THE TESTIMONY OF HIKOTARO YOSHIDA AT THE COMMITTEE
MEETING OF THE DIET IRREGULAR PROPERTY TRANSACTION
INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE ON APRIL 7, 1948

Chairman Muto: - Karoku Tsuji testified at the Public Procurator's Office as follows:

' There are about seventy to eighty politicians whom I know and to whom I presented money as campaign funds. I am, however, reluctant to disclose to whom and how much I presented, because I don't like to trouble these persons. I beg you to appreciate how I feel. However, besides Nakasone, there are friends of mine who willingly present money to me for my own disposal.... I received about 3,000,000 yen from Hikotaro Yoshida, President of the Midori Sangyo Kabushiki Kaisha in Tokyo in the period from last year (1946) up to the present (Oct. 10, 1947).'

Does this statement of Tsuji correspond to the fact?

Witness Yoshida: It is true that I handed 1,000,000 yen in August or in September, 1947. During the War and after the War, I continuously handed money, sometimes 100,000 yen, sometimes 200,000 yen. This kind of money will total to about 2,000,000 yen.

The Chairman: After the War, sometimes ¥ 100,000 yen, sometimes 200,000 yen?

The Witness: From the war time to the post-war time.

The Chairman: This kind of money totaled to about 2,000,000 yen and you presented 1,000,000 yen in August 1947. Both totalled to 3,000,000 yen. Do you mean so?

The Witness: That's right.

The Chairman: What connection do you have to Tsuji?

The Witness: As I was 21 years old, I came up to Tokyo and joined the Taikakai at Ushigome. Some of my seniors from the same place were also members of the Taikakai. Mr. Tsuji was, so to say, a boss to Fumio Iwata, President of the Taikakai.

Under these circumstances, I called on Mr. Tsuji, accompanying Mr. Iwata. Mr. Tsuji held me dear in the

course of time and on my part, I became intimated with him as if he were my father.

The Chairman: For what purpose did you contribute to Tsuji such amount of money as 3,000,000 yen?

The Witness: Now and then, Mr. Tsuji telephoned to me saying "You are in funds, I hear. Bring me some pocket-money, if it is possible for you.", or he came sometimes personally to me. On such occasions, I used to present him with money.

The Chairman: But the amount is a little too large, isn't it?

The Witness: As I had plenty of money at that time, I felt no special pain in doing so.

The Chairman: Was the money of such an amount a trifling matter for you?

The Witness: That was the case at that time. After August last, however, I began to be out of funds. Mr. Tsuji asked me for a good round of money. I thought I could raise the money by borrowing from my friends, if it was the last request of Mr. Tsuji. Thus I raised and handed 1,000,000 yen to him.

The Chairman: What kind of business are you making now?

The Witness: I am supplying the air-fields of the Occupation Forces with ballast.

The Chairman: What were you doing during the War?

The Witness: During the War, I was an assistant commander of the "Kodama Kikan".

The Chairman: How much income did you get?

The Witness: I went to Shanghai with my kindred-spirits and the group of these people began the work which was entrusted by Kodama. There was a great shortage in molybdenum and tungsten which had been earlier imported from Shanghai and the southern regions. We were asked to develop domestic mines. We bought various goods with the profit which we gained in Shanghai, brought them to Japan and sold them to the Navy. We appropriated the money thus earned for developing mines. This undertaking was operated at a constant loss and was going into bankruptcy before the war termination. Owing to the unexpectedly early termination of the War, there was money still left. We brought this money to the Navy but we were told that this money was ours and not of the Navy. Moreover, we were presented with 100,000 yen as remuneration. I think that we possessed about 40,000,000 yen at that time.

The Chairman: In your hands?

The Witness: Well, may be said in my hand -- anyway the money what was left at that time. As Kodama became a war suspect and the whole matter was investigated by the Occupation Forces. I think you know it.

The Chairman: Was it not the money you freely disposed of?

The Witness: When we had disposed of some of it, Kodama became a war suspect, and we no longer could dispose of the rest of the money because of the special property connected with war suspects.

The Chairman: How much did you dispose of?

The Witness: Most of the money was left in the form of buildings and mining equipments, and many of such real properties still remain now. But in the form of money almost none is left.

The Chairman: What have you been doing since the War ended?

The Witness: After the War, we wholly gave up mining. There were about a hundred of our former participants, who remained doing nothing for about a year after the War. We tried to do something to support ourselves, but whatever we tried it did not go well, so we formally broke up early in January.

The Chairman: What kind of company is the Midori-Sangyo-Kabushiki Kaisha?

The Witness: During the war, it was called the Nichinan Kogyo Kabushiki Kaisha and it was engaged in mining tungsten and molybdenum. When the demands for these mineral disappeared as the result of the termination of the war, we decided to start some peace industry such as lumbering, as a side work. When we applied for the official permission, we changed its name to the Midori Sangyo Kabushiki Kaisha.

The Chairmah: Is it a profitable company.

The Witness: No, utterly not.

The Chairman: A certain Kuraishi is connected with this company? Isn't he? ----- Tadao Kuraishi....

The Witness: Yes.

The Chairman: What position does he keep?

The Witness: He left the company last year. He was the president of the company then.

The Chairman: Has he no relation now?

The Witness: None.

The Chairman: The million yen you mentioned above --- How did you raise it? From what sources did you get it?

The Witness: A friend of mine is the president of the Kyoritsu Kinzoku Co. (The Kyoritsu Metal Company) which is in our building, and I asked him to raise the money. We also rent our ground floor to the Asano Higashi Nihon Slate Co., so I borrowed money from the company under the name of the security and promised to return it before the term.

The Chairman: What did Tsuji say to use the money for?

The Witness: To use for paying debts. He said he was overhead and ears in debts.

The Chairman: For paying what?

The Witness: I suppose he made debts here and there.

The Chairman: And so he asked you to raise a round sum of money?

The Witness: Yes.

The Chairman: Are you not aware of the fact that Tsuji is distributing such money among political parties or politicians?

The Witness: Not clearly; still I thought he had an unpleasant hobby.

The Chairman: What do you mean an unpleasant hobby?

The Witness: People may have various hobbies; but to make me raise money with great difficulties and distribute it to various people and be happy is --- this is certainly a very curious hobby. Such is my meaning.

The Chairman: Then it means not to pay debts but to distribute the money among politicians?

The Witness: I don't know such thing very well. But I called on him and found about a hundred thousand yen piled up on the Tokonoma in the room. I sometimes borrowed a half of it, saying only, 'Give me a half'. But we were in such a confidential relation as not to inquire anything about the purpose. So, though I know he had a hobby, I don't know anything clearly.

The Chairman: Has any member of the Committee some question? (It was voiced - "No"). Now, that's all. Thank you, Mr. Yoshida.

Matters Concerning POW Transport

(8 September 1942 - UNSENDEN 557)

Telegram from Transportation and Communication Chief to units concerned:

"Due to a serious shortage of labour power in Japan, the use of white P.O.W. is earnestly desired. Therefore it is required to render consideration to send some white POW to Japan by every returning ship (including both transport and munition ships).

"The Shipping Transport Command is requested to report, besides UNSENDEN No. 375 and 547, the possible amount of personnel expected to be sent every month (special technicians should be classified) before the end of each previous month. It is also desired to send as many personnel as possible by every means such as by loading them on decks."

Matters Concerning POW Transport by Navy Ships

(27 July 1943 - FUKAN 1-77)

Notification from P.O.W. Supervision Chief to units concerned:

"As to the P.O.W. transport to make up for the labour shortage in Japan, the use of Navy ships had already been instructed, besides the instructions given in UNSENDEN No. 558. Further instruction was given this time by the Navy to its organizations on the spot as is shown in the attached sheet, therefore it is desired to hold negotiations with those Navy organizations so as to carry out the instructions."

Each time P.O.W. is shipped out, it is required to inform the number of personnel, expected date and time of arrival at Japan and the name of the ship."

As the use of POW is eagerly desired in every part of Japan, it is required to render every possible consideration so as to send POW of the Army to Japan on every favourable opportunity (It makes no difference if they are sent by small groups due to shipping condition). The army, after discussing the matter with the Naval unit on the spot, is to send instructions to the unit of the spot concerning the POW transport matter.

As to POW transport to Japan, it is requested to render consideration not to send those POW officers who do not submit to labour work and those POW of mixed blood whose appearances be mistaken for Orientals.

Notification from Vice-Minister and Vice-Chief to Units Concerned.

Due to improper treatment on the way of transport of POW who were recently sent to Japan there were a great many of sick people (dead) and many who could not immediately be used for labour work. Further thorough care should be taken as to selection and medical inspection of POW to be sent to Japan, allotment of POW sanitation personnel, necessary medicine on the way of transport, preparation of provisions, supervision on the way of transport, conveniences given at ports of call and supply of clothes.

II. Translated in Full: Military Ultra Secret

2 Area Army Military Law Concerning the Punishment of
Enemy Air Crew Personnel.

Clause One. This law is applicable to the members of
the crews of enemy airplanes who come within the juris-
diction of 2 Area Army and who have participated in air
raids upon the territory of the Japanese Empire, Manchuria,
or any battle area in which Japanese Armies are operating.

Clause Two. All perpetrators of acts listed below will
incur the penalties of military law.

1. Bombing, strafing or any other aggressive act carried
out for the purpose of intimidating or injuring the
civilian population.
2. Bombing, strafing or any other aggressive act carried
out for the purpose of destroying or damaging private
property.
3. Bombing, strafing, or any other aggressive act directed
against non-military targets except in circumstances
rendering such acts unavoidable.
4. Any act, other than the above, which violates wartime
international law.

This law will likewise apply to all persons who make in-
cursions into the territory of the Japanese Empire,
Manchuria, or any battle area in which Japanese armies
are operating, with the intention of committing any of
the acts listed above, but who are apprehended by the
2 Area Army before the actual commission of such acts.

Clause Three. The punishment is death, but in extenuating
circumstances this may be commuted to life imprisonment
or imprisonment for ten years or more years.

Clause Four. The death penalty will be carried out by
shooting. A sentence of imprisonment will be served in
the penitentiary.

Clause Five. Under special circumstances, sentence may be suspended.

Clause Six. In case of a prison sentence the criminal law provisions relating to penal servitude are applicable, in addition to the provisions of this law.

Appendix

This military law will be effective on and after 1 January 1944. This law will apply to offenses committed before its enactment.
