An account of an actual air raid by the Bomber Command of the Royal British Air Force. The picture begins with new aerial photographs of enemy territory brought back by reconnaissance planes. These disclose the objective to be raided. Then comes the staff planning, routine of preparing the bombers, getting weather reports, instructing the crews, and the tension of the evening take-off.
