Lieut. (jg) H. PETERSEN in a PB4Y-1P aircraft of Fleet Air Photographic Squadron One took off from Agana Airfield, Guam, M. I. on 25 July 1945 at 0740 King to photograph enemy installations on Truk Islands. He arrived over his target at 1130 King and secured good vertical photographs of Moen and Param airfields from 18,000 feet and oblique photographs of Eton airfield and Dublon seaplane base from 16,000 feet. No enemy interception or antiaircraft fire was encountered. Lieut. (jg) PETERSEN returned to Agana at 1455 King.
