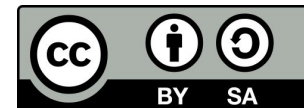

## Why the SheSaid campaign [ modifica ]

To balance the representation of gender in the entries of Wikiquote.

To illustrate the situation, here are a few interesting figures

- On the English Wikiquote main page on 6th of Oct 2020, in the *Selected people* section... 29 men are featured and only 4 women (check out the screenshot on the right...)
- There are 233 women who have a featured article on either French or English Wikipedias... with no entry on the French Wikiquote check it out
- There are 141 women featured article on the English Wikipedia with no wikiquote entry [check it](#)
- There are 519 women listed on the French wikiquote [check it](#) and 3117 men listed [check it out](#)

Obviously, not all women said *good quotes* that would make a wikiquote entry worth it. Still...

**Evelyn Beatrice Hall** (28 September 1868 – 13 April 1956) was an English writer, who wrote under the name **Stephen G. Tallentyre**.

# Wikiquote:Assume good faith

**Assume that people who work on the project are trying to help it, not hurt it.**

To **assume good faith** is a fundamental principle on [Wikiquote](#). In allowing anyone to edit, we must assume that most people who work on the project are trying to help it, not hurt it. If this weren't true, a project like Wikiquote would be doomed from the beginning. When you can reasonably assume that a mistake someone made was a well-intentioned attempt to further the goals of the project, correct it without criticizing. When you disagree with people, remember that they probably believe that they are helping the project. Consider using [talk pages](#) to explain yourself, and give others the opportunity to do the same. This can avoid misunderstandings and prevent problems from escalating. Good faith is obviously not bad faith.

Be [patient with newcomers](#). Newcomers unaware of Wikiquote's unique culture and the mechanics of Wikiquote editing often make mistakes or fail to respect community norms. It is not uncommon for a newcomer to believe that an unfamiliar policy should be changed to match their experience elsewhere. Similarly, many newcomers bring with them experience or expertise for which they expect immediate respect. Behaviors arising from these perspectives are not malicious.

Also, be patient with transfers from Wikipedia, as they are likely to edit Wikiquote based on the style most common to them, the Wikipedia style, and due to the similarity of both projects, they can hardly imagine differences of policies and custom between the two.

Assuming good faith is about intentions, not actions. Well-meaning people make mistakes, and you should correct them when they do. You should not act like their mistake was deliberate. Correct, but do not scold. There will be people on Wikiquote with whom you disagree. Even if they are wrong, that does not mean they are trying to wreck the project. There will be some people with whom you find it hard to work. That does not mean they are trying to wreck the project either. It is never necessary that we attribute an editor's actions to bad faith, even if bad faith seems obvious, as all our countermeasures (i.e. reverting, blocking) can be performed on the basis of behavior rather than intent.

**This guideline does not require that editors continue to assume good faith in the presence of evidence to the contrary.** Actions inconsistent with good faith include repeated vandalism, confirmed malicious [sockpuppetry](#), and lying. Assuming good faith also does not mean that no action by editors should be criticized, but instead that criticism should not be attributed to malice unless there is specific evidence of malice. Editors should not accuse the other side in a conflict of not assuming good faith in the absence of reasonable supporting evidence.

## Marie Curie

**Marie Skłodowska-Curie** (7 November 1867 – 4 July 1934) was a Polish-born scientist. The first woman to be awarded a Nobel Prize, in 1903, for Physics, she became the first person to win two with the 1911 Nobel Prize for Chemistry. She founded the Curie Institute.

- Life is not easy for any of us. But what of that? We must have perseverance and above all confidence in ourselves. We must believe that we are gifted for something, and that this thing, at whatever cost, must be attained.**

### Radio-activity (1904)

by Lincolt Rutherford (as translated) by published on 1905

Marie Curie made a detailed examination by the electrical method of the great majority of known substances, including the very rare elements, to see if they possessed any activity. In cases when it was possible, several compounds of the elements were examined. With the exception of thorium and phosphorus, none of the other substances possessed an activity even of the order of 1/100 of uranium.

It seemed probable that the large activity of some of these minerals, compared with uranium and thorium, was due to the presence of small quantities of some very active substance, which was different from the known bodies thorium and uranium. This supposition was completely verified by the work of M. and Mme Curie, who were able to separate from pitchblende by purely chemical methods two active bodies, one of which in the pure state is over a million times more active than the metal uranium. This important discovery was due entirely to the property of radio-activity possessed by the new bodies. The only guide in their separation was the activity of the products obtained. . . . The activity of the specimens thus served as a basis of rough qualitative and quantitative analysis, analogous in some respects to the indication of the spectroscope.

The chief difficulty lay in the fact that pitchblende is a very complex mineral and contains in varying quantities nearly all the known metals. . . . The analysis of pitchblende by chemical methods, using the procedure suggested above, led to the discovery of two very active bodies, polonium and radium. The name polonium was given to the first substance discovered by Mme Curie in honor of the country of her birth. The name radium was a very happy inspiration of the discoverers, for this substance in the pure state possesses the property of radio-activity to an astonishing degree.
