1. The Consolation Association responsible for the petition enumerated in Inclosure 1, attached letter, is a volunteer Japanese organization which proposes to offer comfort bags and the like to United Nations Allied Forces in Korea.

2. An article appearing on the front page of the 9 August 1950 Stars and Stripes is captioned "ARC Now in Charge of Volunteer Effort". This article announced that the American Red Cross had been officially designated as the overall agency in Japan for the acceptance and coordination of services and goods which individuals, organized groups or agencies may wish to volunteer in connection with the return to the States of sick and wounded, and all types of dependents.

3. It is recommended that the Red Cross be the only agency to receive volunteer gifts from non-occupation donors and that further publicity be given this matter, not only in the Stars and Stripes but also in the Japanese newspapers.

4. Special Services will continue to accept magazines and other gifts and assistance at canteens for able bodied troops in Korea and at ports and replacement centers in Japan.

1. G-1 considers that indigenous individuals and organizations proffering goods or monies, in connection with the action in Korea, should be referred to the American Red Cross. This would apply to all offers proposing to furnish goods or monies, for use of UN Military Forces whether it was intended that the goods be used in Korea or in Japan.

2. Where indigenous individuals or organizations proffer services, such as entertainers, it is considered that their acceptance or non-acceptance should be a determination of SS. If accepted, SS should take full responsibility for the entertainers, including their logistic support. Such offers
