Statistics about Wikimedia

The Wikimedia Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization based in San Francisco, California operates Wikipedia.org, a top-five global web property. The Wikimedia Foundation was created in **June 2003** by Jimmy Wales to establish a long-term future for Wikipedia and its nine sister projects.

Today the Foundation supports a global volunteer base of over 100,000 active editors (known as Wikipedians or Wikimedians) representing over 260 languages.

The Wikimedia Foundation has conducted annual fundraisers since 2003. The most recent fundraiser (09 –10) raised approximately **\$8.1 million** dollars from over **235,000 donors**, giving an average gift of **\$35**. The Wikimedia Foundation is also funded through **grants** and **large gifts** from individual donors.

As of November 2010 the Wikimedia Foundation has a staff of **54**. The Foundation is further supported by 29 grass-roots Wikimedia chapter organizations around the world.

For the fiscal year 2010–2011, the Wikimedia Foundation has planned for **\$20.4 million** of annual expenses, most of which will be spent on technology.

The mission of the Wikimedia Foundation is to empower and engage people around the world to collect and develop educational content under free license or in the public domain, and to disseminate it effectively and globally.
