Germany flawless as quarterfinal pairings are finalised in women's wheelchair basketball

LONDON, 3 September - Germany retained the only perfect record in the women's wheelchair basketball competition after the preliminary round came to a close on Monday.

Germany (4-0) employed their full roster but still coasted to victory over Mexico. In the game of the day the United States produced an astonishing fourth quarter comeback to defeat China in overtime to move into second place in group A behind Germany.

The final standings in group B were much tighter with Australia leading the standings ahead of the Netherlands and Canada, with goal average used as a tie-breaker after all three teams finished with 3-1 records.

In the quarterfinals, which will be held on Tuesday 4 September at North Greenwich Arena, Australia face Mexico, Canada take on the United States, the Netherlands play China, and Germany meet Great Britain.

Germany 68 Mexico 28

Mareike ADERMANN (GER) had 18 points and 10 rebounds as Germany routed Mexico to finish the preliminary round unbeaten, scoring 13 straight points in the second half as Mexico (1-3) were swept aside.

United States 68 China 65 OT

Rebecca MURRAY (USA) grabbed 30 points and 14 rebounds as defending Paralympic champions USA overturned a huge second half deficit to beat China in overtime in a thrilling group B game. They rallied from 46-25 behind with four minutes 42 seconds left to force the extra period when Alana NICHOLS (USA) levelled at 61-61 with a free throw, and then scored the last five points to snatch victory.

Canada 67 Great Britain 50

Katie HARNOCK (CAN) scored 20 points as Canada defeated Great Britain 67-50. With Janet McLACHLAN (CAN) grabbing 15 points and 15 rebounds, Canada's offence proved too strong and they had built an unassailable 63-42 lead with five minutes left in the game to leave the British with a 1-3 record.

Netherlands 55 Brazil 42

Mariska BEIJER (NED) had 27 points and 12 rebounds as the Netherlands claimed second place in group B and ensured Brazil would end the preliminary round without a win, despite a game-high 28 points from Lia SOARES MARTINS (BRA).

USA target third straight women's wheelchair basketball gold

LONDON, 26 August - The United States, the world and Paralympic women's wheelchair basketball champions, are seeking a successive gold medal in the event at the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

But the dominant force in the sport over the last decade have been rebuilding since Beijing 2008 and will face strong challenges from silver medallists Germany, along with Australia, Canada and Netherlands.

The USA's first big test will be their second match on Friday 31 August against European champions Germany.

The Germans come into the tournament after a confidence-boosting 51-39 victory over USA in May on their way to winning the basketball competition in the BT paralympic world cup in Manchester.

The London 2012 preliminary round consists of two groups of five teams playing in a round-robin format, with the top four from each pool advancing into the quarterfinals for the knockout stages.

There are 12 athletes in each team (five players and seven substitutes), with each assigned a point value based on functional ability from 1.0 through to 4.5 for the most physical function. The sum score of all players on court from any one team cannot exceed 14.

The quarterfinals, semifinals, final and bronze-medal match all take place at the 20,000-capacity North Greenwich Arena.

Leading medal contenders

- Paralympic champions the USA should start as favourites, but recent losses to Germany, Australia and Netherlands will give the leading challengers confidence. Head coach David KILEY (USA) has said that the pressure to perform well will motivate his team, but six of the victorious Beijing 2008 squad have retired and with only a few of the veterans returning, USA have a number of players making their Paralympic debuts. Much rests on the shoulders of captain and veteran Sarah CASTLE (USA), a defensive specialist, who will aim to blend youth with experience and get the best out of leading points scorers Becca MURRAY and Desi MILLER, supported by Alana NICHOLS, who has won gold at both summer and winter Paralympics.
- Germany, finalists at Beijing 2008 and six-time European champions, are hitting peak form at the right time, winning a four-nation tournament in Manchester in May against Australia, USA and Great Britain, which followed convincing victories in a nations cup over Great Britain and France in Sheffield in April. Leading points scorer Marina MOHNEN (GER) was in stunning form in Manchester, netting 37 points in her team's 47-40 defeat of Australia in the final.
- Canada, historically the sport's most successful team with three consecutive golds from Barcelona 1992, remain a force on the world stage, despite a disappointing fifth place at Beijing 2008. A third-placed finish at the 2010 world championships in Birmingham, England, was followed by a good showing at the most recent warm-up tournament in Papendal, Netherlands, in August when they were beaten by the Dutch in the finals. Janet McCLACHLAN (CAN), who topped the scoring and rebounding charts at the 2010 world championship, was in fine form during the finals, scoring 26 points and 12 rebounds in the first of two defeats by the Dutch.
- Australia, bronze medallists at Beijing 2008 and silver medallists at Athens 2004, cannot be ruled out of contention and their medal hopes have been boosted by a successful tour of Europe that netted a silver at the BT paralympic world cup in May, and included back-to-back wins over the USA. The Australians have an exciting blend of youth and experience, with 23-year-old leading points scorer Cobi CRISPIN likely to be the linchpin of the team in her second Paralympic Games. The Australian will also look to veterans Sarah STEWART and Kylie GAUCI to provide the cornerstone of the team.

Medal hopefuls

- Netherlands, who finished a disappointing sixth at Beijing 2008, are the form team going into London 2012, with a stunning victory on home territory in the warm-up tournament against Paralympic medal contenders in Papendal earlier this month. The Dutch won all five of their matches, defeating Canada in the finals after beating Germany, Great Britain, Australia and Mexico on the way. The Dutch, coached by legendary wheelchair basketball player Gertjan VAN DER LINDEN (NED), will get a better idea if their home form can be exported to London when they face Great Britain in their first match on 30 August.

Atos

- Great Britain will hope home advantage will put them in the medals frame after their young team finished a commendable sixth at the 2010 world championships in Birmingham. Great Britain qualified as host NPC, but recent form suggests that they could challenge for a medal after losing to Paralympic champions the USA in a third-place play-off at the BT paralympic world cup in Manchester in May. The British are looking to leading points scorers Amy CONROY and Helen FREEMAN to guide them through to the knockout stages, particularly after FREEMAN'S 20-point haul against USA.

Hoping for a surprise

- China qualified for London 2012 after a 45-44 defeat by Australia in the finals of the 2011 Asia Oceania championships in Korea. Their eighth-placed finish in the 2010 world championships was an improvement on previous world championships, and they must be confident of bettering their seventh-place finish at Beijing 2008 when they face Mexico in their first pool B match.
- Brazil, who qualified by finishing third in the 2011 Parapan American Games, are in a tough pool A with medal contenders Australia, Canada, Great Britain and Netherlands. The Brazilians face Beijing 2008 bronze medallists Australia in their opening match.
- France qualified for London 2012 with a fourth-place finish in the 2011 European championships. They face a formidable first pool A match against USA but must be quietly confident of a quarterfinal berth, with Mexico as their likely rivals for a knockout spot.
- The final team to win their place in the tournament were Mexico, who won an international play-off against South Africa, winning the first two of a best-of-three series. The Mexicans will have their eye on a quarterfinal place and are expecting leading point-scorers Claudia MIRANDA and Anaisa PEREZ to help them to victory in their first pool B match against China.
