1. A survey was conducted by this Headquarters in order to ascertain what factors are effecting the present delay in sugar distribution, and the following conclusions and recommendations are hereby submitted for consideration:

a. Primary reason for the delay has been found to be the belated allocation notices from MAF. Usually notices are received a month later than the distribution period and in some cases even 2 months.

(1) It is recommended that these notices be transmitted so as to reach the prefectural levels not later than the 20th of the month preceding the month of distribution. Prefectural officials have given assurances that if this step is taken, the actual distribution can be completed by at least the 20th of the distribution month.

b. The present sugar coupon system causes much delay in distribution. When the allocation notices are received by the village, town and city offices, coupons are issued to consumers. These coupons are passed in turn through retailers, wholesalers, association of wholesalers and finally to the Kodan. Then and only then does the actual flow of sugar begin.

(1) It is recommended that this system be modified so that the exchange of coupons for sugar will be made between the consumer and the retailer and the collected coupons subsequently sent to the Kodan for sugar already received.

c. It has been claimed by the Shimonoseki Oil, Fats and Sugar Kodan Officials that the present allocation of boxcars is insufficient

9. It is not intended that the Chief Guard will replace the custodian nor perform all of the duties previously connected with that position. Responsibility of the Chief Guard and ordinary guards need not exceed protection of equipment against fire and unauthorized removals. Suggested duties and responsibilities are as follows:

a. Ordinary Guards

- (1) To prevent unauthorized removals of equipment.
- (2) To prevent fires within the installation; to summon fire-fighting equipment in event of fire; to extinguish any fires which might occur; and to fight fires pending arrival of fire-fighting equipment.

b. Chief Guard

- (1) To supervise ordinary guards.
- (2) To prepare and submit to your office guard attendance reports for pay purposes.
- (3) To instruct ordinary guards and assure their understanding of their duties and responsibilities, particularly as to specific actions to be taken in case of fire.
- (4) To periodically inspect and test fire extinguishers and other interim fire-fighting equipment to assure accessibility and readiness for use.
- (5) To report to your office inadequacy or faulty operating condition of interim fire-fighting equipment.
- (6) To inspect the installation daily and report to your office by most expeditious means any conditions which might endanger inventoried equipment. Weakened or damaged buildings resulting from elemental disturbance is an example.

10. Problems arising from revised policy cited above, which are considered to be beyond the scope of solution by your office, should be referred to this headquarters for coordinated study.

company expense would normally be required by the operating plants regardless of reparations status. Further, study revealed that safeguarding of dead storage equipment does not materially expand the scope of activities normally connected with the safeguarding of an operating industrial production facility. Payment by the government for guards at the operating plants is therefore not favorably considered.

7. Current revised standards for custody and maintenance of equipment in dead storage, which can be summarized as requiring only that equipment be protected against fire and unauthorized removals and that working surfaces of machines be covered with preservative, conclusively eliminate essential need for custodians at the non-operating plants. Government employed guards at the non-operating plants are capable of protecting equipment against fire and unauthorized removals. Proper preservation of working surfaces of machines and equipment a one-time operation, can be assured by periodic inspection of the plants by the appropriate section of your office.

3. Therefore, effective as of the close of business on 31 January 1950, the following policy will govern expenditure of Japanese Government appropriated funds for custodial personnel at operating and non-operating privately-owned reparations plants:

a. Payment for the services of Chief Custodians and Assistant Custodians at any plant will be terminated.

c. Payment from government appropriated funds for guards at non-operating plants is authorized. Authorized strength and basis for payment is as follows:

- (1) Guard strength as of 1 November 1949 will remain in effect, and will not be increased without approval of this headquarters.
- (2) One (1) Chief Guard will be designated at each plant.
  - (a) The position of Chief Guard may be filled from incumbent personnel if so desired. In any event, existing guard strength will not be increased; i.e., if incumbents are not desired for the new position, other persons will be employed on a replacement basis only.
  - (b) The Chief guard's basic wage, which will be determined by your office, should be commensurate with additional duties and responsibilities as outlined below. However, the Chief Guard's basic

1. Reference: Memorandum for the Japanese Government Reparations Board from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers subject: "New Standards for Maintenance of Reparations Machines and Equipment in Dead Storage", dated 22 June 1949.
2. Current budgetary stringencies necessitate maximum possible reduction in expenditures of Japanese Government funds.
3. Study of the reparations program in the Chugoku Region has revealed that, based on minimized requirements represented by revised standards for custody and maintenance of reparations equipment, the numbers and types of government-paid custodial personnel employed at the privately-owned reparations plants are excessive.
4. Specifically, it is believed that the Chief Custodians and Assistant Custodians retained at both the operating and non-operating plants are not essentially required. It is further concluded that current duties of the custodians can be otherwise adequately provided for without adverse effect on the custody or maintenance of equipment, but with substantial savings to the Japanese Government.
5. Essential need for Chief Custodians and Assistant Custodians, which existed when inventory records and data were being compiled and machines and equipment were required to be maintained in operable condition, has expired. Compilation of inventory records and data has long since been completed, and revised standards of maintenance, cite memorandum referenced in paragraph 1 above, provide that machines and equipment in dead storage need no longer be maintained in operable condition.
6. Proper custody and maintenance of equipment at the operating plants without the presence of custodians is reasonably assured due to awareness of the plant managements that failure to protect and maintain equipment in accordance with existing regulations is sufficient cause for cancellation of operating permit. Regarding guard personnel, employment of guards at
