Troy 8<sup>th</sup> Sept 1825

I Recd on the 2<sup>d</sup> Inst from Canal boat  
Major Bellows Capt Cornelius S. Sanner 70 bbls flour  
50 bbls wheat + 2 Sacks Oat seed for the acct  
which is now going on board Sloop Minerva Capt  
Camstock for New York & not having any instructions  
Respecting the delivery <sup>of the property</sup> or to whom caused therefore  
be so obliging as to inform me on the subject  
by Return mail — I am shipping about 1600  
bushels of wheat on the Minerva & for sale  
— of this wheat the 50 bbls sold with it —  
you will please direct accordingly — & if sold  
who to pay the proceeds ~~on~~ to — our market  
for Grain Remains very dull — yet there has  
been a small advance in the article of wheat & corn  
particular in the latter — which is now worth  
4½ to 4¼ — the former is selling at 7 + 7/8 —  
in small ~~Per~~ Percals & from 73 to 76 by the  
boat load — of the very best of western wheat —
