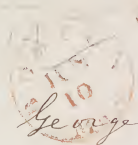
Boston, June 10, 1844.

Dear bro. George:

Catharine arrived at our house from Nashua and Lowell, on Friday, where she has had a very pleasant visit. Her mother came with her, but is stopping elsewhere in the city, and will go with her to Northampton. They will leave for N. on Friday morning next, and Helen and myself will accompany them. Mother and Sarah will go to Providence immediately on our return home. Mother continues quite feeble, and is troubled occasionally, with a slow fever, with loss of appetite. She is evidently not long for this evil world, but is ready for her departure at any moment. Her life has been a long and useful one. Sarah has just taken the care for Lynn, to spend the night with the Johnsons, who were so kind to share when she was taken ill under their roof. I do not know when James Boyl is in the city, but I hear that he was at the Concord (N. H.) meeting last week, and that it was a grand one. Your wife and babe are well.
