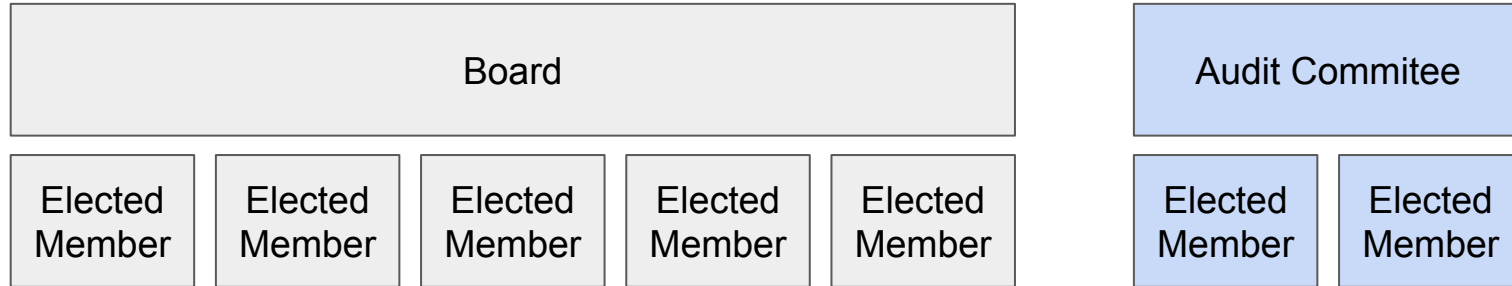

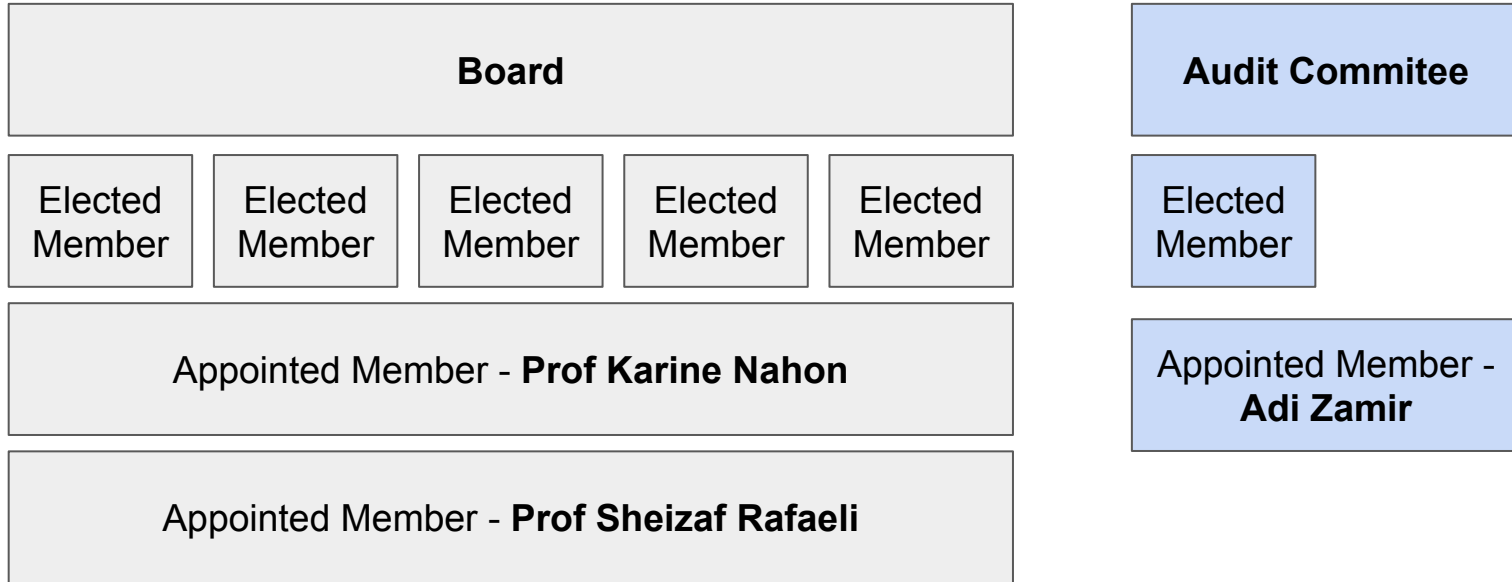

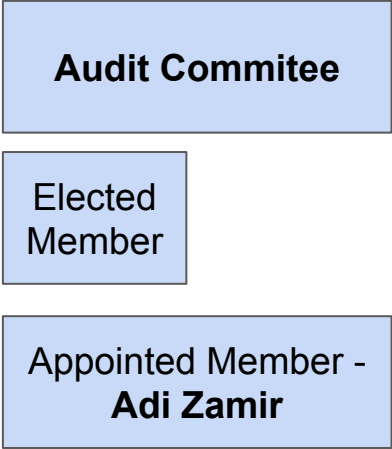
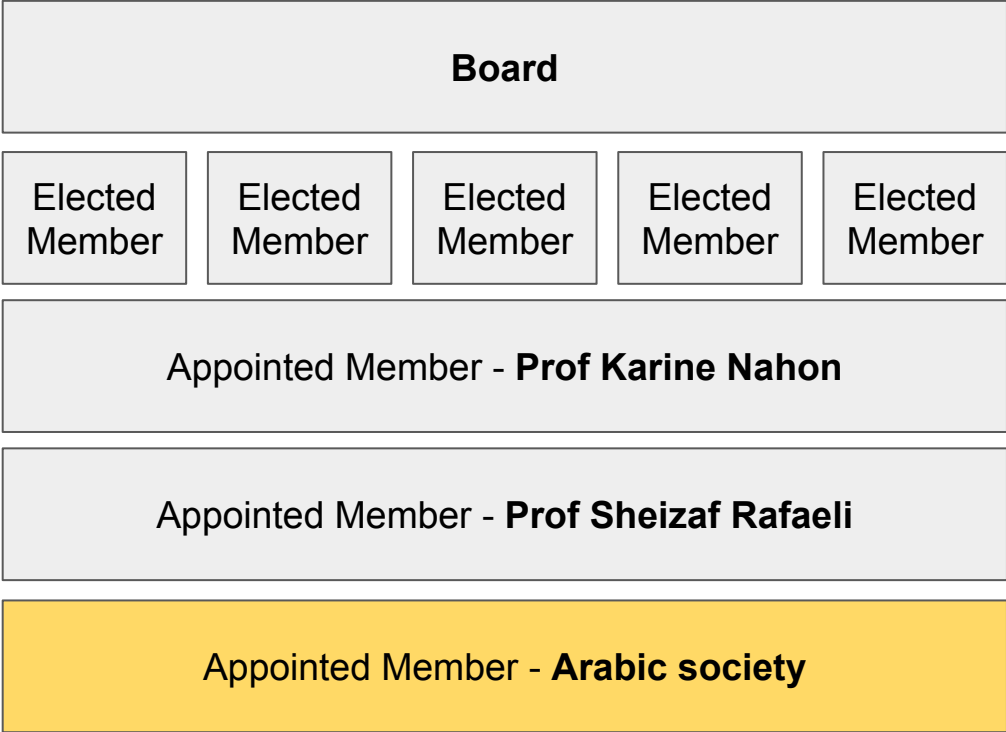
WMIL's Board Structure until 2013

WMIL's Board Structure - Proposal for 2017

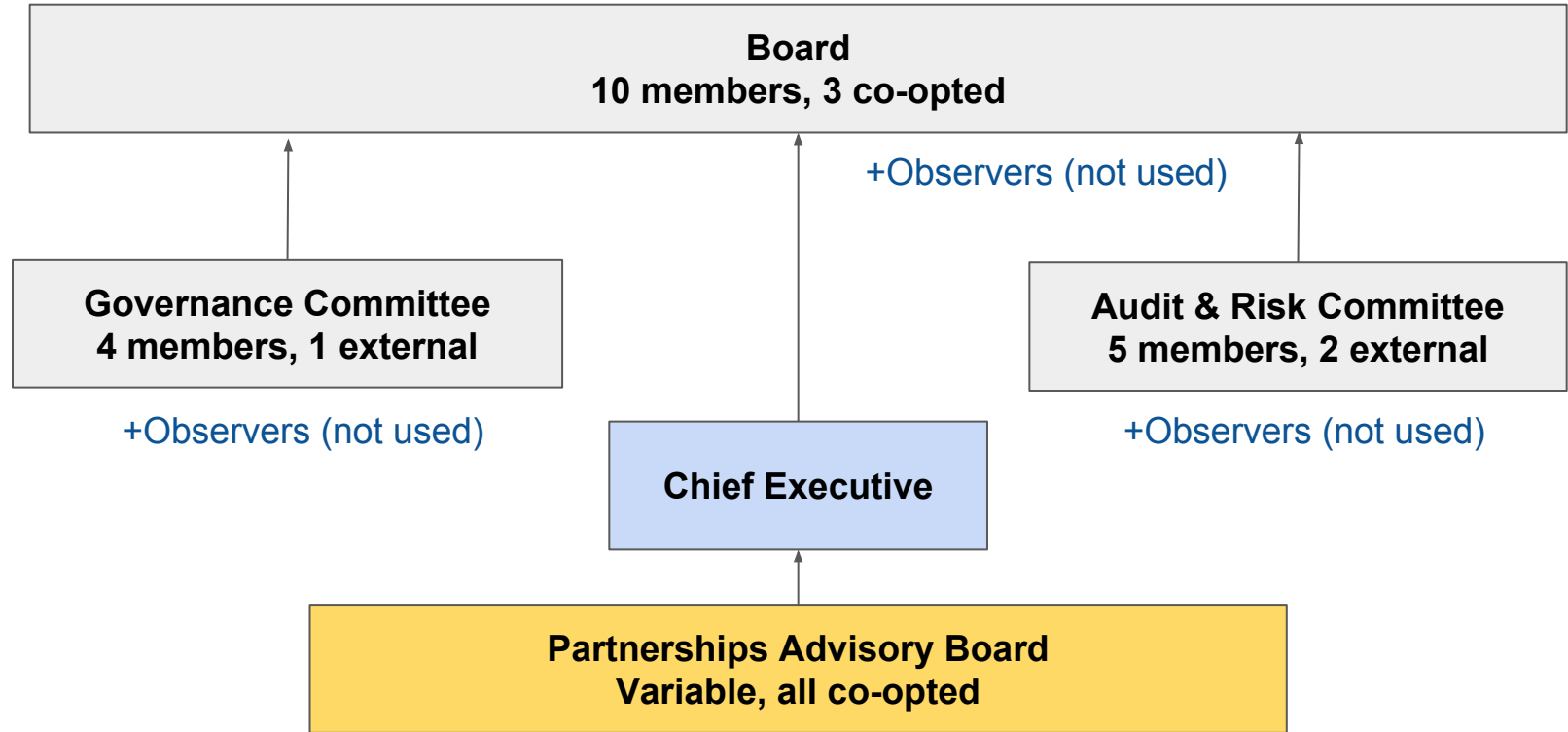

WMUK's Board Structure

WMUK's Articles of Association

The Board usually comprises 7 Elected Members elected by the charity at its General Meetings, and 3 co-opted Members appointed by the Board. From time to time, in the interests of the charity, a further Co-opted Member may be appointed by the Board.

Principles

The board is legally responsible for the **overall direction, effectiveness, supervision and accountability** of WMUK.

- No separate reserved “seats”
- Co-opted members are full voting members of the board
- Allows for non-voting ‘observers’ if we need them
- Very flexible approach

WMUK's Board Structure

Why?

- Brings in valuable perspectives and experience
- Broadens our scope and ambitions
- Ensures we remain a truly independent charity

Who?

People with a lot of experience in:

- The GLAM sector (museums, libraries etc)
- Open education
- Legal
- Financial (eg as Board Treasurer)
- Corporate and charity governance and management

The **Board of Trustees** oversees the Wikimedia Foundation and its work,
as its ultimate corporate authority

- **4 seats appointed by the board**
- **3 seats selected by the community**
- **2 seats selected by the affiliates**
- **1 for the Community Founder, Jimmy Wales**
