

What is Wikispore?


- Wikispore is a wiki, and proposed new sister project, to develop test wikis to fill out the rest of the reference shelf with new genres of free knowledge.
- Unlike Wikimedia Incubator, which is about repeating proven patterns in new languages, it focuses on experimentation and diversification in new formats.
- Eventually, it should function similarly to the Community Wishlist Survey in that the proposals with the widest support would be selected each year for interim development, and we would try to grow them into full sister projects.

Why are we doing it?

Growth and innovation slows down as projects get older.




The Rise and Decline of an Open Collaboration System

How does it work?

- Hosted on Wikimedia Cloud, to make the setup transparent and easy to replicate
- Relies on central identities (Wikimedia login); we avoid storing private data as much as possible
- Once Wikidata federation becomes possible, we'll use that to connect articles to the official projects
- The experimental projects are separate namespaces on the same wiki (for now)

Where are we now?

- 14 experimental projects (spores) proposed, 9 have content
- About a hundred spore pages, with 19 editors working on them
- In total, 27 active users made ~300 edits last month
- Major user experience elements like visual editing have been replicated, a lot of smaller things are missing
