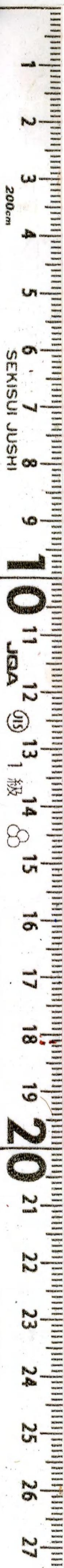

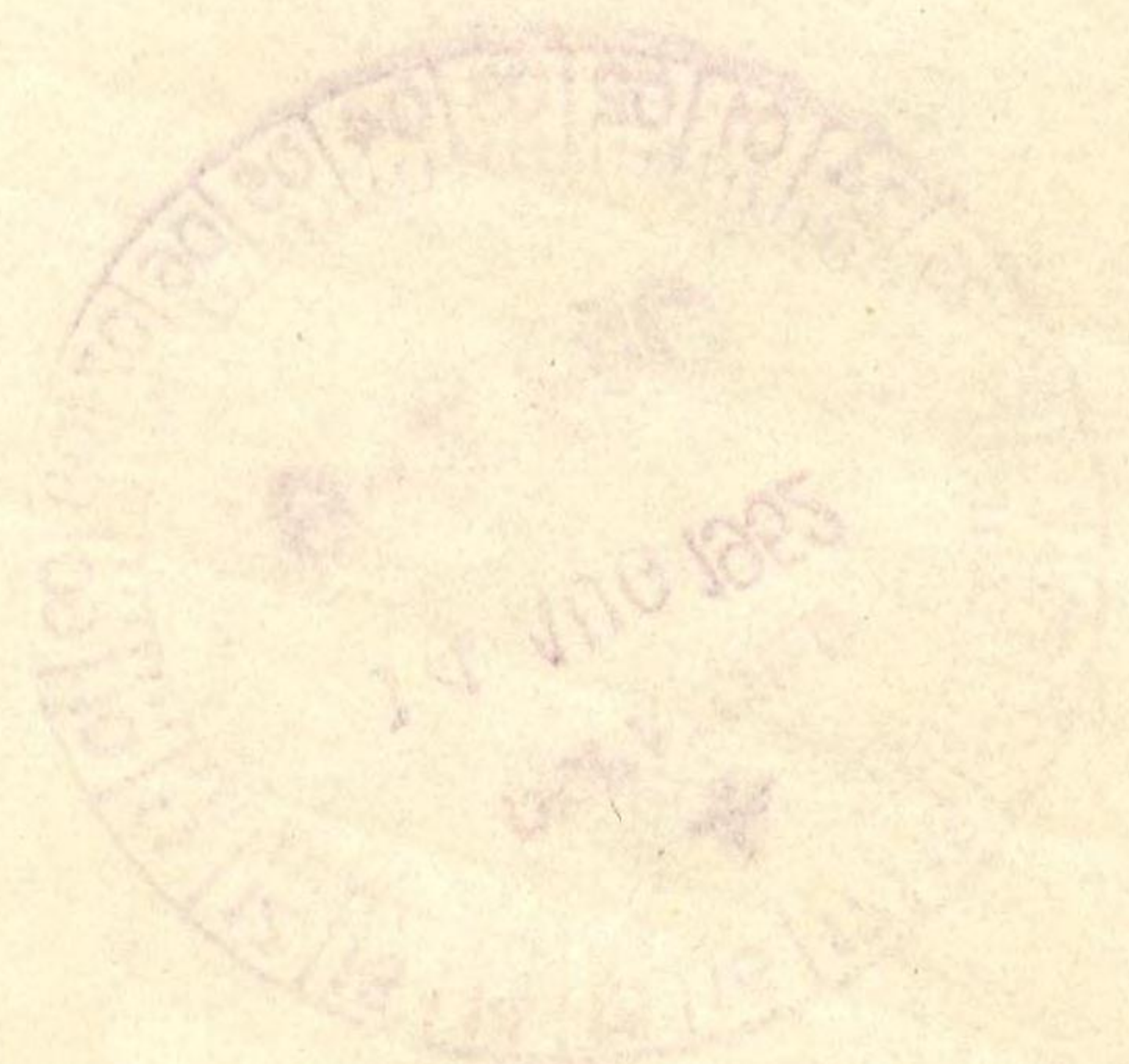
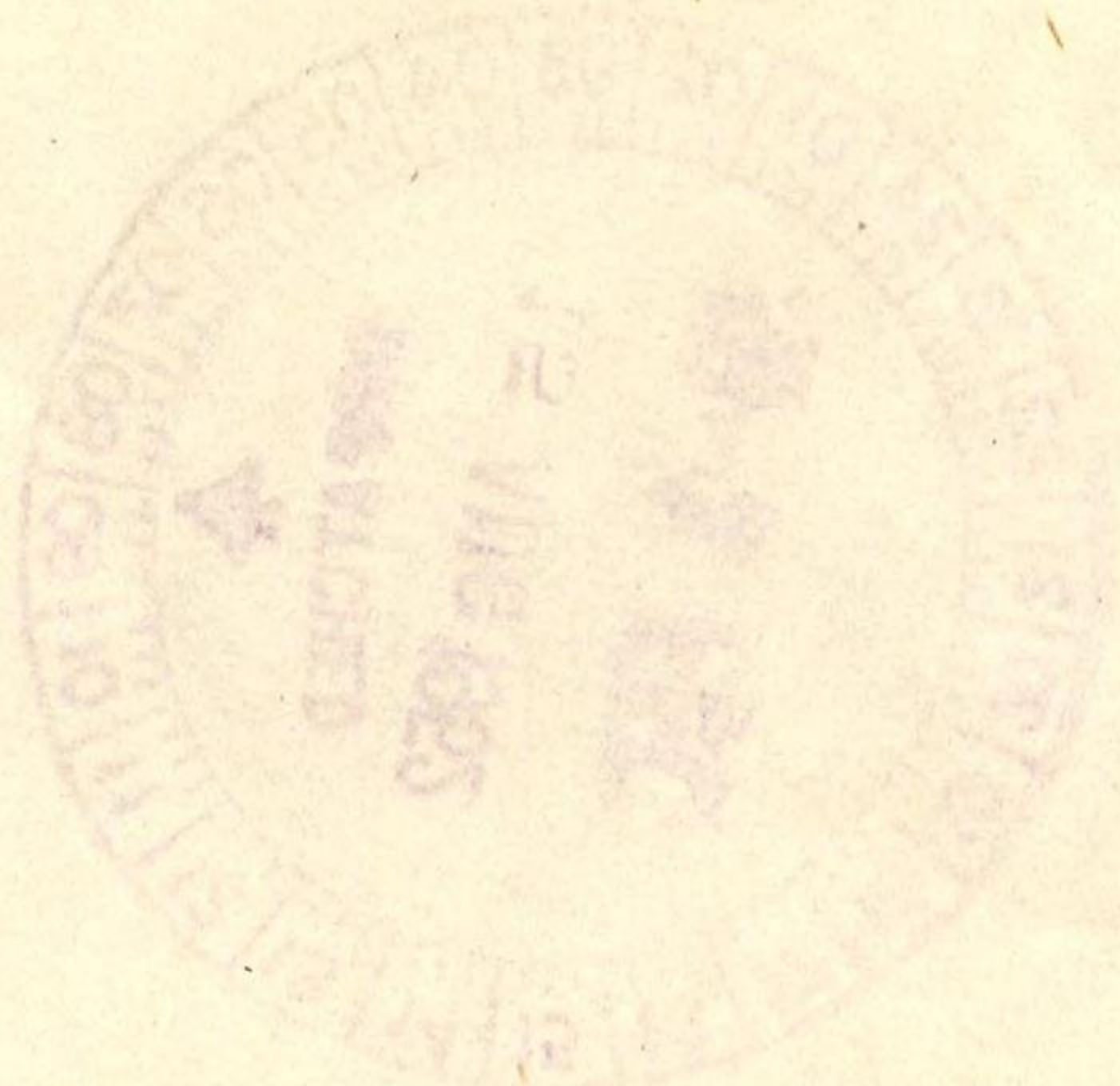

Background

1. Attention has been called to a Korean minority in the neighborhood of Semipalatinsk, Kazakh S. S. R., USSR (50°28' N., 80°13'E.).
2. It is thought that anyone having contact with these Koreans may be able to provide valuable information on Semipalatinsk.

Requirements

1. It is therefore requested that North Korean POW's, who have either personally been to Semipalatinsk Oblast or have close friends or relatives there, be given a detailed interrogation for local knowledge of the area since 1948.
2. a. This interrogation should cover roads, railroads, town plans, industries, secret installations, security forces, and unusual events.  
b. Any information on supply, radar, and anti-aircraft installations, fortifications, weapon storages, motor vehicle and tank parks, and repair facilities for all types of military equipment.

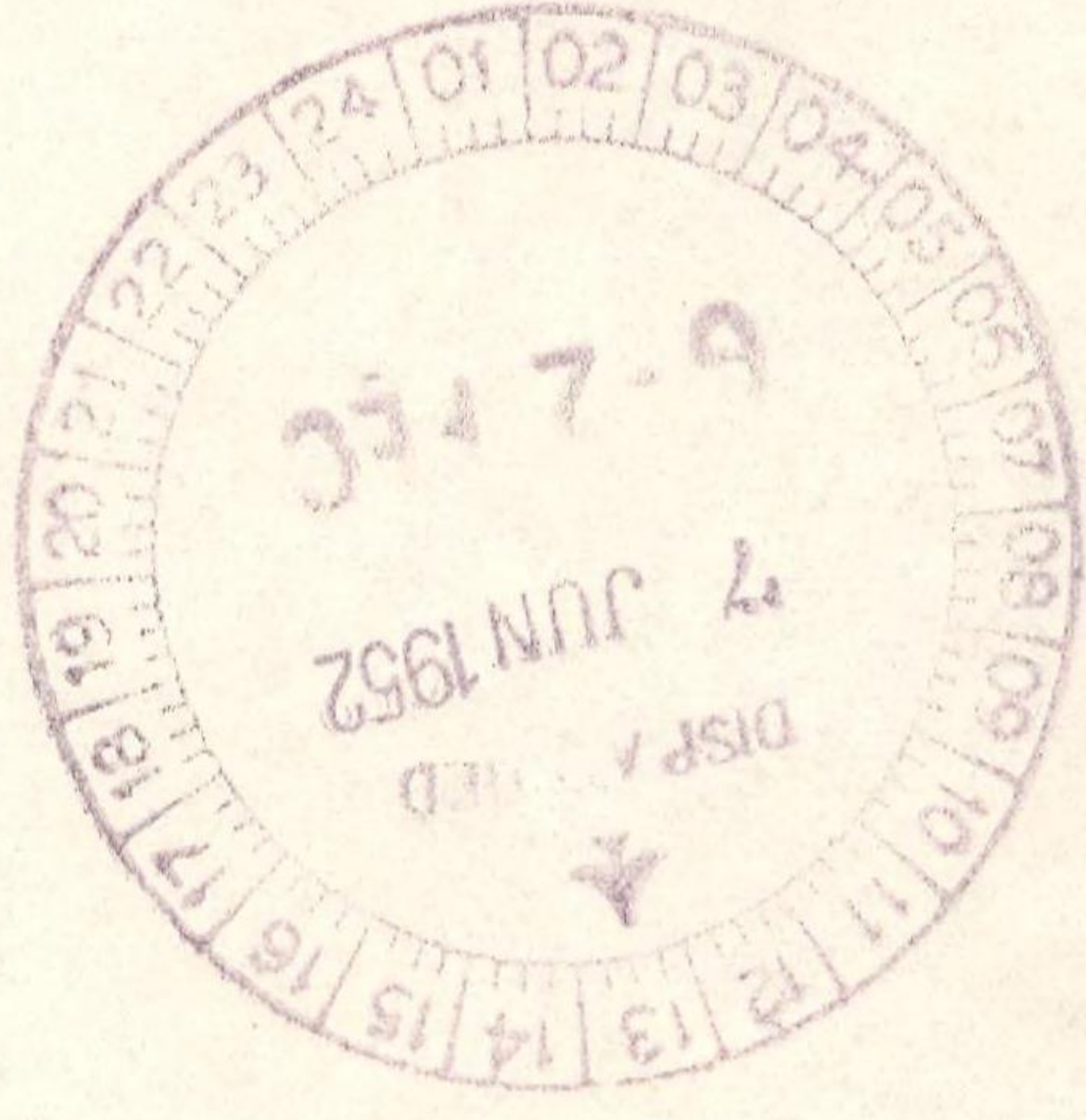

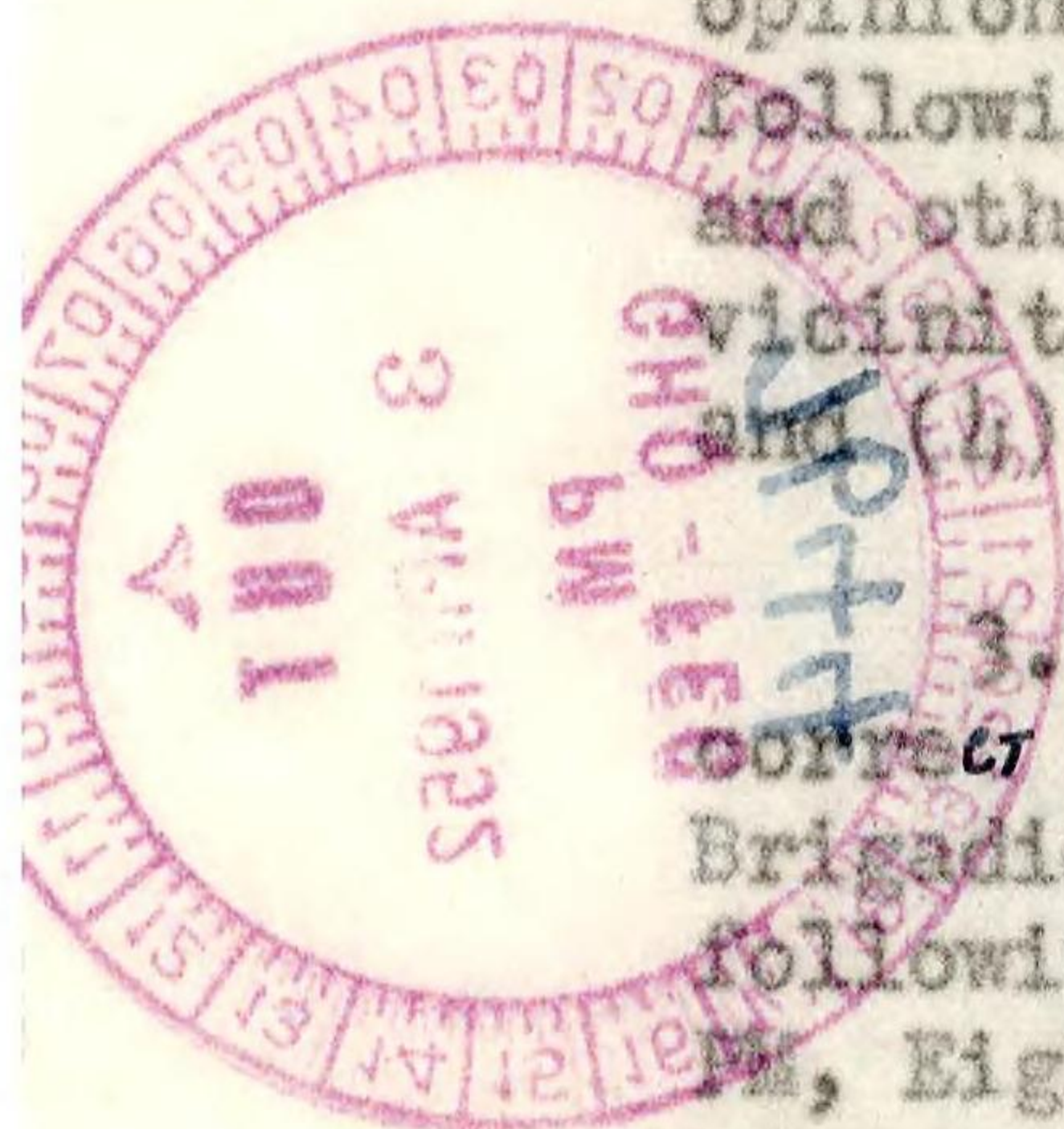

1. 1. When the prisoner of war enclosures were built in two adjoining valleys on Koje-Do Island in the Spring of 1951, a number of native villages were left intact in close proximity to some of the compounds. The farmers who lived in these villages presented no problem at first except that many of them lost their traditional means of livelihood because their rice paddies were taken for the compounds. Gradually an undesirable "floater" population began to move into these villages, including prostitutes, black marketeers, and subversive elements. To meet this situation, Colonel Cadwell, MPC, who was Camp Commander from 25 Sep 51 to 13 Oct 51, worked out an agreement with the local Koje-Do Island Korean authorities whereby (1) the "floater" population would be moved out rapidly and (2) the bona fide original inhabitants would be moved to new houses constructed for them. In some cases the use of prisoner of war labor to construct such houses adjacent to, but outside of, the camp area was contemplated. The plan included setting up a camp area including the two main valleys, with road blocks, from which all unauthorized persons would be excluded. While Colonel Cadwell, MPC, was in command, the majority of the "floater" population was screened out and moved off the Island of Koje-Do and the resettlement of the native population was begun. Some villages were moved. The importance of completing this project was brought to the attention of Colonel Fitzgerald, MPC, when he took command on 13 Oct 51 by Colonel Cadwell, MPC, PM Eighth Army, and by PM FEC.

2. In the course of a staff visit to Koje-Do from March 19 to March 21, by PM FEC (Colonel Chaplin), and a representative of G-1, FEC (Lt Colonel Kogstad), it was observed that this situation had deteriorated to a marked degree. Instead of further removal of these villages, a building boom was in progress, many new shacks were noticed, and there were many shacks under construction in these villages. It was admitted that there was again a large and very objectionable "floater" population in the villages. In the opinion of PM, this presents a very serious problem from one or more of the following standpoints: (1) Diversion into black market of clothing, food, and other prisoner of war supplies; (2) prostitution in the immediate vicinity of camps of U. S. and Korean troops assigned to Koje-Do; (3) security; and (4) ready channels of information between prisoners of war and the enemy.

3. It appeared that this situation, particularly the former plan to correct it, had not been brought to the attention of the new camp commander, Brigadier General Dodd. This matter was brought to the attention of the following staff officers who accompanied PM, FEC on this staff visit: PM, Eighth Army (Colonel Cadwell); PM, 2d Logistical Command (Colonel Grubb); representative of G-1, Eighth Army (Lt Colonel McKenzie); G-1, 2d Logistical Command (Lt Colonel Brooks). PM, FEC and PM, Eighth Army discussed this

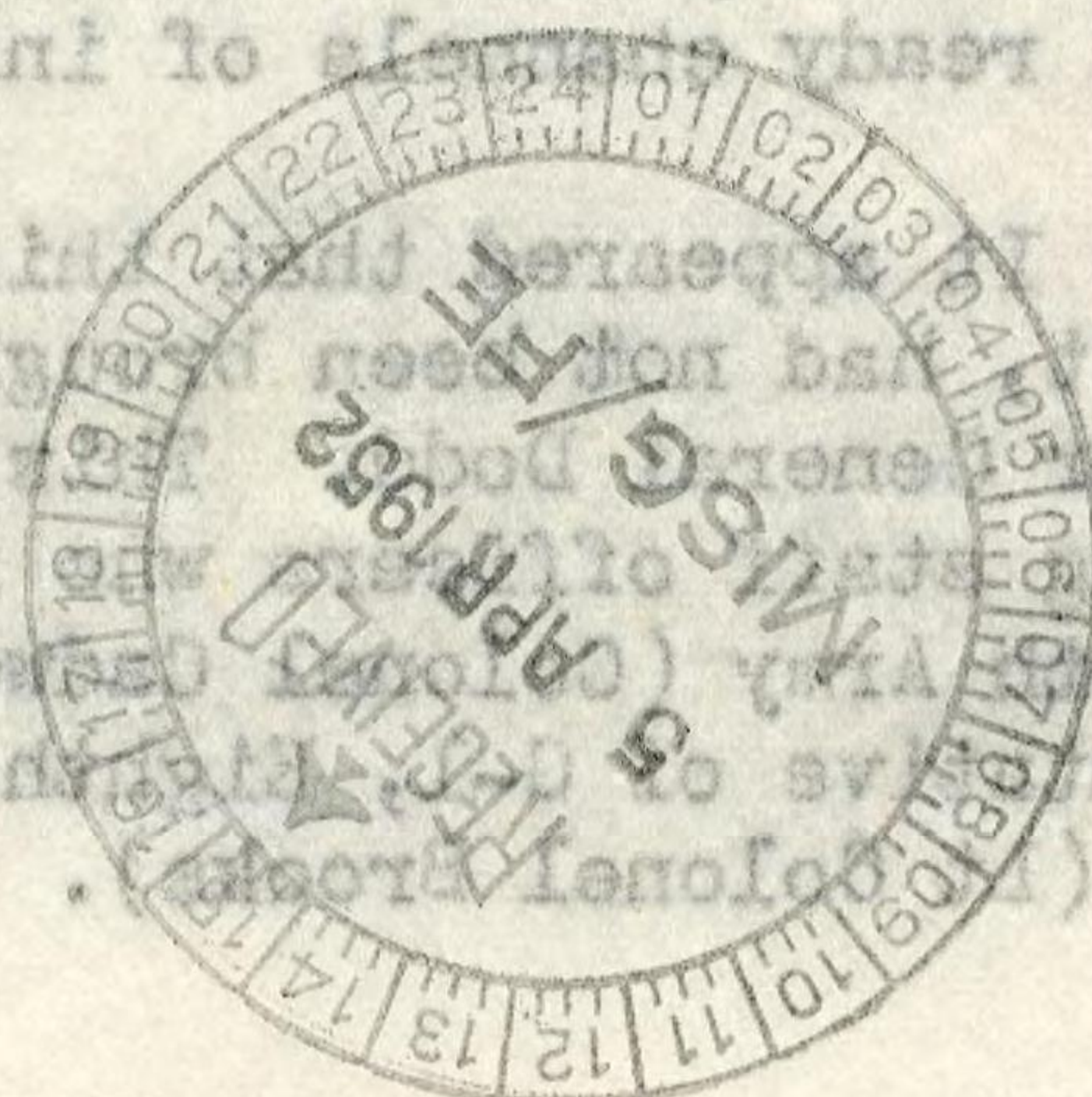

When the prisoner of war enclosures were built in two adjoining valleys on Koje-Do Island in the Spring of 1951, a number of native villages were left intact in close proximity to some of the compounds. The farmers who lived in these villages presented no problem at first except that many of them lost their traditional means of livelihood because their rice paddies were taken for the compounds. Gradually an undesirable "floating" population began to move into these villages, including prostitutes, black marketers, and supervisory elements. To meet this situation, Colonel Gadowell, MFC, who was Camp Commander from 25 Sep 51 to 13 Oct 51, worked out an agreement with the local Koje-Do Island Korean authorities whereby (1) the "floating" population would be moved to new houses constructed for them. In some cases the use of prisoner of war labor to construct such houses adjacent to, but outside of, the camp area was contemplated. The plan included setting up a camp area including the two main valleys, with road blocks, from which all unauthorized persons would be excluded. While Colonel Gadowell, MFC, was in command, the majority of the "floating" population was screened out and moved off the Island of Koje-Do and the resettlement of the native population was begun. Some villages were moved. The importance of completing this project was brought to the attention of Colonel Fitzgerald, MFC, when he took command on 13 Oct 51 by Colonel Gadowell, MFC, 8th Army, and by PM FEC.

2. In the course of a staff visit to Koje-Do from March 19 to March 21, by PM FEC (Colonel Chaplin), and a representative of G-1, FEC (Lt Colonel Kogstad), it was observed that this situation had deteriorated to a marked degree. Instead of further removal of these villages, a building boom was in progress, many new shacks were noticed, and there were many shacks under construction in these villages. It was admitted that there was again a large and very objectionable "floating" population in the villages. In the opinion of PM, this presents a very serious problem from one or more of the following standpoints: (1) Diversion into black market of clothing, food, other prisoner of war supplies; (2) prostitution in the immediate vicinity of camps of U. S. and Korean troops assigned to Koje-Do; (3) security; (4) ready source of information between prisoners of war and the enemy.

It is suggested that this situation, particularly the former plan to divert attention to the attention of the new camp commander, be brought to the attention of the 8th Army (Colonel Gadowell) and the 8th Army (Colonel Gadowell) on this staff visit. 1. It has come to the attention of this office that G2, Far East Command, intends to cease the production of Far East Town Plans Series Special Reports.

2. These reports constitute a valuable adjunct to the target material available to Strategic Air Command. They contain a wealth of information as to layout of cities and towns and furthermore give in great detail information as to height and structure of buildings. This kind of information enables Strategic Air Command to predict the kind of radar return these places will provide and therefore permits the production of training aids for simulated bombing attacks on potential targets. Not infrequently such information will constitute target material sufficient for radar attack on a target and decrease the necessity to obtain reconnaissance prior to attack.

3. In view of the value of these special reports it is recommended that their production be continued as long as possible and that any decision to discontinue them be reconsidered in the light of the above.

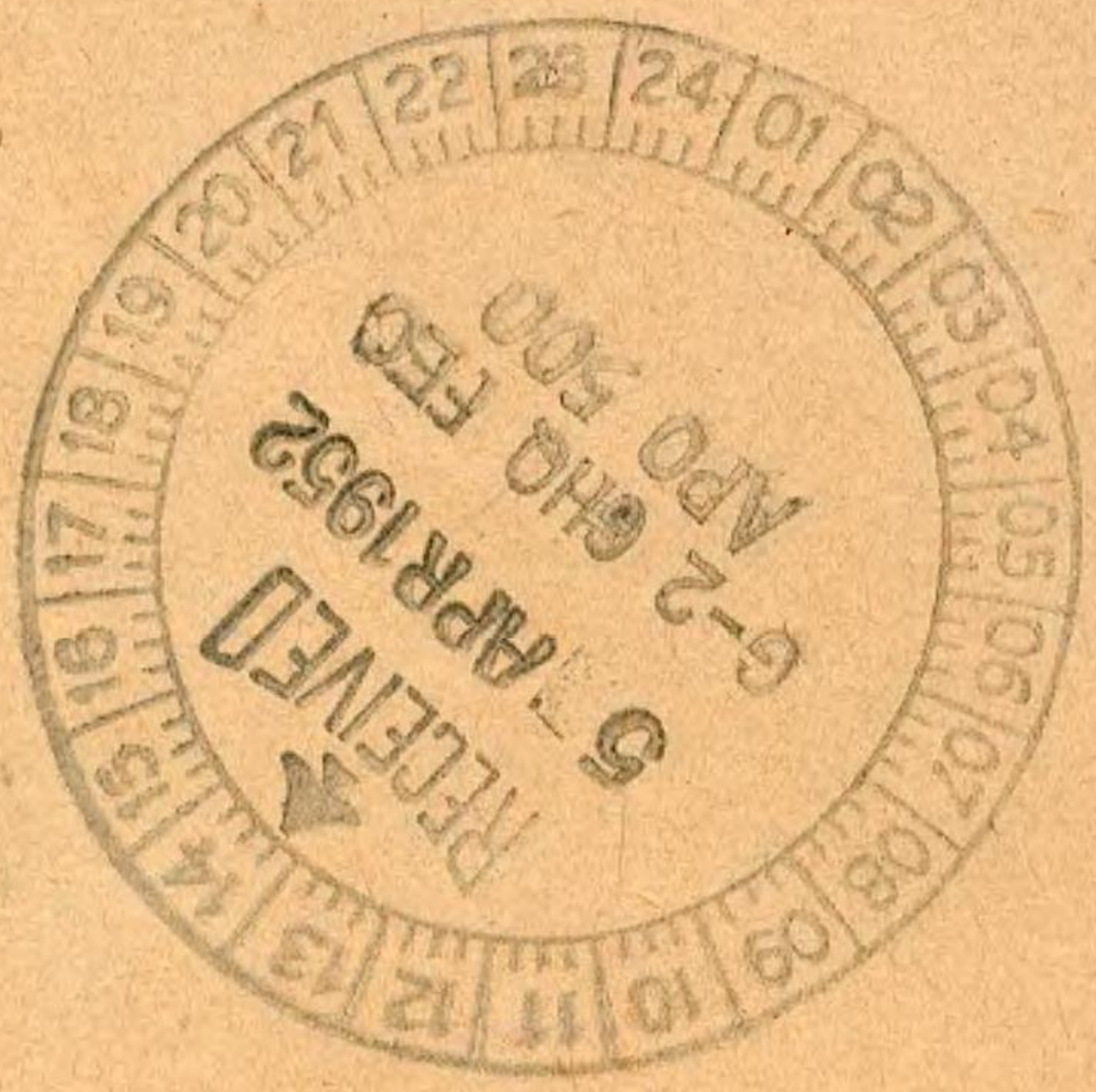
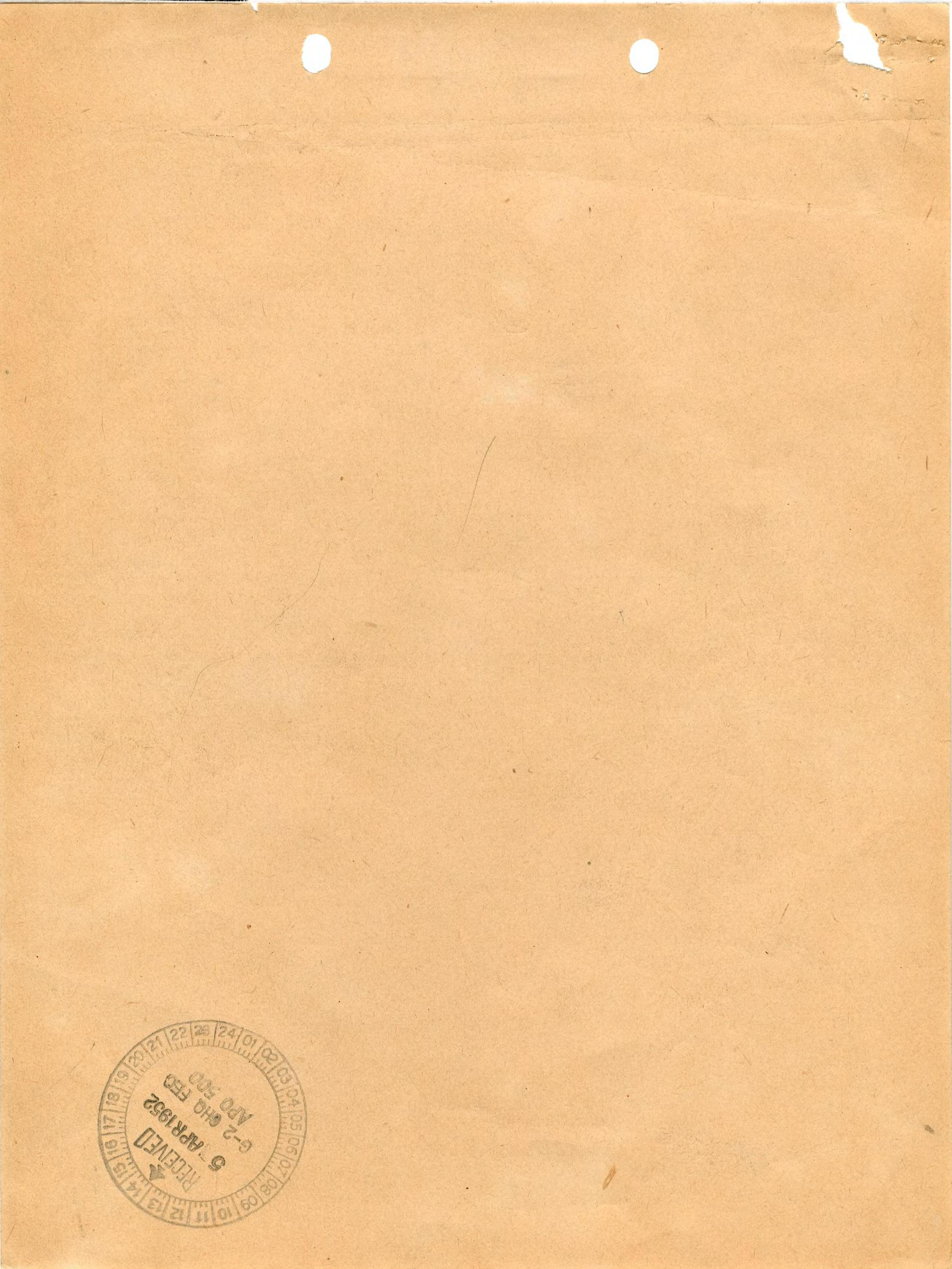

2. By sources the material is;

a. Demobilization Headquarters Chinese Expeditionary Forces, Investigation of Military Installations and other Properties. Data which includes sketch maps, building plans, construction materials and function was prepared thru Japanese interrogations of former military personnel. Hope springs eternal - - -. There are approximately 800 volumes, each about 10" x 13" x 1", which are temporarily in possession of Geographic Branch.

b. Bank of Japan. Has compiled data relative to industrial and commercial buildings in Japanese occupied areas. It is being procured.

3. This is a Jack-pot. It is recognized that function today may be different from 1945 but here we have exact information on the physical characteristics of the buildings. Now it is necessary only to interrogate for location and current use. Geographic plans to use the material in conjunction with current town plan priorities.
