10's, altered from Farm. & Mech. Bk., Wisconsin. They have for a vignette, a female reclining on a stack of wheat, cattle in the distance.

20's, spurious, vignette, a female sitting at a spinning wheel; roll of right margin, and liberty and eagle on left.

50's, altered from Farmers' and Mechanics' Bank, Wisconsin. Observe the vignette, figure of Hope. On the right hand a wing and on the left a female figure, with one foot resting on a globe.

100's, altered from Farmers' & Mechanics' Bank, Wisconsin. Detected by observing that the spurious ones have on the right hand margin a circular head of Lafayette, and on the left the head of Washington.
