*Joseph A. Nunes*—For making short payments; evading full settlements of just dues, and causing discontent and insubordination.

*Howard Mathers*—For being inaccurate and intemperate.

*Henry Foote*—For want of energy and efficiency.

*James C. Yohn*—Being in too feeble health for efficient field service.

*John A. Lowry*—Being in too feeble health for efficient field service since March.

*William E. Hoy*—Being in too feeble health for efficient field service since July 15; and for want of energy.

*R. P. L. Barber*—For inefficiency. *Revoked Feb. 9, 1863.*

*Nathaniel G. Wilcox*—Incapacitated by old age and feebleness for field service; and for making false charges against the government.

*Silas B. A. Haynes*—Having been afflicted with insanity, it would be improper to impose important responsibilities upon him.

*Ezra Webb*—Being too aged for efficient field service.

*Richard O. Warren*—Being feeble, old, and not fit for field duty.

*Moses S. Gibson*—Being sick and unfit for field duty, without prospect of recovery this winter.
