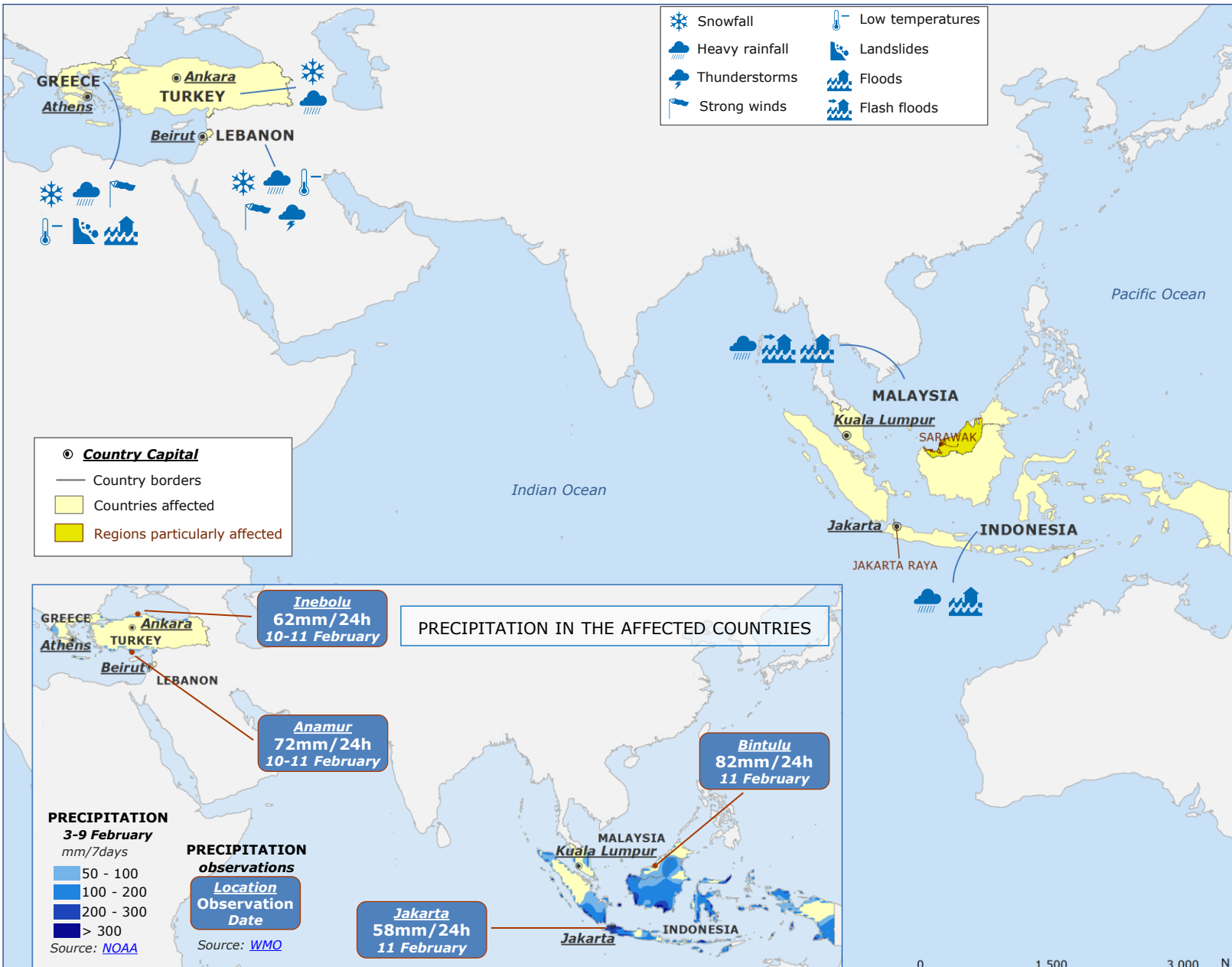


12 February 2015: World - Severe weather



SITUATION

GREECE

- Snow, rainfall, strong winds, and low temperatures affected Greece over the past three days, causing river overflow and landslides. Infrastructure, including ports, roads and railroads, as well as the electricity supply, were affected throughout the country, according to media. The weather conditions are expected to ameliorate starting 12 February and the ports have reportedly opened again.

TURKEY

- Heavy snow and rain continued affecting Turkey over 10 - 11 February, impacting air, sea and road traffic countrywide, causing the isolation of villages, according to media. The weather conditions are expected to improve over the next 24h.

LEBANON

- Heavy rain, snow, strong winds and thunderstorms affected Lebanon over 11 - 12 February. Local media report traffic disruptions in the mountainous regions, while strong winds and waves caused damage to infrastructure in the Beirut area. More rain, winds and snow are forecast for eastern Lebanon for the next 24h.

INDONESIA

- Heavy rainfall continues affecting the greater area of the capital Jakarta (Jakarta Raya), where nearly 7 000 people have evacuated their homes due to the ongoing floods, according to local authorities quoted in the media. For the next 24h, more moderate to heavy rainfall is forecast in the area of Jakarta.
