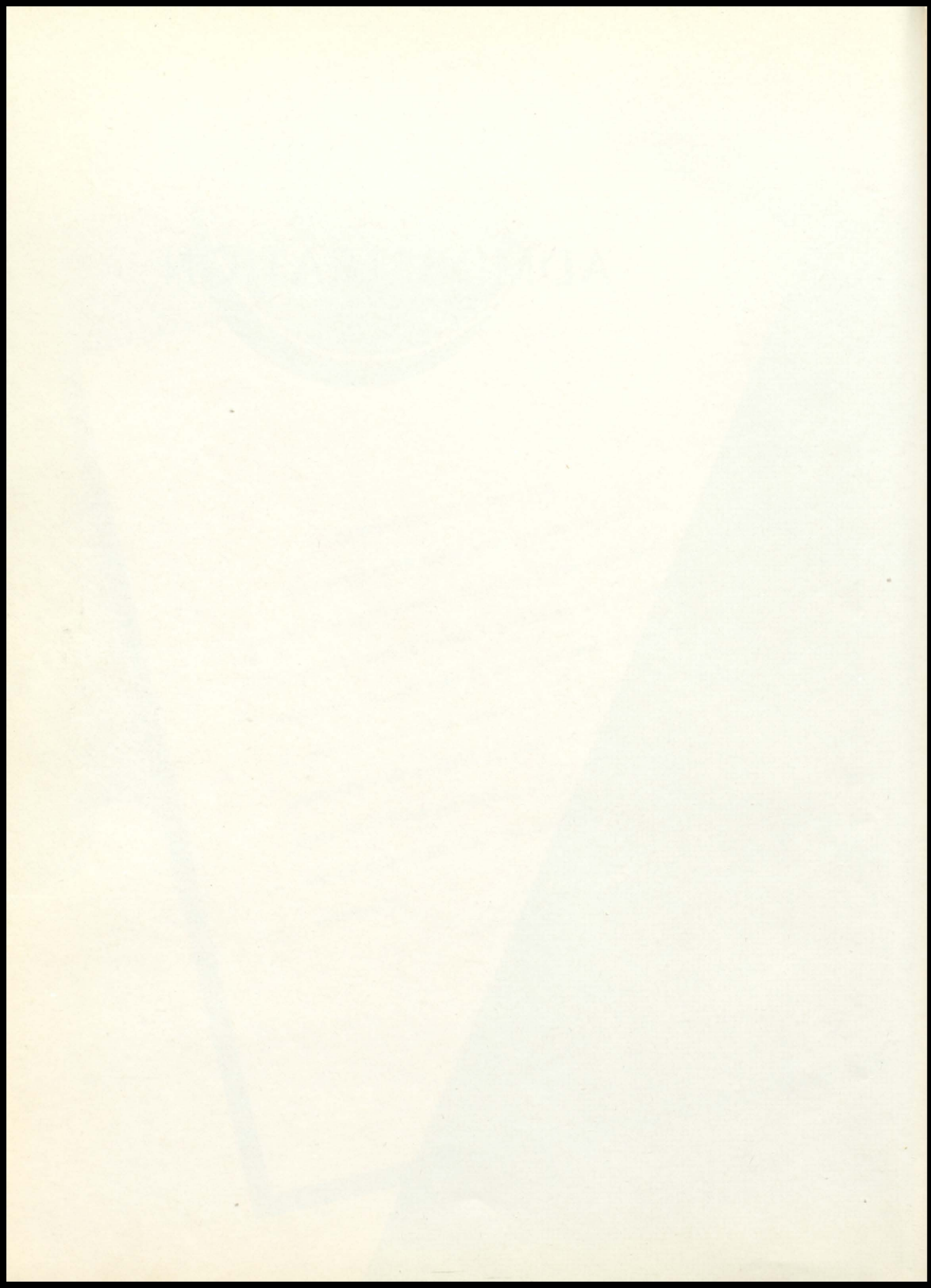
SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

We went to the State Tournament in basketball, with Trent Tanner, Burch Wells, Don Sower, and Wendell Bartholomew on the "A" squad.

Last but not least, came the prom. Work? Oh, our poor minds and bodies! It was well worth while, however, when the night arrived and we could say we did all the planning and decorating by ourselves without any help at all. . . . much.

Now we are seniors. We have reached the most exciting year yet; we have attained our goal.

We are really the BIG CHEESE now and still showing how smart we are by our good (?) grades!

THE DENVER POST selected Trent Tanner on the all-star state second team in "B" league football this year.

Now, nearing the end of our senior year, we are all looking forward to our play, hoping our basketball team will go to State, and anticipating graduation, the most important milestone of all.
