MRS. FLORENCE LAMB (FD)

Large 10 inch blooms well out above the foliage on long stout stiff stems, a very sturdy grower with dark green foliage. Color is a deep garnet at the center, shading a bit lighter at tips of petals. Has been very much admired the past two seasons. Tubers \$5.00 Plants \$2.50

ADELCIA (ID)

A novelty of rare beauty, one that makes you go back the second time before leaving the garden. Plant' grows about five feet tall and very robust. Stems are very long and stiff holding the seven and eight blooms well above the foliage. The petals are settarated with three and four petloids at the base of each petal making the blooms very attractive. Color is pale lilac shading to white. Tubers \$5.00 Plants

MRS. STANLEY R. PERRY (SC) In this mamouth bloom we have a beauty that will grow twelve inches without any extra care. The plants are tall growing with great long stems that can be cut three or four feet long with the blooms standing erect, six and seven of these large blooms on one plant at the same time are very common to see.
