

## Size:

The flag has a ratio of $3: 5$; each stripe takes up $1 / 3^{\text {rd }}$ of the width (top to bottom) and extends the entire length (left to right) of the flag. The Douglas fir, on a $3 \times 5$ sized flag, takes up 2.9 of the width $(96.67 \%)$ and $1.48(29.6 \%)$ of the length. The Douglas fir is modeled from the Oregon license plate.

## Colors:

The following colors are in the Pantone Matching System and were chosen from the various flags that represent the Cascadia region. Stripes, top to bottom, are Pantone 288 C (British Columbia), Process White and 348 C (Washington). The Douglas fir is Pantone 2768 C (Oregon).
