vestments for the changing self

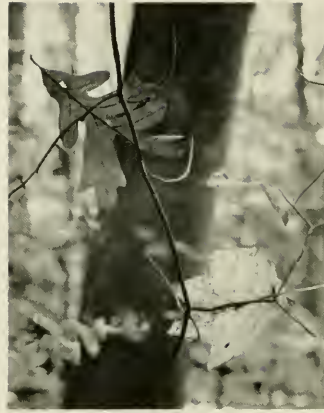
Cascades of flame, maize yellow -- storms of crispness

Nature's lavish battles in the branches

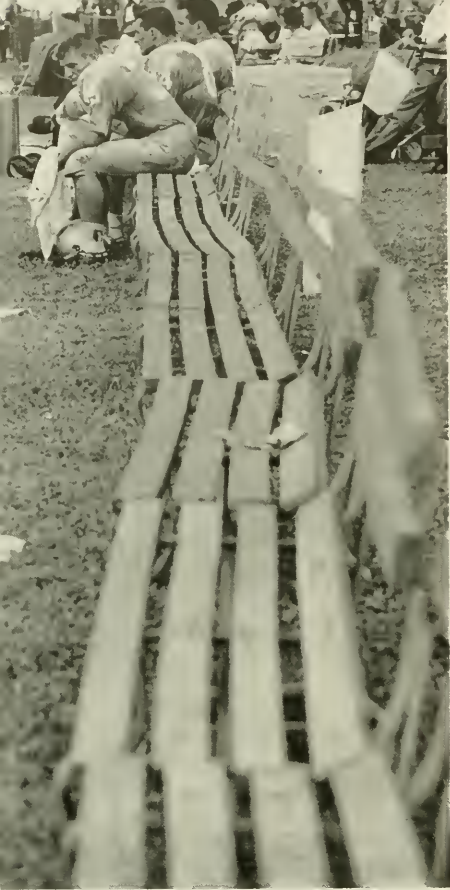
Stalks of corn -- bound -- skyward pointing

Hark the sound — fast die the days.





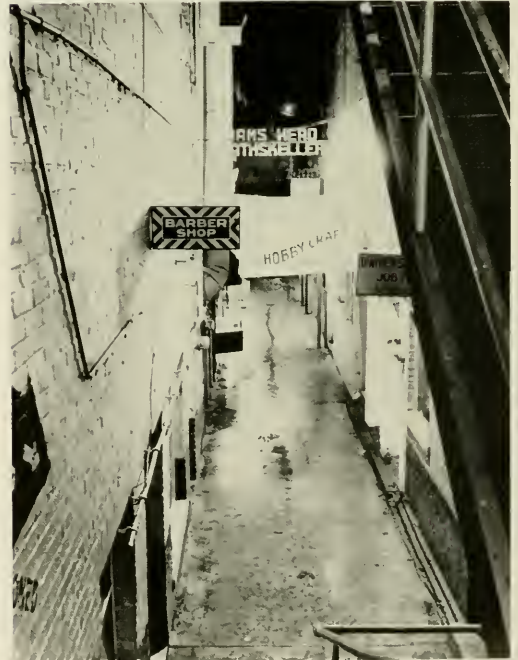
W I N T E R

Ours are the names cut deep in friendships tree.



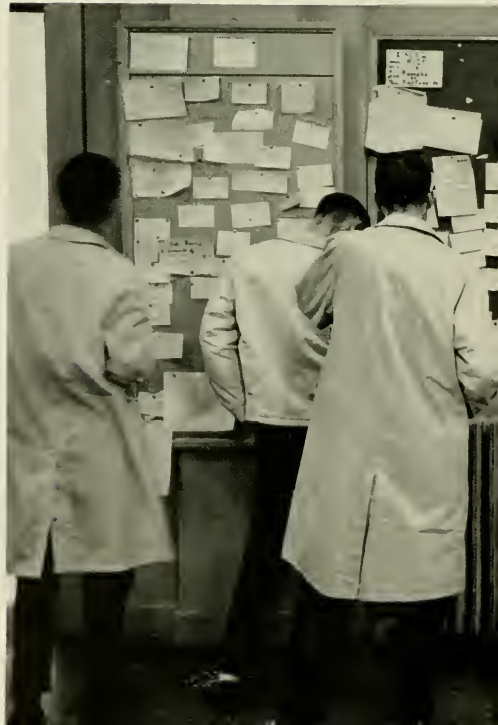


We are the Weejoined, hand-knit questions —

some may win this game of hearts

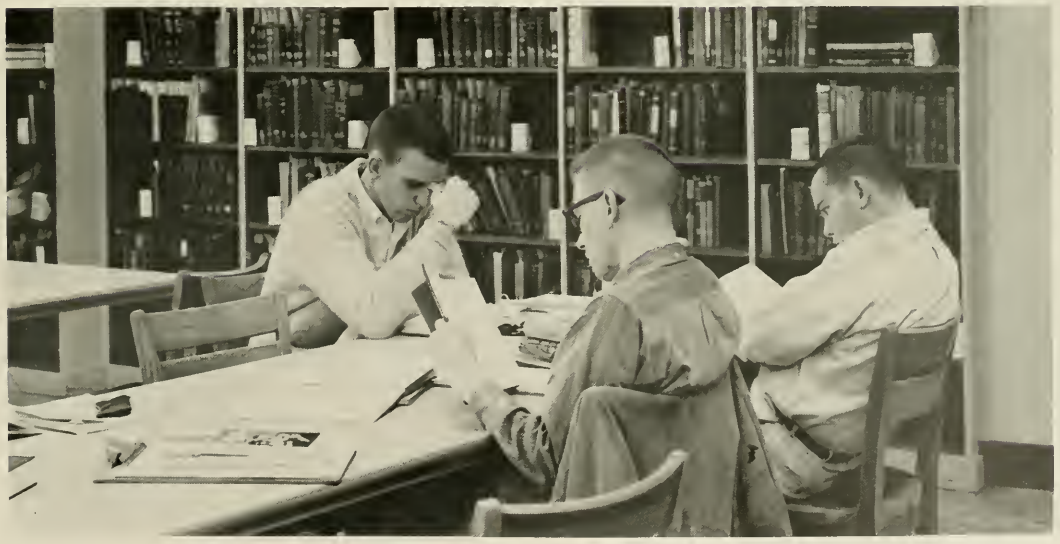
We are the army of cold knees, spitting fires — torn

mind — circle files of course forgotten.



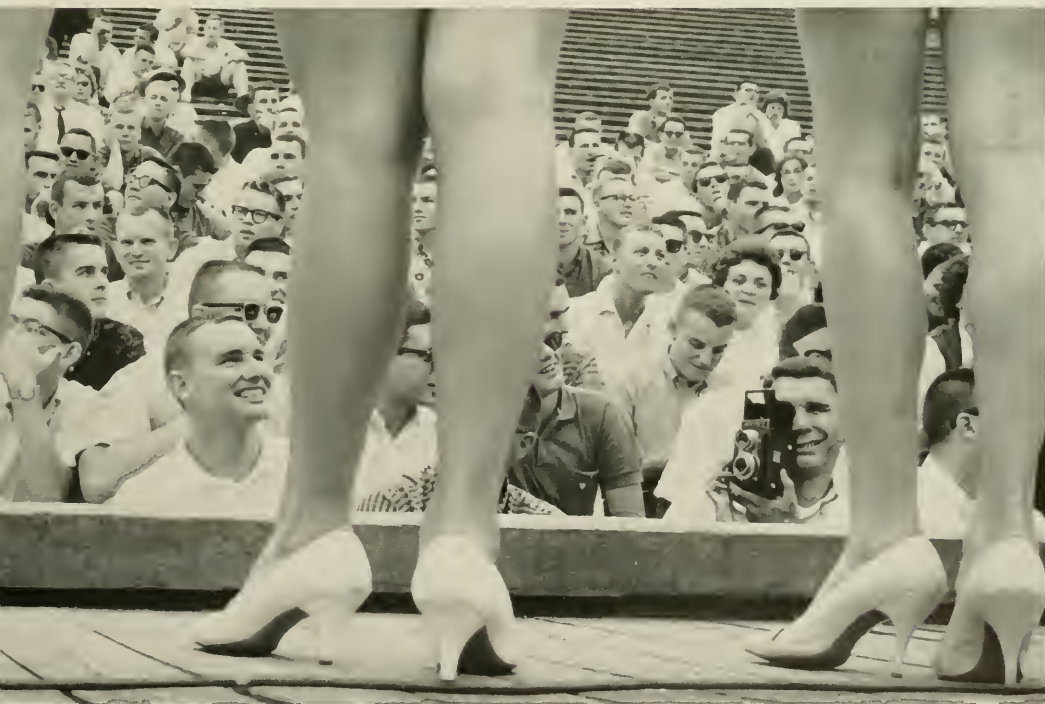
We are time's blue shirt days

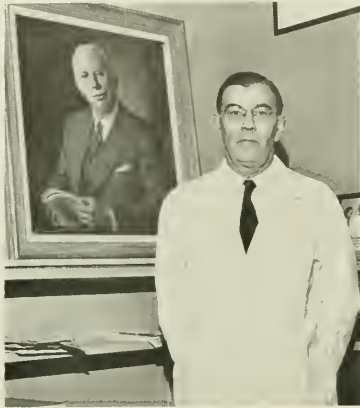

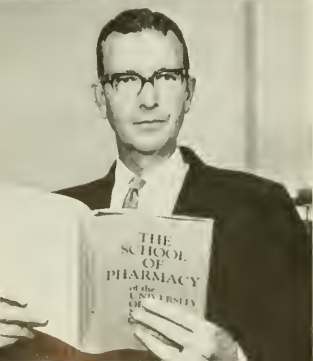

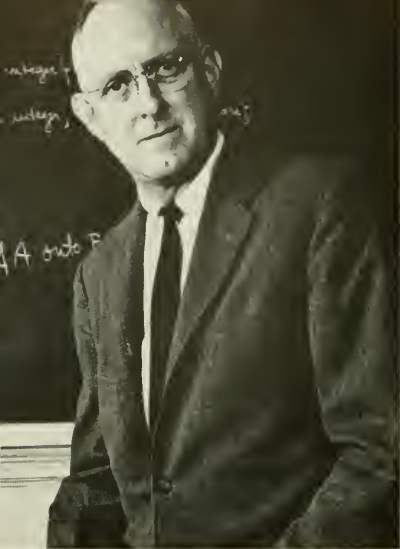

EDWARD A. CAMERON, Ph.D., 1936 (North Carolina), Professor of Mathematics, is the author of three freshman textbooks in mathematics. He is the Chairman of the Committee on Institutes of the Mathematical Association of America and has been the director of five National Science Foundation Institutes for high school teachers of science and mathematics. He is a member of the American Mathematical Society and the Mathematics Association of America. Dr. Cameron was one of the originators of the Freshman Honors Program at the University of North Carolina and he is, at present, the Chairman of the Faculty Council on Honors.



RUPERT B. VANCE, Ph.D., 1928 (North Carolina), Kenan Professor of Sociology, has as his special field of study the human and regional geography of the South. Dr. Vance is associated with the Institute of Research in Social Science of the University of North Carolina, and is co-editor of its research periodical *Social Forces*. He is a member and past President of the American Sociological Society, and a member of the Southern Sociological Society. Dr. Vance has written numerous articles and his book, *Human Geography of the South*, received the Mayflower Cup as the most outstanding book of non-fiction written in North Carolina.

HUGH T. LEFLER, Ph.D., 1931 (Pennsylvania), Kenan Professor of History, is a member of the American Historical Association, the Southern Historical Association, the Society of American Historians, and past President of the North Carolina Literary and Historical Association. He has written some nineteen books, including an outstanding college text, *Colonial America*. In 1959, Dr. Lefler received an honorary doctor of laws from Duke University, and he was the recipient of the Mayflower Cup for the outstanding non-fiction book in North Carolina in 1954. At present, Dr. Lefler is engaged in an enlargement of one of his North Carolina history texts.



DUDLEY J. COWDEN, Ph.D., 1931 (Columbia), Professor of Economic Statistics, is the author of two best-sellers in the technical field as well as numerous other books and articles. He is a member of the American Economic Association, the Econometric Society, and the Institute of Mathematical Statistics. Dr. Cowden is a Fellow of the American Statistical Association and a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Dr. Cowden is at present involved in the analysis of economic time series.

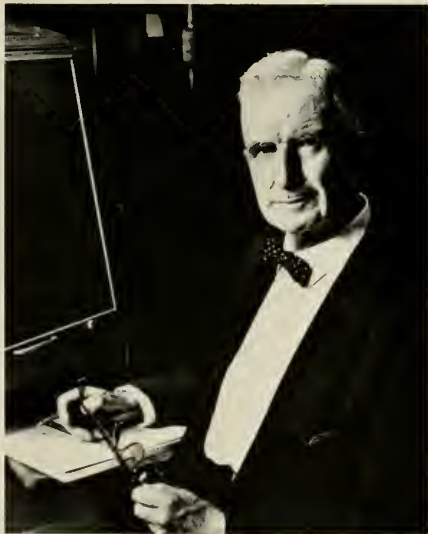


ELIE M. ADAMS, Ph.D., 1948 (Harvard), Professor of Philosophy, is a member of the Executive Committee of the American Philosophical Association. He is the author of several philosophy books and a contributor to various journals. He has also written several articles which will appear in an encyclopedia. At present, Dr. Adams is working on two new books. His most recently published work is *Ethical Naturalism and the Modern World* which appeared in 1960.



ALBERT E. RADFORD, Ph.D., 1948 (North Carolina), Professor of Botany, is especially interested in the native growing flora of North Carolina and South Carolina. He has contributed articles to several professional botanical journals, including *Rhodora*. At present, Dr. Radford is engaged in research on the study of all native growing plants in North Carolina and South Carolina. This project is being supported by a grant from the National Science Foundation.

GLEN HAYDON, Ph.D., 1932 (Vienna), Kenan Professor of Music and Chairman of the Department of Music, has served as President of the Music Teachers' National Association and President of the American Musicological Society. He is a composer and has also written numerous articles and books about music. He has been instrumental in the development of a strong music department with an excellent faculty and a good library. At present, Dr. Haydon is working on a history of the polyphonic hymn in the Renaissance.



WERNER P. FRIEDRICH, Ph.D., 1932 (Harvard), Schweizerisches Staatsexamen, 1931, Kenan Professor of German and Comparative Literature and Chairman of the Department of Comparative Literature, has served as the American Representative to the International Federation for Modern Languages and Literature, Secretary-General of the International Committee for Comparative Literature. He is a noted author, and his books include *Outline History of German Literature*. Dr. Friedrich was elected President of the International Comparative Literature Association, and he is associate editor of the *Revue de Littérature Comparee*.



LYMAN A. COTTEN, Ph.D., 1941 (Yale), Professor of English, is well-known among the students for his stimulating courses ranging from sophomore literature to modern poetry. He is a member of the Modern Language Association, the National Association of Teachers of English, and the College English Association. He is a past faculty member of the Publication Board. In recognition of Dr. Cotten's excellence in teaching, he was the recipient of a Tanner Award in 1961. At present, Dr. Cotten is working on an edition of a nineteenth century poem.

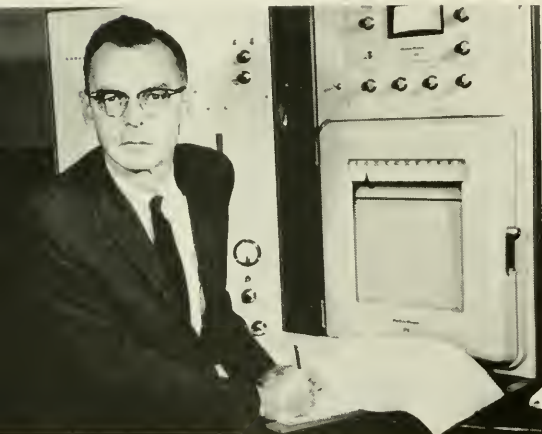




JOHN M. EHLE, JR., A.M., 1953 (North Carolina), Associate Professor of Radio, Television and Motion Pictures, is the author of *American Adventures*, a radio series which won numerous prizes, including two awards from the Ohio State Exhibition for Radio and Television, two George Washington Honor Medals from the Freedoms Foundation, and a special citation from the National Conference of Christians and Jews. Dr. Ehle's stories and articles have appeared in national magazines and some of his plays have been produced for national television. He is the author of several novels and biographies. His most recent book is *Lion on the Hearth* published in 1961.



HAROLD HOTELLING, Ph.D., 1924 (Princeton), Kenan Professor of Statistics, is an international authority in his field and has lectured in numerous foreign universities such as Paris, Brussels, and London. He is a consultant to the Gulf Research and Development Corporation, and the U. S. Navy. He is a Fellow of the Royal Economic Society, and an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Statistical Society. On his last birthday, his fellow statisticians published two volumes in his honor. Dr. Hotelling's special field of study is welfare economics and the incidence and effect of taxation.



SAMUEL B. KNIGHT, Ph.D., 1938 (North Carolina), Professor of Chemistry, is noted among students for his clarity of explanation of the most difficult chemical concepts. He is a member of the American Chemistry Society, and the Elisha Mitchell Scientific Society. He has written a number of articles and has prepared and organized a series of educational programs for a college television course in chemistry. Dr. Knight co-authored the text *Fundamentals of Physical Chemistry* and contributed to the *Encyclopedia of Science*. In 1959, Dr. Knight received a Tanner Award for excellence in teaching.



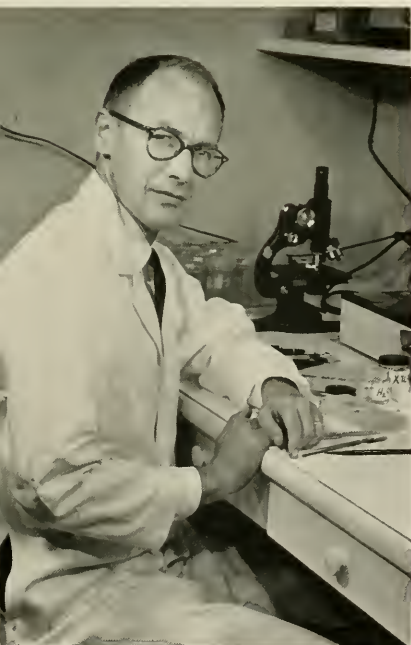
HARRY E. DAVIS, M.A., 1940 (Columbia), Professor of Dramatic Art and Chairman of the Department of Dramatic Art, gets a great deal of practical experience in his field as Director of *Unto These Hills*, an outdoor drama presented in North Carolina, and as Director of the famous Carolina Playmakers at the University of North Carolina. He is President of the South Eastern Theater Conference and on the Board of Directors of the American Educational Theater Association. Professor Davis is a member of the International Council of the Arts and the State Arts Council.



DONALD P. COSTELLO, Ph.D., 1934 (Pennsylvania), Kenan Professor of Zoology, has as his special field of research experimental embryology and cytology. He is a Fellow of the *Institute Internationale d'Embryologie*, a member of the Editorial Board of the journal of *Growth*, a member of the Executive Committee of the American Society of Zoologists, a Trustee of the Marine Biological Laboratory at Woods Hole, Massachusetts, and a Consultant to the National Institutes of Health to the Research Grants Division. He is the managing editor of *The Biological Bulletin* and the author of numerous papers for scientific journals. Dr. Costello has a five year research grant from the National Institutes of Health.



JOHN G. KUNTSMANN, Ph.D., 1938 (Chicago), Professor of German and Chairman of the Department of Germanic Languages, is a member of the Modern Languages Association, and a member and past President of the Association of Teachers of German in the United States. He is on the editorial board of *Modern Philology*, and a past research director of the Lutheran Academy for Scholarship. Dr. Kuntsmann is also a member of the Society for the Advancement of Scandinavian Studies. This year Dr. Kuntsmann was the recipient of the Great Cross of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany at Bonn in recognition of his outstanding contributions in the field of Germanics.



HARVEY E. LEHMAN, Ph.D., 1948 (Stanford), Professor of Zoology, has recently received a grant from the Institute of Muscle Research. He is a member of the Society of Zoology, and was in charge of an experimental embryological course at the Bermuda Biological Station. Dr. Lehman has written numerous articles for professional zoological journals as well as a laboratory manual for use in introductory zoology. Dr. Lehman was the recipient of a Tanner Award for excellence in Teaching in 1961.

DAVID G. BASILE, M.A., 1939 (Columbia), Assistant Professor of Geography, is a very familiar figure to the students since he is an advisor in the General College and serves as the faculty advisor to the student Y.M.C.A. He is a Fellow of the Social Science Research Council. His special field of interest is Latin American Geography, and he did his field work in Ecuador. Mr. Basile received a Tanner Award for excellence in teaching in 1957.



JOHN W. THIBAUT, Ph.D., 1949 (M.I.T.), Professor of Psychology and Sociology, and Chairman of the Department of Psychology, is on the Chancellor's Advisory Committee and affiliated with the Institute for Research in Social Science. One of the foremost social psychologists in the country, he is on the Board of Editors of the *Journal of Personality and Social Forces and Sociometry* and editorial consultant to *Psychological Review*. He is a member of the Research Panel for Sociology of the National Science Foundation. Dr. Thibaut is a contributor to various journals and the co-author of the celebrated textbook, *Social Psychology of Groups*.





ALFRED C. ENGSTROM, Ph.D., 1941 (North Carolina), Professor of Romance Languages, is on the Editorial Committee of the *University of North Carolina Studies in Comparative Literature*, on the Editorial Board of *Romance Notes*, and on the Editorial Board of the *University of North Carolina Studies in Romance Languages and Literatures*. Dr. Engstrom's special field of interest is French literature of the nineteenth century and he has done extensive work in the area of literary motifs and symbols. He is the author of numerous articles and reviews. This year Dr. Engstrom was named an Alumni Distinguished Professor.



ROBERT B. HOUSE, LL.D. (Catawba; Bowdoin), University Professor of English and Classics, is still affectionately known as Chancellor House since he made many outstanding contributions to the University of North Carolina in this position from 1945-1957. Dr. House has now returned to the classroom and students to teach several very popular courses in Greek and Latin Literature enhanced with his own sound philosophy and harmonica playing.



SAMUEL S. JONES, Ph.D., 1936 (Oxford), Professor of Political Science, was a Rhodes Scholar, and has been a Burton Craig Professor of Political Science since 1956. He served as Chairman of the Chancellor's Committee on International Studies in 1959. He is the author of several books and a contributor to various periodicals. Dr. Jones served as an officer in the U. S. State Department from 1942-1956. During the fall semester of this year, Dr. Jones taught a seminar at the Johns-Hopkins Center for Advanced Studies.

KENNETH M. BRINKHOUS, M.D., 1932 (Iowa), Professor of Pathology and Chairman of the Department of Pathology, is an international authority and research specialist in hemophilia. He is a member of the committee on blood coagulation of the National Research Council, a member of the medical advisory committee of the National Hemophilia Foundation, a scientific consultant to the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, and Chairman of the Hematology Study Section of the United States Public Health Service. Dr. Brinkhous was voted the "best teacher" by the U.N.C. medical class of 1960. Last year, Dr. Brinkhous was awarded the O. Max Gardner Award for his research in blood disease and for his outstanding teaching and training of pathologists.





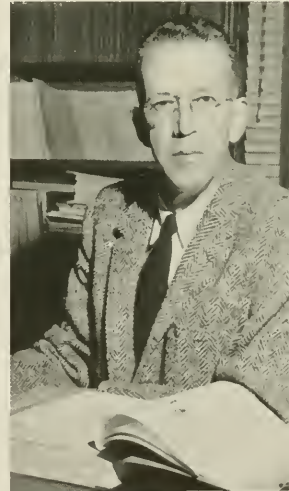
URBAN T. HOLMES, JR., Ph.D., 1923 (Harvard); Litt.D. (Washington and Lee). Kenan Professor of Romance Philology, is one of the outstanding language scholars in this country. He has served on the executive council of the Modern Language Association and as President of the South Atlantic Modern Language Association. He is a Fellow of the Medieval Academy and, in 1951, Dr. Holmes was awarded the medal of the Chevalier of the Legion of Honor by the French government. Dr. Holmes is editor of the *University of North Carolina Studies in the Romance Languages and Literatures* and editor of *Romance Notes*, a journal published by the Department of Romance Languages.



BERNARD BOYD, Th.D., 1946 (Union Theological Seminary in Virginia), Professor of Biblical Literature, has been a James A. Gray Professor of Biblical Literature at the University of North Carolina since 1950. He is a member of the Society of Biblical Literature and Exegesis, the American Schools of Oriental Research, and the National Association of Biblical Instructors. He is engaged in educational television and has taught many students through this medium. Dr. Boyd was the recipient of a Tanner Award for distinction in college teaching in 1956.



LOREN C. MacKINNEY, Ph.D., 1925 (Chicago), Kenan Professor of Medieval History, is especially interested in medieval history and particularly medical history during this period. He is on the editorial boards of the *American Historical Review* and *Manuscripta*. He serves on a Liaison Committee on Microfilming for several learned societies. Dr. MacKinney is a past Chairman of the Honors Committee, and a past member of the Screening Committee for Fulbright Grants. At present, he is on the Advisory Board of Humanities. He is a member of the Medieval Academy and the Southern Historical Association. Dr. MacKinney has written an outstanding text entitled *The Medieval World* and contributed to numerous journals.



MAURICE W. LEE, Ph.D., 1939 (Chicago), Professor of Economics and Business and Dean of the School of Business Administration, is one of the leaders of thought on collegiate business education in this country. He has devoted a considerable amount of his energies to the work of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, serving, at various times, as President, Vice-President, and Chairman of the Committee on Standards of this organization. Dean Lee has served as a consultant to a variety of business firms, and to both the executive and legislative branches of the federal government. He has held various positions in the Office of Price Administration, including that of Executive Assistant to Administrator Chester Bowles. Dean Lee is the author of a variety of papers and books, including the major study *Economic Fluctuations: Growth and Stability*.



EVERETT D. PALMATIER, Ph.D., 1951 (Cornell), Kenan Professor of Physics and Chairman of the Department of Physics, has taken cosmic radiation as his special field of research. Last year, Dr. Palmatier had a National Science Foundation Senior Post-Doctoral Fellowship and spent the year studying at the University of Bristol, England. At present, Dr. Palmatier and his assistants are engaged in designing a satellite-born experiment to measure cosmic rays above the atmosphere.

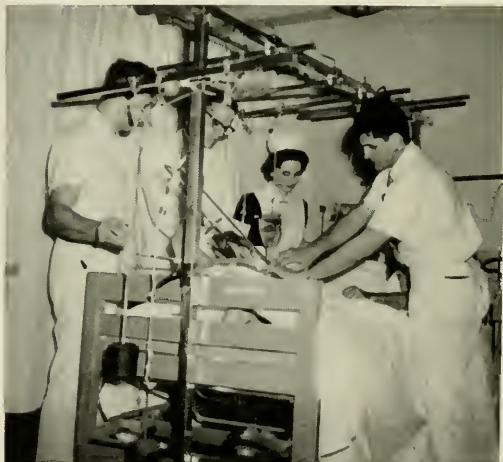
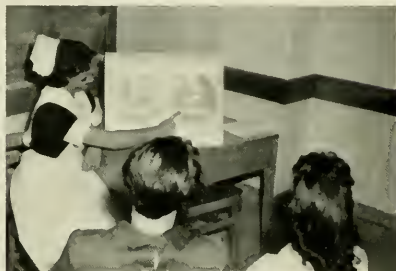
NURSING SCHOOL

The University of North Carolina School of Nursing — the youngest school in the oldest state university — celebrated its tenth anniversary this year.

In 1951, the school opened its doors to the first 26 students in North Carolina to enter a four-year collegiate nursing program. Dr. Elizabeth L. Kemble has been dean of the school since its opening, and other original faculty members were Mrs. Alice J. Gifford, Ruth Dalrymple, and Ruth M. Boyles.

Currently, the school has over 240 students enrolled. These include generic, general and graduate students. The faculty now has over 30 members.

The school continues to pursue the four-fold approach to the nursing needs of the state undertaken in 1951 — a mission to offer undergraduate education, graduate education, continuation education (through extension courses, institutes and workshops) and research in the field of nursing.

PHARMACY SCHOOL

The fall semester of 1961 marked the beginning of the sixty-fourth year of pharmaceutical education at the University of North Carolina and our third year in Beard Hall. The new pharmacy building was named Beard Hall last spring by trustee action to honor John Grover Beard, who was a Professor of Pharmacy and served from 1931 to 1946 as Dean.

Seventy-two seniors graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy, and there were sixteen students with studies leading to degrees of Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy with majors in Pharmacy or Pharmaceutical Chemistry.

A book, *A History of the School of Pharmacy*, was written by Miss Alice Noble, research historian. This was the first history of an individual school at the University to be published.

Pharmacy school consists of many formal lectures and laboratories, but also student organizations centered around points of interest, such as the Student Branches of the American Pharmaceutical Association and North Carolina Pharmaceutical Association, Rho Chi, Kappa Epsilon, Kappa Psi, Phi Delta Chi, and Pharmacy Senate. The social calendar is highlighted by fraternity dances, parties, the Christmas Party, Pharmacy Weekend, and Senior Commencement Picnic.

This is the School of Pharmacy — study on a professional level with extra-curricular and social activities designed to develop conscientious and well-rounded pharmacists to carry on a time-honored profession.

DENTAL SCHOOL

The faculty of the School of Dentistry deem it an unusual privilege to share their professional lives and experiences with the students in the several areas of dentistry, i.e., the undergraduate, postgraduate, and graduate programs, as well as in the Dental Hygiene Curriculum. Interesting and meaningful is the fact that the educational and professional standards established and maintained by the faculty become standards of the profession in the State of North Carolina, and, accordingly, the quality of dental health service available to the citizens.

The faculty again is proud to present its ninth graduating class in dentistry to the people of this state and nation. While more than ninety per cent of all dental graduates are residents of North Carolina, they may be found in private practice, teaching, research, the Armed Forces, Public Health Service, and Departments of Health throughout the country and world. We are equally proud of the graduates from the Dental Hygiene Curriculum, as well as those who have achieved their Certificate or Master's Degree in one of the specialty areas, i.e., Orthodontics or Pedodontics.

Important and interesting, too, is the expression of leadership from many of our graduates in dental education, research, private practice, and organizational activities on a local and national level. Such leadership provides additional status to this school and the profession.

Another area of leadership and signal recognition afforded this school is the substantial grant received from the Public Health Service for the training of teachers and researchers for other universities in the specialty fields of Orthodontics and Pedodontics. This program was activated in June, 1960. The School of Dentistry working with the Graduate School now affords several other graduate programs for those dentists who are qualified and who may elect to limit their practice or teaching to a recognized specialty.





Progress in teaching and practice continues to be a major objective of the faculty. The present graduating class has received additional intensive clinical training in the effective utilization of dental assistants. This additional instruction and training, made possible by another grant from the Public Health Service, will provide a greater opportunity for service to all patients.

Postgraduate or refresher course instruction is another very important area of instruction permitting dentists from this state and part of the country to devote one or more weeks in concentrated study and additional clinical work. Dentists who graduated five, ten, or more years ago find it desirable to pursue continued postgraduate work. Accordingly, this School of Dentistry has featured a number of short courses each year, and the demand continues to increase annually.



While the State Legislature provides a substantial budget annually for the operation of the School of Dentistry, the funds which have been made available through the Dental Foundation of North Carolina, Incorporated, permit an enrichment of the teaching and research programs which is meaningful and helpful to the students, faculty, and patients. The closed circuit television equipment is an excellent example, wherein the Dental Foundation has made possible a finer and more adequate teaching program. The University Administration as well as the faculty, therefore, are grateful for the loyalty and fine support which has been given to the School by the Alumni, the profession, and its friends throughout the state.

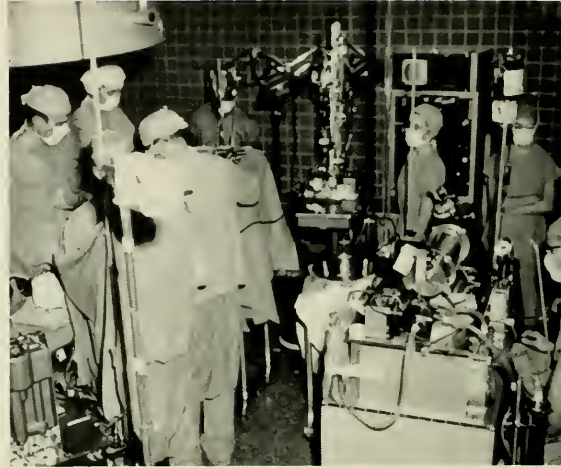


MEDICAL SCHOOL

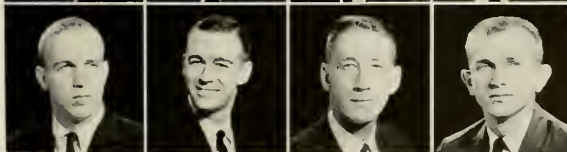

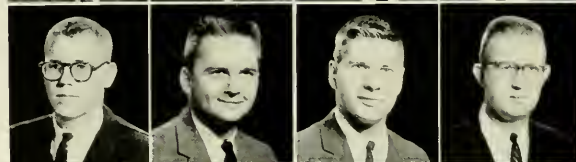

LAW SCHOOL

The Law School, which developed into the School of Law of the University, was founded in 1843 at Chapel Hill as a private school by William H. Battle, then a judge of the Superior Court, later a justice of the Supreme Court of the state. In 1845, Judge Battle was made Professor of Law in the University, and it was provided that the degree of Bachelor of Laws should be conferred on those completing the prescribed two-year course. From the records of the University, however, it seems that few degrees were actually conferred. For a long time the School maintained a certain independence of the University. The professor of law received no salary, though he enjoyed the fees from his classes. The students were not entirely subject to the discipline of the University.

This was the position of the School during the professorship of Judge Battle, who retired in 1879; during the two years when the law classes were conducted by Kemp P. Battle, then President of the University; and, to a considerable extent, during the professorship of John Manning, who was elected in 1881 and died in 1899. The building in which the School is now conducted was named for Professor Manning. In 1899, the School was completely incorporated into the University, with the late James C. MacRae, previously a justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina, as the first Dean. He was succeeded in 1910 by Dean Lucius P. McGehee, who served in that capacity until 1923.

With the construction of its new home in 1923, the law school entered its "modern" era. Serving successively as deans were: Merton Leroy Ferguson, 1924-26; Abner Leon Green, 1926-27; Charles T. McCormick, 1927-31; Maurice T. Van Hecke, 1931-41; Robert H. Wettach, 1941-49; and Henry P. Brandis, Jr., 1949 to date.

PUBLIC HEALTH SCHOOL

Every community has certain health matters that must be approached on the basis of public action. For example, how can an urban dweller provide himself with a pure and wholesome milk or water supply? How can the impoverished or even the average income family deal with a hopelessly crippled child, or with grievous mental illness?

This list could be increased a thousandfold — health problems that might conceivably be handled privately by very resourceful individuals but which are more likely to be dealt with on the basis of community action.

Of such, then, is public health — the art and the science of community diagnosis and treatment.

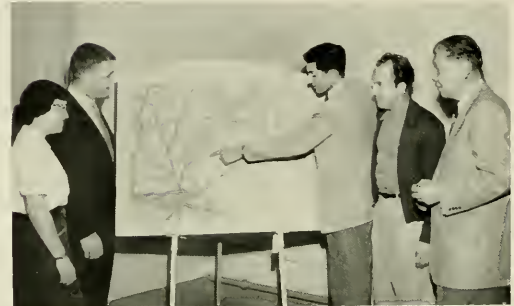
When such enterprise is based on community action, trained people are needed to do the job in the interest of efficiency and economy.

Coming within the realm of public affairs, public health will always be a controversial professional activity. For some a little is too much. For others there is never enough in the name of the common good. Thus the tides ebb and flow.

Be that as it may, what is done must be done well, hence North America's fourteen accredited Schools of Public Health. The University of North Carolina operates one of these. Public health leadership emanates from such schools and a sizable portion of operative personnel is trained therein.

Our School of Public Health partakes of State, National, and International flavor. A third of the students are Tarheels. There are always a dozen to a score of international students. The remainder come from the far corners of the nation with emphasis upon the Southeast.

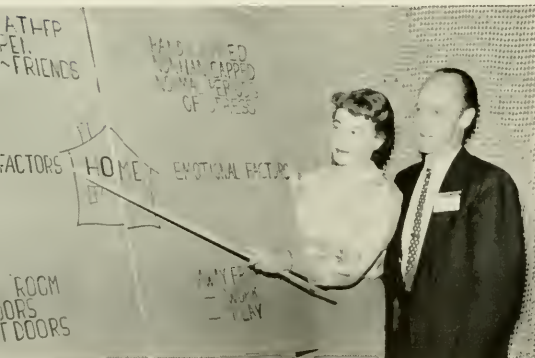
There are ten operating departments. Student body and faculty alike are of many disciplines. Administration, Biostatistics, Epidemiology, Health Education, Maternal and Child Health, Mental Health, Public Health Nursing, Parasitology, Nutrition and Sanitary Engineering comprise the building blocks.



The student body numbers usually from one hundred sixty to two hundred. Faculty is on the order of seventy-five, a fairly high ratio to students because of the very considerable amount of research that is undertaken.

There is a measure of undergraduate training. Masters candidates comprise the bulk of the student body. Fifteen or twenty are to be found usually in pursuit of doctoral degrees.

Handsome and commodious quarters are to be occupied in the fall of 1962. The new, long-sought and long-needed Public Health Building will be finished at that time.

FOOTBALL

The Tarheels in 1961 played both exciting and dull football; they upset some teams and they were upset: they showed running prowess and passing ability — in short the Heels were the same good, but not great, football team of old. No more exciting game was played in 1961 than at Kenan Stadium when Tennessee dropped a 22-21 thriller, but in Columbia both Carolina and South Carolina played one of the duller games of the year. Maryland found out the Tarheels could come up with a big win while Wake Forest showed that the men in blue could be upset by the conference's worst. So it went: losing some that should have been won, and winning some that were called upsets.

Head Coach Jim Hickey's team was led in the line by all ACC guard Jim LeCompte. LeCompte played well in all games and showed why he was a co-captain of the team. There were other good players on the team: Elliott, Farris, Craver, Carson, Davies, Green, and Runco. The two positions which seemed most abundant in talent were the ends with Lacey, Runco, Sloop and Yates; and the fullback slot where Bob Elliott and Joe Davies proved themselves the best in the conference.

The Heels made their bid for Carolina's first conference championship since the Justice Era but fell short — a field goal short — in Durham one November afternoon. With that loss went not only the conference crown but the Victory Bell and the desire to win the last two games of the season.

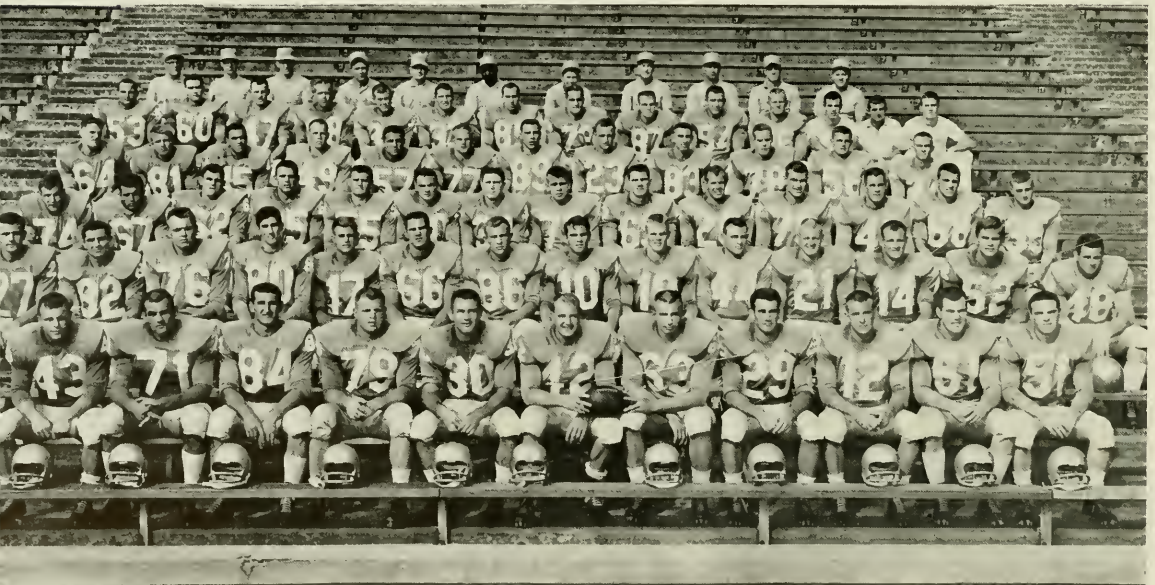
Perhaps if nothing else the 1961 season was a training session for next year's Carolina team. Certainly one has to

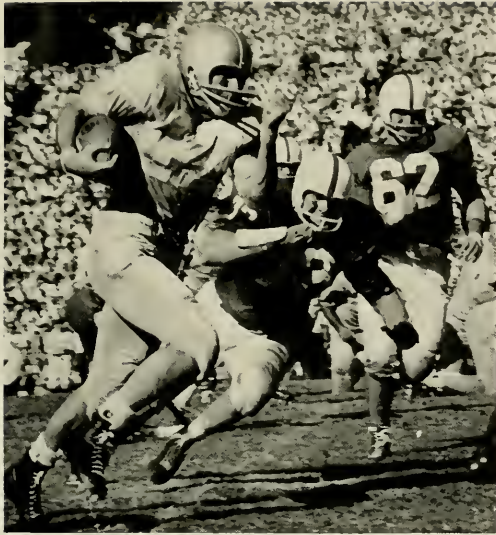


Head Coach Jim Hickey with Co-Captains Jim LeCompte and Bob Elliott.

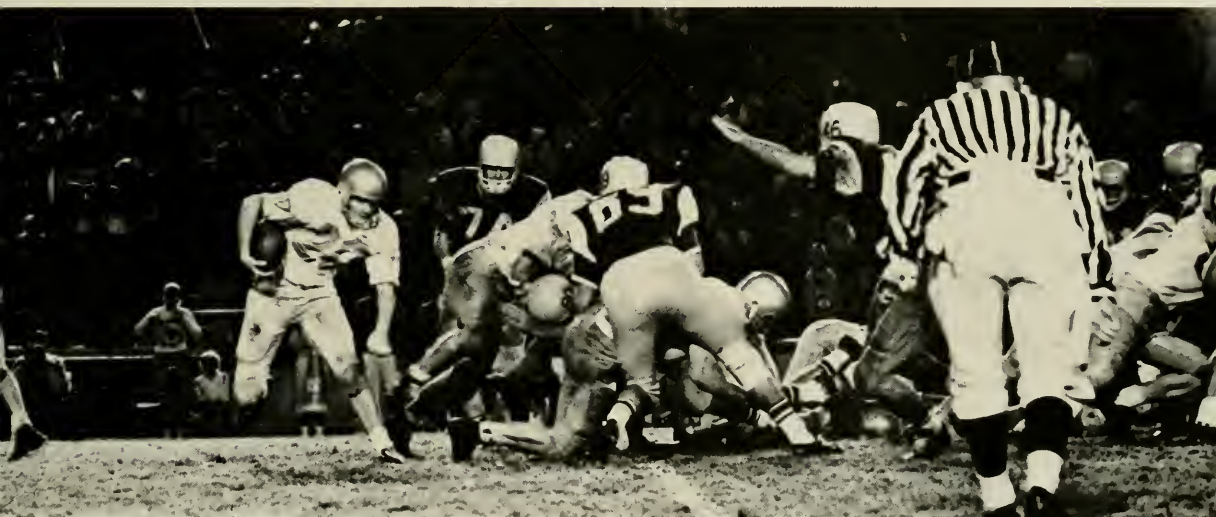

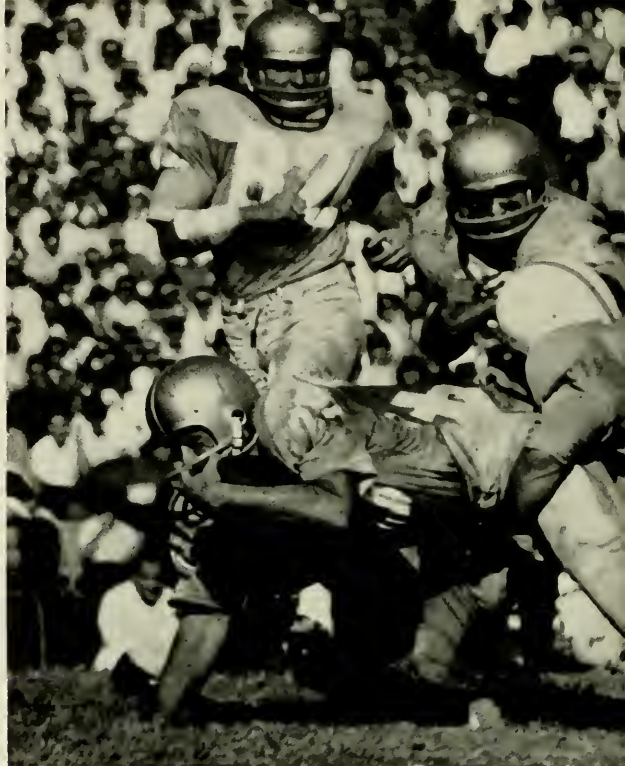

HA-HA! Not this year. Carolina played its best game of the season and on a desperate last-minute dive for glory, won over the Orange Ogres from Knoxville, 22-21. Despite Glass, Orr, and Faircloth, galloping Gib, and Big Bob (along with a hard charging line, sharp pass receivers, and a level headed quarterback), brought Bowden and his boys a loss they won't readily forget.

Carolina took command of the game and scored on a Farris sneak to go ahead 7-0. UT tied the score for the first time as the first quarter ended. 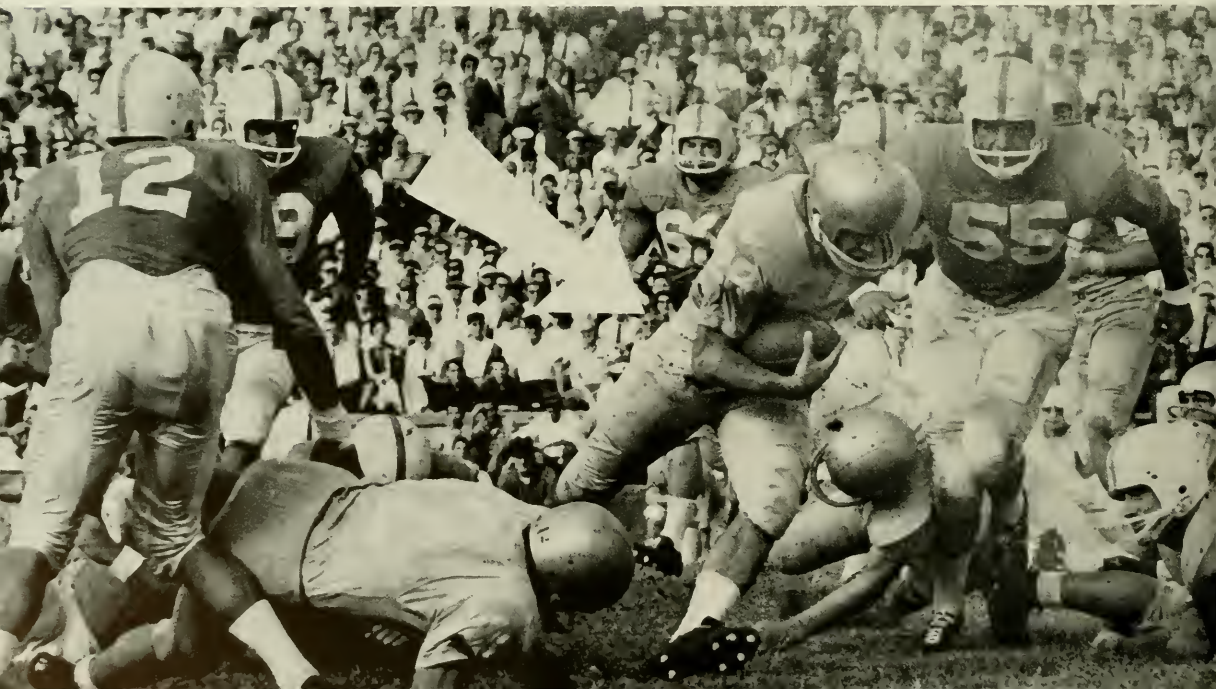

Homecoming was marred by a Southeastern Conference team that combined both speed and power into one of the top five teams in the nation. Louisiana State University came to Chapel Hill with three of the best teams seen here in many seasons. Paul Deitzel had eleven men on his first team that played offense and defense; he had twenty-two men on his second team — eleven played offense and eleven played strictly defense.

Carolina made some glaring mistakes in the first quarter that cost us thirteen points: LSU scored two long touchdowns with ease. From that time until the fourth period the Tarheels played a respectable game, giving up only a field goal in the second period to trail at the half 16-0. It was in the fourth period that the Tigers' overall depth began to show. LSU scored on two long drives while the undermanned Heels stood by and watched; they could forestall the inevitable only so long. The final score was 30-0.

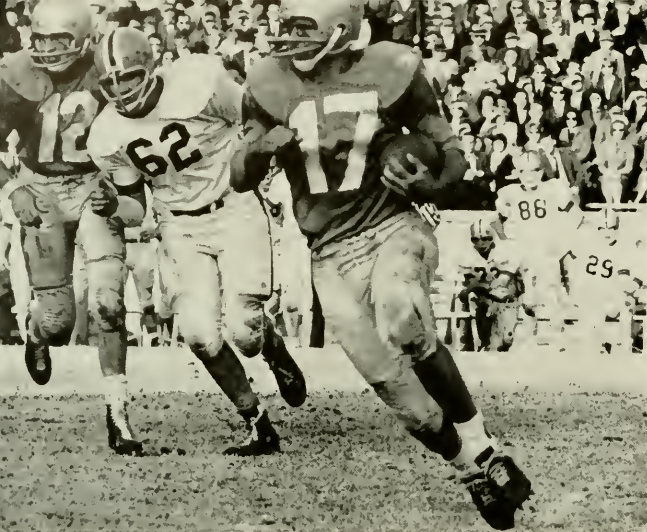

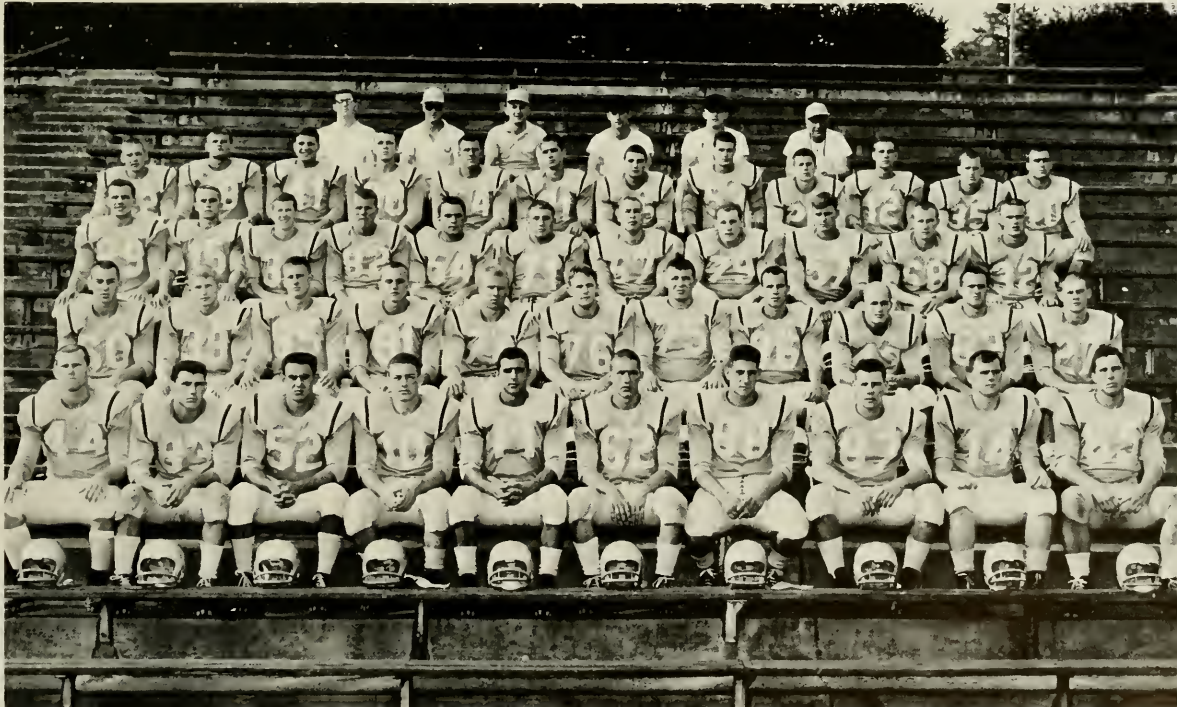

BASKETBALL

As the 1961-62 basketball season closed, Carolina became the second best de-emphasized ball team in the state. Our brothers on the "State Farm" were the best. Carolina's 7-7 ACC record was sufficient to tie us with South Carolina for fourth place in the Conference and State tied nationally ranked Duke for second place. The highly touted Deacons of Wake Forest did not live up to their pre-season expectations but in the wild ax-swinging that always accompanies an ACC race, they managed to profit from the rolling heads and cop first place in the regular season play.

Carolina was a relatively inexperienced team with a new head coach. The team was not talent-laden as in past years but had a solid core of returning lettermen. Even though greatly hampered by a limited schedule which prevented some members of the Tarheel squad from gaining valuable experience, Coach Smith still turned out a polished team upholding Carolina's tradition.

The high point of the season came as the Tarheels won their first game with State by a 10 point margin (66-56) and ran their season's record up to six wins and two defeats. Unfortunately, this was followed by four straight losses, one of which was to State. Carolina split games with South Carolina and Maryland and lost two games each to Duke and Wake Forest. Carolina played good ball against the Blue Devils and the Deacons but was outclassed both in skill and height.

The Carolina team posted two wins over both Virginia and Clemson while playing the same type of ball that lost to Duke and Wake Forest. This year proved a greater disparity of basketball strength among the "Big Four" than has been true in the past.

Although the Carolina team certainly needs no excuse for an 8-8 record, it is interesting to note that in the first eight games, Carolina had a 6-2 record and in the last nine, a 2-7 record. It is possible that our team did not continue to improve at the same rate as teams with a full schedule.

Larry Brown and Jim Hudock led Carolina statistics, tying each other for most total points scored in one game (26) and most free throws made in one game (12). Charlie Shaffer, who became a member of the starting team late in the season, made 10 field goals out of 12 attempts against Clemson for the best individual accuracy mark. Brown led the individual scoring averages with 16.4 per game which was greatly helped by his 26 points in two games and 12 free throws in three games. Hudock was second highest scorer (15.3 average) and Donnie Walsh, the third (13.6 average). Brown tied for fifth position on the star studded ACC first team and Hudock was picked for the ACC second team. Donohue, Cooke, and McSweeney all did a great deal toward making the ball club as good as it was.

The opening round of the ACC Tournament saw the Tarheels defeated 57-55 by South Carolina in a game that should have been a victory but was turned into defeat in the last few minutes of play. Thus ended Carolina's first losing season since 1955.

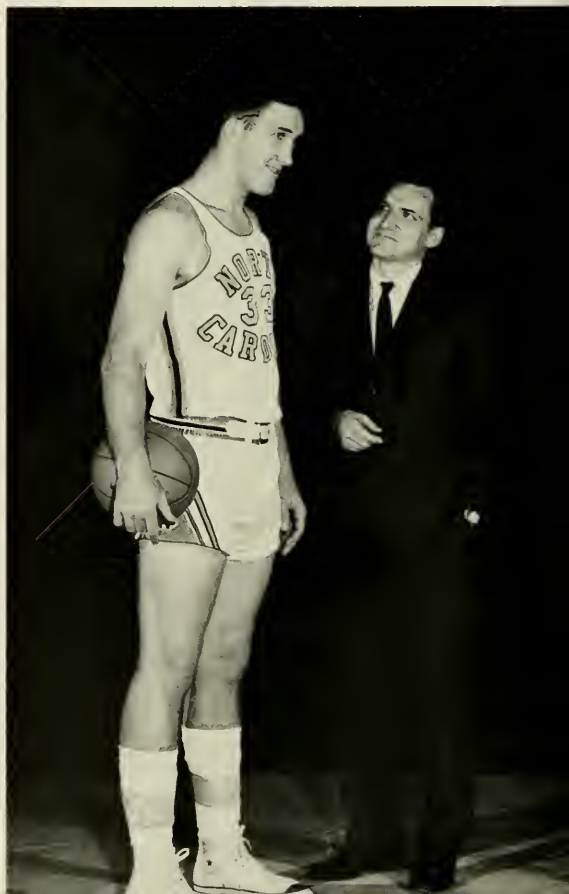

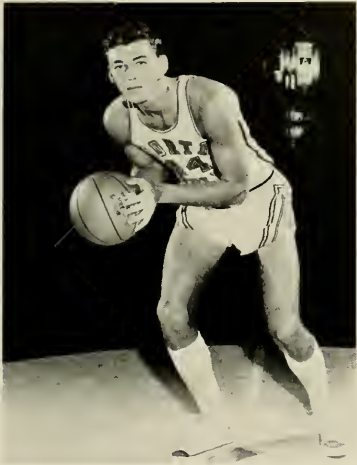

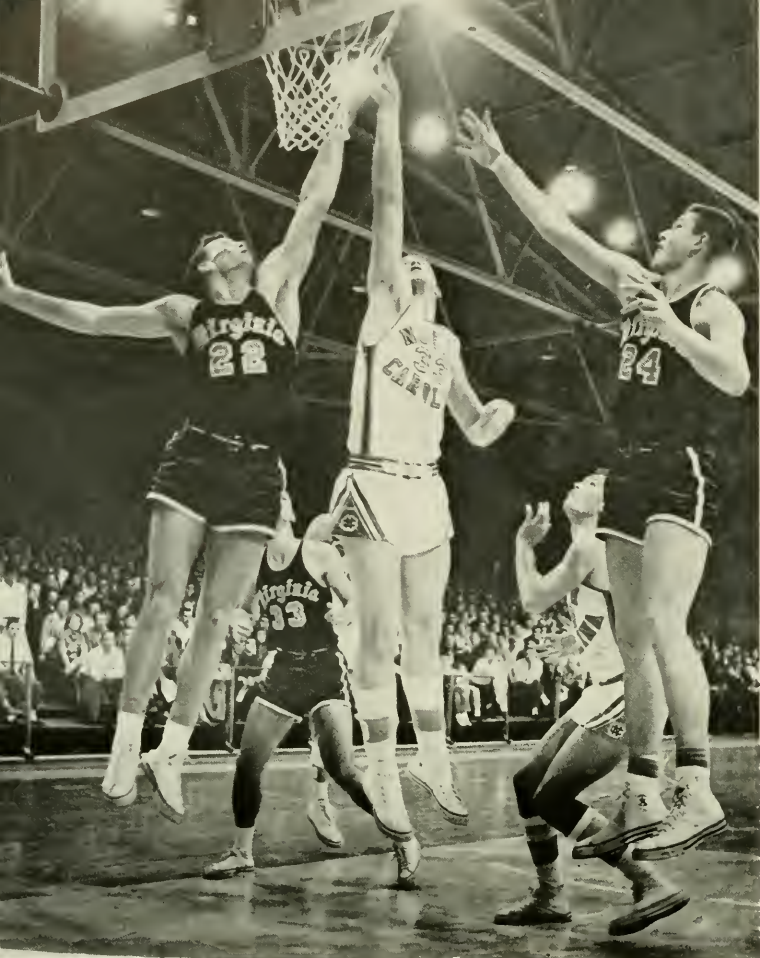

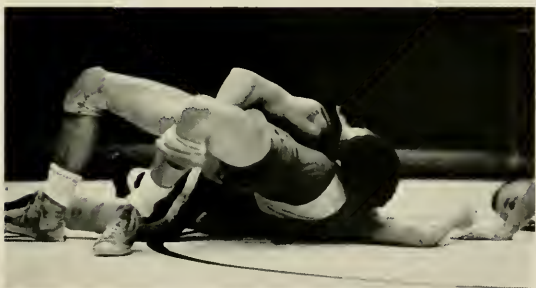

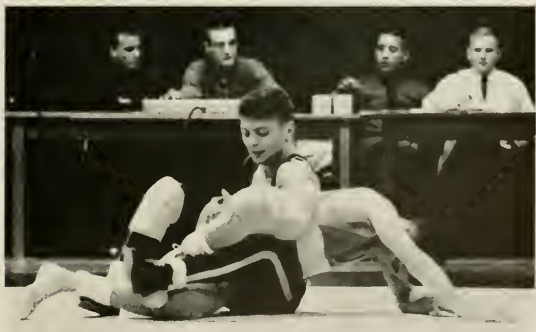

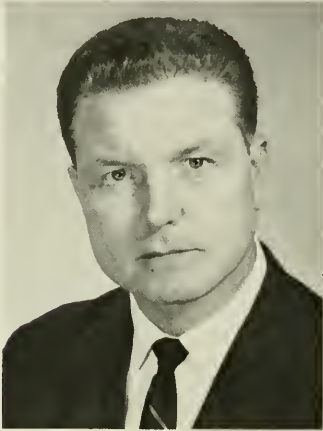

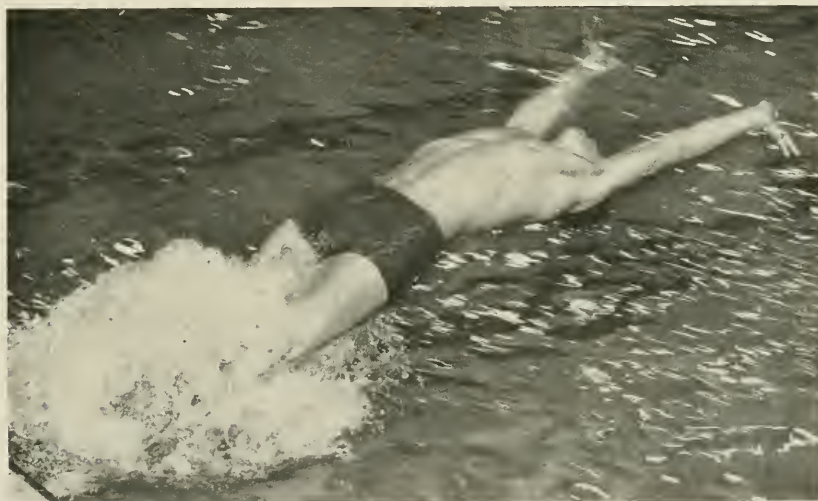

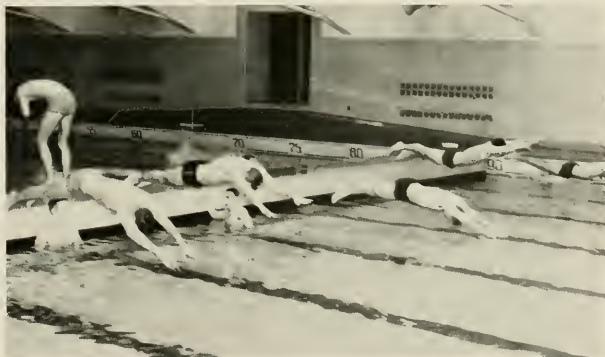

In keeping with the trend since Walter Rabb became head coach of Carolina's Baseball Team, the 1960-61 team had a very successful season. Falling slightly below their 1959-60 mark of ACC Champions, the Carolina "Nine" placed second in the ACC with a 10-4 record and a 15-6 record overall.

Able paced by the batting of All-American Jim Mooring and second baseman Paul Swing, Carolina was a hard hitting ball team, averaging 6.85 runs per game in 21 games of the 60-61 season. Nicky Warren, a pitcher now turned pro, had never pitched a losing game in college before 1960-61. Last year he accounted for 7 of Carolina's 15 wins by pitching a 7 won, none lost record.

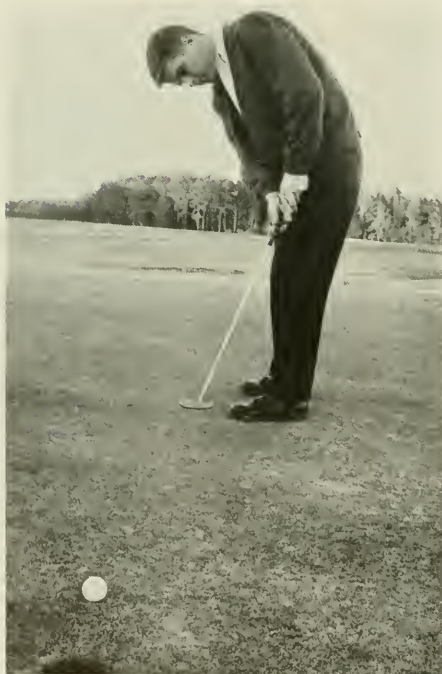

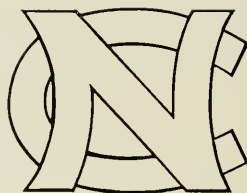

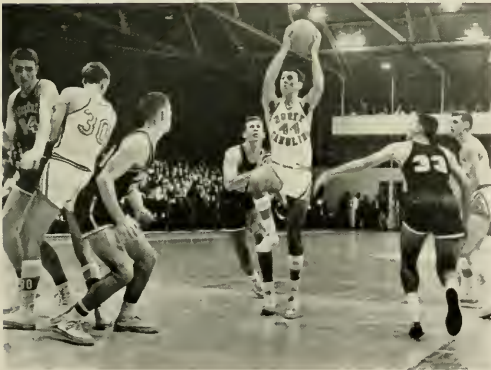

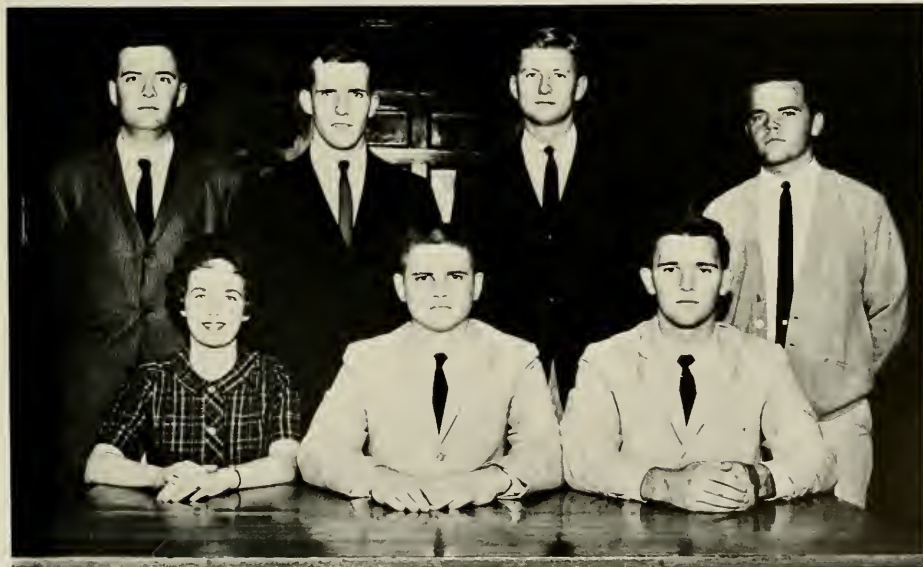

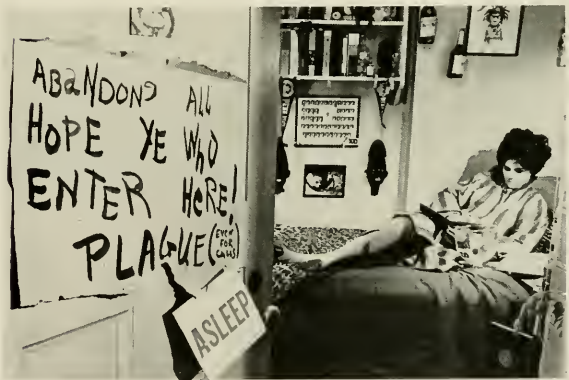

WUNC RADIO

WUNC Radio, the Voice of the University, returned to the air in December as one of the most powerful non-commercial, educational stations in the South.

Previously the FM station had operated at 15,500 watts and had covered an area within 35 miles of Chapel Hill. During the fall semester, the station's antenna and transmitter were moved to Terrell's Mountain in Chatham County, facilitating reception of the station up to 100 miles from Chapel Hill.

In its ninth year of service to the people of the community and the state, the station was manned by a staff of 60 Carolina students, and was managed by Reno Bailey. In the 1961-62 season, as in years past, WUNC continued to strive for unequalled excellence in programming and production.

The WUNC transmitter was further utilized by the North Carolina Memorial Hospital, which broadcast medical lectures, conferences and demonstrations to hospital personnel in a score of North Carolina cities.

In addition to the expanded public coverage, the station initiated a "carrier current" system, whereby students in dormitories on the campus could receive WUNC programming on their standard AM radios.



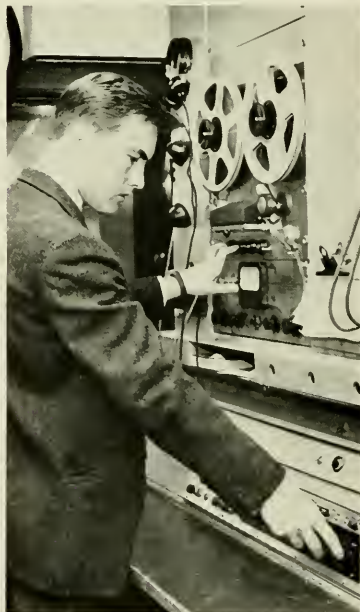

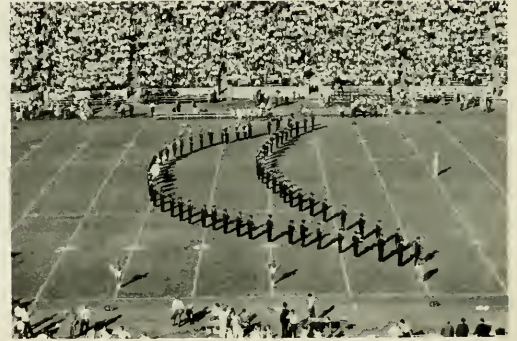
U.N.C. BANDS

UNC MEN'S GLEE CLUB

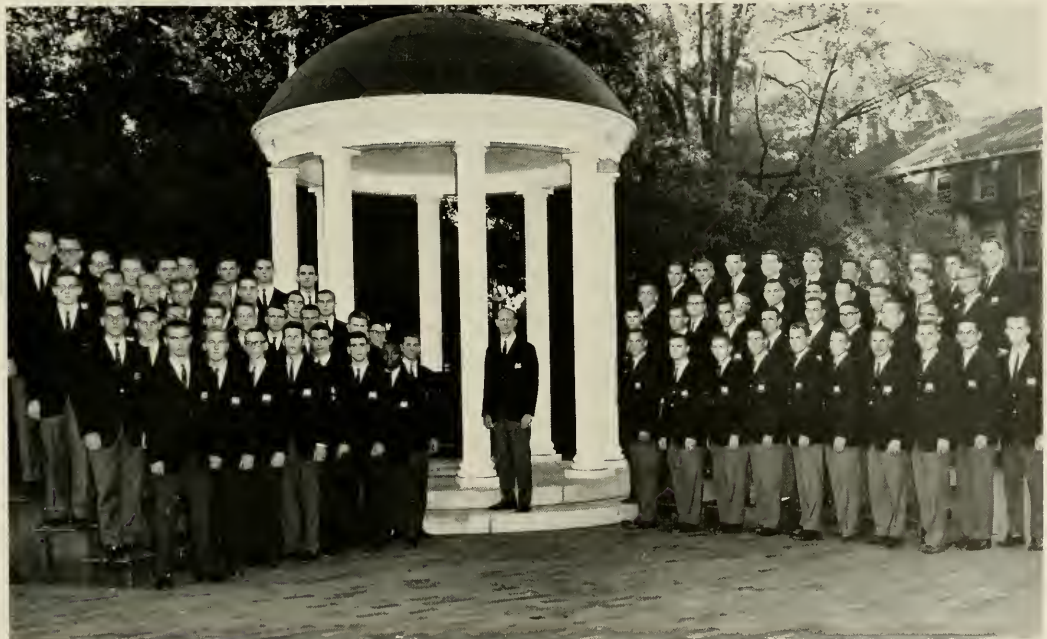

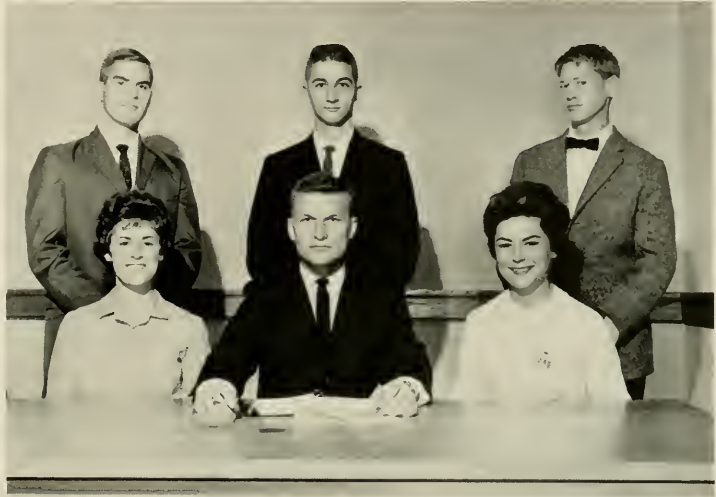

UNIVERSITY DAY

The legend goes that in the 1780's, William Davie sat under the "Davie Poplar" and decided that Chapel Hill, situated in the beautiful hilly region of the piedmont section, should be the site of a proposed state university. He had the job of finding a suitable location for a state supported school and decided that Chapel Hill was the best site. His judgment resulted in the founding of the University of North Carolina in 1793.



"What this country needs are those who look, as the motto of your State says, at things as they are and not as they seem to be."

On October 12, each year, the University celebrates its humble beginning with a commemorative ceremony. The day is devoted to reaffirming the University's purpose, to honoring the University's faculty, and to celebrating the date of the University's founding.

This year, 168 years later, the ceremony deviated from the traditional re-enactment of laying the cornerstone, in that the program centered around our nation's President, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, as the guest speaker.

President Kennedy arrived a few minutes before the ceremony was scheduled to begin. Under a boiling hot sun, the crowd of 32,000, made up of University students, school children, and interested spectators, gathered in Kenan Stadium. The people were anxious to hear the first speech to be given by the President south of the Mason-Dixon line since his inauguration in January, 1961.

Many politically interested spectators had gathered in the hope of hearing the President comment on current events or foreign policy, but they were not disappointed by his speech which centered appropriately on university education.

Kennedy's beginning reference to Harvard as a "small land grant school" was received humorously, but as his speech became more serious everyone listened in quiet attention. He challenged university students to use their "intellectual energy in the service of their country and in recognizing contributions educated men and women can make in the field of intellectual and political leadership." His speech ended with the pledge "We shall be neither Red nor dead, but alive and free."

The President of the United States has come and gone, and seldom has the University been host to so distinguished a guest.

Saturday afternoon was a different story. The weather was cool and crisp. So were Paul Dietzel's Bayou Bengals as they methodically crushed a good Carolina football aggregation. 30-0.

PERSONALITIES

e. e. cummings, one of America's most popular and controversial poets, appeared on campus in November, sponsored by the English Club. Among his better known works are included *eini*, depicting his trip through Russia, *the enormous room*, about his imprisonment, and "buffalo bill's defunct." Photographs of this gentleman are scarce — we understand he's camera shy.



Ferrante and Teicher hit the Carolina campus, setting fire to an ordinarily "I'm too cool to smile" audience. The students packed Memorial Hall via the windows, as well as the doors, leaving not even standing room only. Included in their piano selections were "Exodus" and "Theme from the Apartment," both million dollar sellers. Also during the program the students heard this twosome's own arrangements of pop classics and show tunes, and a special number on their custom made "Baby Grands."



During the Carolina Symposium, James J. Kilpatrick, associate editor of the Richmond newspaper, *The News Leader*, served on a panel concerned with problems of racial conflicts. He is considered a strong segregationist, his views having been reflected in two recent books, *The Sovereign States* and *The Lasting South*, both published in 1957. Mr. Kilpatrick is a past recipient of the Sigma Delta Chi honorary journalism award for distinguished editorial writing, and has served as chairman of the National Conference of Editorial Writers.



Gina Bachauer, Greek pianist, gave a concert here in December, displaying a spark of vitality and sheer verve that is peculiarly her own. Miss Bachauer "played with great brilliance, thundering tone, and a masterly command of the Brahms style."

Appearing at Carolina during the Fall Germans weekend, The Brothers Four, a popular singing group, captured the attention of the audience. These Four began their careers in San Francisco in October 1958 and have played for many college audiences throughout the country. To date, their most popular recordings have been "Greenfields" and "The Green Leaves of Summer."



Dr. Crane Brinton, renowned Harvard historian, opened the 1962 Carolina Symposium with an interesting and learned synopsis of world political revolutions. As well as being an excellent teacher, Dr. Brinton's accomplishments and honors range from special work with the Office of Strategic Services to membership in the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.



A North Carolina representative participating in this year's Symposium was John McNeill Smith, chairman of the North Carolina Civil Rights Commission. Mr. Smith graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1934 where he earned a Phi Beta Kappa key, served as editor of the *Daily Tar Heel*, and was tapped as a member of the Golden Fleece. Besides heading the state Civil Rights Commission, Mr. Smith has an outstanding law practice in Greensboro. He served as defense counsel on the famous Scales Case dealing with communism.

Senator Gale McGee of Wyoming spoke the second night of the Carolina Symposium on political revolutions of the contemporary world. After a distinguished career as an educator and lecturer, Senator McGee made his first venture into politics when he was elected to the United States Senate in 1958. For his concern and knowledge in foreign and domestic affairs, and for his vigorous attempts to put his ideas into legislation, McGee was chosen as one of his party's two most outstanding young senators.





Odetta, singing a group of folk songs while accompanying herself on the guitar, caused the audience to take notice of an exceptionally beautiful voice and a haunting style. Odetta's career, covering little more than six years, has won her great stature with her unique style.



Appearing at the Fall Germans Concert with the Brothers Four, Joe Bushkin and his Trio transformed Memorial Hall into a Newport Festival. This nationally renowned pianist and composer, has appeared with the Benny Goodman, Tommy Dorsey, and Bunny Berigan bands and composed the backgrounds and appeared in the Edmond O'Brien TV series "Johnny Midnight."

Dr. A. J. Ayer, Grate Professor of Philosophy of Mind and Logic at the University of London, visited the Carolina campus for the Philosophy Department Symposium. He is the leading exponent of logical positivism in Great Britain and his *Language, Truth and Logic* (1936) is regarded as a kind of textbook of this school. Few philosophical works of any age have been more widely discussed.



Dr. Claude Faucheux, assistant director of the Social Psychology Laboratory at the University of Paris (Sorbonne), spoke to all interested persons of the University on "Group Creativity." This outstanding social psychologist has written a great number of research articles and monographs. He finances his wing of the lab by money earned through consulting the French Government and private industries in Europe concerning consumer and marketing research.



The campus resounded with the music of the National Symphony Orchestra, which was founded in 1931, and has, under the leadership of Music Director, Howard Mitchell, taken its proud place among a handful of really great symphonic ensembles in the world. Since he was appointed conductor of the National Symphony in 1949, Mr. Mitchell has achieved the highest artistic and technical excellence for the Orchestra, and he won recognition and acclaim from critics and the public alike.



One of the events of Consolidated University Day in September was the unveiling of a portrait of O. Max Gardner, presented by his widow and painted by New York artist, Albert Murray. Mr. Gardner, a past Governor of North Carolina and Ambassador to the Court of St. James, was a foremost figure in the consolidation of the three institutions into a combined University of North Carolina. Speakers on this occasion included Dr. Frank P. Graham, Governor Terry Sanford, and Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges. Dr. Graham (to the right) is a member of the Atomic Energy Commission, a consultant for the U.N., and a past president of the University of North Carolina.



A rock and roll spectacular was presented for Winter Germans. One of the featured groups was the colorful Isley Brothers (pictured at the right) famous for their record, "Shout." Appearing on the same program were Ernie K-Doe, Lee Dorsey, and the Five Royales.



The venerable New England poet, Robert Frost, has been an annual visitor to the campus for many years. Memorial Hall has always been thronged with students during his poetry readings, and small seminars enjoyed his leadership in stimulating discussions.

The tribute to the Woman's College's poet-professor Randall Jarrell, the 1961 winner of the National Book award for Poetry, was the first such recognition given by the Consolidated University as a whole. The main address, "Poetry and Our Moment," was delivered by Robert Penn Warren, Pulitzer Prize winning novelist and poet. Although not pictured, President Friday spoke for the C.U., and Paul Green, author of "The Lost Colony," spoke for the North Carolina Writers.



Carlos Montoya, one of the world's greatest flamenco guitarists and the first to experiment with concert solos, demonstrated his talent to the UNC student in October. At the time, he was on a North American tour before returning to Europe and his native Spain.

Josh White, acclaimed by many as one of the world's greatest folk singers of this generation, appeared December 2 with his son in Memorial Hall. Josh White is known throughout the western world as a perceptive artist and a versatile craftsman who can "electrify a sophisticated audience while retaining the power and simplicity of traditional singing."



Nell Rankin, a veteran of the art and considered by most critics as the foremost mezzo soprano before the public today, performed in Memorial Hall as a G.M. production. Miss Rankin has appeared at the Metropolitan Opera, La Scala, Milan, Vienna State Opera, and the Opera International, Mexico City, to mention only a few, and her recordings are available through RCA Victor, Capital, and London.

The Four Aces, famous for their "Love Is A Many Splendored Thing," appeared here on their Southern Tour. Included on the program were Ricardi, an illusionist who has performed throughout Europe, and Alan Black, an outstanding and entertaining harmonica player.



Billy Graham, well-known evangelist, addressed the student body here in March. Mr. Graham, a resident of North Carolina, was sponsored by the Religious Emphasis Committee of the Y-M-Y-W-C-A. Last year Mr. Graham's activities included a speaking tour in England and an appearance at the North Carolina Council of Churches.

The Stray Greek Organization which was founded in 1944, is composed of sorority women whose chapter is not represented on this campus. Its aims are to preserve the bonds of unity and sisterhood in sorority life, to serve its members as a service and social organization, and to stimulate co-operation between sorority and dormitory women.

Each year the Stray Greeks take over the responsibility of the Panhellenic Post Office during sorority rush and its

members serve as advisors in the dormitories. Following rush, the Stray Greeks hold the Stray Greek-Panhellenic Pledge Picnic to honor the new pledge classes and an Officers Tea for the sorority officers.

The Stray Greeks also participate in service projects, social events, various campus activities, and Women's Athletic Association.

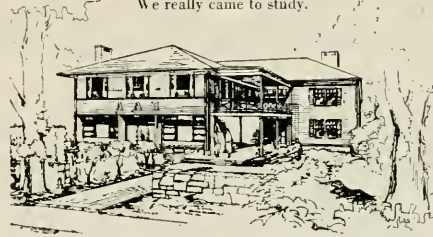

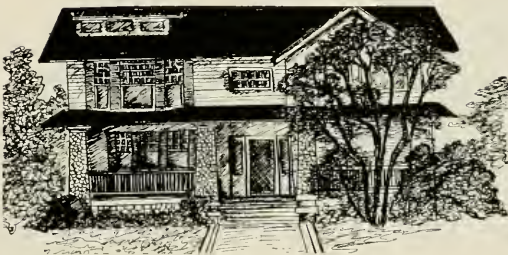

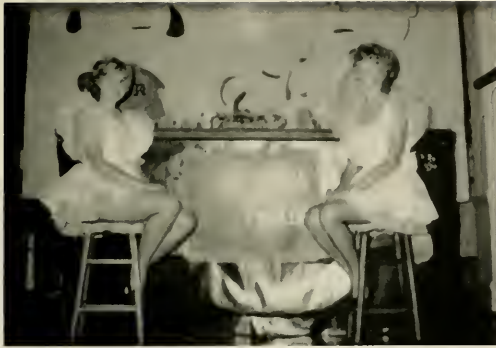

The Interfraternity Council of the University of North Carolina serves as the unifying and governing body of Carolina's twenty-four Greek letter societies. Its membership consists of the president and an elected representative from each Carolina chapter. The I.F.C.'s goal is to promote the lofty ideals of the fraternity system in general. There are various committees which work to attain these goals. Among them are the following: Rush, Greek Week, Scholarship, Rules, Special Projects, Publicity, and Handbook. These committees, as is the whole I.F.C., are guided by the Executive Committee which consists of the major officers.

Discipline among Carolina's fraternities is largely self-imposed and is supervised by the I.F.C. Court. This body consists of seven men — the President, Vice-President, and five other members elected by the I.F.C. The by-laws give this judicial arm almost unlimited power in its effort to maintain high standards of conduct among the fraternities.

This year, under the leadership of President Bill Sullivan, the I.F.C. has become what its members have been striving for over the years — a powerful representative voice for the fraternities. The I.F.C. year started with the Midpines Faculty — Fraternity Conference at Southern Pines at which the faculty and fraternities exchanged valuable ideas and opinions. This conference was the seed for several new I.F.C. policies which include a new scholarship rule and a program of deferred rush.

In addition, the I.F.C. gave, as it has since 1948, an Andrew Bershak Scholarship to an outstanding and needy North Carolina graduate. The scholarship is worth \$2,000.

Lastly, in its efforts to promote interest and enthusiasm in I.F.C. as well as scholarship and other worthwhile activities, the I.F.C. annually awards several trophies. These include the R. B. House Trophy for the best fraternity, the Scholarship Trophy for most improved scholarship, the Phi Delt Trophy for highest overall scholarship, and the Strum Trophy to the year's best pledge class.
