### MONEY MARKET.

Whether the Subtreasury is or is not a safe and convenient institution for the government, or whether it is or is not calculated at all times to act as a wholesome restraint upon the zeal and enterprise of the country, it is not our purpose to inquire. Certain it is, that to its present operation, all agree, is to be attributed the continuance of the existing distrust and pressure. The recuperative energies of the business community of this country have hitherto been able to withstand a period of "hard times," and come out with a renewed energy, after perhaps greater real losses than they have now sustained; but, while now, as a whole, the position of mercantile houses seems secure, and they feel confidence in each others' ability, trade and commerce are dull, the disposition to embark anew and take advantage of the times, is crushed; everybody seems paralyzed; self-preservation is the order of the day. Banks and merchants look out for themselves; neither cares for the other; both are independent in themselves and of each other; the former feel under no obligation to discount for the latter, because they are regular merchants, and their customers; and the latter place no reliance on them because they are banks and they their regular customers. Such appears to be the state of things. A feeling of distrust is plainly enough prevalent among the banks, and they are kept in a constant uneasy excitement by the steady drain upon their specie for the requirements of the Subtreasury.

The currency is gradually contracting notwithstanding great efforts to keep out circulation. Until the basis for circulation is enlarged, this must continue to be the case; the sure basis of bank circulation is specie, of which there is much less in the vaults of the banks than prudence requires.

The relief then is from the subtreasury, which holds the specie tied up; the withdrawal of which from the banks causes the contraction; or an importation from abroad, which cannot be brought about with the existing opportunities offered to foreigners to pay us in goods rather than specie.

In this connection it is not our intention to argue for or against one political party or another (all this suffering may be for the best), but we mean merely to state what we believe to be a sufficient cause for a very palpable effect, and upon a subject which all will admit is getting to be rather serious.

In New York, money matters are quoted easier; but beyond occasional fluctuations from day to day, as the demand is more or less stringent, we do not note any change for the better. There has all along been a scarcity of strictly legitimate business paper, and there is but little offering now. The operations of trade have been so much curtailed that there is comparatively but little regular paper making, and what there is of a strictly prime character, the banks will discount for their customers, with the usual exchange, but for the greatest proportion of accommodation which people in trade require, they are obliged to submit to extra rates in the street, or, by operating with banks where they have no regular account, pay indirectly the same high rate, by taking for the proceeds of their discounts, checks payable at the south and west; another source of giving the banks a shave is to pay interest on an amount of paper of which they are not allowed to draw the whole of the proceeds.

The current rates for money are from twelve to fifteen per cent. on the very best four to six months paper, and fifteen to eighteen, with brokerage, on the common description of satisfactory business notes. Much higher rates are constantly submitted to on short loans, and on accommodation paper, upon irregular collaterals. The most favorable feature in the money market is the low ruling of exchange on England. The abundance of the supply of sterling exchange does away the apprehension of an export of specie, and from the late accounts from Europe, it is not unlikely that an export of grain may take place, which would certainly result in a considerable import of specie from abroad.

Domestic exchanges rule lower than the value of money would seem to indicate. This may be accounted for by the convenient opportunities they offer to banks dealing in them to get over six per cent. for their money, by discounting out their checks on the south and west at par.

**NEW COUNTERFEITS.**

100's, on Western Bank, Philadelphia, Penn., vignet on right upper end, two females, one pointing to a train of cars passing over a bridge, beneath which is a canal boat, on right margin, medallion head of a Roman; on left hand, of Washington.

100's, on Exchange Bank of Virginia, Norfolk, Va. letter A, paper whiter than the genuine, purports to be engraved by Rawdon, Wright & Hatch, New York.

10's, altered from 2's, on Exchange Bank, Salem, are in circulation. The letters "wo" are covered by the letters "en;" the ends of the genuine bills are cut off, and the ends of bills of another bank pasted on.

**THE BANK OF VIRGINIA**

Was chartered and established in 1844, with a capital of 1,500,000 dollars, which was afterwards increased to 2,500,000 dollars. The state was a large stockholder, with the understanding that the Bank should lend the State an amount of money, equal to its stock, at 4 per cent. interest. Its notes were receivable for public dues.

The management of the institution has always been the subject of more or less local complaint. They have been accused of great partiality, &c. Since the last general suspension the Virginia Banks have evaded specie payments, by issuing only the bills of distant banks within the State, which could not be converted into coin, except at the particular bank which issued them. Thus exchange on Virginia has constantly ruled higher than at almost any other point in the country. All checks drawn on, or certificates issued by, the Virginia banks, have on their face, "PAYABLE IN CURRENT BANK NOTES." This, of course, has prevented any equalization of exchange by remittances of specie. The premium for exchange on the north and east has been therefore arbitrarily controlled by the Virginia banks themselves.

**UNITED STATES STOCKS**

AND TREASURY NOTES ARE NOT LIABLE TO TAXATION. It has been formally decided by the Supreme Court of the United States, that United States Stocks are exempt from taxation. The conclusion was that "all subjects over which the power of the State extends, are objects of taxation; but those over which it does not extend, are, upon the soundest principles, exempt from taxation."

The sovereignty of the State extends to every thing which exists by its own authority, or is introduced by its permission; but not to those which are employed by Congress to carry into effect powers conferred on that body by the people of the United States.

"The States have no power, by taxation or otherwise, to retard, impede, burthen, or in any manner control the operation of the constitutional laws enacted by Congress to carry into execution the power vested in the general government."

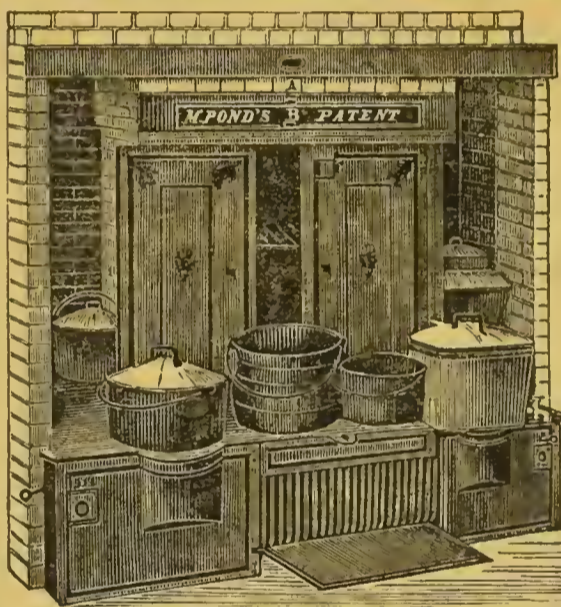

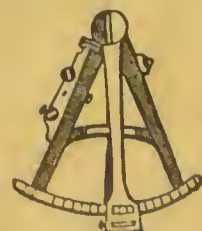

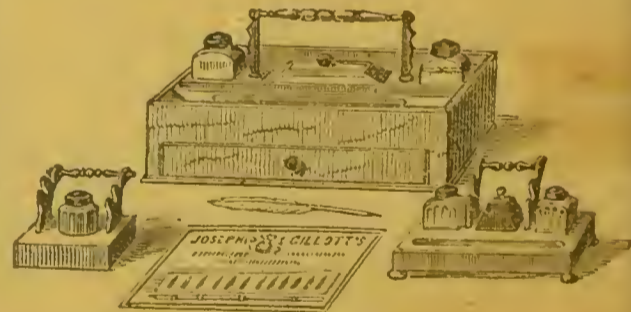
