Bonus Bill NEWPORT DRIVE END Is Ready

Proposed That State Raise \$10,000,000 to Compensate the Boys Who Went to War

A bill providing for submission to voters of Kentucky the lestion of levying a special tax to pay adjusted compensation \$10 for each mouth in service to veterans of the late war has ten prepared by John T. It is provided that every soldier, sailor, marine or nurse in the service, whose legal residence was in the state at the time of entrance to the service, shall be paid \$10 for every month of fraction thereof served.

In event of death of such veteran, the compensation, under the bill, will be paid the wife, mother, child, father, dependent ister or brother. Any person who obtained compensation in another state is not eligible under the Kentucky bill.

The bill also provides for the appointment of a "Soldiers' Compensation Board," to consist of the governor, anditor, adjutant general and secretary of state, which will handle all fairs pertaining to payment of the bonus, but which must operate without pay.

It is further provided the secretary of state place the question of issuing bonds in the sum of \$10,000,000, of 20,vear duration, on the ballot to take eare of the payment. The bonds are to be issued at a rate of interest of 5½ per cent.

The, question will be placed on the ballots as follows, in the event the bill passes:

"Are you in favor of issuing bonds in the sum of \$10,000,000, pledging full faith and credit of the commonwealth of Kentucky, bearing 5½ per cent interest per annum, and redeemable within 30 years from the date thereof, providing a sinking fund by levying a tax of five cents on each \$100 valuation of all property subject to maturity, for the exclusive purpose of providing a fund to reward the soldiers, sallors, marines and nurses who served in the military or naval services of the United States between April 6, 1917, and Nov. 11, 1918, or any part line the referendame near the support of the part of the control of t

In the event the referendum passes muster at hands of the ctorate, the bill provides the governor shall at once convent Soldiers' Compensation Board and proceed at once to carry the law's provisions.

This board is empowered to issue and sell the bonds proed for in the act as soon as possible.

The bonds to be issued under the act are to be free fro taxafion in the state, county and eity.

Further provision is contained in the bill that money received by any beneficiary of the law is not liable to attachine or levy or seizure under any legal process.
