During a visit to Kagoshima City by an officer of this Mission, the Vice Governor of Kagoshima Prefecture expressed hope that in the peace treaty the territory formerly within this prefecture would be restored to Japan. He had reference to that portion of Kagoshima Prefecture which is below 30 degrees north latitude. He pointed out that economically, politically, and ethnologically it has been part of Japan proper for a long period of time. He mentioned that nearly all residents of the portion of Kagoshima north of the 30 degree line have relatives or friends in the area below this line and are deeply disturbed at this artificial barrier. While people can now write and telephone one another, they cannot easily travel or trade. The Vice Governor stated that the inhabitants of Kagoshima Prefecture have confidence that the United States will see to it that at the time of the peace treaty the whole of Kagoshima Prefecture is united.

The Vice Governor stated that information obtained from Amami-O-Shima, the major island below 30 degrees, indicates that support of the population is very costly to the United States whereas formerly there was a thriving trade between the islands south of the 30 degree line and the main portion of Kagoshima Prefecture north of the line.

The Acting Political Adviser has the honor to enclose a verbatim copy of a petition dated August 5, 1948 sent to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by the Patriotic Old Men's Association, Seoul, Korea, requesting that favorable consideration be given Korea's claim for the return of "Docksum" (said to be Takeshima or Liancourt Rocks), Ullungo Do (Utsuryo To), Tsushima, and "Parang" Islands. "Parang" Island cannot be identified by this Mission.

The petition attempts to trace Korea's historical interest in these islands and to illustrate how Japan has used the islands as stepping stones for aggression upon the continent of Asia. In this connection reference is made to the Mission's despatch no. 1296, September 23, 1947, transmitting Part IV of a study by the Japanese Foreign Office entitled "Minor Islands Adjacent to Japan Proper"; Part IV of this study discusses Japan's claim to Takeshima and to Utsuryo To.

Although nothing is known concerning the organization and purposes of the Patriotic Old Men's Association, it is believed that the enclosed petition may be indicative of Korean thinking in regard to the disposition of the islands in question.

SUBJECT: Request for Arrangement of Lands Between Korea and Japan

TO: Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Supreme Commander, SCAP

We, Korean people, are ever so interesting for your negotiation for peace to Japan, because Korea stands near by Japan and Korea was under the cruel compression of Japan for years and vast sacrifices were always paid to Japan. We expect you that so sharp and keen plans for establishment of oriental peace and order and are waiting for its announcement. Korea who has no actual voice in the conference should be well considered by your great plans.

Speaking oriental peace, Korean opinions which will play a great role in it, is absolutely necessary. Before some advices are submitted you in the course of negotiation of peace and establishment or oriental orders, we, Patriotic Oldmen's Association, are to submit a request on arrangement of lands, believing your kind consideration.

Importance of legal arrangement of lands in the international order, was shown in the corridor at the east Europe established in the Versailles construction.

Generally speaking, legal arrangemental standards stand on a passive side, e.g., restoration of lands taken away, and on the other active side, e.g., division of land for supporting development some nation and for the peace of the nation.

On the land matters between Korea and Japan, both active and passive sides are present and we hereby request as follows:

I. Returning back the island "Docksum."

It is not suspected at all but well understood that the island "Ulneungdo", and its attached are belonging to Korea historically and actually. Japan, however, planned to profit by fishing and foresting under the evacuating policy of Korea for internal security prohibiting people to enter the island. Armed robbery-fishers of West Coast of Japan dared to invade into the island and assert that the island was belonging to Japan and undisposed entanglement continued. But in accordance with the resolute negotiation on it, Japan acknowledged their fault and made a word to prohibit to fish there in 1693. Since 1881, seizing on the empty sea defense, Japan began to re-invade into it and difficulties between

both countries, Korea and Japan, became to arise, again. Under the negotiation in Tokyo on it by Korean plenipotentiary, Suh Sang Woo and his advisor G. von Mollendorf, Japan surrendered to Korea, and thereafter Korean Government managed in legally and absolutely, and no chance was given them to re-make such difficulties. On the other hand, due to the Russian Pacific Policy, international equality was made and finally Japan closed to invade somewhere.

Japan, however, never dismiss the fishing profit around the island "Ulneungdo", but planned to occupy a corner of it by some means and became to find out a small island called "Docksung" in Korean name, meaning a small pot-shaped island, near the Ulneungdo, where whales gathered. In 1904, Japanese fisher of Tottoriken named Nakai Yosaburo made a cruel programme to seize the Docksung and was practised to submit petitions or requests to the hydrographic department of Navy, Dep't of Home Affairs, Dep't of Foreign Affairs and Dep't of Agriculture and Commerce, etc. to register the island into Japanese territory.

At that time, considering the delicate international relations, Japanese officials hesitated to put into practice. Japan, however, guessed the Russian failure in the Russian-Japanese War, and Provincial Notice No. 40 of Tottoriken was issued officially as follows: "Islands located 85 miles far from Okishima are hereby called Takeshima and transferred to this province." Thus, these islands were occupied by Japanese Government. This was of so secrecy that not only Korean Government but also either nations could not know it. Furthermore, even if Korean Government turned his attention to it, no policy might be made for it. As above, Japanese wills were completely successful on it.

The so-called Takeshima is the very "Dockusum (sic) in Korean name," and this is namely, Liancourt Rocks on the world's chart. This name "Liancourt-Rocks" was established due to the name of the French whaler which found out the island. Thereafter, by the Russian Warship "Palleada" in 1854 and by the English warship "Hornet" in 1855, the said island was re-found and the ship's name was given to it. But it was never suspected that these variously named island was the very island "Ulneungdo."

In the 2nd edition of "the Korean Hydrographies" published by the Japanese Navy Hydrographic Department 1889, the Liancourt-Rocks and Ulneungdo are described as a same island. It is to be considerably said that a Japanese district office carried out such a plan imposing upon the world. As a matter of course, it is well understood that such an island occupied illegally by Japan should be returned to Korea.

II. Transferring the island "Tsushima" to Korea.

The island "Tsushima" located at the boundary between the Sea of Korea and the Sea of Japan is a strategic point on the transportation from Japan to the Continent. Its geographical importance is easily recognized by the defeat of Russia. We have to understand

that

that the Baltic Fleet could not escape from this point and it made Russia defeated in the final stage of the Russian-Japanese War.

Oriental-historically, the Tsushima was the Waiku's headquarters of aggression into the orient for 5 centuries since the 5th century, and Korean-historically, it was the den of the burglars who abused their power in the front of Korea for about 2,000 years.

Thus, Japan always marched out into Korea or the continent by using the island as a basal point or as a stepping point. In the world-map made by Lapo Homem, 1554 (an old oriental map) the "Ladrois" on the sea between China and Japan was undoubtedly the Tsushima and its character was already known among the Europeans.

Escaping from the attacking of the pirates based at the Tsushima, Korea had to pay them several million suks of rice, several million pieces of cloth and other means of livings annually, for 5 centuries. When we consider that black clouds covering the recent Korean history started from Japan and the ill air current was retained in this island, Korean people cannot pacify their nerves against the Tsushima.

In the local reconstruction after the great world war II, the Tsushima should be transferred to Korea as to

- 1) remove absolutely a standing menace to the livings of Korean people,
- 2) prohibit the Japanese aggressive emergence into the continent,
- 3) prevent the trampling upon the orient of the burglars.

We hereby indicate the appropriate basal conditions as follows:

a. Geographically: The localization of the Tsushima is rather nearer to Korea than to Japan, and it is not unnaturally thought that the Tsushima belongs to Korea if we decide its belonging freely, standing far from the political conditions.

b. Historically: The name "Tsushima" was originated from the Korean name "Toosum" meaning two islands (Tshushima is composed of two islands actually) and the grounding civilization of the Tsushima were almostly due to the Korean old civilization, as many scholars said, and it is well indicated that the recent civilization was made by the hand of the Japanese of Korean origin, according to various references.

First of all, when Korea subjugated the Tsushima 1396 and 1419, due to their bad faith, the Tsushima re-recognized the relation between both nations, namely, master and servant. And as most of the people in the Tsushima received official ranks and salaries from Korean Government, Korea thought the Tsushima a land belonging to Korean Government, and this fact was clearly described in the history and geography of Korea (Lee's Korea). It is explained that Tsushima belonged to Korea and then to Korea and Japan since Japanese pirates occupied the island. Such instances occupied by two nations, are

often

often found in the oriental history. For example, Ryukyu belonged to China and Japan, and Joshin belonged to Korea and China. And it is not denied that for some period, the Tsushima belonged to Korea and Japan doubtlessly.

c. Politically: Though the oriental peace will be completely made according to the equally developed political self-awakening of all oriental nations and quite enriched national conditions of them, the Japanese aggression should be by the root removed before to be so. For these purposes, firstly it is necessary not to let Japan have any bridge to the orient and the Tsushima is carefully considered for it. As long as Japan manages and governs the Tsushima freely and legally, Japan will have the chance and power to aggress into the orient. Of course, this reaggression of Japan is a great menace to Korea and the orient.

Considering frankly the uneasiness of the United States when Cuba and Haiti being a basal ground of pirates or aggressing powers, everyone can well understand the sharp mental process against the Tsushima.

d. Economically: The Tsushima has poor soil to agriculture that independent supporting was never obtained. And this resulted from that the island was under the supervision of Japan but satisfied with the mean position to Korea, and, they could not help falling to beggars as soon as they could not pirate ships. And those who were under such stages of beggaring, they used to get fishing profits in the Korean channel to continue their lives. In old ages, the way to submit the Tsushima was to open them three fishing bases on the south coast of Korea, too.

Thereafter, when the Meiji-restoration was established and international relation between Korea and Japan was interrupted, re-opening of diplomatic relation between both countries began with the fishing treaty. This fishing profit obtained in the Korean coast which center is the Korean channel, is necessary for only the island population but also indeed plays a great role in the financial problems of Japan.

It is doubtlessly expected that the fighting on their fishing centers for living between both countries will be severely. And so the reversion of the Tsushima where is the point of commanding sea is of importance meaning, and this economical base may be turned to the starting point to the political activity.

Without objection, the change of living means of Japan for their living and development will be indeed allowed, but it will be never permitted to rehabilitate standing on the base of our fear and sacrifices. We firmly carry our point that transferring the Tsushima to Korea will be the grounding stone for establishment of the new oriental orders. Some debater may say that Korea which is not a direct victor will not be able to request the division of land. In the period of Imperialism, many lands were taken away to compensate for one or two lives, and so, it will not much estimated to take back the Tsushima for our great sacrifice or loss for 2,000 years, though

all

all lands of Japan will be less enough to compensate them. It is better understood that a small island "Tsushima" will be a compensation for loss of people and substances of Korea. Establishment of Polish Corridor in the Versailles construction was for the new European order but for the Polish meritorious service, and the military service of Korea will be considered.

Potsdam announcement of 26th July 1945 said, "the sovereignty of Japan should only be on Honshu, Hokkaido, Kyushu, Shikoku and islands directed-----." It is to be interesting that the Ryukyu and the Tsushima were omitted from the item, and this point is the very base to request the problem. Sicily to Italy, Corsica to France and Tsushima to Korea! They are legal.

III. Making clear the belonging of Parang Island.

"Parang" is a series of islands which are on the sea, Long 125° E and 32°30' N.L. "Parang" is a Korean word and means "green island," and it has been a markpoint of course from Mokpo to Hangju of China. The localization of the islands is measured by 150 km. from Cheju of Korea, 450 km. from Nagasaki of Japan and 320 km. from Shanghai of China, and their belongings are by these distances well explained.

People say Japan asserted to occupy these islands after surrender to escape from the sea limitation. It will be a foolish plan to occupy islands which historically and geographically are not connected with them, and is an indication of their invasion.

Japan by this means got the Docksun, and Paracel Island on the South China Sea, and the occupying of Parang will be a re-attack of their cruel worn-out measure. If this planning above stated of Japan is true we cannot stand out of the problem. And the chance which will make clear the Parang's belonging comes now.

The above mentioned requests are to arrange lands between Korea and Japan to establish a new oriental orders. And this establishment will be not for temporary benefit but for permanent ground of world's peace. Judging with right and truth, both menacing and being menaced obtain a legal peace and guaranty.

Of course, we expect that the tradition of the United States, your sagacity and your deep plans will execute the mission of the period. You know our welcoming you is much passionate and deeper than welcoming Wilson at the peace conference in Paris. It is because of his being sagacity and sharp decision. We submit you this request to help your plans which might or may contain the policy to support the position of Korea.

We are and were sorry that the unfavorable negotiation for peace between Korea and Japan was made through the United States, but we never be to remember it and it was already gone out. We, now, know

You are kindly requested your sagacity be fully given for restoration of lands and establishment of oriental peace.

IMPRESSIONS OF HIROSHIMA

I spent three days in Hiroshima from March 30 to April 2, 1949 while on leave from the Office of the Political Adviser. Arrangements for my wife and me to visit Hiroshima were made by Mr. Takizo MATSUMOTO, People's Cooperative Party member of the House of Representatives of the Diet representing Hiroshima.

We arrived in Hiroshima at 3:30 in the afternoon of March 30, having left Tokyo the preceding evening, and took a brief ride about the city. I was immediately impressed by the extent of rebuilding. Most of the area about the station, itself a large building rebuilt since the war, was entirely occupied by small shops, houses, or corrugated iron shacks. Two days earlier a large fire had destroyed about 400 small buildings in front of the station and the razed area was in sharp contrast with the buildings around it. Although I had never been in Hiroshima before, I had expected evidence of war damage to be all-pervasive, and seeing that large parts of the downtown area have been completely built up came as a surprise. One building, the Trade Display Center, which was within a few yards of the bomb blast, has been left untouched as a symbol of the destruction caused by the atomic bomb, and the dilapidated condition of this large building, particularly its dome-shaped roof, stands out. Buildings of reinforced concrete construction appear generally to have withstood the blast, although their interiors were without exception severely damaged.

It was soon obvious, however, that most of the reconstruction was of an insubstantial wooden type characteristic of practically all building in Japan since the end of the war. This type of construction was all the more noticeable and depressing in Hiroshima because of its complete prevalence. Much of the city appeared as if it had been hastily built up in a very short time. Some of the streets downtown were very narrow and buildings were jammed next to each other, all evidently repeating the prewar pattern. In contrast were many open spaces, some consisting of only a single plot of land and others as much as a hundred yards square, which have not yet been rebuilt; some of the larger areas were being held open, we were told, as a result of city plans for schools and civic buildings. The rubble for the most part has been cleared away.

Hiroshima is built in the delta of the Ota River, which ramifies into seven branches as it empties into the Inland Sea. Surrounding the city on the other three sides are a series of hills. The delta is about thirteen square miles in area. It was this area which was devastated by the concussion, radiation, and fires caused by the atomic bomb. Buildings on the hills around the city, mostly residential, being located about two and one-half miles from the explosion, appear for the most part to have escaped serious damage, although many of them were shaken and in some areas fires were caused. We stayed in two houses located on hills overlooking the town and were told that they were severely shaken but not otherwise damaged.

The resort

The resort and shrine at Itsukushima about twenty miles from Hiroshima, famous as one of Japan's three beautiful sites, were of course undamaged and greatly relieve the somewhat oppressive atmosphere of Hiroshima.

Also located well apart from the center of the damage is the Toyo Kogyo Kabushiki Kaisha (Far East Industrial), which is the principal industrial concern in the city along with the shipping works formerly owned by the Mitsubishi interests. We spent four hours looking through the plant and talking to Mr. Jujiro MATSUDA, its president. The company is one of Japan's chief producers of sarrinsha, three-wheeled vehicles resembling motorcycles with a small carrying capacity; it produces about 500 of these vehicles every month and also manufactures drills used for mining coal. During the war the company made rifles in addition to its present products, and as a result a part of its machinery has been set aside to be used for reparations; this equipment remains in the factory but is not being used. The company makes all parts of its vehicles except the rubber accessories, and gives the impression of being extremely well-operated. Mr. Matsuda, a self-made man who received little schooling and built the company entirely by his own skill and effort, said that his main trouble is in getting raw material, and that his company, which now consists of about 2,500 employees as against a wartime peak of about 5,000, could greatly increase production if it had the material. Mr. Matsuda also expressed the hope that reparations policy for Japan would shortly be clarified and that if possible he could retain at least part of the machinery now set aside for reparations. I was unable to learn much about Mr. Matsuda's labor policy; I had heard that he had had labor troubles some time ago but he said rather cryptically that he was having no difficulty and that the labor union was a company organization. He pointed out that the company has a clinic, recreation rooms and grounds, dormitories and other facilities for workers, and I noted that the office and factory appeared to be clean and well-lighted. All in all, one could not help being impressed with this company as a model of medium-sized industry in Japan.

We also spent several hours visiting the buildings of the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission and talking to its director, Lieutenant Colonel Carl TESSMER. The Commission presently occupies a large building formerly used by the Japanese as a war memorial center and one small, temporary building. It is about to purchase or lease from the City of Hiroshima a piece of land in a desirable site to be used for building its permanent headquarters; Commission authorities apparently saw no difficulty in the way of acquiring this property. The Commission is already preparing to operate on a large scale; it has recruited almost its complete staff, and has what appears to be excellent, new laboratory equipment and a considerable number of station wagons, jeeps, and trucks. Colonel Tessmer was obliging in explaining the purposes and work of the Commission. The Commission is under the jurisdiction of the National Research Council of the United States Government, as a result of a contract between the latter and the Atomic Energy Commission. It is tentatively planning on a study of about twenty to thirty years' duration, and its operations are intended to be of a diagnostic rather than therapeutic nature. The Commission has at present a staff of about 250, of whom about fifty or sixty are American, British, and Australian; it maintains

a small

a small unit in Nagasaki and is establishing a control laboratory in Kure. Doctor Tessmer stated that they are receiving excellent cooperation from the City and people of Hiroshima, although they are having some trouble combating the mistaken impression that the Commission's activities are of a secret and military nature. In discussing the effects of the atomic bomb, Doctor Tessmer said that the Commission is really just beginning its work, but that to date there is no indication that the bomb created abnormal genetic effects. He cautioned that it was premature to draw any significant conclusions in regard to the long-term effect of the atomic bomb.

Japanese residents of Hiroshima were without exception willing to discuss the atomic bomb, although several said that it was no longer an ordinary topic of discussion among themselves. All who were in Hiroshima at the time could remember vividly where they were when the bomb burst at eight o'clock on the morning of August 6, 1945. Few of them were left untouched by the blast, radiation, or fire that followed. Almost every family lost several members. It was difficult to comprehend the fatalism of a man who lost his wife and four children and said he had closed off that part of his life. The Mayor of Hiroshima told us that although the official number of persons killed by the atomic bomb was given at 78,000, in fact this number did not include the figures for missing and for military personnel; this additional figure is estimated at such as to bring the total of killed to about 100,000.

We talked at length with two Catholic priests who had lived in Hiroshima for many years, one of whom was in the church rectory along with Father KLEINSORGE, whose experience was described in John HERSEY's Hiroshima -- at the time of the explosion. They have already commenced building on their former site and have plans for a large church to be started in the near future. The priests said that the number of their parishioners has increased somewhat over prewar figures but that there has been no great influx of converts to any of the Christian churches in Hiroshima.

We spent the evening before our departure talking with the Mayor of Hiroshima, Mr. Shinzo HAMAI, who told us of some of the difficulties the city is facing. Chief of these is the problem of financing reconstruction. Mr. Hamai said that the city has received liberal grants from the National Diet but that in view of recent budgetary restrictions these allotments are likely to be greatly reduced or eliminated. He pointed to the lack of an effective sewage system and of anything like a sufficient number of schools as primary handicaps, and said that careful city planning is in danger of defeat because of the city's inability to construct the buildings and roads it desires. As evidence in the city, which now houses with reasonable adequacy about 240,000 people; Hiroshima's wartime population was 450,000. The supply of food, water, and electricity is good; transportation, including that provided by busses and streetcars, is adequate. He said that Hiroshima's principal prewar industries, in addition to the shipbuilding and vehicle production noted above, were needle manufacture and fisheries products, particularly oysters; the fisheries industry is again in good shape, but the needle industry suffers from lack of materials.

Mayor Hamai stated that he had always found United States military government officials, whose regional headquarters is in Kure, to be helpful; he said that he had found Lieutenant General H. C. H. ROBERTSON, commander of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force, which is responsible for the military occupation of Hiroshima Prefecture, sympathetic and cooperative (in spite of certain public pronouncements), and that General Robertson had secured the release to the city of some valuable surplus property. In this connection I had noted considerable grumbling by some of the people of Hiroshima toward British and Australian forces, mostly because they were stiff and unobliging, particularly as contrasted with American troops and officials; there is a saying in Hiroshima that the United States cannot like the people of Hiroshima much because first it gave them the atomic bomb and then it gave them BCOF (British Commonwealth Occupation Force).

I asked the Mayor about the general progress of Occupation reforms in the Hiroshima area and he said they are being well received and progressing favorably. He stated that the Communist Party in Hiroshima has little strength. He appeared to feel that the good job being done in rebuilding the city, together with the desire of many civic leaders to make Hiroshima a symbol of peace, had gone far toward creating favorable political conditions.

The Department of Commerce has referred a similar letter which you addressed to it to the Department of State for reply.

The Department of State cannot give an authoritative construction of the term "territory of Japan" as used in a contract between private parties. The following information may, however, be of assistance to you.

The Ryukyu Islands, including Okinawa, were recognized by the Government of the United States as Japanese territory before the war with Japan, and are presently under United States military government. There has been no treaty with Japan or other international agreement transferring them to the sovereignty of the United States or any other country. However, the Potsdam Proclamation of July 25, 1945 defining the terms for Japanese surrender, by the President of the United States, the President of the National Government of the Republic of China, and the Prime Minister of Great Britain, contained the following provision: "The terms of the Cairo Declaration shall be carried out and Japanese sovereignty shall be limited to the islands of Honshu, Hokkaido, Kyushu, Shikoku and such minor islands as we determine." This Proclamation was later subscribed to by the Government of the Soviet Union. By the Instrument of Surrender executed on September 2, 1945, the Japanese Government formally accepted the provisions of the Potsdam Declaration.


