- December 9th 2007: Got registered in the Spanish Wikipedia, the first edit came one day later.
- 10 days later I discovered the special page NewPages and started maintenance tasks.
- April 19th 2008: first edit and image upload in Commons.
- In May 2009: bureaucrat and administrator in the Spanish Wikipedia. October 2010: 1,000 new articles.
- November 2011: 100,000 edits in the Spanish Wikipedia; first QI
- February 2012: First FP
- November 2012: 1,000 Quality Images in Commons
- December 2013: 10,000 uploaded images to Commons and became there also administrator
- March 2014: 100 Featured Pictures in Commons.
- **Est.** August 2014: 5,000 Quality images in Commons.

Digging a bit into the history of Commons

- By September 2004 there was a process in place in 3 wikipedias for featured images: English (since May 2003), German (since June 2004) and Chinese (since July 2004).
- September 7th 2004: Wikimedia Commons went live.
- November 9th 2004: Featured picture (FP) process started in Commons, first FP awarded on February 5th 2005.
- June 25th 2006: Quality image (QI) process started in Commons, first QI awarded on July 12th 2006.
- April 10th 2008: Valued image (VI) process started in Commons, first VI awarded on June 8th 2008.

Origins of Quality Images in Commons

The Quality Images process was created in Commons because mainly **3 things came together in a short time window** back in June 2006:

- The spark: one of the very first Commons users, Pfctdayelise, who wanted to locate suitable images by Commons people for a calender, had a hard time to gather 12 good images of a single theme.
- The **idea** came from user Gnangarra, who was then very involved in the Good Article process in the English Wikimedia and introduced the idea into Commons.
- The means were provided by user Dschwen who automated the process with bots making it
 efficient and robust for a high amount of nominations. Those bots are still active today and take
 care of dozens of QI candidates everyday.

The idea was to identify our own work in Commons that we can be confident of in terms of quality. It differed from Featured Pictures in being solely for Commons contributors and was focused on technical value over the wow factor because many of the subjects that Commons need photos for could never wow enough people to pass FP despite their technical aspects. The hope was in recognising these efforts we would be encouraging continued provision of the "boring/plain/dull" subjects as well as rewarding our people for that effort.

The mechanism and philosphy of the Quality images process has not changed since then.

Commons as a learning platform

- Can Wikimedia Commons be considered as a learning platform?
- Without any doubts!, Commons, especially QIC, has been the best "course" I've ever visited!

First experiences:

- One of my criterias to nominate pictures was their beauty (wrong!).
- I was not aware of the problems that would prevent a picture of becoming QI (adversity is the school of wisdom!).
- I couldn't realize some problems pointed out by a reviewer (crazy people! ©).
- I didn't know how to prevent or solve those problems.
- I didn't have the software to solve the problems.
- I didn't know how to use the software to solve the problems.

...and the experiences after a lot of Qls:


- When taking the picture I bear in mind the result I aim (e.g. proper frame to avoid problems when applying perspective correction).
- Before a nomination I proactively search for the typical problems in my pictures.
- I can fix those problems without problems.
- As an experienced reviewer I point out problems to help other users and if needed fix the problems for them.

Still, I learn from Commons every day thank to the technical discussions and get inspired with the great work of other photographers!!!

Hint: Get a good technical basis in QIC and look in a next step for FP's wow.

How does the QI process work?

- Visit the QI candidates page in Comons: https://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/Commons:Quality_images_candidates,
- **Nominate** on the top your own pictures (or of another Commons user) that, you believe, meet the QI criteria (a breeze with help of the QINominator gadget).
- A reviewer decides whether:
 - It meets QI requirements level => Promote (if nothing happens will automatically become QI 2 days later)
 - It fails to reach QI level => Decline providing the reason/s for that (that's feedback! will be cleaned up 2 days later)
 - It **could reach QI** level but not quite yet => Makes a comment pointing out the problem/s (this process could take some loops), color does not change and remains blue. In this way the reviewer can help the author step by step to reach the QI threshold (will be cleaned up latest after 8 days).
 - Pictures that have been promoted or declined by one reviewer are put on consensual review by another reviewer who does not agree with the initial judgement, the nomination becomes yellow and awaits additional reviews in a different section.
- At the same time those nominating (and with some experience) shall review the pictures of others.

Criteria to meet QI requirements

- Non-technical requirements:
 - Good description (incl. Taxa for organisms)
 - Accurate categories
 - Author must be a Commons user
- Technical requirements (same like for FP, although a big wow of a FP could compensate lower quality):
 - Resolution > 2 Megapixel (don't confuse with the size in Megabytes)
 - Low noise level and no JPG artifacts
 - Good exposure (neither underexposed nor overexposed), this can be tricky in scenes with high contrast
 - Free of dust (damned dust spots in the sky! ⊚), lens flares, vignetting and, of course, water marks
 - Good **composition** (clear subject, no disturbing elements, tight crop...)
 - No color problems (especially chromatic aberration in borders and white balance)
 - Focus shall be on the main subject and sufficient depth of field
 - No distortion (vertical/horizontal perspective, barrel/pincushion)

Typical problems under QI candidates

Usually fixable problems (feedback):

- Description or categories too general, need to be more specific
- Dust spots
- Noise (both luminosity and chromatic), especially in darker areas
- Chromatic aberration


Sometimes fixable problems (feedback):

- Distortions, especially vertical perspective with falling lines that should be vertical
- Overexposed areas, especially the sky (trade off to ensure good exposure of the subject), more difficult to solve with JPEG

Rarely fixable problems (decline):

- Lack of sharpness
- Wrong focus
- Motion blur
- Composition problems (cluttered image, unclear subject, tight crop)

How is the learning process fostered?

These are the keys of QIC:

- Prompt feedback on your work and how to improve it.
- There is a bunch of experienced users, many of whom have gained that experience in Commons
- Good faith of everybody to help others and share know-how with the benefit of the project in the first place.
- Simple process = clear and fair rules + easy to understand
- An online platform that enables the interexchange, incl. Dschwen's bots to keep it running
- An awarding system in place (Qls, but also FPs, Vls, POTY,...) as a recognition of the performed work.

There are also other initiatives outside QIC (WM chapters) that help:

- Some chapters actively organise photographic learning workshops or photo events (WLM, Wikitakes, aerial photography,...)
- Equipment lending programs or equipment purchasing assistance.






