persons in rebellion against the same, or to promote disobedience,
mutiny or desertion in the army of the Confederate States, or

person so offending shall be guilty of a high crime, and, upon
conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine not exceeding five
thousand dollars, and shall be imprisoned, with or without labor,
