

Afghanistan – Flash Floods

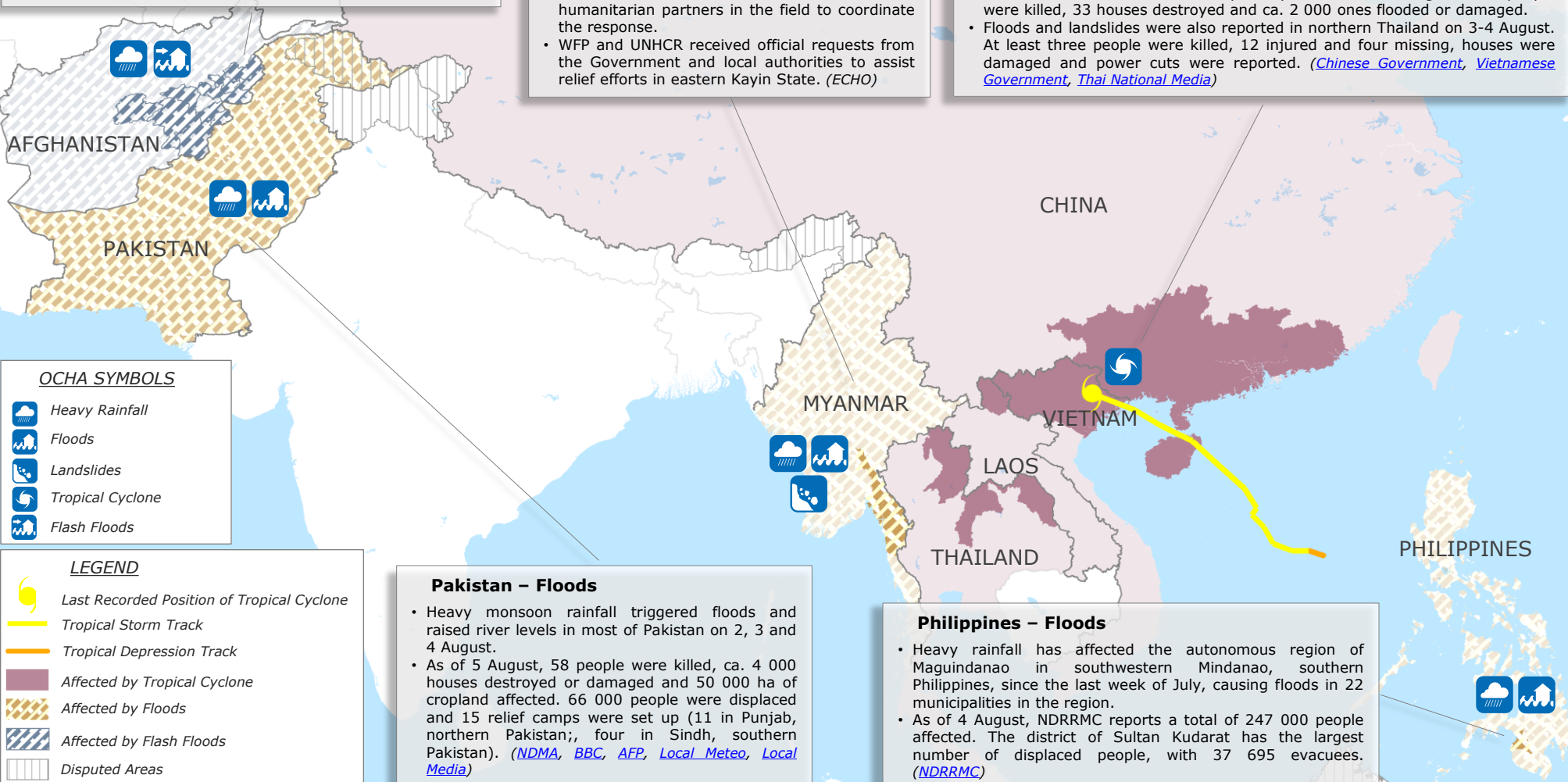
- Heavy rainfall on 3 August caused severe flash floods in at least 13 villages in Surobi district, Kabul province. As of 5 August, 75 people were killed, 426 houses destroyed, at least two schools destroyed, 15 bridges damaged and the state hospital of Surobi partly destroyed.
- Local media report floods also in Nangarhar, Laghman, Maidan Wardak, Ghazni, Khost, Kapisa, Paktika, Paktia, Nuristan and Daikundi provinces. ([OCHA](#), [AFP](#), [BBC](#), [Local Media \(1\)](#), [\(2\)](#))

Myanmar – Floods

- Continuous heavy rainfall caused Salween River to burst its banks, resulting in floods in Kayin and Mon States, southeastern Myanmar. Landslides have also been reported.
- In remote areas of Kayin State, access to affected villages has been difficult and slow, due to bad weather, landslides and poor road conditions. Kayin and Mon State Governments are convening regular meetings with humanitarian partners in the field to coordinate the response.
- WFP and UNHCR received official requests from the Government and local authorities to assist relief efforts in eastern Kayin State. ([ECHO](#))

China, Vietnam, Thailand – Tropical Cyclone JEBI

- JEBI made landfall in Hainan province, southern China, on 2 August (UTC) as a Tropical Storm. It traversed the northern parts of the island, emerged out to sea and made landfall again in Quang Ninh province, northern Vietnam, on 3 August, still with Tropical Storm strength. It then weakened into a Low Pressure Area over northern Vietnam.
- In China, Hainan, Guangdong and Guangxi provinces were hit by heavy rainfall between 2 and 4 August, resulting in the evacuation of 57 000 people. 500 houses collapsed and another 700 were damaged.
- Northern Vietnam was affected by heavy rainfall on 3-4 August. Four people were killed, 33 houses destroyed and ca. 2 000 ones flooded or damaged.
- Floods and landslides were also reported in northern Thailand on 3-4 August. At least three people were killed, 12 injured and four missing, houses were damaged and power cuts were reported. ([Chinese Government](#), [Vietnamese Government](#), [Thai National Media](#))

Pakistan – Floods

- Heavy monsoon rainfall triggered floods and raised river levels in most of Pakistan on 2, 3 and 4 August.
- As of 5 August, 58 people were killed, ca. 4 000 houses destroyed or damaged and 50 000 ha of cropland affected. 66 000 people were displaced and 15 relief camps were set up (11 in Punjab, northern Pakistan; four in Sindh, southern Pakistan). Philippines – Floods

- Heavy rainfall has affected the autonomous region of Maguindanao in southwestern Mindanao, southern Philippines, since the last week of July, causing floods in 22 municipalities in the region.
- As of 4 August, NDRRMC reports a total of 247 000 people affected. The district of Sultan Kudarat has the largest number of displaced people, with 37 695 evacuees. ([NDRRMC](#))
