MEMORANDUM

Subject: General NARA

1. Mr. Liu, Room 328-B, War Ministry Building, states that Colonel Tung and Captain Chang, Chinese Division, Legal Section, GHQ, SCAP, Room 735 Meiji Building, have been consulted on this case.
2. Colonel Tung says that he would like to have written depositions in order that he could see whether direct conversation on the case would be desirable. He says that it is not necessary to obtain counsel, but that friends and relations of General Nara may provide the depositions.
3. The depositions may follow the lines suggested to the writer by friends of General Nara, namely, the facts in regard to the names and whereabouts of subordinates directly responsible for any atrocities in 1938-1939 in Hupeh Province, China. The depositions may deal also with the character of General Nara and with the names or statements of Chinese who considered the General's conduct to be satisfactory or commendable.
