TO THE TRADE,

In presenting our winter price-list of Grafts, Seedlings, Scions, etc., I wish to thank our many patrons for the trade extended in the past and invite your careful attention to the stock offered herein.

PACKING AND SHIPPING FACILITIES.

Our packing facilities are not excelled in the West. We have large and commodious cellars and packing houses especially designed for our business, with city water in all buildings and covering the entire packing grounds. A separate building and storage cellar, especially designed for this purpose, is used for our work in grafting, packing and callousing the grafts. With our facilities and thorough methods in packing we are prepared to make shipments at any time during the winter months with safety.

Railway Lines—Chicago, Burlington & Quincy; Wabash, and Keokuk & Western. Express Companies—Adams and Pacific.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

Shipping—Please give shipping directions, whether by freight or express; also route. If no directions are given we forward to the best of our judgment, without assuming responsibility, as all goods travel at purchaser's risk and expense. All freight shipments released to the value of \$5.00 per cwt., unless otherwise instructed.

Caution—We accept all orders on the condition that they shall be void should injury befall our stock from frost, hail, fire or other causes over which we have no control.

Claims—All claims for errors and deductions must be made within ten days after receipt of goods.

Terms—To known responsible parties we extend the usual terms of credit. Orders from those with whose financial standing we are not acquainted should be accompanied with one-fourth cash or satisfactory references.

Packing—Grafts Boxed Free—On other stock we charge to cover cost. All packing carefully done in the best possible manner in paper lined boxes.

Guarantee of Genuineness—While we exercise the utmost diligence and care to have our varieties true to name, and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc., that may prove otherwise, or refund the amount paid, it is mutually understood and agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that we shall in no case be liable for any sum greater than the amount originally received for said trees, etc., that prove untrue.

ROOT GRAFTS,

We make a specialty of this branch of the business during the winter season and are especially well equipped for handling it.

Our Grafts are put up by the day (no cheap job work) by old experienced men, who have been in our employ for years and thoroughly understand their business and are interested in our success, making quality not quantity their standard. This is the secret of our large trade in this line, as our grafts grow and give satisfaction. We grow a large stock of Seedlings and Scions and are prepared to make low prices for Grafts of the best quality.

Any Style of Graft Made to Order—In Apple and Crab Grafts we prefer the Piece-Root Graft with a six-inch Scion and three and one-half-inch Root. We plant largely of these ourselves. We make the price of Whole-Root Grafts so low that those who prefer them can easily afford to buy them.

All Grafts are carefully assorted and only the best of material used in orders, so that customers can depend on getting a first-class article. Orders should be placed early to secure the best selection of varieties and to give the Grafts ample time to callous before shipment. After our Grafts are made they are tied in bundles of 100, each bunch carefully labeled, and packed away to callous.
