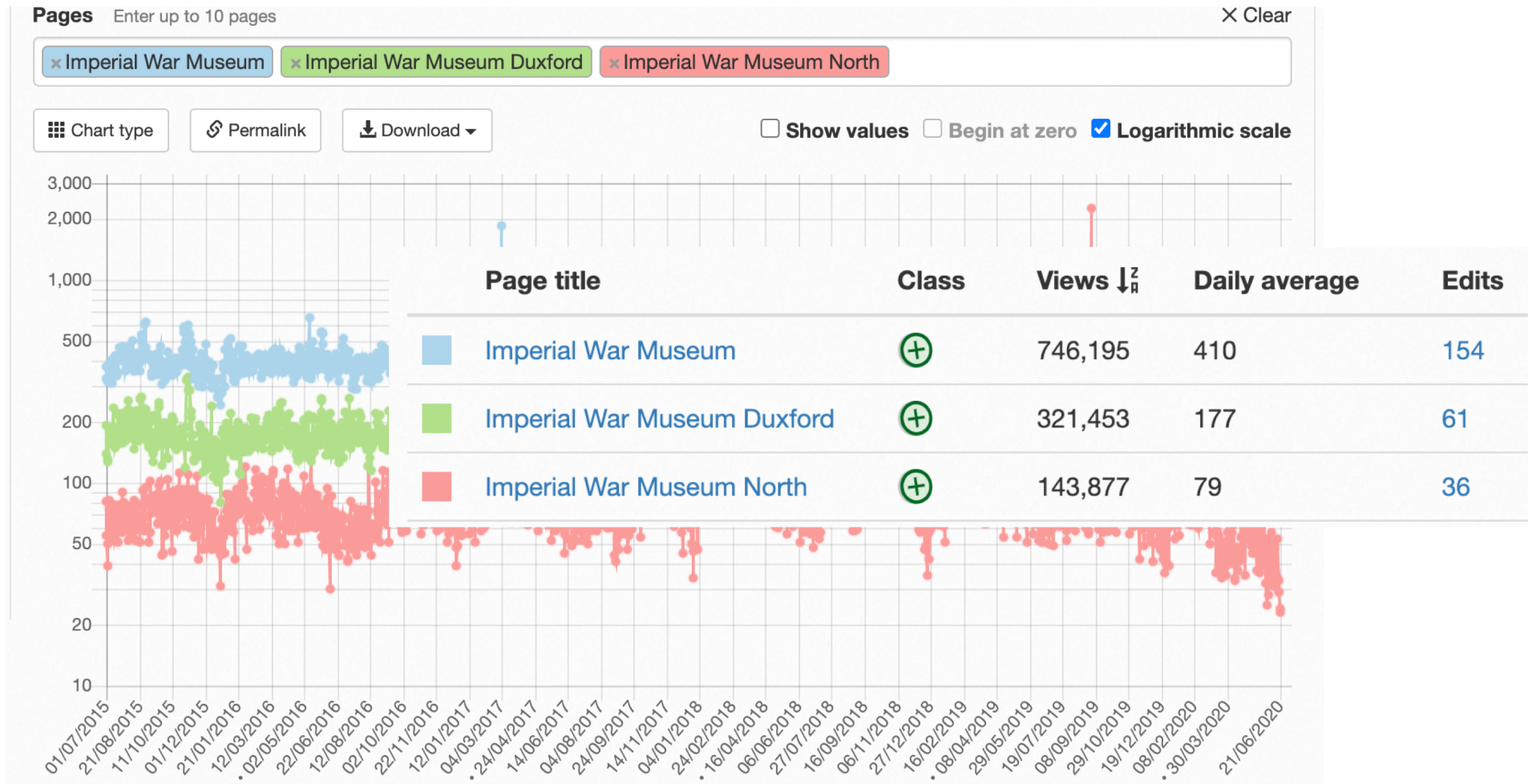

Why edit Wikipedia? Because its wrong!

- Poorly written (in places)
- Incomplete (sometimes)
- Lacks citations (to verify factual claims)
- Frequently lacks pictures, especially good ones!
- Systemic bias (by omission) e.g. :
 - Gender biased en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Gender_bias_on_Wikipedia and some women are treated badly
 - Racially biased en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Racial_bias_on_Wikipedia for example en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Black_Lives_Matter

Why edit Wikipedia? Because people read it



Why edit Wikipedia? Because people read it!

- 15 billion times by over 1.5 billion unique devices in 2019
- 500 million visits *per day*, or about 6000 visits *per second*
- To put it another way, every month, people spend ~60,000 years reading Wikipedia articles!

Five pillars

- Wikipedia is an encyclopedia (not a soapbox, vanity press or ad platform)



- Wikipedia is written from a neutral point of view (NPOV)



- Wikipedia is free content that anyone can use, edit & distribute



- Wikipedia editors should treat each other with respect



- Wikipedia has no firm rules (ignore all rules w.wiki/i)

Why edit Wikipedia: Systemic bias

- In 2014 what proportion of biographies are about women?
- When you're ready: Post in the chat dialogue

In 2014 proportion of biographies that were about women

15.53%

Why edit Wikipedia? Systemic bias

As of 23rd June 2020, only 318,844 of 1,723,693 biographies are about women (**18.50%**)

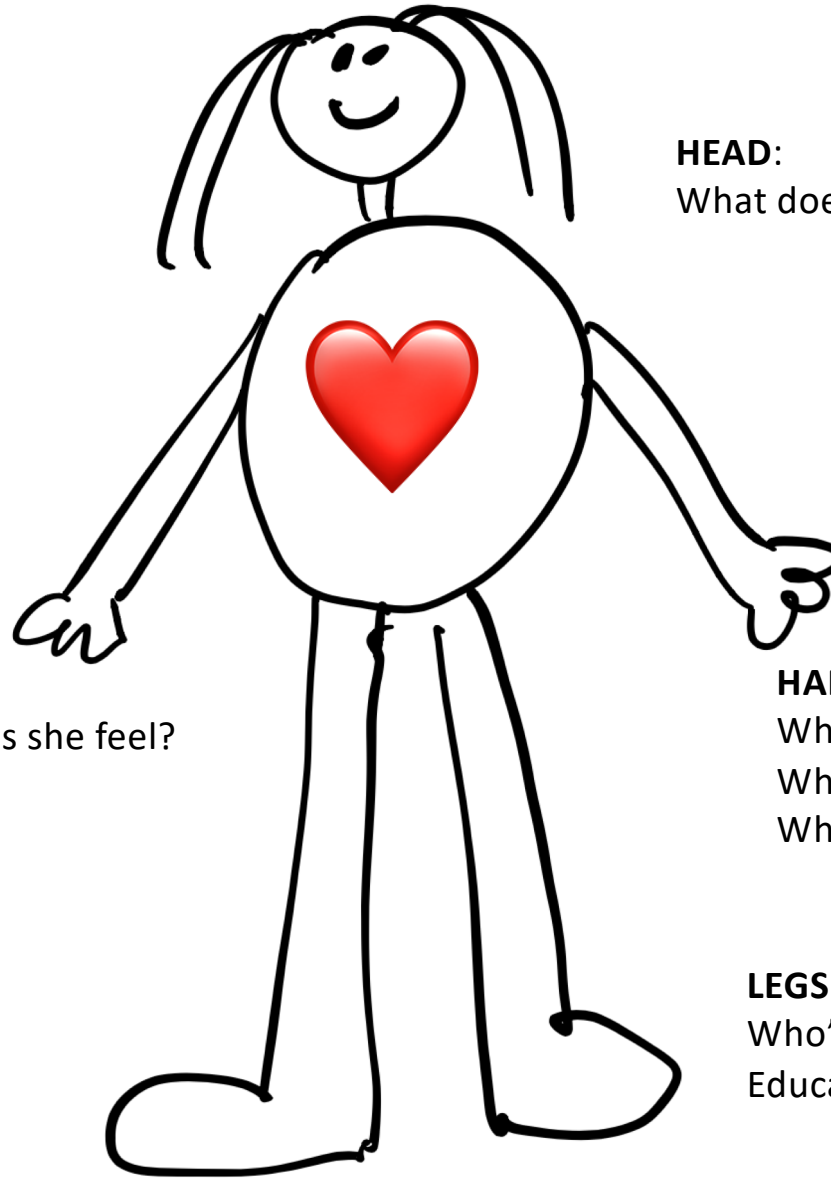
