RECORD SHIPMENT TO GO NORTH TO-MORROW

SCHOONER CASCO BACK.

Tried New Sealing Grounds With Good Success—Has Over Eight Hundred Skins.

After exploiting new sealing grounds with good success, the schooner Casco, Capt. Munro, returned this afternoon, bringing 828 skins to represent the catch of the schooner Oscar and Hattie, which she met on her way home.
