PROTEST BY FARMERS AND GRAZIERS' ASSOCIATION.

The managing director of the Farm ers and Graziers' Co-operative Grain. Insurance and Agency Co., Ltd., writes: "When, early in December, it was learned that the Bailway rates were to be increased. I immediately got late touch with the Government, objecting to producers being hurassed by hav their products; and, on December 12 I s. at the following communication to

to Minister for Railways:then Mr. Ball,-1 notice in toas concemplate increasing ince for the carriage of variinc. that for using months, now the carriage of wool has been restricted, and many clips have been held up on account of the scarcity of trucks, I think it would be very unfair at the present time for the Government to annetion any rumany products, particularly if the changes are to operate at a com-

Any unbiassed person, I maintain, gannot truthfully state that the reques received sympathetic consideraion. My company maintains that the time was not opportune for a big advance in the rail charges, and a 5 per cent. allowance on a small proportion of the wool clip, coming on top of an imposition of 10 per cent., may be characterised as a clumsy and irritating action, calculated to cause resentment amongst already heavily-handi-

capped producers. It was recently catled that rates up the railways of England were increased. but that primary products were exempt ed, from which it will be seen that the perspective of the English authorities is not clouded. Apparently, there is not much sine rity in the appeal of this country's administrators for increased production!.

It is to be regretted that this company's efforts on behalf of the producers, have met with such little succose, but the 5 per cent. allowance should, at all events, be available of by the wool growers generally, who can comply with the conditions, which, it is presumed, will also apply by rebate
