PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. TOPICS.a. Personnel and Administration.

(1) Administration. No significant changes.

(2) Personnel. During this reporting period operations consisted of processing and assignment of 301 replacements, 507 Rest & Recuperation quotas being allocated and filled, administration of 157 rotatees, processing of 58 recommendations for personal awards, and the processing of 13 meritorious combat promotion requests.

(3) Casualties Sustained.

(a) There were 136 combat casualties during the month of which 13 were KIA and 123 WIA.

(b) There were 39 non-battle injuries.

b. Enemy, Weather and Terrain.

(1) Significant Reports.

(a) During the month of May, low level agent reports were received indicating considerable VC movement of a battalion and company size units in the southern and south eastern portion of the SOR.

(b) The 3rd NVA Regiment minus the 2nd Battalion continues to operate within QUANG NAM Province. Several agent reports have indicated that the VC are using VN workers to carry rockets from the mountains, specifically in the northern portion of the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines SOR. Generally there have been no significant changes in the surrounding area of the DA NANG SOR, with no new units being introduced.

(c) An interrogation of a detainee captured on 26 May by Co C 1/7 produced the following information: There are presently 200 VC operating in the area roughly equivalent to the SOR of Co C 1/7; this force includes 100 NVA and 100 GUERRILLAS. The detainee reported that the force moved to vicinity AT 9052, and could probably be elements of the R.20th Battalion and V.25th Battalion. He reported their weapons include, 6x60mm mortars, 6xB-40 type rocket launchers, 8xheavy machine guns and individual weapons. This force is also supposedly accompanied by both male and female laborers. Several reports were received indicating

that the VC are utilizing groups of young VN as agents, Also recent reports disclosed female guerrilla units are being formed.

(d) In the 7th Marines SOR there have been no significant changes; generally, all the locally accepted units are operating in their normal areas of operations.

(2) Operations.

(a) There were two USMC Operations during the month of May. Operation WEBSTER was initiated and conducted by the 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines during the period 16-18 May in DAI LOC District, QUANG NAM Province. Enemy contact was very light with a few mine and booby trap incidents. Operation WEBSTER inflicted a total of 2 VC KIA confirmed, 2 VC KIA probable and 2 VN were detained as suspects.

(b) Operation DUVAL was initiated and conducted by the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines during the period 19-25 MAY in HOA VANG and HIEU DUC Districts. During this operation there was negative enemy contact. All USMC casualties were non-battle.

(3) VC Activity.

(a) VC activity within the TAOR during May was light with a total of 173 VC initiated incidents of which 94 were mine/booby trap incidents. There were four significant events within the TAOR during the month of May.

(b) On 13 May, the VC initiated an attack on CAC B2-2 (3/7) located vicinity AT 865574. The attacking force was estimated to be 100 VC who were well armed, well equipped, wore helmets and conducted a highly coordinated attack with the use of supporting arms. Penetrations were made in the NW and NE sector of the perimeter by cutting the wire and propping up the strands with sticks so they could crawl under it. The entire area was hit with mortar fire and possible 57mm recoilless rifle fire. CHI COM grenades were thrown and 1 satchel charge was used against the command bunker. The VC fired small arms and automatic weapons into the living quarters but no one was in the living quarters at the time. A reaction force was committed with tanks and continuous illumination was fired. The assault lasted approximately 8-10 minutes. The area was searched and many blood trails were found. In addition, 23 grenades were found throughout the position. VC casualties were 20 KIA probable. Friendly casualties included 2 USMC KIA, 4 USMC WIA (Evac), 4 PF's KIA and 2 PF's WIA (Evac).

(c) On 15 May, H Battery 3/11 AT 921795 received approximately 9 rounds of suspected rocket fire. Co G 2/7 reported muzzle flashes at vicinity AT 8686 and also heard the suspected rockets passing overhead and saw the impact in the 3/11 C.P. Counter battery fire was fired at the suspected positions. Friendly casualties was 1 USMC WIA (Evac).

On 16-17 May, G, 2/7 AT 858854 located 47 rocket positions, 31 rocket tubes and 15x140mm rockets.

(d) On 31 May, K, 3/7 local PF's reported to CAC 3-1 at AT 944692 that 1 VC platoon had entered a refugee hamlet several hundred meters from CAC B 3-1, telling the refugees to leave. The terrorists shot a woman and her child. The VC fled before local PF's in refugee hamlet could react. At 311030H: local villagers pointed out to CAC B 3-1 two 140mm rockets left by the VC in the hamlet. Both rockets were lying on the ground about 100 meters apart. Both of the rockets were muddy and rusty indicating that the rockets were previously buried. In addition to the rockets 1 7.62 type 50 cartridge, 2 expended M-1 cartridges and 1 expended M-14 cartridge were found. A further search of the hamlet revealed 4 fighting holes that were facing north. HIEU DUC DIOCC reported that the VC were attempting to clear the VN from the hamlet and then intended to destroy the hamlet by detonating the rockets.

(4) Regimental Intelligence Section Activities. Normal administrative and Combat Intelligence functions were carried out during the month of May.

(5) Weather. Ground operations were not affected by the weather conditions. The number of days with measurable precipitation was 6 days, with a trace of precipitation during 2 days of the month. Precipitation amounted to .87 inches. Maximum temperature was 102 degrees, the minimum temperature was 75 degrees and the mean temperature was 85 degrees during May. The relative humidity was 84 percent during May.

(6) VC Statistics. Activities in the TAOR resulted in the detention of 161 VN, of which 33 were forwarded to III MAF. There were 2 ralliers during the month. Enemy casualties revealed 24 VC KIA confirmed and 83 VC KIA probable. Equipment and weapons captured are as follows:

(4) Significant Operations Conducted.

(a) Operation WEBSTER was conducted by Company K and Company L, 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines in coordination with THOUNG DUC CIDG forces along SONG VU GIA between THUONG DUC CIDG Camp and Hill 52, 16-18 May. Very light contact was experienced throughout the operation.

(b) Operation DUVAL was conducted by Company A and Company B, 1st Battalion and Company M, 3rd Battalion 7th Marines in eastern Elephant Valley along SONG CU DE (AT 8684). Negative enemy contact was experienced during the operation.

(c) County Fair 7-11 was conducted by Company D, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines in conjunction with GVN Support and two Commando Platoons, 51st ARVN Regiment in CHAU SON (AT 9461) 16-18 May. Additional information is contained in 1/7's Command Chronology. (Enclosure 2)

(d) County Fair 7-12 was conducted by Company H, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines in coordination with GVN Forces and support elements in KIM LIEN (AT 924855), 26-28 May. Additional information is contained in 2/7's Command Chronology. (Enclosure 3)

(e) County Fair 7-13 was conducted by Company A, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines in coordination with two Commando Platoons 51st ARVN Regiment and GVN support in GIANG LA (AT 974604) 31 May - 2 June. Additional information will be contained in next month's Command Chronology.

d. Plans.(1) Combat Missions Assigned.

(a) 7th Marines has established and maintains a recon screen throughout assigned sector of DA NANG TAOR; conducts coordinated, unilateral and combined offensive operations in Division Area of Responsibility and I CTZ as directed; and maintains control of assigned sector of DA NANG TAOR.

(b) When directed, on twelve hours notice, 7th Marines provides one Battalion (rein) for employment anywhere in RVN; with an additional 12 hours notice, provides a regimental headquarters and one or two battalions for employment anywhere in RVN upon commitment of initial battalion.

(c) 7th Marines is prepared to provide one battalion as

division reserve when directed and one company (rein) to Air Base Defense Battalion for defense of DA NANG Air Base and DA NANG East when directed.

(d) 7th Marines ensures coordinated, planned surveillance and interdiction of possible enemy mortar and rocket firing sites within its assigned area and similarly conducts aggressive patrol activities and employs all available assets to interdict and deny use of waterways to the enemy.

(e) 7th Marines provides forces to reinforce threatened Civilian Irregular Defense Group camps, to re-establish such camps in enemy territory if destroyed, and to pursue enemy forces involved in attacks on such camps as necessary.

(f) 7th Marines provides forces to reinforce threatened District Capitols and Revolutionary Development cadre, to re-establish such positions in enemy hands and pursue enemy forces involved in attacks on such positions.

(g) 7th Marines is prepared to commit rapidly by helicopters such reinforced units of squad, platoon or company size as appropriate to engage and destroy small VC forces sighted or contacted in or adjacent to the TAOR, to reinforce friendly units, to protect downed aircraft or drones, and to exploit supporting arms employment.

e. Training.

(1) During May, 12 personnel from 7th Marines attended Vietnamese language school in DA NANG and 5 attended school in OKINAWA.

(2) Three men attended NCO School in OKINAWA.

(3) Five men received instruction in Basic Infantry Weapons.

(4) Nine men received instruction on Field Radio.

(5) Two men attended crypto comm school.

f. Combined Action Company Program.

(1) 7th Marines has 12 Combined Action Platoons within its DA NANG SOR.

g. Logistics, Equipment and Supply.

(1) During the period 2-5 May 1967 and 7-10 May 1967 MUMMS School was conducted for Supply personnel of the Regiment.

(4) Correspondence was submitted to 1st Marine Division G-4 requesting acquisition of Real Estate in the 7th Marines SOR for Battalion and Regimental Command Post locations.

(5) Granted additional \$20,000 requisitional authority to 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines and \$5,000 to 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines from the Regimental Reserve.

(6) Random testing of M16E1 was conducted in order to ^{evaluate reports} ~~determine~~ of malfunctions and unsatisfactory performance.

(7) Primary logistical support throughout the month was provided by truck transportation. On several occasions tactical movements of personnel were executed on short notice. The support rendered by 1st Marine Division Motor Transport was excellent.

(8) Emphasis continues to be placed on Engineer support in the area of road improvement, bridge and observation tower construction.

h. Civic Action.

(1) The 7th Marines provided Med CAP treatments for 7,390 civilians within their DA NANG Civic Action Area of Responsibility.

Scrap lumber is being donated to the Revolutionary Development Team located in DAI LOC District. Large pieces of cardboard are being donated to the 51st ARVN's for use in building Peace Hamlets.

(2) On 9 May 1967, CG III MAF, CG 1st MarDiv, CO 7th Marines, CO 3/7 and the District Chief of DAI LOC District attended the dedication of a school at AN MY (3). The school was a self-help project and was named in honor of Lt. Frank REASONER who died defending that Hamlet. Another school was dedicated at AI DONG Hamlet. This dedication was attended by the CO 3/7, the District Chief and local officials.

(3) The Regimental Civil Affairs Officer continues to attend the weekly briefing at the Civil Operations Office in HOI AN.

(4) Civic Action support was provided for three County Fairs held during the month of May. Two County Fairs were held by 1/7 for a total of approximately 600 Vietnamese. The County Fair held at KIM LIEN was the largest ever held in the DA NANG area. Over 2,000 Vietnamese Civilians were fed for two and a half days and in addition to foodstuffs, soap, sewing kits and Med CAP - Dent CAP were provided. A flag raising ceremony was held with American and Vietnamese dignitaries participating jointly.

(5) Thirty bags of fertilizer remain to be sold to local farmers in THANH SON Village. Agricultural Representatives from Province Headquarters are included in all County Fairs, and it is expected that the fertilizer will be sold very shortly.

(6) Progress is being made with some of the hamlets that are considered unpacified in the 1/7 TAOR. The people of DUC KY Hamlet have asked to have a charcoal dealer haul charcoal out to them from DA NANG. This provides 1/7 with the opportunity to get to know those people and receive intelligence from them relative to VC activity. The first load of charcoal was delivered on 27 May, and it was very happily received.

i. Psychological Operations.

(1) Since the 7th Marines arrival in the DA NANG area, continued emphasis has been placed on Psychological Operations. Daily leaflet drops and aerial broadcasts have been conducted throughout the Regimental SOR. In addition patrols have distributed numerous leaflets by hand to the Vietnamese they have encountered.

(2) There has been no change in the attitude of the civilian population during this period.

(3) Activities during the first half of the month were characterized by contact with small VC units. During the remainder of the month this contact has declined drastically. An increase in mining incidents has accompanied the decrease in contacts. It is believed that if this trend continues, the civilian population will swing more toward the Marines and the GVN.

(4) The Regimental PsyOps program will exploit the trend indicated above, by pushing the rewards program and by distributing leaflets to the effect that VC mines kill innocent civilians.

j. Communications.

The Radio/Radio Relay Central Bunker was completed during May. It is constructed of standard bunker materials with a quadruple layer of sandbagging on the outside and a timber/sandbag roof. Communication circuits consolidated within the bunker are:

The Regimental Communication platoon provided an automatic retransmission radio station on Hill 868 in support of Operation DUVAL (1/7).

k. Medical.

(1) A total of 240 men were seen at the Regimental Aid Station during the month of May. There were 4 cases of venereal disease reported this month in Headquarters Company.

(2) The number of fevers of undetermined origin (FUO's) was down to zero, and we had only one new case of Malaria. The Diarrhea problem has diminished but is still present. Close attention to the water supply and processing is still necessary to keep this problem in check.

(3) The Regimental Aid Station moved into a 16 x 32 foot hut (from a 16 x 16) during May. This has improved operational space and in general the running of the Aid Station.

(4) Medical Supply has become a problem. The items ordered 5 days after arriving in DA NANG have never been received. This has necessitated Walk-Thru chits to keep us supplied with day to day operational gear. This delay between ordering and receiving supplies is a big problem and needs quite a bit of attention on higher echelons of command.

(5) The health of the Regiment is generally good.

H-3-11 Battery (AT 921795) received enemy rocket attack commencing about 160105H. G-2-7 (AT 803822) observed muzzle flashes and heard rockets passing overhead at (AT 8686) (AT 8786). Missile averted to fire south east. Evidence indicate positions were quickly abandoned and that AP box mines emplanted in the area prior to departure of enemy. Search continues. More rockets may be found during diggings.

G-2-7 plt will remain in area tonight and continue search tomorrow. Waterways and other likely areas will be searched.

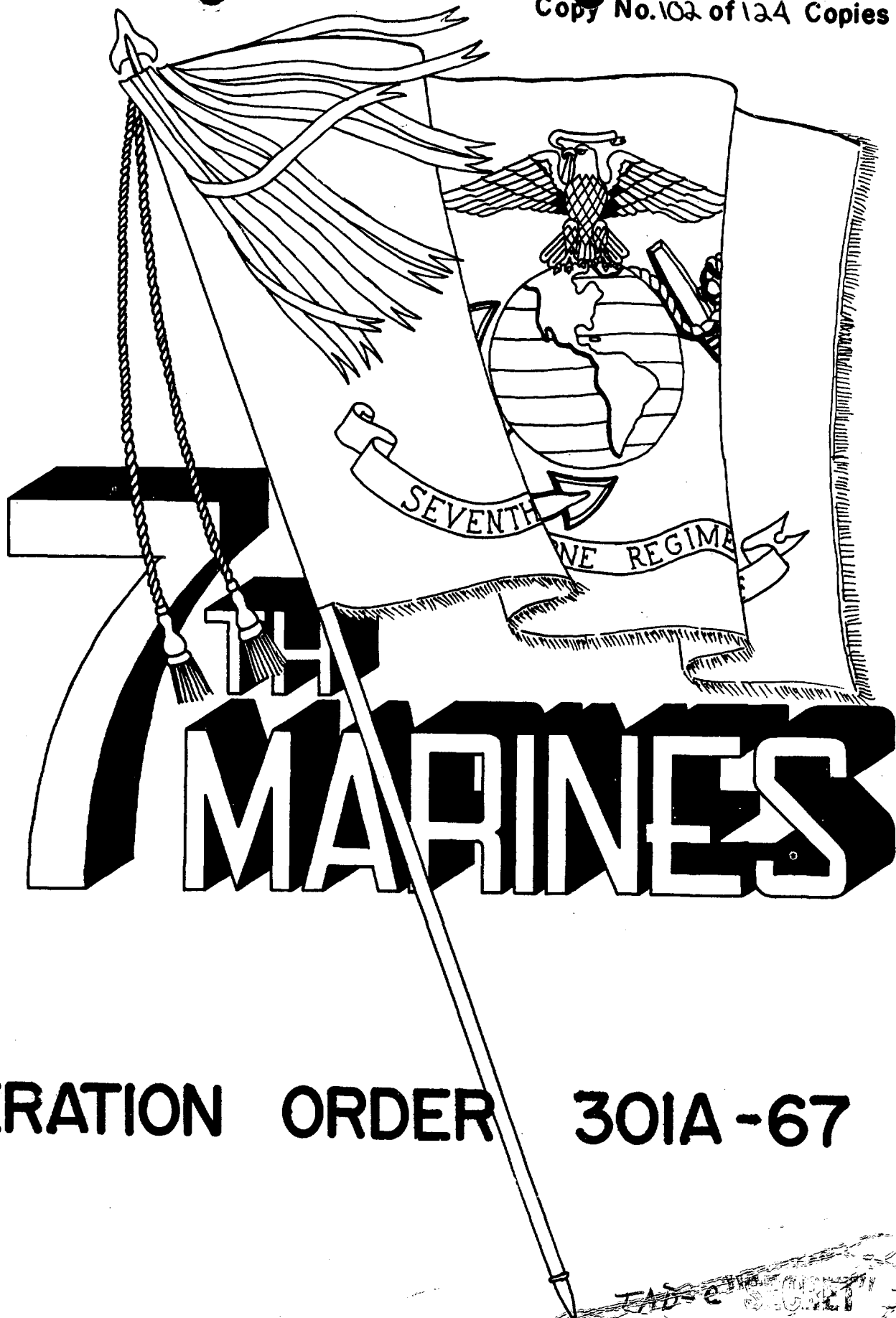

1. SUMMARY OF THE ENEMY SITUATION. See Appendix 1 (Enemy Situation).
2. MISSION.

a. Basic Mission. Occupy and defend assigned area within the DA NANG TAOR; conduct operations to seek out and destroy VC forces and facilities; conduct co-ordinated USMC/GVN Operations including a concentrated and sustained Civic action Program; and control and maintain lines of communication within the TAOR.

3. EI's.

- a. Determine if enemy units will attack friendly and USMC positions within the Regimental SOR; is so where, when, and in what strength.
- b. Determine if enemy units will launch a 140mm rocket, mortar, or artillery attack against friendly units within the SOR or against the DA NANG airstrip (from what area in the TAOR).
- c. Determine the enemies strengths, designations, wps and equipment, and capabilities within the TAOR.
- d. Determine the enemies infiltration routes and routes of withdrawal in the SOR.
- e. Determine what areas are VC controlled within the SOR.
- f. Determine the most lucrative VC targets within the SOR (Bridges, CAC's, RD, etc.)
- g. Determine the locations of VC headquarters, camps, rest areas, training area, special cultivation areas, supply points, and weapons and ammunition storage areas.
- h. Additional EI will be promulgated as requested.

4. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE AREA OF OPERATIONS.

a. Orientation. The area included in this estimate is in the Northern and Central portions of QUANG NAM Province. Specifically, the area is

bounded by E-W grid line ZC 18 on the West the QUANG NAM-THUA THIEN border on the North. E-W grid line BT 00 on the East, and the N-S grid line ZC-AT 45 on the South. It includes portions of PHU LOC, HOA VANG, HIEU DUC, DAI LOC, DIEN BAN, DUC DUC, and DUY XUYEN Districts.

b. Weather. The customary two season weather is associated with the area. Daily weather report and long range forecast will be disseminated.

c. Terrain.

(1) Relief

(a) The predominant vegetation in the area of interest is wetland rice. A portion of the area, specifically the Northern, Western, and Southern regions is mountainous and is covered with dense broadleaf evergreen.

(b) The area of interest is dominated by two major rivers. In the northernmost portion the SONG CU DE, which generally flows ESE and ENE, and in the southernmost portion of the area the SONG WU GIA which generally flows ENE and then SE.

(c) The Northern, Western, and Southern regions in the area of interest are generally dominated by piedmonts and mountainous terrain. These areas are covered with a dense canopy of evergreen and are intermingled with small, swift flowing streams. The relatively high elevation of the mountains ranging from 200 to 1,000 meters overlooks key terrain features and afford excellent observation over the valleys and lowland regions. The mountainous regions are not ideal areas to conduct operations. They cannot be overlooked, however, as they are principally the regions where the enemy will build up his forces, infiltrate through to lowland regions, and stage equipment. The Central or Eastern portion of the area of interest is rice paddy land with scattered high ground ranging between 10 and 60 meters in height. Several streams dissect the area creating obstacles to troop movement especially in rainy weather. The existing villages and hamlets constitute key terrain features within the area of interest.

- (d) ELEPHANT VALLEY is located in the northern most portion of the area of interest. It is a lowland portion of the SONG CU DE River Valley consisting mainly of rice paddies which extend approximately 200 to over 1,500 meters on either side of the river. This area is rather sparsely populated and movement is restricted. Mountains of various heights exceeding 900 meters rise on either side of the SONG CU DE. These mountains run north to a coastal area adjacent to the SOUTH CHINA Sea, and south to the SONG VU GIA. Both ridge lines on either side of the SONG CU DE command the lowland regions and offer excellent observation of the lower regions. There is a finger of high ground extending from the northern corner of the area of interest, vicinity AT 8784 to vicinity AT 9084. This ground separates and secludes ELEPHANT VALLEY from the lowland coastal region which borders the SOUTH CHINA Sea. It will provide long range observation either over the western portion of the area of interest, specifically ELEPHANT VALLEY or the lowland coastal region. The commanding high ground which could afford control over avenues of approach are as follows: Hill 82 vicinity AT 807849, Hill 202 vicinity AT 846870, Hill 216 vicinity AT 871826, and Hill 208 vicinity AT 861848.
- (e) THE INDEPENDENCE AREA is located in the southern most portion of the area of interest. South of the SONG VU GIA is a large plain consisting almost entirely of rice paddies. The paddies in this area are extremely large, and are broken only by treelines, and surrounding hamlets. In the south central portion of the INDEPENDENCE AREA is a ridge line that rises to meet the piedmonts in the southwest corner of the AREA. This ridge line commands the surrounding rice paddies and is the commanding terrain feature south of the river. North of the SONG VU GIA, the terrain is divided into two parts. Along the north bank of the river is a stretch of flat paddy land averaging about two kilometers wide. North of the flatland the ground rises suddenly into a mountainous area known as Charlie Ridge. In a space of five kilometers the ground elevation goes from ten meters to over twelve hundred meters. The ridge is steep with deep cuts in which intermittent streams flow. The ridge is covered with a dense growth of jungle with a double canopy. The southern edge of the ridge dominates the flatland on the north bank. The western portion of the INDEPENDENCE AREA is generally dominated by piedmonts and mountainous terrain. There is a finger of high ground extending from the NW corner of the area to the vicinity of

CONFIDENTIAL

grid square AT8452. This ground will provide long range observation over the Northwestern portion of the area. Isolated hills in the lowland regions constitute the same factor as mentioned about in the Central portion of the area of interest. The commanding high ground which could afford control over avenues of approach are as follows: HILL 300 vicinity AT792523, HILL 146 vicinity AT825453, HILL 38 vicinity AT836529, HILL 34 vicinity AT806512, and HILL 29 vicinity AT827504.

(2) Drainage

- (a) The principal stream in the Northern most portion of the study area is the SONG CU DE which generally flows NE to AT8585 where it bends sharply to the NE for approximately 1000 meters before following a Southern and then ENE where it joins the SONG CA DE vicinity AT8783. The SONG CU DE has a width of 20-300 meters, and the bank material varies from rock and gravel to sand, silt, and gravel. The secondary waterway, the SONG CA DE flows ENE to the SOUTH CHINA Sea and has basically the same characteristics as the SONG CU DE except that it widens to over 600 meters at several points.
- (b) The principal streams in the Central portion of the study area are the SONG TUY LOAN which generally flows Eastward, the SONG YEN which generally flows NE, and the SONG AI NGAI which flows NE. These rivers vary from 20-60 meters in width and the bank material varies from rock and gravel to sand, silt, and gravel. Numerous streams branch off from these rivers and meander throughout the lowland region.
- (c) The principal stream in the Southern most portion of the study area is the SONG VU GHA which generally flows ENE to AT8757 where it bends sharply to the SE for approximately 1500 meters before following a ENE course for another 2000 meters at which point it bends sharply again to join the SONG THU BON AT920533. The SONG VU GHA has a width of 25-300 meters, and the bank material varies from rock and gravel to sand, silt and gravel. The secondary waterways such as the SONG AI NGAI, SONG THU BON, and SONG THIE YEN have basically the same characteristics. The SONG THU BON and SONG THIE YEN's width varies from 10-200 meters with an average being less than 100 meters. Bank, and bottom material consists normally of the same substances as those previously mentioned.

CONFIDENTIAL(3) CROSS COUNTRY MOVEMENT

1. GENERAL. Movement is restricted throughout the area, except along coastal plain and in the large river valleys, by dense vegetation, great variation in local relief, and seasonal to year-round inundation of rice paddies in river valleys and coastal plains. Conditions preclude all but local movement.

a. Flat or rolling treeless areas. Movement conditions are fair at all times for M-113 APC's and fair in dry weather for M-48 tanks and 2 1/2 ton trucks. During wet weather, conditions are poor to unsuited for tanks and trucks. For foot troops conditions are good during dry weather and fair to poor during wet weather.

b. Flat or rolling beaches and sandy areas. Movement conditions in this category are fair to poor at all times for M-113 APC's. During dry weather conditions are fair to good for M-48 tanks, poor for trucks, and fair for foot troops.

c. Treeless dissected areas ranging from flat lands to low hills. Movement conditions are poor at all times for M-113 APC's. Movement for M-48 tanks is fair to poor in dry weather and poor to unsuited in wet weather. For 2 1/2 trucks movement is poor in dry weather and unsuited in wet weather.

d. Seasonally inundated rice paddies. Movement is fair to poor at all times for M-113 APC's. When soils are dry conditions are fair to poor for M-48 tanks, poor for 2 1/2 ton trucks, and fair for troops. When inundated or wet, these areas are poor to unsuited for 2 1/2 ton trucks and poor for foot troops.

e. Numerous streams and gullies dissecting open forest with light moderate undergrowth, dense scrub and orchards. Movement conditions are poor to unsuited for M-113 APC's and M-48 tanks at all times and poor for 2 1/2 ton trucks when soils are wet. Conditions for foot troops are fair to poor during the dry season and poor during the wet season.

f. Marshes, perennially flooded, or soft rice paddies and highly compartmented muddy lands. Conditions for M-113 APC's are either fair to poor or unsuited. Conditions are poor to unsuited at all times for M-48 tanks and 2 1/2 ton trucks.

g. Dense forest to fairly open undergrowth. Conditions at all times are unsuited for all types of vehicular movement and poor to unsuited for foot troop movement.

h. Slopes over 30%. Conditions are at all times unsuited for all types of vehicular movement and poor to unsuited for foot movement.

II. SUMMARY. The M-49 APC can move fairly easily throughout the coastal plain except where dense vegetation or high dikes preclude movement. The M-49 tank and 2 1/2 ton truck are confined to improved road and local areas of hard, dry terrain.

(4) Zones of Entry. Nearly any rice paddy during the dry season is suitable as an LZ, but the close proximity of any Hamlet should be considered a potential and highly probable site for sniper activity.

(5) Lines of Communication.

(a) Roads. National Route #1 is the principle road which runs along the seacoast mainly in the Northern part of the study area to the SONG CA DE. This is a hard surfaced, all weather two lane road. Route #14 which is an all weather, loose or light surfaced, all weather road runs along the Southern bank of the SONG CU DE - SONG CA DE Rivers to vicinity AT9032 where it veers North sharply and then joins Route #1 vicinity AT904784. Route #1 has generally the same characteristics as Route #14 except that it runs through the Central portion of the study area. National Routes 4 and 537 are the principle and virtually only land lines of communication within the Southern most portion of the study area. Route #4 is located just north and generally parallels to the SONG VU GIA. Route #537, which traverses approximately the SE half of the INDEPENDENCE AREA, is located on the Southern Bank of the SONG THIM YEN - SONG THU BON. Both of these roads are all weather, two lane, hard surfaced roads. There are numerous secondary roads throughout the study area, most of which are only open at certain periods weather permitting, and only light vehicles or foot traffic can pass over them.

(b) Rivers. Principle water routes are the SONG VU GIA flowing generally East, the SONG THIM YEN - SONG AI NGHIA - SONG THU BON flowing generally Northeast, and the SONG CU DE - SONG CA DE which generally flow E-Northeast.

CONFIDENTIAL5. INTELLIGENCE TASKSa. Orders to subordinate units

- (1) Report, as obtained, information concerning Intelligence Requirements listed in reference (a).
- (2) Conduct terrain, stream and road reconnaissance within assigned sectors.
- (3) Submit regular reports on trafficability for foot, wheel, and track vehicles, especially during and after prolonged periods of seasonal weather.
- (4) Maintain surveillance over major avenues of approach leading into friendly positions. Report, as obtained, information on enemy or suspected enemy movement along these routes.

b. Co-ordinating Instructions

- (1) Submit information as obtained to S-2 via most expeditious means available.
- (2) Make maximum effort to take captives and forward as expeditiously as possible to IIR with all accompanying documents and/or equipment for intelligence exploitation.
- (3) Submit by FLASH message to this Headquarters first sighting or positive indication of:
 - (a) Enemy artillery, anti-aircraft guns or other heavy caliber weapons; to include shellrep or martrep where appropriate.
 - (b) Enemy companies, sized or larger units within or adjacent to respective areas of action. (Include location, direction of movement, size of unit, type and color of uniforms, equipment, weapons and whether or not unit can be kept under observation.)
 - (c) Any unusual activity that represents an immediate or potential threat to any USMC or ARVN facility or activity within the TAOR.

CONFIDENTIALc. Requests to higher, adjacent and supporting units.(1) CG, First Marine Division

(a) Provide information as obtained on:

1. Enemy ground forces within Regtional TAOR;
2. Nature and extent of enemy or potential enemy air threat;
3. Movement of additional enemy forces into Regtional TAOR;
4. Suitable helicopter landing zones for projected operations as required;
5. Enemy ECM capabilities;
6. Enemy supply and infiltration routes into the TAOR;
7. Provide requested aerial photography in support of current or projected operations as required;
8. Provide additional interrogator/translator, counterintelligence or other intelligence personnel/equipment support as required;
9. Provide AC support/coverage as requested.
10. Weather Reports.

6. MEASURES FOR HANDLING CAPTURED PERSONNEL, DOCUMENTS AND MATERIALa. Captured personnel.

- (1) All captured personnel will initially be classified as "detainees", and will retain this classification until their exact status can be determined through detained interrogation, except that personnel who can positively be identified as enemy will be classified PW's.
- (2) Classification of Detainees. Due to the nature of counter-guerrilla operations and the environment in which the enemy is found, detainees will generally fall into one of the several possible categories. In referring to detainees they will be classified by the following definitions:
 - (a) PW (NVA). Those captives who can be definitely determined to be from NVN. This will include regular military forces, political cadre, spies, agents or persons who speak a North Vietnamese dialect.

CONFIDENTIAL

- (b) PW (VC). Those captives who can be definitely determined to be from SVN. This will include all those taken captive while engaging in combat with USMC, RVN or allied units unless it can be determined they are from NVN.
- (c) Returnee (NV). Those personnel as defined in para (a) above who surrender of their own free will.
- (d) Returnee (VC). Those personnel as defined in para (b) above who surrender of their own free will.
- (e) Civil Defendent. Members of political cadre, and other South Vietnamese members of the Viet Cong who are non-combatants.
- (f) Innocent Civilians. Vietnamese nationals who are apprehended or taken captive as a result of normal operations. Their status will generally be in question at the time of capture due to a lack of identification, their being encountered in an area of operations or other circumstances that require further investigation in order to clear them of affiliation with the Viet Cong.
- (g) Ralliers. Applies to those individuals not engaging in combat who voluntarily surrender and rally to the cause of the Government of the Republic of Vietnam under the "Open Arms" or Chieu Hoi Policy of the Vietnamese Government.

(3) Handling Detainees.

- (a) All detainees taken by USMC units will be accorded firm, just, humane treatment at all times in accordance with the law of land warfare as derived from customs and treaties, such as the Geneva Conventions.
- (b) Normal procedures in processing "prisoners of war" apply to the processing of detainees taken in counterguerrilla operations in Vietnam. Extreme care must be taken to ensure that innocent civilians taken captive are not subjected to any treatment that might engender hostile attitude on their part toward the USMC or GVN.

CONFIDENTIAL

- (c) Handling of detainees will be firm, at all times, but will not involve force beyond that necessary to defend against or subdue resistance. Detainees will be led firmly, but gently when blindfolded. Special care must be exercised in the handling of detainees who are blindfolded and tied, when being moved or transported to or from aircraft or vehicles. These people are helpless and must be assisted to prevent injury.
- (d) Detainees will be bound in such a manner to ensure that they cannot escape or harm either their captors, guards, interrogators, or other captives. Binding will insure security but will not be such as to cut off blood circulation, cut, injure, or otherwise cause pain. Detainees will not be treated in any way that is or could be mistaken to be torturous.
- (e) Commanding Officers will insure that all Marines and other personnel in their commands are instructed in the proper manner and procedures for the handling of detainees, and that these procedures are applied to all insurgent captives.

(4) Processing Detainees.

- (a) All detainees will be searched, tagged and evacuated through the intelligence chain as expeditiously as possible. Innocent civilians will be separated from other detainees as expeditiously as possible.
- (b) Normally, processing at the battalion level will involve screening detainees by the unit S-2 for information of immediate tactical value and to determine if possible, the category of the individual to facilitate and expedite disposition.

(5) Disposition of Detainees.

- (a) Initial screening of detainees will normally take place at the battalion level. Here, based on the circumstances or capture and any information obtained by the S-2, detainees will be classified into the categories defined above and disposed of as follows:
 1. All PWs, returnees, civil defendants, Rallyers and detainees whose status cannot be determined will be forwarded to the Division Collection Point (III MAF Compound) for interrogation after exploitation at the capturing unit level.

CONFIDENTIALb. Captured Documents

- (1) All captured documents must be tagged to show time, place and circumstances of capture prior to forwarding through intelligence channels for timely exploitation. Complete information concerning the documents is necessary to aid in the evaluation of same and to permit return of "friendly" documents which may have been captured.
- (2) RVN ID Cards will not be taken from captives, but will remain with them throughout the evacuation process.
- (3) Captured documents relating to communications, including operating instructions, codes, messages, frequency lists and call signs will be tagged and evacuated to the S-2 without delay. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL PLAIN LANGUAGE TRANSMISSIONS BE MADE TO REPORT THE CAPTURE OF ENEMY COMMUNICATIONS AND SECURITY MATERIAL.
- (4) Documents captured at communication installations will not be separated from the equipment unless recapture is imminent or evacuation of the equipment is impossible. Such documents and equipment will be tagged and evacuated together to the S-2 without delay.

c. Captured material.

- (1) All captured weapons, munitions, uniforms and equipment will be evacuated to the Regimental S-2 for intelligence evaluation. A system of accountability will be established to prevent the loss of captured equipment.
- (2) Captured communication electronic equipment will be reported immediately and evacuated to the Regimental S-2 without delay. Any associated documents and/or personnel captured with the equipment should be evacuated with the equipment. Following capture of such equipment, actions should be made of dial settings to ensure that such information is available for technical exploitation. Dial settings will not be changed or any parts be removed including identifying labels or manufacturer's plates.
- (3) Captured ordinance will be forwarded to the Regimental S-2.
- (4) Explosive ordinance materials will be inspected by an EOD representative where reasonably possible. When EOD personnel are not available a complete description of the material will be recorded and the material will be destroyed. Those items of intelligence or training value that can be made safe will

be turned over to the Regimental S-2 for further disposition.

7. a. Maps and Charts.

- (1) The standard tactical map for operations in Vietnam is: Map VIETNAM 1:50,000 AMS Series L7014. The following sheets are required:

Series L7014, Sheets 6540 I, 6540 II, 6541 II, 6640 III, 6640 IV, 6641 II

- (2) Map allowances. See Reference (a). Units should notify the S-2 of any deficiencies or inadequacies in the stated map allowance.
- (3) Map corrections. All units will maintain a record of map corrections covering their SOP. Such corrections should be reported to the S-2 as encountered. Whenever a unit is relieved of its SOP, the record of map corrections and any additional geographical information will be turned over to the relieving unit.

a. Strengths and combat efficiency. The following estimate of enemy forces locally available and reinforcing elements is based on confirmed units.

(1) Locally available enemy forces confirmed as operating within the 7th Marines SOR.

(a) T.89th Sapper Bn (MF)

Total strength of the battalion is estimated at 350 men divided into five companies and a headquarters (The HQ is known as the 402nd Unit). One company is permanently stationed within the INDEPENDENCE AREA on "Charlie Ridge". The INDEPENDENCE AREA is believed to be the location of a training, rest and recreation area. Companies of the T.89th Battalion normally operate as independent companies.

Weapons and equipment include 1-120mm mortar (poss), 1-81mm mortars, 1-57mm RR, 1-PRC-10, and individual weapons. How these weapons are distributed in the T.89th Battalion is not known.

Uniforms are light green with a patch on the shoulder. The patch is the size of a poker card edged in red with the number 402 in blue on a white background.

Known AKA's for the T.89th Battalion are: 402nd Sapper Battalion, and 602nd Sapper Battalion; Letter Box No. 21395 GI HONG HAI

Combat effectiveness is rated as GOOD.

(b) V.25th Battalion (LF)

The V.25th Battalion has a total strength of 400 men with three companies subordinate to it (V-26, V-27, and V-28). At the present all three companies of the V.25th Battalion are believed to be located in the study area.

Weapons include 1-81mm mortar, 2-60mm mortars, 1-57mm RR, 3-.30 cal MG's, and individual weapons.

Uniforms worn are usually grey in color.

Known AKA's for the V.25th Battalion are: LAM Battalion, and 5th Battalion.

Combat effectiveness is rated as FAIR

CONFIDENTIAL(c) Q.14th Co (LF)

The Q.14th LF Co has a total strength of 70 men and is presently believed to be located in the study area.

Weapons include 1-60mm mortar, 1-50 cal MG, 4-M-79, and individual weapons.

Known AKA's for the Q.14th LF Co are: H-42 Co, D&I LOC Co, and X-54 Co (?).

(d) Q.16th Co (LF)

The Q.16th LF Co has a total strength of 120 men and is presently believed to be located within the study area.

Weapons include 1-81mm mortar, 2-60mm mortars, 1-IMG, and 6-AR.

Known AKA's for the Q.16th LF Co are: HOA VANG Co, H-41, H-56, HOA HIEU, 100 Co, and Q-16B.

Combat effectiveness is UNKNOWN.

(2) Reinforcements within 12 to 24 hours after movement commences:

(a) R.20th Bn (LF)

The R.20th Battalion has a total strength of 250 men, and consists of three companies due to the losses of men incurred in recent months. The companies are R-21 Co, R-22 Co, and R-23 Co. Companies of the R.20th Battalion operate separately, further breaking down and operating on platoon level. The R.20th Battalion was last reported just South-east of the study area.

Weapon and equipment include 1-81mm mortar, 3-60mm mortars, 1-57mm RR, 5--50 cal MG's (?), 2-IMG's, and 54-AR's, 3-PPC-10's, and individual weapons.

The uniform worn by members of the R.20th Battalion is suspected to be grey in color.

Known AKA's are: QUANG NAM Independent Battalion, DOC LAP Battalion, HAI GANG 20, Q&I, HUNG-GIA-NY, and B-20; Letter Box No. 206300X, or 21341EM BA HA.

Combat effectiveness is rated as FAIR.

CONFIDENTIAL(b) R.15th Co (LF)

The Q.15th LF Co has a total strength of 120 men and is presently believed to be located East of the study area.

Weapons include 1-81mm mortar, 2-60mm mortars, 1-57mm mm, 3-LMG, and individual weapons.

Known AKA's for the Q.15th LF Co are: DIEN BAN Co, H-40, H-35, H-55, 104th, Q.15th, X-65, 75 (?), X-55 (?).

Combat effectiveness is UNKNOWN.

(c) Q.13th Co (LF)

The Q.13th LF Co has the total strength of 120 men and is presently believed to be located Southeast of the area of interest.

Weapons of the Q.13th Co include 1-60mm mortar, 1-.30 cal MG, 9-AR's, and individual weapons.

Known AKA's for the Q.13th LF Co are: DUY XUYEN Co, H-52, TAN LAP Co, 103rd Co.

Combat effectiveness is UNKNOWN.

- (d) Irregular Forces: Information is virtually non-existent on guerrilla and self-defense forces in the study area. However, on the basis of numbers of villages and population, it can be reasonably assumed that there is at least one guerrilla platoon, which operates from each village in the area. The strength of the guerrilla platoon varies, but it usually is approximately 30 men. A correct figure cannot be reached but it can be assumed that the total guerrilla strength is somewhere in the vicinity of 1100 men which is a conservative figure in comparison to the size of the study area. Due to the losses the enemy incurs daily, weekly, and monthly it is difficult to establish a set figure. Weapons of guerrilla forces usually consist of individual small arms, and automatic weapons. Their main activity usually consists of harassing fire, sniping incidents, and the setting of mines and booby traps. Unlike the Local Companies and Main Forces, the Guerrilla often operates alone or in squad sized units, mainly acting as a screening force for large units which are withdrawing.



c. Arms and Armament. 81mm Mortars, and 57mm RR's are the largest weapons reported with the unit operating within the 7th Marines SOR. However, the enemy could be reinforced within 48 to 96 hours by 120mm Mortars which are attached to the 2nd NVA Division Headquarters Presently believed to be located in the HINH DUC District, QUANG TRI Province. Also, the probability of the utilization of 140mm ROCKETS cannot be discounted although in all probability the stock of this weapon is limited in SVN and it would be used against a vulnerable target such as DA NANG Air Base as done in the past. The R. LO Bn has been linked with the two previous 140mm rocket attacks against the DA NANG Air base. The enemy may possess some artillery capability, but as yet artillery hasn't been employed in QUANG NAM Province.

d. Support Capabilities. See appendix 1 (Enemy Situation). The highland and mountainous regions within and surrounding the area of interest provide the enemy with numerous Base and logistical facilities. Just South of the area of interest is a VC Base area (BASE 116) which provides the enemy with a relatively close Supply and Rest Region. Movement through these areas is virtually unrestricted for the enemy and supplies and reinforcements can move forward or to the rear with considerable freedom under the dense canopy which affords a certain amount of protection from aerial observation. The enemy's interest lies in the lowland regions because these areas are the rice crop producing regions; but, his main source of supply and logistics is located in areas where they can be less vulnerable to destruction by the Friendly Forces.

Time Zone: H

1. GENERAL. Security is especially important in the counterintelligence environment in the Republic of VIETNAM. The US may be expected to;

- a. Conduct espionage activities to obtain military information.
- b. Sabotage vital US or ARVN installations.
- c. Undertake acts of terrorism against US and Pro-GVN civilian personnel.
- d. Propagandize the Vietnamese civilian population and to incite anti-US feelings.

2. MILITARY SECURITY.

a. Safeguarding Military Information.

(1) Classified information will be handled and safeguarded in accordance with references (a) through (d).

(2) Classified material will not be taken forward of the Battalion Command Post except when essential for the conduct of operations. In such cases, only extracts of necessary information from classified documents shall be used.

(3) Upon displacement, command posts will be thoroughly policed to ensure that nothing of intelligence value is left behind.

(4) Special Instructions.

(a) While current US Armed Forces security directives do not require that unclassified maps, training manuals, and other publications of this nature be treated as classified material, RVNAP require that these items be treated with utmost care.

(b) During the period of operational deployment in RVN, unclassified maps, training manuals and other publications of this type will be given sufficient protection to prevent their falling into unauthorized hands. Disposal will be made as if the material were classified.

(5) Classified material furnished to this command by a foreign government or international organization will retain the same classification as the furnishing government has assigned it. Vietnamese defense information is limited to the following categories of classification.

(a) TOI MAT is the Vietnamese equivalent to TOP SECRET.

(b) MAT is the Vietnamese equivalent of SECRET.

(c) KIN is the Vietnamese equivalent of CONFIDENTIAL.

All material carrying these classifications will be afforded the same or greater degree of protection than that which the United States affords material of like classification.

b. Communications Security.

(1) Communications security will be in accordance with provisions of Annex N (Communications-Electronics) and other directives issued by higher authority.

(2) Classified information will not be discussed over telephones or voice radio nets. Coupling sheets and operation codes will be used when appropriate to safeguard friendly information.

(3) The EGO will prepare an emergency destruction plan for Crypto material.

c. Challenge and Passwords.

(1) See reference (c).

(2) Compromise of the challenge and password will be reported to Regimental S-2 immediately.

d. Countersabotage.

(1) All units will stress countersabotage in security plans. Particular emphasis will be placed on safeguarding command posts, supply points, communications centers and water points.

(2) Prior to occupying an existing building or structure a thorough search will be made for hidden explosives or booby traps.

e. Counterespionage.

(1) Commanders will ensure that all personnel are warned that low level agents (bar girls, vendors, shop keepers, pedicab drivers) have been known to gather information for the Viet Cong.

(2) The Viet Cong also have the capability of using Caucasian or Negro agents, either in uniform or civilian clothes, to penetrate our installations or units. Any person, regardless of rank or position who acts suspiciously, expresses undue interest in military routine, location of units or who is observed in a restricted area, will be approached and identified. If he has improper identification or requires verification, he will be detained and the details will be reported immediately to the Unit's S-2.

f. Countersubversion.

(1) Troop information programs will include the official role of the United States in the Republic of VIETNAM in both political and military matters.

(2) Any propaganda directed at the United States policy or U.S. servicemen will be reported immediately to the Regimental S-2 with all details possible.

g. Visitor Control.

(1) All units will provide escorts for and control the movement of all visitors within their areas of responsibility.

(2) Representatives of the press and photographers will be escorted by personnel as designated by the commanding officer.

h. Protection of Ranking Officials. Units being visited by ranking government officials or general/flag officers will provide adequate protective security for such visitors.

i. Target Lists.

(1) Facilities and Installations. To be issued.

(2) Personality Lists. To be issued.

3. CIVIL SECURITY.a. Control of Civilians.

(1) Civilians will not be permitted access to camps or installations unless appropriately cleared and authorized by the commander.

(2) All personnel are prohibited from dealing with itinerant vendors operating on the periphery of camps and along MSR's.

b. Civil Leaders. Friendly civilian community leaders, including village and hamlet officials, will be treated with due respect.



c. Civil Unrest. Notify the Regimental S-2 immediately of any incident which may indicate a deterioration in relations between the local civilian population and U.S. forces.

4. CENSORSHIP.

Armed Forces Censorship, if directed by higher authority, will be conducted in accordance with instructions promulgated by this Headquarters.

a. Reward fund will be utilized to award Vietnamese civilians including prospective Kit Carson Scouts, prior to the time they are placed on a pay status. Reward will not be paid to U.S. personnel, GVN official or agencies, Vietnam military or paramilitary personnel, nor will these funds be used to establish agent networks.

b. The fund will be made available to the lowest echelon possible to insure maximum effectiveness of the program.

c. Individual Marines who possess reward funds, must evaluate the information before making a judgement regarding the size of reward. In an effort to standardize rewards, the following scale is offered as a guide:

(1) Location of mines/booby traps-	400 \$VN
(2) Delivery of individual weapons-	500 \$VN
(3) Delivery of crew served weapons-	1000 \$VN
(4) Specific location of Viet Cong personnel, supply caches, installations, etc	500-2000 \$VN

d. No maximum payment has been established. The above scale has been deliberately set below the compensation provided to returnees under the Chieu Hoi program, so as not to be competitive with that program.

e. Informants will not be required to sign receipt for reward funds, however units will be required to maintain a record listing the date, amount and purpose of the reward.

2. ACTION.

a. Coordinate and emphasize reward program with civil affairs and psychological operations.

b. Publicize the reward program and its rationale both to Marines and to the Vietnamese. Emphasize that personnel who volunteer information will be provided anonymity and may receive an on the spot reward.

- (6) The 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines will obtain clearance for fires east of grid line 90 with 7th Marines FSCC. They will obtain clearance from Hoa Vang district via 1st Marine Division FSCC.
- (7) The 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines is authorized to clear fires in the DAI LOC no fire zone directly with the Senior Advisor DAI LOC District Headquarters.
- (8) The 1st Battalion, 7th Marines is authorized to clear fires in the DAI LOC no fire zone directly with DAI LOC District Headquarters.
- (9) All fires outside the 7th Marines SOR will be cleared through 7th Marines FSCC.
- (10) Fires will be cleared through the 7th Marines FSCC when they plot within the below listed distances of boundaries with adjacent SORs.

4. SAV-A PLANE SAFETY.

a. SAV-A PLANE

- (1) The SAV-A PLANE system described in 1st Marine Division Order P5000.1D will be implemented to insure aircraft safety with respect to surface to surface firing.

b. Request Procedure.

- (1) All SAV-A PLANES will be submitted by the fastest means to the 7th Marines FSCC in the format set forth in reference (b).

- c. Air Sentries and Lockouts.
- (1) Air sentries will be positioned at artillery firing positions. Sentries will pass "Check Fire" when friendly aircraft are observed approaching or in a danger area.
 - (2) Artillery forward observers and Naval Gunfire spotters will check firing when it appears that the projectile trajectories will endanger friendly aircraft.
- d. Restrictive Fire Plan.
- (1) When massed artillery and/or naval gunfire could endanger a air support mission, a restrictive fire plan may be employed. The unit FSCC will promulgate the restrictive fire plan. IAW reference (b).
 - (2) The unit requesting an air support mission will recommend restrictive fire plan if deemed appropriate.
 - (3) Ground commanders will exercise prudent judgement in the use of restrictive fire plans to permit maximum use of all supporting arms available in accomplishment of ground force mission.
- e. Landing Zone preparation
- (1) Helicopter landing zones will be prepared by supporting arms, as required, prior to their use by helicopters executing a tactical lift.

CONFIDENTIAL5. SAFETY OF GROUND FORCES.

- a. Fire Coordination Line (FCL). A line between two forces beyond which fires may not be delivered without coordinating with the affected force. Fires with effects extending across the line must be cleared with the headquarters of the force on the other side of the line before firing. The FCL is established by the headquarters which controls both forces and should follow easily identifiable terrain features.
- b. Units operating independently outside SOR will be enclosed by a FCL to insure safety from friendly fires. The 7th Marines FSCC will put the FCL into effect upon notification by the unit involved and will notify appropriate agencies of the location and duration of the FCL.
- c. Free Fire/No Fire Zone: This technique is normally used when a unit is going to operate either outside the 7th Marines SOR or in an area which lies within another unit's SOR. Authority to operate in such areas will be obtained through 7th Marines S-3. Once approval has been obtained to so operate a no fire/free fire zone should be requested from the 7th Marines FSCC. This zone will be a free fire zone to the requesting unit and a no fire zone to the unit in whose SOR the area lies.

(3) Organize all defense installations within the sub-sector insuring close coordination of fires with adjacent and supporting units.

(4) Insure close supervision of ambushes, patrols, listening posts, emplacement of weapons and bunkers and use of claymore mines and booby traps by commissioned and/or non-commissioned officers.

(5) Coordinate planning, training and exercises pertaining to ground defense.

(6) Provide the necessary training in infantry tactics appropriate to each individual's grade and assignment.

(7) Determine requirements for provisional forces in accordance with the policies established in paragraphs 6, 6a and 6b of reference (a) and be prepared to submit recommendations as required.

(8) Execute such approved defense plans and orders as the CO, 7th Marines designates.

(9) Establish priorities of work for organizations and units within assigned sectors in matters related to field fortifications, barrier and obstacle installations, and removal of hazards to ground defense positions.

(10) Future instructions include:

(a) Battle positions to be organized within each sub-sector.

(b) Conditions under which battle positions will be occupied.

(c) Requirements for coordination with other sub-sectors and forces.

(d) Other orders and instructions pertaining to ground defense as required to accomplish the assigned ground defense mission.

(11) Insure defense of assigned vital areas such as bridges, ferry crossings, and other designated areas. Vital areas must be kept under observation at all times. Obstacles and barriers protecting vital areas will be covered by fire. A positive civilian/boat/traffic control policy will be established and enforced for each vital area.

1. SITUATION.

- a. Enemy Forces. Annex E (Intelligence) and current INTSUNS and PERINTREPS.
- b. Friendly Forces. Reference (a).

2. MISSION. 7th Marines assigned corollary mission of providing defense to vital areas. The nature of operation requires establishment of a limited number of combat bases.

3. EXECUTION.

- a. Concept of Operations.

(1) In counterinsurgent warfare, static positions such as combat bases generally command nothing. These positions are useful insofar as they provide for conducting aggressive combat operations. As our effectiveness is largely a function of the number of troops we can commit to the task of pursuing and destroying the enemy, a static position best serves its purpose when it can be adequately defended by a minimum of forces.

(2) As a corollary, only the number of combat bases commensurate with the need to patrol outlying terrain regularly should be maintained. Occupying terrain because it may be high ground or because it has been occupied previously is not acceptable. "Holding ground" is a concept contrary to the nature of the ~~VIETNAM~~ war and dissipates our combat power.

(3) Major improvements are required in our combat bases in order to free more Marines for offensive action. Re-evaluate the need for small-unit positions presently maintained to determine if their continued occupation contributes to our offensive mission. Determine if company sites now maintained are best located for accomplishment of their offensive mission and if they are organized so that a minimum number of Marines are required for their defenses.

(4) Particular attention is required for C A P, platoon and smaller positions because of their special vulnerability to VC attack. Junior officers and, for the most part, very junior NCOs command these positions. They carry a

heavy responsibility with relatively limited experience. They must be assisted by close supervision and detailed command guidance.

CHECK LIST FOR DEFENSE OF COMBAT BASES

1. KEEP THE INITIATIVE. Conduct aggressive day and night patrolling and ambushes during each 24 hour period. This is the first line of defense. As a general rule, you should be able to free two-thirds of your force for such offensive action and still provide adequate defense of the combat base for several days.
2. LISTENING POSTS AND OBSERVATION POSTS FOR EARLY WARNING. These are a vital part of any defense. Listening posts, as a general rule, will be within one to three hundred meters of the defensive perimeter, closer on smaller positions. They must be provided with communications. Go into position after dark. And be located in a different position every night. Observation posts on commanding terrain or likely routes of approach provide early warning during day light hours.
3. AVOID SETTING PATTERNS. Vary all of your activities. If the enemy cannot establish a pattern in the conduct of your defense, he is far less likely to risk an attack. If you set a pattern he will know it and use it against you.
4. OBSERVATION AND FIELDS OF FIRE. Defensive positions, except in unusual circumstances, will not be located within the confines of hamlets or heavy vegetation where observation and fields of fire are limited. Observation must be unobstructed between positions and to the front of each position to a distance of roughly 25 meters beyond tactical wire.
5. EARLY WARNING DEVICES. Use SID's forward of the wire on most likely routes of approach. Make extensive use of trip flares, inside the wire and in the wire.
6. CLAYMORES. Use claymores inside tactical wire to cover most likely routes of enemy penetration. Claymores will be sandbagged, camouflaged and, if consistent with the tactical situation, taken in daily. As a general rule do not aim claymores toward nearby hamlets where accidental discharge would result in civilian casualties.
7. TACTICAL WIRE. Wire must be beyond hand grenade range from every fighting position. Concertina is for hasty defense only. Reinforce and replace with double apron as soon as possible.
8. FIGHTING POSITIONS MUTUALLY SUPPORTED. All positions will afford clear observation and fields of fire to adjacent positions to assure mutual support and interlocking fires. Firing apertures will be low enough to permit grazing fire and wide enough to allow a wide field of fire.

9. PREPARATION OF POSITIONS. If fighting positions are located on high ground, dig deep to provide a low, minimal silhouette. On low ground monsoon rains may necessitate an elevated position. Overhead cover on emplacements must be strong enough to preclude cave-in and to withstand mortars or our own VP artillery fire over the position. Entrances will be large enough to allow rapid entry and egress.
10. ALTERNATE POSITIONS. As time permits, alternate fighting positions will be prepared, linked with interconnecting trenches to the primary position.
11. COMMUNICATION CENTER. A command bunker to include communications gear should be centrally located well within the perimeter. Where feasible, alternate communications will be located in a separate position. Quarters and other common use facilities should also be located inside, not on, the perimeter and should be sandbagged in all cases.
12. MAXIMIZE USE OF SUPPORTING ARMS. Preplan artillery fires to box in the perimeter and prearranged pyrotechnics signal to call preplanned artillery in the event of communication failure.
13. REACTION FORCES. Develop reaction plans for relief of small unit positions. Reconnoiter routes and rehearse the plan but not with sufficient frequency to give away your primary routes. Where feasible avoid roads and the most obvious routes which are likely to be mined or ambushed in the event of attack. Establish pyrotechnic signals with the supported unit in the event of communication failure. Reactions must be immediate, violent, and utilize maximum force and fire power available.
14. THINK. Do not automatically accept a defensive posture because someone else organized it that way. Ground is not important. Don't tie down Marines to defend more area than you actually must hold. Question the value and purpose of each fighting position. Decide why it is there and whether it is needed. Use your imagination and your experience to constantly improve the overall defense. And most important, keep your Marines alert ----- especially when you haven't been hit in a long time.

1. SITUATION.

- a. Enemy Forces. Annex B (Intelligence). Current INTSUMS and PERINTPREPS.
 b. Friendly Forces. Ref (b)

2. MISSION. 7th Marines conducts motorized convoy movements between areas as directed; conducts visual reconnaissance of highways and surrounding areas; demonstrates capability to use highway; and protects convoys from enemy attacks.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. Elements of 7th Mar escort military convoy movements between DANANG, RVN and designated areas as directed. Convoys will consist of 2½ ton, 5 ton or equivalent vehicles with necessary support and control vehicles. Security escort will be provided as well as supporting arms for cover throughout the route to destination and for return. All protective measures will be taken to insure safe arrival of convoys. Reference (c).

b. Classification of Military Convoys. Convoys will be designated as tactical or administrative by this Headquarters.

(1) Tactical convoys exploit motor transport mobility for timely delivery of troops and supplies to their destinations in the proper formation and condition for the accomplishment of a combat mission.

(2) Administrative convoys exploit use of available transportation. Tactical considerations are of less importance than economical use of cargo capabilities and operating personnel.

c. Assigned Infantry Battalion.

- (1) On order, assign one infantry company (Rein) as convoy escort.

- (a) Reinforce with FAU's, NIF spot teams, and FOL's as required.
 - (b) Designate Convoy Commander.
- (2) On order, assign one platoon (rein) as convoy reserve,
- (a) Be prepared on 30-minute alert for helicopterborne movement to convoy location in event of attack.
 - (b) On order chop OPCON reserve to Convoy Commander.
 - (c) Assigned Artillery Battalion. Provide artillery support as designated by 11th Marines. (Annex D ESOC),
 - (d) Assigned Motor Transport Battalion.
 - (1) As designated by CG, 1st Mar Div.
 - (2) Coordinate planning and execution of administrative convoys. Direct liaison with supporting units authorized.
 - (e) Assigned Engineer Battalion. Provide engineer support as designated by CG, 1st Mar Div.
 - (f) Assigned Antitank Battalion. Provide convoy security as designated by CG, 1st Mar Div.
 - (g) Coordinating Instructions.
 - (1) Convoys will be conducted on order of this Headquarters. Tactical convoys will be coordinated by this Headquarters who will conduct convoy. Administrative convoys will be coordinated by motor transport battalion who will conduct convoy.
 - (2) Instructions on personnel and material to be transported, number of cargo vehicles assigned, communication instructions, destination and departure time will be provided to assigned units by this Headquarters.
 - (3) Convoy Commander will report total number of vehicles by type of cargo, communication, supporting arms, wreckers, tracked vehicles and other information, to this Headquarters prior to departure.
 - (4) Convoy Commander will report convoy location at least once every hour by check points, (Appendix 2).
 - (5) Infantry unit is responsible for hardening beds of vehicles. Motor transport battalion will harden vehicle cabs.

(6) Destruction of vehicles and equipment will be on authority of this Headquarters except in extreme emergency when the company commander is authorized to execute destructive measures to prevent capture of vehicles and equipment.

(7) Rules of Engagement in accordance with reference (b) Annex I (Rules of Engagement).

(8) DERLAUTH.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. Reference (d).

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATION - ELECTRONICS.

a. Command.

(1) Because tactical convoys are movements to contact, the troop commander commands the tactical movement for either organic or direct support vehicles. Motor transport commanders act as subordinate commanders and advisors to the tactical commander.

(2) When a truck unit is not assigned or attached to the unit being transported but in direct support, such as administrative convoys, command of the convoy and of each serial or march unit remains with the truck unit commander and his representative at their respective levels. The troop commander being transported retains full command of his troops and issues any orders necessary to confirm and implement those issued by the convoy commander concerning schedules, march discipline and operation of the convoy.

(3) When combat troops are being transported on an administrative convoy and a tactical emergency arises, the senior unrestricted line officer assumes command.


(4) The senior officer or noncommissioned officer of troops in each truck commands the personnel transported in that truck. He is responsible for discipline and compliance with convoy regulations and other standing operating procedures. The vehicle driver is responsible for safe operation of the vehicle and is required to insure that personnel being transported observe safety and other regulations. The troop commander does not interfere with the proper operation of the vehicle, but it is his duty to take immediate action in case of dereliction on the part of the driver and to report such dereliction.



Annex G (Civil Affairs/Civic Action) to Operation Order 301A-67

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces. Current INTSUMS and PERINTREPS.

b. Friendly Forces

(1) Assumptions

(a) There will be multiple contacts between units of the 7th Marines and local inhabitants in the area of operations.

(b) As hamlets are cleared, inhabitants will be temporarily relocated in many instances. Control of these refugees will be at the discretion of unit commanders.

(c) Some temporary refugees may request evacuation as permanent refugees.

(d) Clearing operations may produce civilian casualties.

(e) Hamlets that have been cleared will offer many opportunities for unit civil affairs teams to render medical assistance and to disseminate political propaganda.

(f) MedCap supplies will be available for use by the civil affairs team.

2. MISSION. To support the operation by providing medical assistance for civilian population, to aid refugees, to create good will, and to offer political indoctrination to induce the people to support their legally constituted government.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept of Operations

(1) Refugees requesting evacuation will be sent to the nearest District Headquarters. The Regimental Civil Affairs Officer will be notified of their evacuation as soon as possible.

(2) All substantial quantities of rice or other food stocks that are deemed to belong to the Viet Cong or are available for their use will be transported to the nearest district capital. Vehicular transportation will be utilized if practical and, if not, helicopter requests will be submitted. If the tactical situation dictates, a request for destruction of the food caches will be made to the Regimental Commander.

SECRET

(3) Civilians that become serious casualties will be evacuated to the NSA Hospital, DANANG, and then to USOM Hospital, DANANG. Unit Civil Affairs Officers will coordinate their evacuation with the appropriate Battalion Air Liaison Officer.

(4) All Backlash reports will be submitted to this Headquarters.

(5) Sick call and emergency medical treatment will be provided by civil affairs teams at all practical opportunities.

(6) Civilians will not be needlessly mistreated. Whenever civilians are suffering undue hardships or are in need of medical assistance, the Regimental Civil Affairs Officer will be notified immediately.

(7) Dwellings, domestic structures, and crops will not be indiscriminately damaged or destroyed.

b. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Battalion Civil Affairs Officers will submit daily reports on their activities to the Regimental Civil Affairs Officer. These reports will include the number of civilians provided with medical aid and all other civil affairs activities that occurred during the reporting period.

(2) Local inhabitants will be permitted to return to their homes and hamlets as soon as the military permits.

(3) Commanders will insure that troops are especially careful not to damage graves or premises of any religious establishment.

(4) Troops are not allowed to fraternize with the local populace and they are prohibited from taking any personal belongings from civilians.

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy Forces.

- (1) Annex B (Intelligence).
- (2) Current INTSUMS and PERINTREPS.

b. Friendly Forces. Reference (a).

2. MISSION. Marine elements of Combined Action platoons will organize, train, advise and, as necessary, provide the combat skilled leadership to the Popular Force members in the tasks of destroying the local VC infrastructure, protecting the local friendly government, protecting their common combat base and communications, providing public security, maintaining law and order, organizing intelligence nets, participating in civic action projects and conducting propaganda against the VC.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. The Combined Action platoon is organized to provide a sufficient force to occupy and control areas uncovered by the outward expansion of USMC and ARVN operational areas and to assist in Revolutionary Development efforts in these areas. A Popular Forces platoon native to such an area, assisted by a US Marine Squad, comprises a unit well suited to the task of providing security to hamlets and villages in cleared or semi-cleared areas. USMC and ARVN supporting arms assist the CAP in the accomplishment of its mission. The coordination of activities is the responsibility of the USMC commander in whose area the CAP is located.

b. Assigned Infantry Battalions.

- (1) Assume OPCON of CAP's located in assigned sector.
- (2) Insure that missions and tasks of CAP's are accomplished.
- (3) Insure that training in CAP's is accomplished.

- (4) Establish and maintain communications with CAP's.
- (5) provide supporting arms fires and reaction forces to assist CAP's as tactical situation dictates.
- (6) Employ CAP's, with the concurrence of the District Chief, in operations which correspond to PF's assigned mission. COUNTY FAIR and GOLDEN FLEECE operations are well suited for employment of CAP's.
- (7) Maintain an active inspection program, in coordination with the CAC Sub-Unit, to insure that the operational performance of the CAP's is progressing satisfactorily.
- (8) Insure that Marine and PF personnel are employed only in accordance with their mission.
- (9) Submit reports in accordance with reference (d).

c. Coordinating Instructions:

(1) USMC and PF personnel will work together in Combined Action units to provide security for unstable areas until positive control is established and full responsibility can be relinquished to GVN forces.

(2) Designations:

- (a) PF platoon. All PF units are referred to as platoons.
- (b) Combined Action Platoon. A PF platoon once combined with a Marine Squad becomes a CAP.
- (c) Combined Action Company Headquarters. This is an administrative headquarters that will be generally co-located with the battalion exercising tactical control of the CAP.
- (d) CAC Sub-unit. This administrative unit in Headquarters Battalion will assist in exercising administrative control of Marine/Navy personnel in the Combined Action program. The Sub-unit will also exercise direct command over the Combined Action Company Headquarters.

(3) Training. Training will be adjusted to the particular needs and requirements of the unit concerned consistent with the basic mission of rear area security.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. Reference (b).


SECRET5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS.a. Command.

(1) Operational control of PF units rests with the district, village or hamlet chief. Through mutual agreement and cooperation, battalion commanders exercise operational control of CAP's within their assigned sector of the TAOR. Direct liaison is authorized with the district, village or hamlet chiefs regarding employment of CAP's.

(2) The Marine squad leader commands his squad and the assigned corpsmen but does not command the PF element of the CAP or its personnel. His relationship to the PF platoon commander is that of an advisor and coordinator of joint activities. The Marine squad leader influences actions of the PF personnel by example and by development of a spirit of cooperation and of an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect.

1. General

a. Rules of engagement herein are prescribed to minimize noncombatant personnel and property losses which may occur in execution of military operations against enemies of RVN.

b. The use of unnecessary force leading to noncombatant battle casualties in areas temporarily controlled by enemy will embitter the population, drive them into the arms of the enemy, and make the long range goal of pacification more difficult and costly. Circumstances in RVN call for exercise of restraints not normally required on the battlefield. All unit commanders will apply only that force necessary to accomplish their mission, giving due regard to safety of their command and importance of preventing injury to non-combatant populace.

c. Incidents of noncombatant casualties and destruction of property by RVN/AF and US combat forces are exploited by the enemy to the fullest extent to enhance their objectives, to foster resentment against GVN and US and to permanently alienate the people from GVN.

d. The 1st Mar Div will establish a reputation of being able to move at will throughout assigned area of responsibility and to defeat any enemy force encountered. Concurrently, 1st Mar Div units will constantly demonstrate their concern for the safety of noncombatants, compassion for the injured and willingness to aid and assist the sick, hungry and dispossessed.

2. Application. All commanders are directed to plan and conduct operations in accordance with following guidelines:

a. Both military and psychological objectives of each operation will be considered.

b. Troop indoctrination briefings will be held before each operation to emphasize both short and long range importance of minimizing noncombatant battle casualties.

c. Concurrent air/ground planning to ensure proper selection of helicopter landing zones and proper employment and integration of artillery, naval gunfire and air strikes will avoid unnecessary damage to lives and property of noncombatants.

d. Forward air controllers will be briefed on areas where air strikes should not be called because of the presence of friendly or potentially friendly populace. Such information must be sought from local officials at province and district level.

e. Free strike zones should be configured to avoid populated areas except those in accepted enemy bases.

f. Operations should be planned in coordination with province/sector and district/subsector chiefs with due regard to security of plans. A liaison officer from Marine forces conducting operations in a particular province/sector should be positioned at district/subsector headquarters for coordination. District/subsector advisors will perform this function in absence of liaison officer.

g. With due regard to the security and success of the mission, people will be warned of impending air strikes or operations by leaflets and broadcasts whenever possible. This warning should emphasize that the enemy, by his presence, makes action necessary and that the enemy is directly responsible for damages resulting from combat in populated areas.

h. Hamlets and villages may be attacked without prior warning if the attack is in conjunction with a ground operation involving movement of ground forces through an area, and if, in the judgement of the ground commander, his mission would be jeopardized by such warning.

i. Hamlets or villages not associated with ground operations will not be attacked without prior warning (by leaflets and/or speaker system or other appropriate means) even though light fire is received from them.

j. Participation of Vietnamese forces in operations will be encouraged so that the war does not appear to be a US action against Vietnamese people. Regional and Popular Force participation will be sought at Marine battalion or company level so they may assist in search of private dwellings, obtain information and contribute to the desired effect of cooperative war effort.

k. Assignment to Marine forces of qualified RVNAF liaison officers from appropriate RVNAF commands is essential and will be arranged between Marine commanders and appropriate advisors for each significant operation. These liaison officers, through their knowledge of the area of operations and the population, can assist in identification of personnel and can help ensure close coordination with all Vietnamese forces.

l. In carrying out search and destroy operations, take all practicable measures to minimize destruction of indigenous private property and to ensure its proper control, disposition, and safeguarding. Plans will include procedures for protection of private property and reporting, security and disposition of excess supplies.

m. A civic action plan shall support each operation even if the area has been controlled by the enemy. As each situation dictates, operation plans shall provide for utilization of all available assets to include a program for dispensing of medical supplies, transportation and distribution of emergency rations, medical evacuation of injured or sick regardless of suspected or known political affiliation, and light engineering work within the capabilities of tactical units.

n. Whenever possible, utilize appropriate leaflets, airborne loudspeakers, ground loudspeakers and/or face-to-face teams to separate noncombatants from the enemy.

o. The following practices are self-defeating and shall not be tolerated:

(1) Employment of unobserved and unregistered harassing and interdiction fires upon a populated area, when attack from that area is not indicated by available information.

(2) Use of heavy supporting arms upon populated areas when resistance received is not such to impede maneuver of our forces to objective or accomplishment of mission.

(3) Use of noncombatant civilians as the point for combat patrols or for a unit in approach march.

p. Established rules of good military conduct and discipline shall be enforced.

3. Conduct of Operations

a. General

Local instructions shall specify where challenges are required. In those instances where a challenge is required the sequence of engagement shall be:

(a) Normal challenge.

(b) If person challenged makes an overt attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire or commits any other hostile act and thereby endangers life of challenger, challenger may fire.

(c) Unit commanders may prescribe illumination prior to firing if local circumstances allow.

(d) Requirement for challenge may be waived by local commander if required by tactical situation and no friendly forces are known to be operating in the area.

(2) Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area during daylight hours unless under attack.

(3) Warning shots will not be employed on contact with enemy with exception of daytime control of waterborne traffic. Craft failing to respond to challenge may be warned by fire.

(4) Rounds will not be chambered in individual weapons unless contact with enemy is imminent. Senior Marine present will determine if, in his judgement, measures must be taken to preserve lives of 1st MarDiv personnel. Initiation of any offensive or defensive formation implies imminent contact with enemy.

(5) Within TROC and SOR, and during operations in areas external thereto, establishment of a curfew is the responsibility of GVN officials. Assistance in enforcing curfew will normally devolve upon 1st MarDiv organizations and units. In such instances, indigenous personnel will be informed of time limits involved and requirement for strict adherence. It will be further explained that the purpose of the curfew is to ensure that innocent civilians are not mistaken for enemy and shot.

b. Destruction of VN Property

(1) Civilian dwellings will not be burned, nor will private property, and livestock, be destroyed except as an unavoidable consequence of combat actions. Therefore, the firing of tracers into dwellings will be avoided unless absolutely necessary to accomplish the commanders mission.

(2) Destruction of Vietnamese dwellings and livestock as a measure of denying their use to enemy is left to RVN units. Requests from Vietnamese authorities for employment of 1st MarDiv to perform such destruction will be referred to this Hqs.

c. Artillery/Naval Gunfire.

(1) Use of artillery and naval gunfire against known or suspected enemy targets in hamlets and villages occupied by noncombatants is governed by following criteria:

(a) All attacks will be controlled by airborne or ground observers or RVNAF observers and will be executed only after US/GVN/RVNAF approval as appropriate.

(b) Except as specified below, hamlets or villages not associated with ground operations will not be attacked without prior warning (by leaflets and/or speaker systems or other appropriate means) even though fire is received from them.

(c) Villages and hamlets may be attacked without prior warning if the attack is in conjunction with a ground operation involving maneuver of ground forces through the area, and if in the judgement of the ground commander, his mission would be jeopardized by such warning.

(d) The use of incendiary type ammunition will be avoided unless absolutely necessary in the accomplishment of the commander's mission.

(2) In areas exclusive of villages and hamlets, artillery fire and naval gunfire may be directed against enemy forces in contact in accordance with normal procedures. However, unobserved fire will be directed only at targets or target areas declared hostile by GVN, VN liaison personnel, or air and/or ground observers. Further, unobserved naval gunfire will be employed only under exceptional circumstances and in cases where:

(a) Requested naval gunfire support missions fall within specified strike zones approved by GVN/RVNAF as appropriate.

(b) Requested naval gunfire support missions cannot be observed due to geography, weather and other factors.

(c) No US ALC's, FAC's or airborne artillery spotters trained in naval gunfire spotting are available. (Conduct of naval gunfire support missions under this provision must be undertaken as an acknowledged deviation from standard procedures).

(3) All pilots will have knowledge of the disposition of friendly forces and/or civilians prior to conducting strikes. This information may come from ground or air briefing.

(4) For purposes of this order, references to Forward Air Controller (FAC) also encompass and apply to Marine Tactical Air Coordinator Airborne (TACA) and Aerial Observers (AO) when appropriate.

(5) USAF, USMC and USN strike aircraft will normally be controlled by the following in order of preference as listed.

*(a) US Air Force ALO/FAC or Marine TACA/FAC.

*(b) VNAF FAC/FAO.

*(c) USAF MSQ-77 (SKY SPOT) or USMC TPQ-10.

*Under VFR conditions, when a USAF, USMC, or VNAF FAC is not available, a qualified Army Target Identifying Pilot (TIP) may designate the target and flight leader of strike aircraft will control strike.

(6) In an emergency, when no qualified means of control is available, following personnel may designate a target for strike aircraft:

(a) Commander of a ground unit or US advisor to a unit engaged with Viet Cong.

(b) US pilot of an airplane or helicopter supporting a ground unit, who has radio contact with ground unit involved and/or can identify friendly positions in relation to enemy positions.

(c) US pilot of an airplane or helicopter required to operate within vicinity of hostile village or hamlet for the purpose of conducting a medical evacuation or supply mission, and where enemy fire presents an immediate threat to lives of helicopter or transport crew.

(7) Close Air Support missions that involve strikes on hamlets or villages must always be controlled by a FAC. If attack on a village or hamlet is deemed necessary and is executed in conjunction with a ground operation involving movement of ground forces through an area, attack may be made without warning; however, appropriate US/GVN/RVNAF approval is required, except in emergencies. In an attack on a village or hamlet is not in conjunction with any immediate ground operation, inhabitants must be warned by leaflets and/or loudspeaker system prior to attack and must be given sufficient time to evacuate area.

e. Specific Instructions for Close Air Support to Include Interdiction (Day or Night):

(1) ALO/FAC will:

(a) Have through knowledge of ground scheme of maneuver.

(b) Make every effort to secure VNAF observer to assist in directing an air strike. If VNAF observer is not available an ALO/FAC is authorized to direct air strikes.

(c) Maintain reliable communications with ground unit and with strike aircraft.

(d) Make positive identification and mark target.

(e) Ensure that strike pilots are aware of friendly locations in relation to the target, characteristics of target area, and local weather conditions.

(f) Use 1:50,000 scale maps of target area, and photographs when available.

CONFIDENTIAL(2) **Strike Pilots will:**

(a) Always be under control and have direct radio contact for a strike with a FAC or designated control agency (Airborne or ground).

(b) Have visual contact with the target or target marker except as noted in paragraph (e) below.

(c) Always ascertain position of friendly troops (or civilians, when applicable).

(d) Ascertain local conditions regarding weather, target area, and surrounding terrain characteristics.

(e) Defend themselves against ground fire providing:

1. Source of fire can be visually identified.

2. Strike can be positively oriented against source.

3. Fire is of such intensity that counter-action is necessary.

(f) Strike at night only with flares, unless under control of TPQ-10 or MSQ-77.

f. **Border Restrictions for Aircraft Conducting Assigned Missions in RVN.**

(1) Aircraft will not cross demilitarized zone or Cambodian border unless specific authorization is obtained by this Hq.

(2) All FACs operating in vicinity of border will have a 1:50,000 map of target area. Maps, mosaics, and photos will be made available to pilots.

(3) Joint operations-intelligence facilities will be established and complete prestrike briefings and poststrike debriefings will be conducted for strikes within 5000 meters of border, when practical.

(4) Cambodian border restrictions which are additional to above:

(a) Strike aircraft within 5000 meters of Cambodian border will be under positive control of FAC or MSQ-77/TPQ-10. Authority to waive this requirement must be obtained by this Hq.

(b) All organizations responsible for planning or execution of missions within 5 km of the border will have posted in operations a 1:250,000 or larger scale map on which the Cambodian border is distinctly marked, on RVN side, to depth of 5 km.

(c) Aircraft supporting border outposts (fire support, reconnaissance, supply, and transportation) are allowed to operate as necessary in outpost area, but will neither cross nor fire across the border.

g. Jettison

(1) Munitions will be jettisoned only in designated specified strike zones.

(2) During night or IFR conditions, aircraft will be under positive radar control while jettisoning.

(3) During day VFR drops will be monitored by radar whenever possible.

h. US Armed Helicopters

(1) US Army and US Marine armed helicopters will be marked "US Army" or "US Marines," as appropriate, and may be manned with all-US crews at unit commanders discretion.

(2) If target involves noncombatants, such as in hamlet or village, an RVNAF observer will be aboard helicopter whenever possible and US/GVN/RVNAF approval to fire must be obtained unless the situation clearly presents an immediate threat to the lives of the crew.

i. Air Reconnaissance and Aerial Surveillance Missions

(1) Operational restrictions placed upon reconnaissance aircraft near RVN/Cambodian border for the purpose of insuring that inadvertent overflights do not occur, preclude aerial reconnaissance over large areas within RVN where significant enemy activity is known to be taking place. In order to eliminate immunity of such areas to observation and photography, these restrictions may be waived on a case-by-case basis.

(2) Requests for reconnaissance coverage in areas which present a danger of overflight or border violation will be forwarded through normal reconnaissance request channels.

(3) US Army OV-1 aircraft may be armed with target marking ordnance while on surveillance missions.

4. Post Operations

a. Where feasible, follow each operation with PsyWar/C₁ team to explain to population what happened and how to avoid future non-combatant casualties.

b. Following each operation wherein noncombatant casualties and/or property damage have occurred, coordinate with province/district chief concerned on prompt identification of those affected. Consideration should also be given at this time to appropriate civic action measures.

5. Miscellaneous

a. USMC units do not have authority to exercise police powers over Vietnamese people; hence majority of controls will have to be established by National Police, Army of Vietnam Military Police, or other ARVN military units and Regional and Popular Force units as appropriate. In event of civil disturbance, nearest Vietnamese National Police establishment will be notified. 1st MarDiv units will take no action other than to defend themselves and US property.

1. Policy. Control measures will be established in order to limit enemy access to the following controlled items: rice, money, medicine, contraband and food caches consistent with guidelines below:

a. Rice

(1) The rice which fills enemy caches is the product of an increasingly burdensome enemy tax program imposed on peasantry in areas which the enemy controls or to which they have access. Discovery of this rice and its return to villagers in the immediate area constitutes an opportunity for generation of a major psychological impact in support of US/RVN objectives. Use of recovered rice for civic action purposes also reduces the drain on government rice supplies and transportation. It is desired, therefore, that Marine commanders be alert in order to exploit enemy rice stocks for civic action purposes and also to reduce the drain on government rice supplies and transportation.

(2) Rice harvests will be controlled on a planned basis within the capability of available forces. Requests to destroy rice or rice fields which cannot be controlled will be referred to this Hqs. Approval of such destruction will be granted only when assurances that legitimate food needs of the local populace can be anticipated and provided for by GVN provincial authorities, monitored and assisted by US members of the Provincial Team.

(3) Commanding Officers will insure that these provisions are carefully explained to all hands. Further, rice and foodstuffs will be destroyed only as a last resort. Where on-hand-resources are inadequate for evacuation of such rice and foodstuffs, assistance will be requested from higher echelon. Where rice caches are destroyed a written report will be submitted to this Hq.

(4) Procedures to be followed in protection of rice crops are:

(a) Determine areas which produce large quantities of rice and establish priorities for protecting these areas.

(b) Conduct joint and combined military and police operations to protect people during rice harvesting.

(c) Protect convoys transporting rice harvest to agricultural cooperatives and farmers associations.

(d) Initiate propaganda activities and psychological warfare urging people to sell their rice only to GVN authorities or legal rice traders.

(e) Deny to the enemy, rice from paddies farmed or controlled by him. If enemy rice paddies are not accessible, consideration will be given to the use of herbicides to destroy the crop. Final decision to use herbicides always rests with GVN and always requires complete coordination of US and GVN agencies involved.

(5) Specific instructions for protection of rice harvests are contained in Annex S. (Golden Fleece Operation)

b. Money

(1) The enemy relies heavily on extortion of money from RVN populace to finance his aggression. They have extorted about 2 to 4 billion piasters during the past twelve months. About 75% of this money was extorted from the people in the form of an alleged tax on agricultural produce and industrial goods; the balance was extorted from commercial civilian traffic on roads, trails and waterways of RVN. Many of these "tax collection points" are in areas which are accessible from the 1st MarDiv area of responsibility and can be successfully interdicted. Within assigned sectors of the TAOR and during operations outside the TAOR, organizations will coordinate with ARVN, FE... R, those activities aimed at neutralizing enemy sources of money and money instruments. These activities are primarily attacks on enemy "tax collection" points on roads and waterways and provision of assistance to local populace in evading so-called enemy taxes and bond-selling efforts. Captured funds will be handled in accordance with reference (b).

c. Medicines

(1) The enemy obtains medicines from Communist countries and by direct or indirect purchase in RVN from commercial establishments. NVN units bring a basic supply of medicine with them from North Vietnam and thereafter depend primarily on local purchase. Medicines are transported from cities and towns by every means of transportation using roads, trails, and waterways to enemy distribution points. Some medicines are also obtained by selective hijacking of civilian traffic. Local enemy sources of medicine must be identified and neutralized.

(2) Captured or abandoned enemy medical stores or material including medical items which are determined or suspected to be contaminated, outdated or uncertified will not be intentionally destroyed.

(3) Captured enemy medical supplies may be used for the care and treatment of wounded or sick enemy personnel, but only when such use is under the supervision of enemy medical personnel. The enemy medical supplies will not be used by U. S. medical personnel except in an emergency due to nonavailability of U. S. medical items of the type required.

(4) Captured enemy medical supplies have great potential for harm due to unknown enemy standards of quality and doubtful enemy capability for adequate quality control of items. Release of captured medical supplies to local GVN officials or other relief agencies in the field will not be made except in cases of urgent humanitarian need when U. S. supplies of the type and quantity required are not available. Such release will be limited to types and quantities of items required to meet the existing medical emergency as determined by the U. S. Military Surgeon in the incident area. The release will be reported in the next sitrep to include types and quantities of items, date of release, name and location of recipient(s) and intended purpose for which released.

(5) Every effort shall be made to extract all captured medical supplies by capturing units through established channels. If all available means have been exhausted and extraction remains impossible, they shall be left intact and in place. Date, location, and estimate of quantities shall be reported to this headquarters.

d. Contraband.

(1) All contraband seized by units will be turned into this headquarters for appropriate disposal.

e. Food Caches

(1) Large food caches, obviously over and above needs of local population as determined by local GVN officials, will be reported to this headquarters for appropriate disposal. For extractions, where private ownership is claimed, a receipt system will be utilized. General security for extraction operations and packaging materials and transportation may be provided if requested by GVN officials. Plans should provide for availability of those resources. The following measures, as a minimum, should be coordinated with the local GVN officials:

(a) Procedures for informing GVN officials of locations and amounts of food supplies discovered.

(b) Procedures for provision of necessary labor, packaging materials, and transportation to permit extraction.

(c) Provision for GVN to furnish receipts for supplies extracted when private ownership is claimed.

(d) Procedures for use of 1st Mar Div personnel to furnish security elements during extraction operations.

By taking to water, enemy avoids friendly patrols and ambushes, and supports his forces logistically with minimum manpower requirement. Effective interdiction of such traffic is vital element in reduction and eventual destruction of enemy military effectiveness. The enemy will attempt to destroy bridges.

(5) ARVN Forces. QUANG DA SPECIAL ZONE and QUANG NAM SECTOR provide forces upon request and if available for coordinated bridge security with Free World Military Allied Forces.

(6) Attachments and Detachments

(a) DIRLAUTH

2. MISSION. 7th Mar in addition to continuation of the defense of assigned sectors, will interdict and maintain control of all bridges and ferries within respective sectors.

3. EXECUTIONa. Concept of Operation

(1) 7th Mar (-) (Rein) in coordination with local GVN officials ensure that proper and adequate security is provided to ensure day and night control of all bridges. References (c), (d) and (e) outline procedures to be used for waterway interdiction. Since both interdiction of waterways and bridge security are closely related the principles involved are of necessity compatible.

b. Assigned Infantry Battalions

(1) Provide close-in physical security and control of bridges located within assigned sector.

(2) Conduct coordinated patrols and ambushes in vicinity of assigned bridges.

(3) Establish defensive positions to ensure positive control of all bridge approaches, both on top and under bridges.

(4) Establish shore, river and bridge traffic control and checkpoints as necessary.

(5) Employ patrols along river banks and under bridges at low tide to discover enemy attempts to bury or emplace weapons, or mines.

(6) Develop a supporting arms fire and illumination plan to support bridge security and defense.

(7) Utilize available equipment such as AN/APS-21, infrared devices SID's, etc. to enhance bridge security.

(8) Conduct leaflet drops, loudspeaker broadcasts and other Psy Warfare operations to stress to Vietnamese people the importance of the bridges to their security and welfare. Stress that people should inform Americans of any VC attempts or plans to attack bridges.

(9) Carefully control, inspect and check all boat traffic approaching bridges. Maintain observation of all watercraft passing under bridges.

(10) Employ swimmers and divers to check underwater pilings and bridge supports.

(11) Ensure that necessary fire fighting equipment is available on each bridge in event of fire on creosote bridging material.

(12) Position supporting arms to enhance bridge security.

(13) When resources are available, establish towers, searchlights, utilize starlight scopes, install barriers, deadman cables, and assign boats in vicinity of assigned bridges.

(14) Enforce curfew and establish close liaison and coordination with District officials.

(15) Insure control of all vehicles or personnel who cross bridges or catwalks.

(16) Utilize GAC's to extent possible for assistance in providing bridge security forces.

c. Coordinating Instructions

(1) During the hours of darkness, there is no authorized river traffic. All boats approaching bridges at night will be fired upon.

(2) Requests for LVT's, Swift Boats and Junk Fleet and other support will be made through this Headquarters

(3) Request for psychological warfare assistance from this Headquarters.

(1) Coast Guard Cutters may be called on 408ke (SSB/USB), 46.4mc (VHF/FM), 277.8mc (HF) or 301.0mc (UHF) in event of emergency. Call is "ARTICLE" for net control station. "ARTICLE" plus unit letter or "ARTICLE UNIT" may be used to call ships.

(2) Swift Boats (PCF) may be called on 4085ke (SSB/USB) or 46.4mc (VHF/FM) in event of emergency. Call is "NEWSBOY INDIA" for net control station. "NEWSBOY INDIA" plus hull number or "NEWSBOY UNIT" may be used to call boats. Swifts have equipment to guard infantry unit UHF/FM tactical nets as required.

(3) In all requests for support, unit voice call and frequency will be designated.

(4) All naval units hold KAC 138 numeral and authentication code. They do not hold "KAC-Q" series.

(5) If operations with the "JUNK FLEET" are contemplated, a liaison radio operator from the using unit should be stationed aboard the junk for the duration of the operation.

(6) In the message requesting the use of Swift Boats or Junks, the unit will specify the following:

- (a) Unit Call Sign and frequency.

2. Mission. 7th Mar in addition to continuation of the defense of assigned Sector will interdict and maintain control of the area extending from grid square BF 0174 to a distance of ten kilometers; this area is commonly referred to as the Rocket Belt; Appendix 3 (Rocket Belt and Approach Route Overlay)

3. Executiona. Concept of Operation

(1) 7th Mar (Rein) in coordination with ARVN forces and local GVN officials conducts extensive search and clear, patrols and ambush operations and other denial measures in the Rocket Belt to prevent employment of enemy rockets, to detect those which may be used and to react to any rocket attack.

b. Assigned Infantry Battalions

(1) Conduct increased and extensive patrolling and ambushing in Rocket Belt and along waterways to interdict enemy movement to firing sites and to detect evidence of preparation of launching sites.

(2) Establish observation posts and listening posts to detect movement toward and in the Rocket Belt.

(3) Ensure that adequate measures and means are established to provide for prompt reporting of any activity related to enemy attack or preparations therefor.

(4) Schedule H&I fires.

(5) Fire random illumination for greater night surveillance.

(6) Conduct aerial reconnaissance of Rocket Belt and avenues of approach into the area.

(7) Interrogate all detainees and friendly villagers to determine possible movement of heavy weapons.

(8) Request AO aerial coverage of area.

(9) When resources are available, establish additional towers, searchlight and Xenon light positions to assist in Rocket Belt surveillance.

(10) Position supporting arms to enhance Rocket Belt control.

(11) Conduct leaflet drops, loudspeaker broadcasts and other Psy Warfare Operations as required to stress theme that people should help Marines and that rewards will be paid for information concerning weapons or enemy movement.

(12) Include Rocket Belt in organizational counter mortar/rocket fire plans.

(13) Submit Spot Reports of any activity which relates to the Rocket Belt.

(14) Maintain one rifle platoon (main) on thirty minute alert to deploy to Rocket Belt or to block egress from that area. The Sparrowhawk platoon may be utilized for this contingency.

1. SUMMARY OF THE ENEMY SITUATION.

a. Background. As a result of the recent rocket attacks on the DANANG Airfield, the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division, has declared a probable rocket belt in a 10,000 meter area around the airfield. Every available means must be employed to prevent a recurrence of the attack.

2. ORIENTATION. The area included in this estimate is the NE portion of UANG NAM Province, specifically the area surrounding, and approximately 10,000 meters from DANANG city. It is the area bounded by the AT 82 North-South grid line on the north, the AT 91 East-West Grid line on the west, the AT 63 North-South grid line on the south, and the seacoast on the east. This area includes the SE and southern portions of the HOA VANG District, the eastern portion of HIEU DUC District, and the northern portion of DIEN BAN District within which the rocket belt lies.

(1) Relief. The southern and southeastern portions of the rocket belt are characterized by flat rice paddy/dry crop type terrain which is interdicted by numerous tree lines and villages. The northern and north-eastern portions of the rocket belt are characterized by thickly vegetated hill masses which are interdicted by low river valleys.

(2) Drainage. There are numerous streams and rivers in the southern half of the rocket belt. The two principle rivers in the rocket belt are the SONG YEN and SONG TUY LOAN. These two rivers flow together at AP 969699 and form the SONG CAU DO, which in turn flows into the SONG HAN.

2. ROUTES OF COMMUNICATIONS.

a. Roads. There are numerous roads running through the rocket belt. All weather roads include National Route # 1 and Highway # 545. Fair or dry weather roads include Liberty Road, Highway # 5, Highway # 542 and Highway # 540.

b. Overland Travel. The southern portion of the rocket belt is quite accessible by overland travel. Overland travel in the northern portion is more restricted but provides easy access as long as the valleys are followed.

Units possessing rocket capabilities: Unconfirmed. It is not known if any of the units mentioned possess 140mm rockets. A recent interrogation report did link the R-20 LF Bn with the last rkt attack on DANANG airbase. It has been reported that the rkts come directly from MR-V Hq located in QUANG NGAI Province.

2. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE 140mm ROCKET. The 140mm rkt is 42 5/8" long and weighs 84 pounds, with a 57 1/2" long warhead. It is electrically initiated, spin stabilized, point estimating round. The rkt may be fired singly or by phasing a series of rkts to a single firing point. The rkt launcher is a single metal tube mounted on a wooden board with very simple elevation and deflection mechanisms. The maximum range of the rkt is between 9,000 and 10,000 meters. The optimum firing range is between 6,000 and 8,000 meters. The rocket, in the past, has been employed near a water network for ease in disposing of equipment/ammunition in case of discovery. In the past two attacks the rkt positions were aligned generally perpendicular to the airfield complex.

3. ENEMY CAPABILITIES. The enemy is capable of launching a swift, limited rkt attack upon the DANANG airbase at any time. He is also capable of launching a simultaneous attack from several positions. Factors which favor another attack on the DANANG airbase are:

a. The VC can claim a major victory by rocketing the airbase and increase their prestige among the VN population.

b. The VC can inflict a maximum of damage and casualties upon U.S. forces while suffering a minimum loss to themselves if not detected rapidly.

(b) The SONG VU GIA east of N-S grid line 87 and the SONG AI NGHIA are unrestricted during the daylight hours. Patrols along the river hail and search any boat on the water but their movements are otherwise free. There is no authorized traffic after dark.

(c) Traffic on the SONG THU BON between (AT 918534) and (BT 001553) is by permit only. Boats are hailed and searched during daylight hours. There is no authorized traffic after dark.

(d) The river between (AT 942593) and the eastern TAOR boundary is authorized for boat traffic in daylight only.

(e) The SONG YEN is presently open to daylight traffic, but is soon to be closed in cooperation with the 51st Regt ARVN.

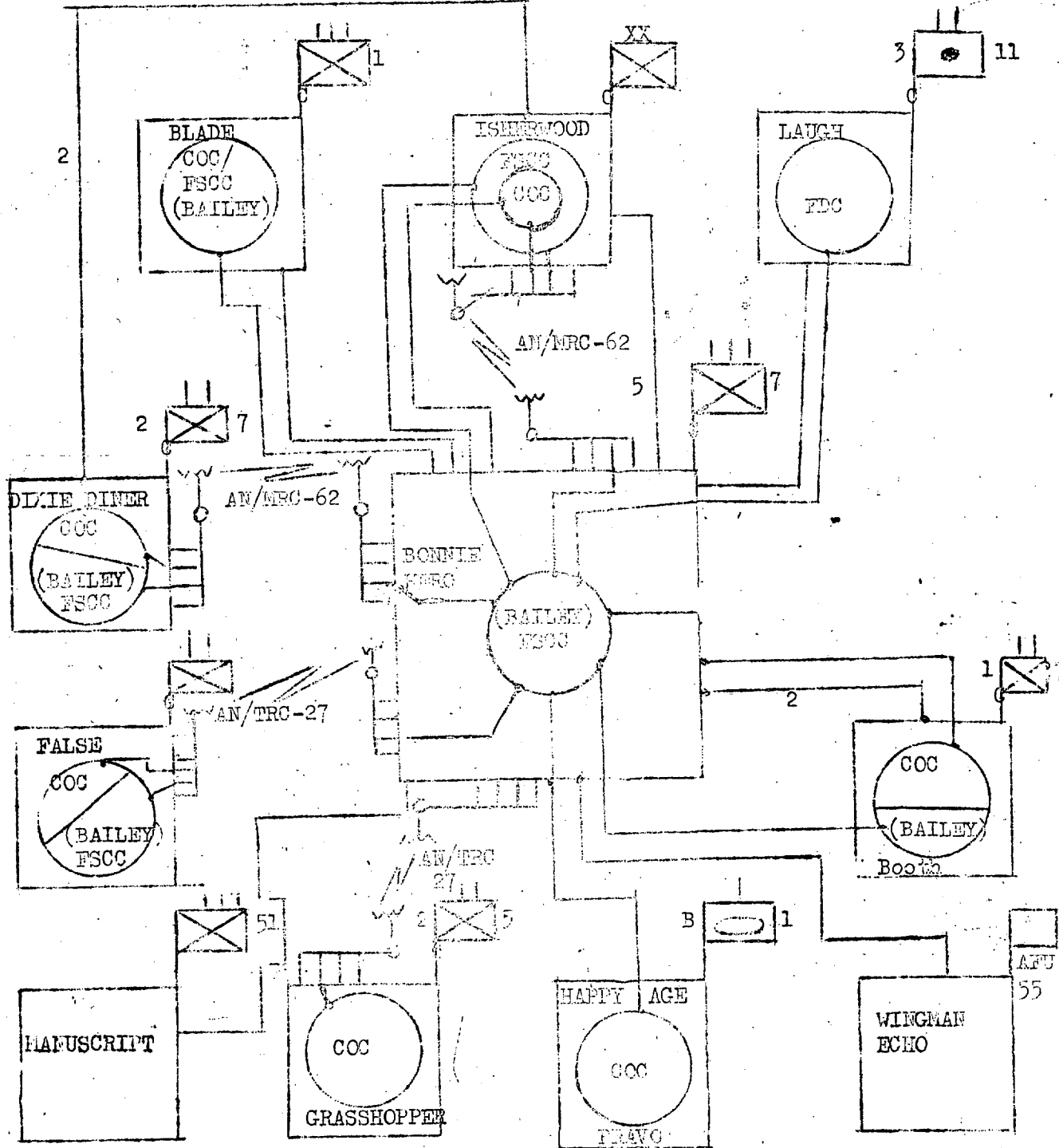

- (6) Vietnamese Air Force (VNAF). Conducts air operations in support of ARVN Forces.

2. PROCEDURES.

a. General

- (1) Tactical air operations coordination responsibilities and procedures will be determined by doctrine as contained in references (a) through (d).
- (2) General procedures and operational restrictions governing the use of U.S. Military air delivered firepower in RVN are contained in reference (e).
- (3) Air strikes within TACOR/RZ must be under the positive control of a TACP, TAC(A) or ASPT. Air activities outside the 1st Marine Division TACOR/RZ will be in accordance with Annex I (Rules of Engagement).

b. Execution.

- (1) Air requests will be submitted via normal air channels. Routine requests will be submitted to the Division via the Regimental Air Officer by 1000 and priority by 1700 on the day prior to the day desired. The Regimental Air Officer will consolidate all requests from Seventh Marine units and relay them to the Division Air Officer. The Division Air Officer will consolidate all requests from division units in the Da Nang area and submit routine and priority requests to CG, 1st MAW, info CG, III MAF by 1000 and 1800 respectively. Emergency requests may be submitted at any time. All requests for air support will be submitted in the formats set forth in Appendixes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 9. Routine and Priority requirements submitted subsequent to the above time frames will either be delayed or supported only at the expense of earlier acknowledged requirements of lower priority.
- (2) Air-ground planning and liaison will be established for all company strength and larger unit operations involving air support. This planning liaison will be initiated by the Regimental Air Officer at the request of the ground unit. To ensure adequate and timely support, planning and liaison should be established a minimum of 48 hours prior to the operation. Air requirements derived from these planning conferences will be submitted to the Regimental Air Officer by 0900 of the day prior to the operation, in accordance with Appendix 9.

- (3) On call missions (para. 3a (3) below) may be scheduled in support of a particular operation. Aircraft scheduled for this purpose are not normally available for missions other than those for which specifically scheduled.
- (4) In keeping with the doctrine outlined in reference (c), maximum utilization of the ~~assault units~~ assault units is encouraged.

3. RESOURCES AND CONSIDERATIONS.

a. Resources

- (1) Fixed wing tactical air support may be provided from either the Da Nang (MAG-11) or Chu Lai (MAG-12 and MAG-13) based air groups depending on the missions to be accomplished and the availability of aircraft. When 1st MAF aircraft are providing close and immediate support for 1st Marine Division forces actively engaged in combat, standard Marine close air support doctrine applies, as outlined in reference (c).
- (2) Helicopter support for 1st Marine Division (Rein) in the Da Nang T/O/R/RZ will normally be provided by MAG-16 located at Marble Mountain Air Facility. MAG-36, located at Ky Ha Air Facility, will be utilized as necessary. Helicopter support doctrine is outlined in reference (d). Overall coordination for the employment of helicopter resources rests with CG, III MAF.
- (3) On Call Support
- a. MED EV.C. UH34 and UH1E escort helicopters are available on Condition III alert at MM F and Ky Ha AF day and night. MED EV.C aircraft are requested through the D SC by use of the T.R. net, using the format shown in Appendix 3, COMBAT, without entry into the T.R. net. This service is obtained through adjacent units or by headline. Appendix 3 contains guidelines for assigning priorities to MED EV.C requests.
- b. Sparrow Hawk. Two CR46 and two UH1E escort aircraft are on Condition III alert during daylight hours at MM F and Ky Ha AF for lifting of a reinforced rifle squad. Sparrow Hawk is requested through the normal air request channels, using the format as outlined in Appendix D to Div Op Order 304-67 applies.

- c. Bald Eagle. The two CH46 aircraft are on a condition V alert status. In the lifting of a Bald Eagle force they are combined with the two CH-46's and two UH-1E gunships escort of the Sparrow Hawk mission. Procedures for launching the Bald Eagle aircraft are contained in Appendix D to Div Op Order 304-67.
 - d. Fast Reaction Gunships. Two UH-1E gunships are on a condition III standby at MM/F. They are normally launched as escort for the Sparrow Hawk/Bald Eagle Force. One may be launched by the DASC as TAC(A) when necessary.
 - e. Aerial Observer. During the hours of darkness, one aircraft on Condition IV alert is available through normal air request channels.
 - f. Flaeship. One aircraft is airborne in the Da Nang area throughout the hours of darkness. Priority service is provided to units in contact. An additional aircraft is kept on Condition IV alert at the Da Nang or Chu Lai airfields. Flaeship requests are passed via normal air request channels.
 - g. Close Air Support. Strike aircraft on Condition III alert at Da Nang and Chu Lai are available at all times through normal air request nets. These aircraft are loaded with mixed ordnance. During periods of marginal weather, a "Scud Alert" is available. Aircraft on "Scud Alert" are normally armed with low delivery ordnance such as napalm and 20mm.
- (4) The use of herbicides for defoliation will be requested as outlined in reference (f) through normal request channels.
 - (5) Aerial delivered Riot Control Agents (CS) is available for use by ground forces through normal air request channels. Reference (g) provides guidelines for use of RCA. Normal lead time will be given when requesting RCA.

b. Considerations

- (1) The daily commitments of 1st MAW limited helicopter assets, dictates that restraints be observed in the employment of helicopters. To this end, every effort will be made at all

levels of command to consolidate helilift requirements, thereby ensuring efficient utilization of assets. When time is not a factor helicopters will not be used for routine transportation of personnel and materials between points connected by serviceable roads or reasonably timely fixed wing transport flights.

CONFIDENTIALMed Evac Priorities.

1. Med Evac Priorities. The originator of a request for helicopter medical evacuation will classify each such request as either ROUTINE, PRIORITY, or EMERGENCY. Definitions of these classifications are as follows:

- a. Routine: Evacuation of deceased personnel; evacuation of a patient with minor injury or illness; or the routine transfer of a patient from one medical facility to another.
- b. Priority: Evacuation of seriously wounded, injured, or ill personnel who require early hospitalization, but whose immediate hospitalization is not a matter of life or death.
- c. Emergency: Evacuation of critically wounded, injured or ill personnel whose immediate evacuation is a matter of life or death. This classification is justified when a case falls into one of the following categories:
 - (1) The casualty is unconscious from a head wound.
 - (2) The casualty is in severe shock.
 - (3) The casualty is actively bleeding.
 - (4) The casualty has suffered the loss of an arm or leg, has an abdominal wound, or has a penetrating chest wound.
 - (5) The casualty is paralyzed.

2. Considerations. Prior to requesting emergency helicopter evacuations, the following will be assessed by the ground commander:

- a. Security of the landing zone and freedom from interdicting enemy fire.
 - (1) If insecure, movement of evacuee to a secure area will be attempted.
 - (2) If movement is impossible, every effort will be exerted to utilize suppressive fire by local unit small arms, artillery, aircraft, or a combination while evacuation is in progress.
- b. Communication between ground commander and aircraft is essential to exchange pertinent information concerning landing approach, pick up point, and terrain characteristics.
- c. Provide assistance to pilot in locating the pick up point. The use of hoist should only be undertaken when the terrain and vegetation make landing impossible, a landing site cannot be cleared, and movement of the casualty is impossible.

- d. Rarely will ambulatory casualties require emergency helicopter evacuation.

1. PRIORITIES. Priorities, with the exception of MANDATORY priority, will be assigned each mission by the requesting agency and will be monitored and confirmed by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 and/or the Division Air Officer, as appropriate. Commanders will consider priorities assigned to missions in making their decision to conduct flights in marginal weather. The following priorities are established:
 - a. ROUTINE. Administrative or tactical transport of personnel, material or equipment, where time is not a critical factor and delay will not endanger lives or loss of material. Applied to air targets, this category includes missions against targets that are not time sensitive, for example, bridges and buildings.
 - b. PRIORITY. Tactical movement of personnel, material or equipment where excessive delay will jeopardize successful accomplishment of the mission. This category includes air strikes on targets that are time sensitive, i.e., of a fleeting nature such as enemy troops, vehicles, and vessels. It also includes cargo operations where delays will result in excessive material loss through spoilage or seizure by the enemy.
 - c. EMERGENCY. Mission involves safety of human lives or requires immediate transport of vital supplies or equipment. Medical evacuation of wounded personnel and air support of units under attack including re-supply of ammunition or medical supplies are examples of emergency missions.
 - d. MANDATORY. Mission is emergency in nature and involves safety of human life or national prestige to the extent that normally unacceptable risks will be accepted to accomplish mission. This priority will only be assigned to a mission by CG, III MAF or CG, 1st MAF. Mandatory missions will not be cancelled because of weather.

TASK ORGANIZATION: Annex A (Task Organization)1. SITUATION.a. Enemy Forces. Annex B and current ISUMS and PERINTREPS.b. Friendly Forces.

(1) GVN civilian officials conduct census and registration of villagers, issue ID documents, introduce villagers to government officials, conduct psywar operations, reintroduce GVN influence in the area.

(2) GVN military elements (ARVN, PF, and/or RF) provide security for GVN officials, conduct deliberate search of hamlets and villages for VC personnel and/or equipment and facilities, supervise movement of citizens to central collection point for processing.

2. MISSION. On designated dates and in locales mutually agreeable to USMC and GVN military and civilian officials involved, 7th Marines provide infantry and limited medical and logistical support to COUNTY FAIR operations in accordance with reference (a).

3. EXECUTION.a. Concept of Operations. Appendix 1 (Concept of Operations).b. Assigned Infantry Battalions.

(1) Be prepared to provide adequate infantry force to cordon a given area in support of COUNTY FAIR.

(2) Be prepared to provide limited medical personnel in support of GVN medical activities in area of operations.

(3) Be prepared to provide limited equipment and foodstuffs compatible with availability of items and magnitude of requirement.

- (1) Unclassified code names.

COUNTY FAIR 7- Numbers to be issued by this Headquarters in accordance with reference (c).

(2) Rules of engagement outlined in Annex I apply. Objective areas frequently have many friendly villagers. All personnel will be cautioned to exercise care in dealing with unarmed civilians in light of pacification atmosphere of this type of operation.

(3) Rope will be used to establish control lanes and areas for initial screening and identification of villagers. Barbed wire is restricted to security use around VCS interrogation areas.

(4) Direct liaison is authorized between participating units.

(5) Direct liaison is authorized between ~~Company~~ Battalions and District Headquarters.

(6) GVN officials have operational control of all Vietnamese forces.

(7) All personnel in the cordon force will be instructed to exercise extreme restraint in returning fire toward hamlet. Only if a determined effort is made by the Viet Cong to break out of the hamlet will personnel be permitted to fire into the hamlet on order of the Cordon Force Command.

(8) All Marine personnel, including the cordon force and support personnel, will be unprovocative as possible. Whenever possible, the villagers will be encouraged to participate in the County Fair. This includes erecting tents, cooking food, setting up volley ball nets, etc.

(9) Marine personnel in the cordon force will not participate in the search of the village. Supporting personnel will not enter the village except at the invitation of GVN officials.

(10) It is possible that there will be numerous visitors from higher echelons during this operation. Personnel will keep themselves aware of the situation at all times and be alert to answer questions. Personnel will be instructed as to all aspects of their defensive positions, such as sector of fire, principal direction of fire, and supplementary positions. All personnel will be instructed as to the purpose of the County Fair and their participation in it.

(11) All dealings with the villagers will be conducted through the Village Chief and interpreters. Special deference will be shown to the village elders, who should be consulted in all matters pertaining to their people and the hamlet.

(12) The CHIEU HOI program will be explained to all personnel.

(13) County Fairs will normally last three days. Experience has shown that the effect on enemy infrastructure is in direct proportion to the length of County Fair operations.

(14) County Fairs will not be terminated without permission of Regimental Headquarters.

(15) County Fairs conducted by this Regiment will be a minimum of two day duration.

(16) Results of operations to be reported in accordance with reference (e).

1. SITUATION: Omitted.

2. MISSION: On designated dates and in locales mutually agreeable to USMC and GVN military and civilian officials involved, 7th Marines provides infantry and limited medical and logistical support to COUNTY FAIR Operations.

3. EXECUTION:

a. Concept of Operations.

(1) COUNTY FAIR is a coordinated series of military, governmental, civic and psychological warfare actions to re-establish GVN control over the populace of a given area. It is designed to flush the Viet Cong from the community in which he is a member or a parasite, while at the same time insuring that the populace is not alienated toward the Government. Military actions support a vigorous civic action and psy-war program, the purpose of which is to convince the people that the GVN is an effective government, that it is interested in the welfare of the people and that a GVN victory against the Viet Cong is both desirable and inevitable.

(2) USMC participation in COUNTY FAIR Operations is centered around cordoning a target area (village, hamlet, etc.) to isolate it for the duration (normally 3 days) of an operation, and providing limited medical and logistical assistance to the extent possible. GVN military, police, and civil authorities perform the task of searching the target areas and handling the populace. This is considered an essential element of COUNTY FAIR Operations since one of its primary purposes is to restore the populace's confidence in the GVN structure and to instill a sense of trust in and loyalty toward duly appointed officials.

(3) Tab 1 is a diagram depicting the steps through which the populace of a target community is taken and the type of activities and facilities to which they are exposed during the COUNTY FAIR Operation.

(a) Collection and Assembly. The collection and assembly of civilians is handled by GVN military, police, and civil authorities. Ordinarily, the civilian populace is relocated temporarily in an area adjacent to, but not in, the site of the search or hamlet.

(b) Civic Action and Psy-War. This effort is focused around a series of activities designed to gain the villagers' trust and cooperation. Feeding facilities are established to compensate for the inconvenience caused by requiring the villagers to wait in assembly areas and undergo processing. While waiting, the populace is subjected to an intensive Psy-War program consisting of taped messages from local and national officials, propaganda films, newsreels, leaflets, newspapers, and addresses by local officials using loudspeakers.

(c) Searching and Identification. Qualified GVN administrators process assembled villagers in the target area. Among administrative items accomplished at this stage are:

- (1) Census taking.
- (2) Issuance of ID cards.

(3) Initial interrogation to determine background, whereabouts of family members, etc. Viet-Cong suspects are retained for further questioning by qualified ARVN interrogators, assisted as required by U. S. personnel and ~~...~~

(d) Medical. Two or three corpsmen normally comprise the team which provides medical assistance in conjunction with the MEDCAP program. When available, and if required, a U. S. Navy physician accompanies the medical team. The team is capable of administering first aid and treating minor wounds and superficial injuries. Encouragement is also given to participation by GVN physician and corpsmen.

(e) Entertainment. Insofar as possible, provisions should be made for entertainment of the villagers to break the monotony of propaganda lectures and literature. Movies, music, and live entertainment have been well received in most villages. The Division Band and the Division Drum and Bugle Corps are available entertainment sources which are available upon request.

4. COUNTRY FAIR Operations require a coordinated effort between USMC and GVN military and civilian officials. The USMC contribution is primarily military and must not be so overpowering as to detract from the mission of reintroducing GVN influence in the target area through COUNTRY FAIR Operations.

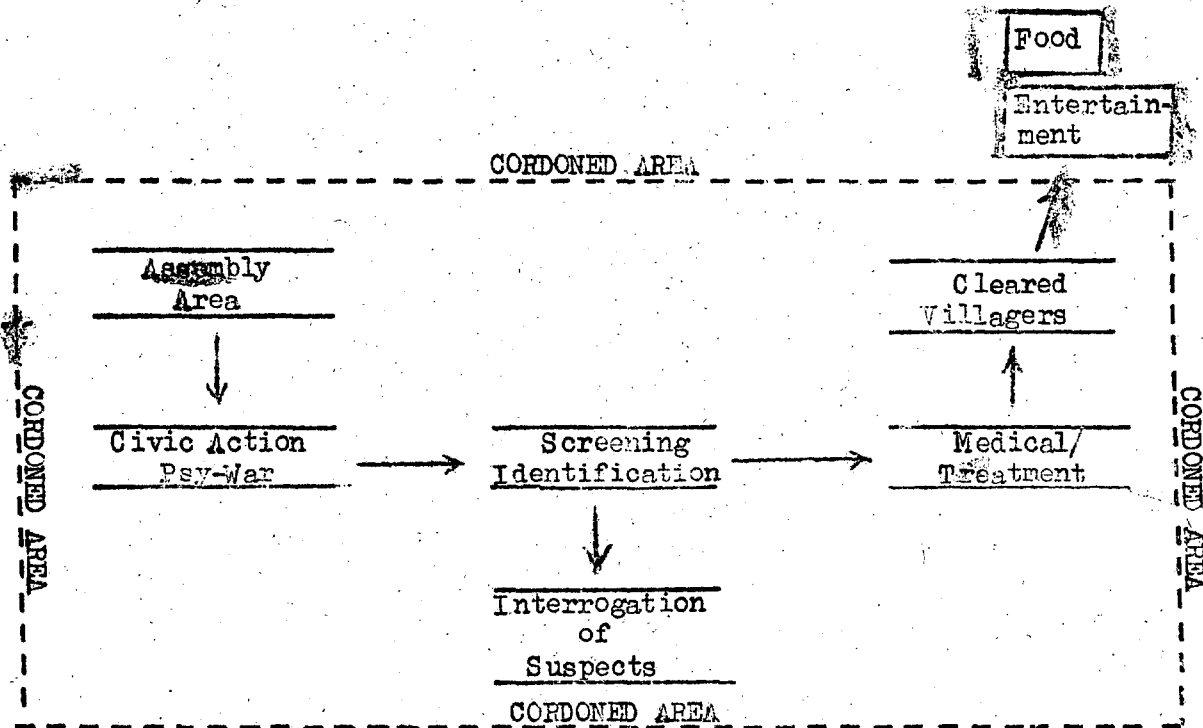

1. SITUATION.a. Enemy Forces.

- (1) Annex B (Intelligence).
- (2) Current INTSUMS and PERINTREPS.
- (3) Experience indicates VC will continue to initiate terrorist mining and action against rice growing areas which they have been denied.
- (4) VC frequently move confiscated rice by boat to avoid land patrols and check points.

b. Friendly Forces. Ref (b)

2. MISSION. 7th Mar in conjunction with RVN officials/forces conducts operations to protect Vietnamese Nationals in harvest of rice crop during main harvest seasons to deny food to the VC, stifle VC control over local populace, and aggravate VC logistics problems.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operations. 7th Mar and assigned infantry battalions coordinates rice harvesting procedures with District and Village Chiefs, thereby emphasizing to populace that local Marine forces are there to protect them against VC encroachment. No established pattern is applicable to all rice growing areas, however, the following methods, tactics and procedures will prevail.

- (1) Whenever possible, consider requests of Vietnamese authorities in establishing priorities, types of assistance, and extent of assistance.
- (2) Patrols operating near periphery of assigned Sectors coordinate patrol and ambush activities with local villagers to protect them while harvesting and transporting rice.
- (3) Marine and ARVN/RF/TF forces coordinate in search and clear operations. Upon conclusion of search and clear operations, Marine units establish outposts and ambushes to safeguard rice harvesting area while ARVN/RF/TF and police forces escort local populace to and from rice fields to harvest crops.

CONFIDENTIAL

(4) Aggressive Marine patrolling around periphery of rice fields provides a screen of protection for local villagers, while RF/PF forces guard rice storage areas.

(5) Marine and ARVN units coordinate activities to patrol and ambush as appropriate to protect local populace and rice storage areas.

(6) Extended search and destroy ops in vicinity of rice harvest areas outside of assigned sectors are planned to allow sufficient time for transport of harvesters to area of operations to harvest crop, and to transport rice and harvesters back to safe area.

(7) District and Village Chiefs are encouraged to arrange for transport of harvesting personnel and rice to safe areas by native bus, truck or sampan. When such local means of transport are not available or sufficient, use of Marine aircraft and/or vehicles is authorized.

b. Assigned Infantry Battalions.

(1) Conduct operations for rice harvest protection within assigned sectors, in and outside the RZ as directed during the period that regional rice harvest is in progress.

(2) Conduct operations, and patrols and ambushes along major avenues of approach of VC forces and/ or indications of VC attempts to seize or disrupt the rice harvest.

(3) Maintain continual liaison for planning and execution with GVN officials.

1. SITUATION.

a. General. In order for the VC to supply their troops with rations, they have had to prey on the local populace with a heavy rice tax. The confiscation of rice is one of the most prominent grievances that the people have against the VC. Thorough exploitation of this grievance can potentially produce valuable psychological advantages. See also reference (a).

b. Enemy. See current ISUM's and SIE's as issued.

c. Friendly Forces.

(1) 244th Psy Ops Company: Provides leaflet and poster reproduction, tape recording, ground loudspeaker teams and propaganda research and analysis.

(2) 5th Air Command Squadron: Provides U-10 and C47 aircraft for leaflet drops and aerial broadcasts.

(3) USMACV Advisory Team #2: Provides liaison with province and district headquarters, with 300 units of the 2nd ARVN Division.

(4) JUSPAC: Provides drama teams, 35mm projectors and 16mm film media to include magazines of propaganda value.

2. MISSION. The psychological operations mission in Golden Fleece Operations is to accomplish the following psychological objectives:

a. To convince local rice farmers that the Government of Vietnam, assisted by the U.S. Marines, is interested in their welfare.

b. To prove to local rice farmers that the Government of Vietnam, assisted by U.S. Marines, can effectively help the people pursue their desired way of life.

c. To encourage the cooperation of the local populace in providing information for intelligence.

d. To expose the Viet Cong to the local populace as an enemy of the people, a result of exploiting them by heavy rice taxes enforced by terror.

e. To create disaffection among the enemy with the VC cause.

SECRET3. EXECUTION.a. Concept of Operations

(1) Phase I: In weeks prior to the operation, through various media, inform the populace of the impending operation and its purposes; and emphasize the injustice of VC confiscation of rice. The purpose of this phase is to begin developing the confidence which will eventually result from fulfilled promises; and to create an awareness of the benefits to be derived from curtailing VC confiscation of rice. This should not reveal the exact area of operations or the time frame, but should be presented in very general terms.

(2) Phase II:

(a) During the operation through various media and face to face persuasion, encourage the local populace to cooperate with friendly forces by providing information and warnings to friendly troops. Keep the people aware that by cooperating with Marines they are benefiting themselves by helping to protect the harvest.

(b) During the operation, posters, leaflets and audio broadcasts will be directed at local VC and VC sympathizers to present the picture of a better life with GVN, the folly and eventual failure of the Viet Cong movement, and the means by which the VC may surrender and enjoy the better life of a free Vietnamese.

(c) During the operation, be alert for VC atrocities and acts of terror and expose these by immediate reaction mass communication media.

(3) Phase III: During the last two weeks of the operation and the weeks following, remind the people of the success of the operation and show how their cooperation contributed to its success and the accomplishment of a peaceful, productive, and oppression-free harvest. Assure the people that during harvest periods, they will enjoy the same peace and security because of the strength and consideration of their government, supported by the United States.

b. Tasks of participating units:

(1) Indoctrinate participating troops in current psychological themes and objectives, and means to be employed in their accomplishment, including good people to people relations.

(2) Inform the local population of the purpose and scope of the operation, thereby exploiting its psychological effect.

(3) Demonstrate the capability of the ARVN, USMC, and local authorities to provide continued security for the population.

(4) Conduct psychological operations, to include leaflet drops, audio broadcasts and ground audio teams.

(5) Develop and recommend themes and material to support the overall program as favorable opportunities develop. Submit this material to this Headquarters for review and approval, prior to dissemination.

c. Coordinating Instructions:

(1) New themes and material will be coordinated and approved by this Headquarters prior to promulgation.

(2) Themes to be stressed:

(a) The people will no longer be oppressed, taxed and preyed upon by the Viet Cong if they cooperate with ARVN, USMC, and local authorities.

(b) The GVN and the United States have a sincere interest in the welfare and happiness of the Vietnamese people.

(c) The military power of the GVN, supported by the United States, will result in the defeat of the VC and continued security for the people of RVN.

4. ADMINISTRATION and LOGISTICS: Requests for Psy Ops support will be submitted to this headquarters using the current psy ops request form, in accordance with Annex 2 (Psy Ops).

1. SITUATION.

- a. A hold on the minds of the people is the greatest source of enemy power in South Vietnam. This hold is based sometimes on honest belief but more often on fear. The Free World Forces assist the GVN in three ways to break this hold:
- (1) By conducting military operations against the enemy and promoting an environment of security and freedom from fear.
 - (2) By conducting civil operations directed at nation building and promoting popular support for the government.
 - (3) By conducting psychological operations to explain the objectives and successes of the government while emphasizing the failures, atrocities and hopelessness of the communists in order to promote an atmosphere of knowledge and understanding between the people and the GVN.
- b. Enemy Forces. Annex B and current INTSUMS and PERINTREPS.
- c. Friendly Forces.
- (1) Higher Headquarters conducts psychological operations to lower the morale, cause disaffection within and desertion from NVA and local and main force VC units operating within I CTZ; assists local, provincial, and regional GVN officials in establishing and expanding their influence and control over the population; and facilitates the occupation of VC controlled areas by giving information and instructions to the local population.
 - (2) The 244th PSYOP Co (USA) provides the following support, as requested.
 - (a) Leaflet and other printing support.
 - (b) Combat Loudspeaker teams.
 - (c) Audio Visual support.
 - (d) Information, advice and technical assistance.

2. MISSION.

- a. The 7th Marines, while emphasizing immediate reaction to exploitable tactical situations and incidents, will also plan and conduct the following type operations.

- (1) Tactical psychological operations in support of strategic psychological operations, combat operations, regional development operations, and military civic action.
- (2) Psychological operations against specific tactical VC/NVA units.
- (3) Special psychological operations to gain maximum face-to-face contact between GVN and VC families.
- (4) Operations designed to enhance USMC-Vietnamese civilian understanding and friendship.

3. EXECUTION.

- a. Concept of Operations. 7th Marines forces conducts psychological operations in accordance with priority tasks listed in Appendix 1 using themes noted in Appendix 2.
- b. Assigned Infantry Battalions:
 - (1) Commanders will establish a psychological campaign which will encompass every hamlet within his area of operations. Media employed will include the following.
 - (a) Aerial broadcasts and leaflet drops.
 - (b) Hand distribution of propaganda and news material.
 - (c) Loudspeaker programs, to include taped or live speeches by GVN officials and returnees.
 - (2) Plan and conduct tactical psychological operations in direct support of offensive military operations, using all media available.
 - (3) Plan and conduct psychological operations against specific tactical VC/NVA units in assigned sector.
 - (4) Conduct on a regular basis, psychological operations communicating news, information, entertainment and propaganda into VC/NVA controlled areas.
 - (5) When possible, insure that all attempts are made, by leaflets, loudspeakers or any other media available, to insure that non-combatants are separated from the enemy.

CONFIDENTIAL

- (6) Conduct psychological operations in the local areas, emphasizing themes of rewards for mines, booby traps, and VC information, and to promote better USMC-Vietnamese understanding and friendship; media used should be hand distributed to cause face-to-face contact as often as possible.

c. Coordinating Instructions.

- (1) Coordinate with local GVN officials to determine appropriate themes and timing for operations to be conducted.
- (2) Insure that the troops are informed as to the nature of the operations being conducted.
- (3) Plan for psychological operations that will take advantage of exploitable situations as soon as they arise, emphasizing counter propaganda measures and incidents demonstrating VC atrocities or failures.
- (4) Plan and conduct psychological operations emphasizing hand distribution of leaflets, newspapers, posters, etc., in order to promote a better understanding between USMC and Vietnamese civilians.
- (5) When directed, support the Revolutionary Development program in the clearing phase by sowing dissension, demoralization and confusion in the ranks of the VC, while dissuading the civilians from supporting them, and support the securing phase by explaining the actions and intentions of the government and explaining the Chieu Hoi program to VC families.
- (6) Plan and conduct tactical psychological operations in direct support of defensive posture, using all media available.
- (7) Conduct on a regular basis, psychological operations communicating news, information, entertainment and propaganda into surrounding areas.

- (3) Convince all target audiences that GVN will not compromise with appeasement and neutralism.
- (4) Convince all target audiences that the U.S. is in Vietnam as a result of external aggression and will withdraw when the threat to Vietnamese independence ceases.
- (5) Convince all target audiences that GVN represents the true Vietnamese revolution.
- (6) Convince all target audiences that minority population groups are a part of the Republic and should and will share in its success on equal terms and that their culture and beliefs will be respected by the Republic.

b. Viet Cong Campaign.

- (1) Convince the VC that they have alienated the people and have violated the principles of revolutionary warfare by relying on terror as a substitute for popular support.
- (2) Convince the VC that they are conducting an isolated, futile struggle against the overwhelming strength of the GVN, US and FVNAF.
- (3) Convince the VC that they are agents of a foreign power.

- (3) The GVN offers peace, prosperity and order under traditional Vietnamese culture.
- (4) The GVN represents the true people's revolution of progress and prosperity and it is the just cause.
- (5) To support the GVN is to work for the revolution, peace and prosperity; to support the VC is to work for misery, poverty, destruction and subversion of the Vietnamese culture.
- (6) The GVN possesses overwhelming strength - victory is inevitable.
- (7) Support the GVN and put a stop to useless death and destruction.
