# A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF PERSIUS.

\*\* This bibliography falls into three parts. The first is a list of editions, arranged chronologically; the second of translations, arranged alphabetically by languages and translators; the third of writings on Persius, arranged alphabetically by writers. The first two lists I made for my own convenience, as a collector of editions and translations of Persius. These lists will be of greater service to collectors and to librarians than to classical scholars. The third list, however, is meant to assist the work of classical seminaries.

I have made each list as full as possible. My chief materials have been the catalogues of great libraries and of booksellers, as well as those of Hain, Ebert and Engelmann, and the bibliographies of Persius in the Bipont, Achaintre and Nuremberg editions. In treating the *incunabula* I have frequently referred to Hauthal's description and collation of thirty early editions. An asterisk shows that I have myself examined the volume so marked. Wherever it was possible, I have indicated one or more places where each book is now to be found. The list of editions proper of Persius is extremely long. But it includes so many reprints, and succeeding editors have helped themselves so liberally from the work of predecessors (often even appropriating a commentary bodily), that, of the commentaries in the 328 editions catalogued in the first list, hardly any are unrepresented in the 97 editions which are now in Cambridge (65 in my own collection and 32 others in the Harvard Library). It should be stated that the new catalogue of the British Museum does not yet include Persius, except as he appears with Juvenal.

Without year, place, printer's name, sign. or pag. Probably the *EDITIO PRINCEPS*; certainly the first of Persius without Juvenal. Generally supposed to be printed by Udalricus Gallus (Hain), Rome, about 1470. It is in the type used in his Juvenal (Ebert, 11189) and the two are sometimes found bound together, whence it has been wrongly thought that they were so published. Audiffredi, *Edit. Allen from the Bodley copy which is stamped on the binding *editio princeps*, but in the ms. catalogue marked *Argentorati, Martinus Flach* (so Hain, 12713; Dibdin, *Bibl. Spenc.* II, 223; Hauthal, A; Ebert, 16231). The verse *Explicit ignotus etc.*

was formerly considered proof that this was the first edition, but it is found also in No. 67, and in certain mss. and was doubtless taken from the ms. from which the edition was printed, *circ. 1472-1474*.

Without pagination. May be the first edition of Persius with a regular title page (f. 1a); the words on it I have given. Above is a woodcut of Persius, crowned with a laurel, sitting in a pulpit, on either side of him his two commentators, dressed as monks, writing at desks. Contents the same as in No. 36. Numerous ornamental initials. Merula first appears here as a worker on Persius. 
