Dealing with the whole process needed around 189 cups of coffee average per meeting.

For a six months project we aimed for high capacity work, so we did have the resources that we needed.

#### **Educational skills**

Education varies from different indigenous nationalities to other ones, so access to education is actually needed to get involved with this. On the good side: They're better with oral education than most of us.

#### Access to computers

Most of them do not have the money to buy any computers or getting close to any.


#### Access to complementary knowledge
