PART II  
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November the Battalion remained in General Support of the 1st Marine Division. Operation Pipestone Canyon, a long-term operation for which units of the Battalion periodically provided artillery support, was terminated on 7 November 1969.

The Battalion retained operational and administrative control of Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines, throughout the month. Battery K's mission remained Reinforcing, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines.

Battery M continued its mission of General Support, Reinforcing 2th Battalion, 11th Marines. Additionally, the Battery continued to answer calls for fire directly from Reconnaissance Inserts operating in the southern portion of the Division TAOR.

Batteries K and L continued their missions of General Support. Due to the low level of enemy activity, the majority of their firing during the month was directed towards Intelligence and Pre-emptive targets located in the northern and center portions of the Division TAOR.

During the month of November, units of the Battalion fired a total of 1877 missions, expending 25,979 rounds in support of the following units:

g. Intelligence.

(1) During the month of November 1969 the S-2 made eight liaison trips to the Regimental S-2 and five to Division G-2. Also three liaison trips were made to 1st Tank Battalion and 3rd MP Battalion.

(2) There were numerous trips made to OP's HAWK and TIGER while only one trip was made to OP's CROWSNEST, "B" TOWER, LAUGH and LOU for the purpose of inspection and instruction.

(3) On 22 November the S-2 presented one class to Battery M's Crater Analysis Team.

(4) During November there were 250 piastres expended on the Volunteer Information Program for the purchase of one M-79 round.

h. Organization and Operations.

(1) The Battalion remained in General Support of the 1st Marine Division, delivering supporting fires throughout the TAOR. The Battalion supported Operation Pipestone Canyon from 1 to 7 Nov 1969.

(2) Organization for Combat at the end of the reporting period.

Battery K - General Support  
 Battery L - General Support  
 Battery M - General Support, Reinforcing 2/11  
 Battery K, 4/13 - Reinforcing 3/11

(3) A patrol from Headquarters Battery, sweeping the area around the Battalion CP, located and destroyed a partially completed rocket site and one improved cave.

(4) As a result of information from several interrogation reports and indications of recent increased enemy activity in the vicinity of the Battalion CP, considerable work was done on improving local defensive positions.

(5) On 12 November, 1st Marine Division personnel conducted an Operation Technical Inspection of this Battalion. At the completion of the inspection, which covered the areas of operations, reports, records, plans, training and NBC, the Battalion was judged to be in excellent state of readiness.



i. Training.

(1) Normal GMS and MOS training was conducted as operational commitments allowed.

(2) An excellent class on Drug Abuse was presented to Headquarters Battery personnel by a III MAF Training Team. This instruction will be presented to other units of the Battalion in the near future.

(3) Two, 1 week, FADAC Operators schools were conducted by personnel of the Operations Section to train new operators of the 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery and Headquarters Battery of this Battalion. Ten new operators were trained.

j. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During this period the deadline rate for M109 Howitzers remained at a low level due to the outstanding performance of maintenance crews. At the end of the month no M109 Howitzers were deadlined.

(2) Eight motor transport vehicles are presently deadlined for a rate of 8%. Of these eight, three are deadlined at 3rd echelon facilities.

(3) Requisitions submitted since this Battalion has been in the Republic of Vietnam total 46,001. Of this number 29,931 have been filled.
