

BURPEE'S FORDHOOK GIANT is an outstanding new Swiss Chard, which, in addition to its great value as a vegetable, makes such a handsome plant that it might be grown solely for decorative purposes in our flower borders. The color of the leaves is a rich blue-green, much crinkled or savoyed, the fully grown leaves averaging 10 inches in width by $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet in length. The entire plant makes a

magnificent bush, not quite $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet in diameter. The texture of the leaves is thick and fleshy, and their quality is highly appreciated when they are boiled. The stems or stalks are pearly white and they measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in width. They are thick and succulent, and may be served as a separate dish in the same manner as asparagus, for which it is a splendid summer substitute.

The fruits are globe-shaped and most attractive in every respect, with an even color running

The first large-podded bush lima bean in exis-tence, namely, Burpee's Bush Lima, was introduced by us in 1890. In 1907 both the Burpee Improved Bush Lima and Fordhook Bush Lima were placed on the market by Burpee. In 1910 Burpee's Giant-Podded Pole Lima was introduced by Burpee, and in 1922 we offered this most outstanding pole lima bean which we have named BURPEE'S SUNNY-BROOK POLE LIMA BEAN.

The main features of this fine new pole lima bean are its extreme earliness and tremendous prolificness, both qualities which are of foremost importance to market growers. It is the result of a cross between Burpee's Fordhook Bush Lima and Wood's Prolific, and embodies the good qualities of both parents. The pods are ready for picking seven days ahead of Wood's Prolific and are of considerably larger size.

All extra-early varieties of Bush Limas hitherto introduced have small pods which usually contain but two or three beans, while our NEW PHILADELPHIA BUSH LIMA produces pods which are comparatively large, flat, and nearly straight. The average pods measure 434 inches in length and 116 inches in width, containing four fair-sized flat beans of excellent quality. In color and general appearance the foliage is similar to Wood's Prolific, but slightly larger. The plants are of upright habit, producing pods in the greatest abundance well to the tip of the flower spikes which rise clear above the foliage. The earlier pods, however, are set quite close to the ground and are borne in clusters of six to eight. Southern planters will find that it far surpasses the bush Sieva or "Butter Bean," as it matures its pods considerably earlier and bears a much heavier crop.

The Annual Pinks make a very showy bed or border of neat appearance and are quite attractive, even when the plants are not in bloom. In the Laciniatus varieties the flower petals are deeply cut in and fringed. 
