## Thrips

1. Keep a little naphthalene (tar camphor flakes, or moth balls) among the bulbs at all times in storage.
2. Soak in some insecticidal solution before planting. Bichloride of Mercury will do.
3. It is better to begin spraying before infestation starts. Use any good plant spray as directed. We have heard of the success of a solution of brown sugar and Paris green.
4. Burn all infested flower spikes.
5. Burn the plant tops after digging.

Devon. Palest rose pink, with small feather of bright rose in the throat. Strong straight spike, well above medium height; flowers large, 8 to 10 open at once, with perfect placement.

Pink Crepe. Upper petals clear flesh pink, blending gradually into the pure cream white of the lower petals. The only throat markings are a few dotted lines of deep red. The shape of the flowers is distinctive with the edges of the petals slightly ruffled. The stem is slender and always straight, placement of flowers is perfect. A very beautiful variety of delicate coloring, which does not fade or droop in the sun.
