Brother Phelps,

I write you a line in haste, sup-
posing that you have returned from your tour
in England; & are now engaged in your former
sphere of labors in Boston. I wrote you about a
time you sailed in the Spring; which letter (con-
taining a receipt for the interest then due & rec^d on
your note) I suppose you have since received,
if not before you sailed.

There is now due us, the Oct. dividend of the Merchants
Bank, 24 dolls. only I believe; i.e. a 3 per cent, in-
stead of a 3½, if I mistake not. I send this
letter by my good deacon, Newbury, who is to
return on wed or thursday of this week. Now if you
get this in season, to call conveniently at said bank
& get dividend & inclose it in a letter ^{left} ⁱⁿ care
of "Davis & Palmer" in season for Newbury ^{to} ^{bring} it,
well. If not, you may pay over the amount, 24
dolls. after the 1st of Jan^y, to Mr. Fiske, Treasurer
of the Board, as a part of the monthly concert
money of this year. We shall send on our
collections early in Jan^y, & we wish it all
acknowledged together, & in the same number
of the Herald. If in calling at Palmer's, ^{wed or thursday,} you ascertain
Newbury has left, you may keep the money & pay it
over to Fiske. If you have to in care of Davis or
Palmer, (not a clerk) tell them that there is a letter

money in it, & regret them to be postmarked
& deliver it. Should have by mistake leave
it; you can take it again by inquiry after
Lumpie + some found time, & dispose of it as
before. I was in Farmington a day or 2 early
in Nov; but heard nothing of my special interest.
I should be happy to hear from you when
ever you are disposed to write.
