SUBJECT: Procurement Problems

TO : Commanding Officer, Nara Military Government Team, APO 25

1. Reference semi-monthly military government activities report for period ending 15 December 1946, your headquarters.

2. The problem presented by the Nara Liaison Office of securing supplies in another prefecture to fill your procurement demands is caused by tax requirements. Unless a procurement demand or tax exemption certificate is presented to the retailer, he will not sell without collecting all taxes. In such case, the Nara representative should first obtain a tax exemption certificate from the prefectural office in which the supplies are to be obtained. In order to get a certificate, he should present a true copy of the procurement demand for the required supplies.

3. Likewise, the Nara representative should report to the local liaison office to obtain a railroad ticket when traveling to secure supplies required to fill your procurement demands.

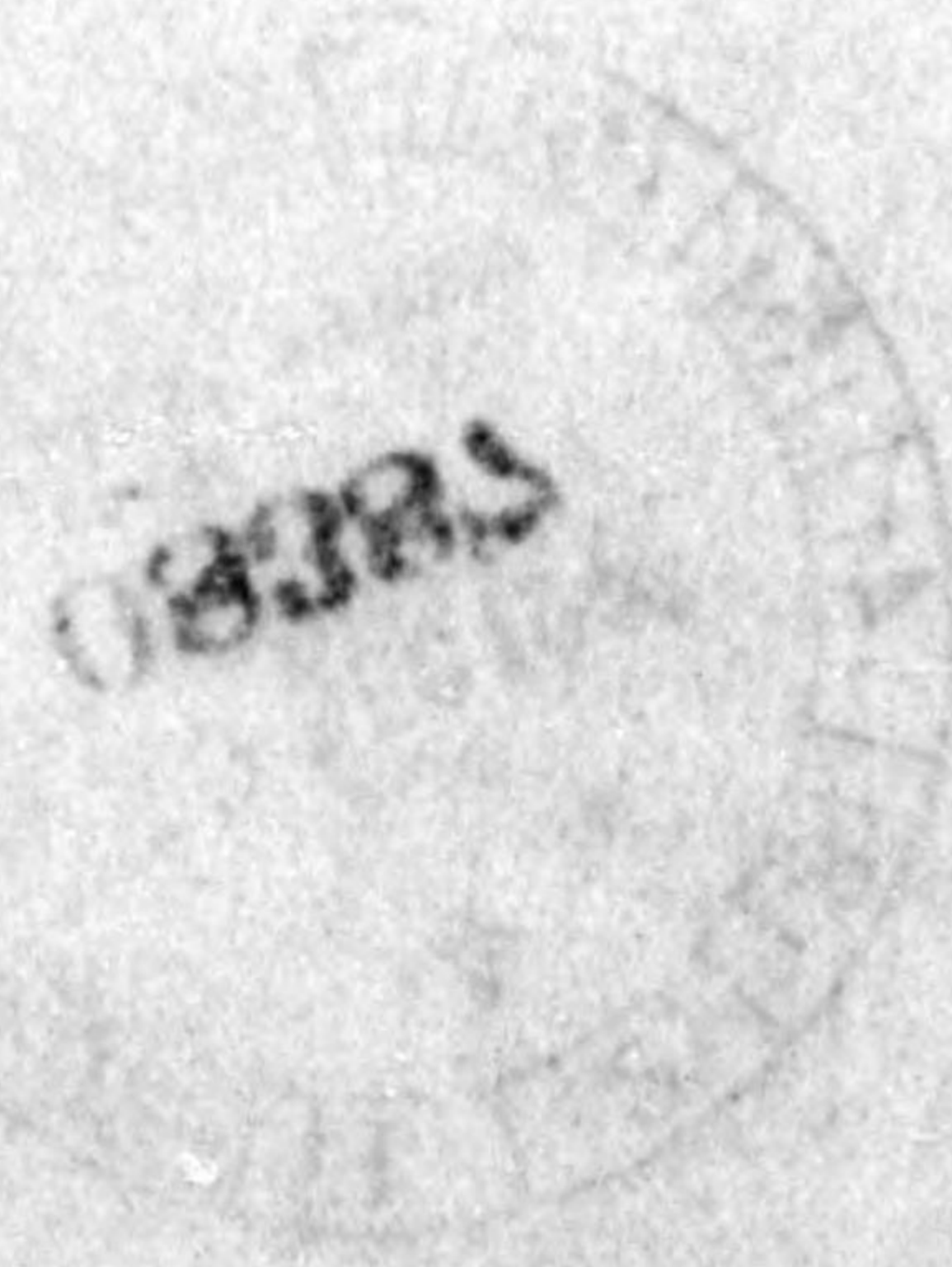

SUBJECT: Release of Procured Realty and Former Japanese Military
Installations

TO: Commanding Officer

1. This headquarters desires to release to the Japanese Government all procured real property and real estate and former Japanese Military installations, not in use, except those held by order of higher headquarters or for reasons of tactical security.

2. It is requested, therefore, that:

a. A list be prepared of procured installations the release of which is deemed advisable by your headquarters.

b. Requests for release be submitted to this headquarters through the commanding officer of the tactical unit in whose Zone of Responsibility the realty is located.

c. You coordinate with unit troop commanders in preparing necessary documents for release of procured realty. (Reference: paragraph 6c, Administrative Order Number 24/2, Headquarters I Corps, 30 September 1946).

d. With reference to former military installations, officials of the Japanese Government be instructed in the provisions of Operational Directive 28/12 for 1945, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 8 July 1946, so that they may intelligently and without undue delay apply for release of such installations.

KAMIGAMO GOLF COURSE

1. Land Procurement PD approved processed and receipts received
 - a. Prefecture in process of moving houses to new locations
2. Cost Estimate reduced from 270 million yen to 130 million with probable further reduction to less than 100 million yen.
3. Construction PD approved and ready for processing except quantity verifications by Engineers
 - a. Held up by Engineers because of their own mathematical error
 - b. Rectification made one day after PD "freeze".
4. Wire sent to DG Eighth Army on 26 Nov requesting authority to issue construction PD
5. Supported by local and regional Japanese officials -- No protests
6. Small amount of cultivated land involved - less than 10%
 - a. Comparable areas being provided from ex Army-Navy sites
 - b. Complete satisfaction of private land owners with arrangements
7. Large amount of government land involved - 26%
8. Benefit to local economy
 - a. Lumber from trees for reconstruction
 - b. Firewood and faggots - badly needed because of extreme shortage of charcoal this winter
 - c. Labor for unskilled persons - over 3,000 for six (6) months
 - (1) Returning Japanese ex-service men practically all unemployed
9. Negligible amount of materials needed for project
10. Official opening ceremony held - publicity
 - a. Officials now working with contractors on design - practically complete
11. No golf course in Kyoto Area nor within 40 miles.
12. Golf Course equipment allotment has already been made by Eighth Army.
13. Military Government stands to lose "prestige" if project is interrupted at this point because of the great amount of liaison work done by Military Government with Japanese officials on behalf of Special Service.

SUBJECT: Independent Procurement Authority for Signal Corps

TO : Procurement Officer, Ninki Reg Mil Govt Team, APO

1. Attached herewith is Eighth Army letter dated 19 November 1946 file AG 337 (C4) subject, "Agreements Concerning SC-PIN 1299," which was transmitted to the Commanding Generals of I Corps, IX Corps, Kobe Base, 24th Div, 25th Div, 1st Cav, 11th A/B Div, PACUSA, 5th Air Force, G.C.C. BCCF, and GIQ SCAP.
2. Attention of procurement officers is invited to paragraph 2b and 2h (3) which pertains to a revision of the procurement procedure and which will be covered shortly by an amendment to Operational Directive No. 33.
3. Pending publication of the amendment, procurement officers will be guided by the following:
 - a. Effective 2400 hours, 30 November 1946, the procurement by means of procurement demands, G.P. Form 1, of communication equipment, services, and facilities by military government procurement officers will be discontinued.
 - b. Thereafter procurement of such items by means of Communications Orders, G.P. Form 3, will be a function of Signal Corps personnel under independent procurement authority.
 - c. For communication equipment or service which was procured on a total (outright) basis on G.P. Form 1 and for which a receipt was issued on G.P. Form 2, Signal Corps personnel will initiate a procurement release on Form MGP 7.
 - d. For communication equipment or service which is being or was procured on a total (outright) basis and for which no receipt has been issued, Signal Corps personnel will initiate a request to cancel and procurement officers will cancel by amending the procurement demand. Claims for payment by individual suppliers for work done under cancelled procurement demands will be referred to the local liaison office for payment by the local Board of Communications.
 - e. For communication equipment or service which was procured on a monthly basis and for which monthly receipts were required, Signal Corps personnel will terminate the procurement demand by issuing a final receipt for the month of November.

f. Procurement officers will make a thorough search of their files including files in their possession of inactivated procurement section or boards (that is, procurement demands issued prior to 1 April 1946) in order to insure that the necessary releases, cancellations, and terminations for communication equipment and service have been effected.

g. The notation "Superseded by Communications Order No. _____, SCMPIN 1299," will be entered in the remarks space of GPA Form 1 and 2 and Form MCP 7 issued to effect the action described above.

h. Each Signal Staff Section will prepare a final GPA Form 5 for the period 1 October to 30 November 1946, and will forward it in accordance with existing instructions.

1. There are (or were) two golf courses in the Kyoto area, namely, the YAMASHINA GOLF COURSE and the ISHIYAMA GOLF COURSE. The Yamashina Golf course is now under full cultivation. The Ishiyama Golf course was under construction when the war broke out. It is NOT under cultivation except for one section (about one fourth of the entire area). Both are laid out for nine holes.
2. The YAMASHINA GOLF COURSE is located in the town on Yamashina, half way between Kyoto and Otsu. It was a fairly good nine hole course before the war consisting of nice greens on a fairly level piece of ground. Connected with it is a small comfortable little clubhouse (one story) with Japanese baths, locker rooms, club rooms and the like.

The land is owned by the Yamashina Seiko (Iron Works) and the Towa Sokusan KK, the former owning the bulk of the land and operating under the name of Yamashina Nojo. The two companies rent the land out to the people of Yamashina and vicinage on a tenant farming basis in 30 tsubo lots. Every variety of crop suitable to the area is being raised there.

The clubhouse is utilized as present as an office and warehouse. Some of the steel lockers are now being used as letter files while the others were donated for scrap during the war. There is an office staff of about 15 people always on the premises.

3. The ISHIYAMA GOLF COURSE is located in the hills back of the village of Ishiyama (on the Seto River) just south of Otsu.

The course was under construction ($\frac{1}{2}$ complete) when the war broke out. It is laid out over three small foothill valleys with numerous natural hazards. As the place has not been touched for more than five years, the greens are in poor shape. The general lines of the course are still there. The promoters had a fairly ambitious plan for same.

There is a two story wooden building on the premises which served as a clubhouse. It is in a dilapidated condition. The frame and walls of the house remain and are in fair condition. The water came from a well nearby and the electricity from Ishiyama.

4. The

4. The Yamashina Golf Course is now under full cultivation. Something is always being cultivated and harvested by a large number of people from the vicinity. As the land in this area is rich and production is quite extensive it may be considered an important source of food supply.

The Ishiyama Golf Course is NOT under cultivation except for one portion (not more than $\frac{1}{4}$). As the land is poor it would work little hardship if production were stopped. While considerable work would be necessary to put it into state-side condition, it would be comparatively easy to prepare it for a practise driving and putting course this year looking forward to a completed course a year or two hence.

The area of the Yamashina Golf Course is about 33 acres (30,000 tsubo).

1. The Ishiyama Golf course was less than one half complete when the war started. The course is located in very rugged terrain. There is no suitable site for making a driving practice range or a putting course.

2. It is possible that four of the greens could be put into operating condition. This would require taking from the Japanese some land now under cultivation. The idea is impracticable considering the large number of men to be accommodated.

3. It would be necessary to construct approximately one mile of road to enable automobiles to reach to Club house.

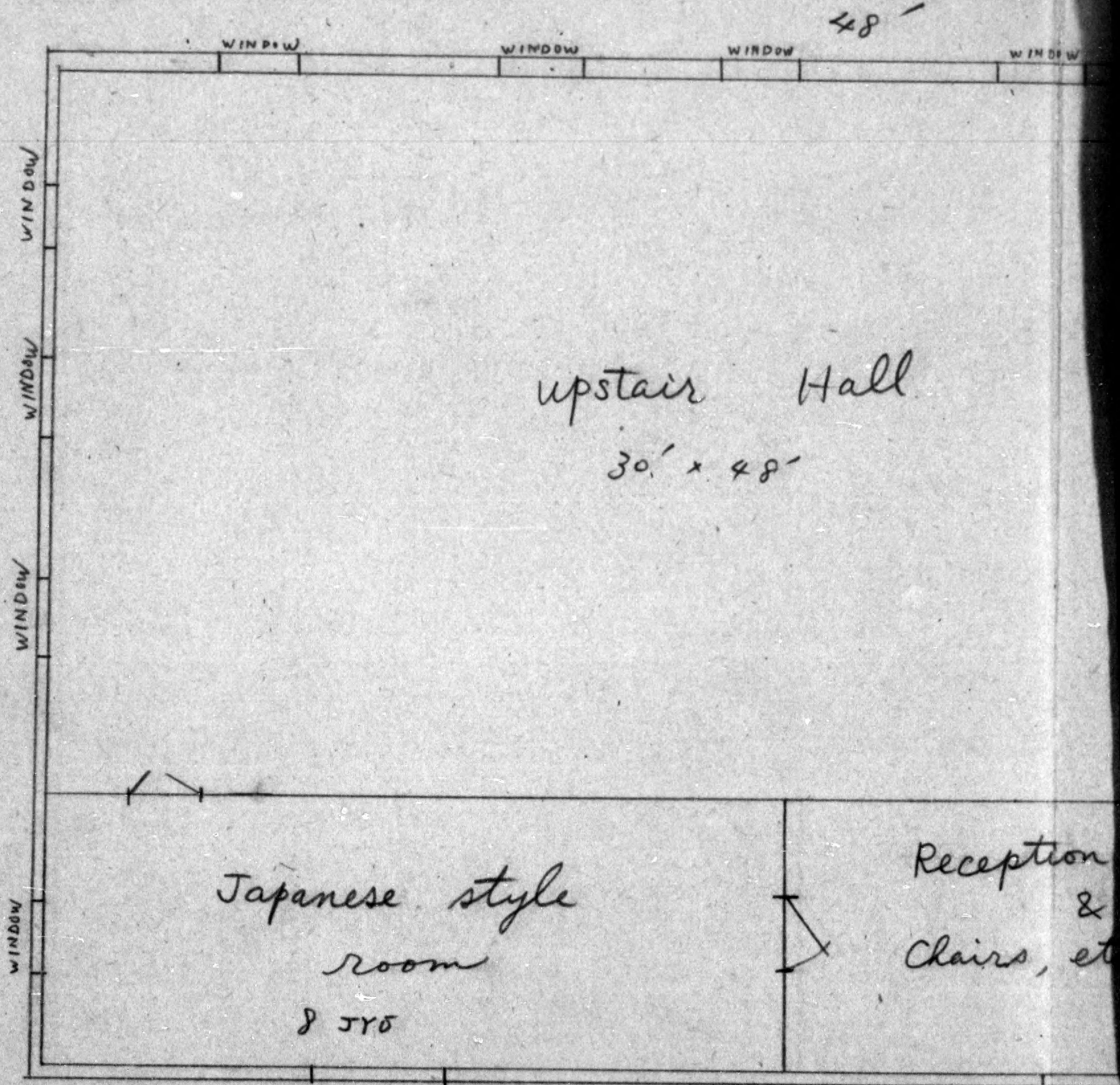

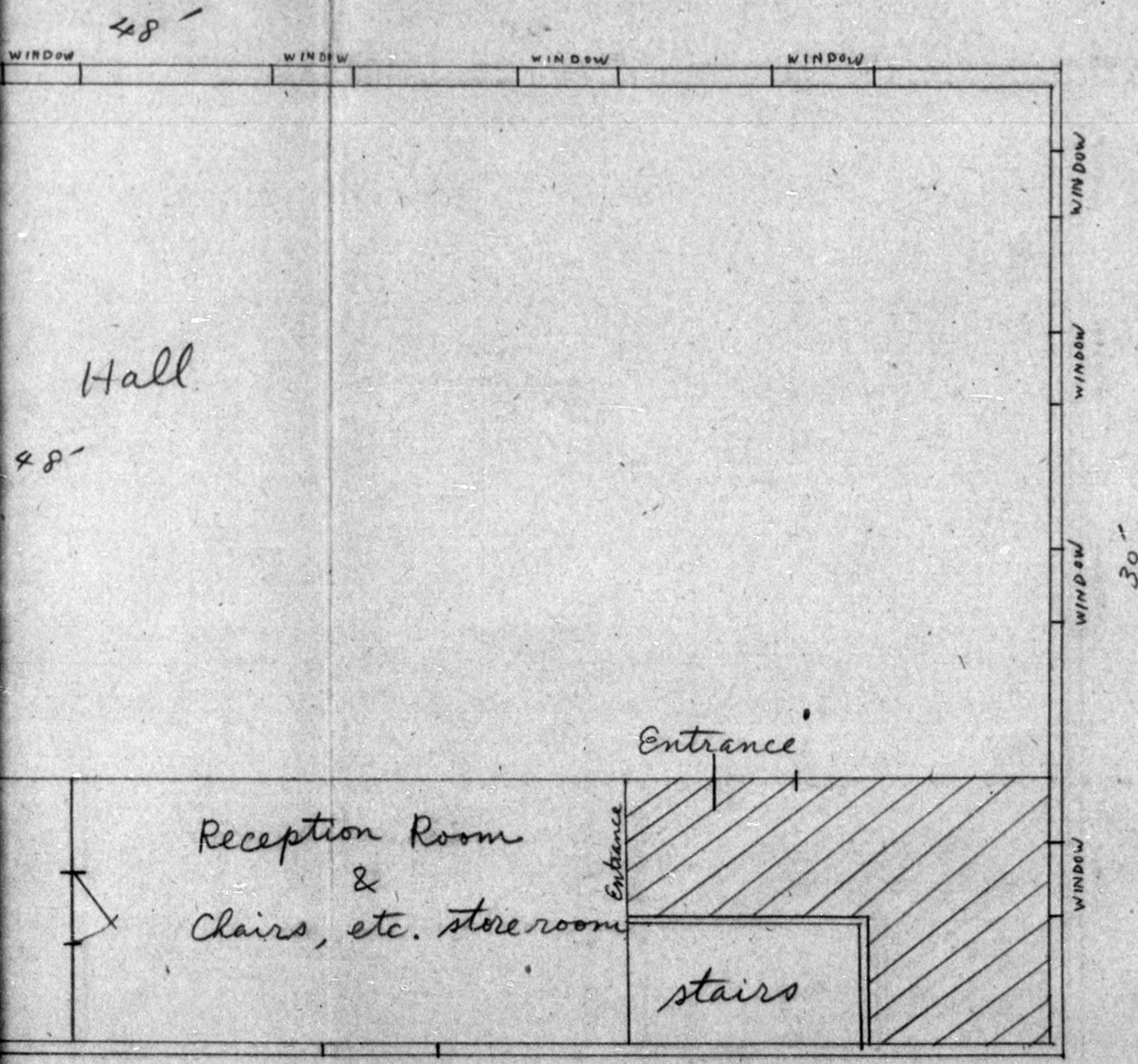

My dear Colonel Partridge:

It has come to my attention that certain sections of I Corps and sections of other higher headquarters are dealing direct with the Japanese authorities of the Osaka Prefectural Government. Following examples are cited:

The I Corps Engineering Section has placed contracts with certain contractors and directed them to proceed with the work. Later, the procurement demands for those projects will reach this headquarters for processing and, subsequently, be presented to the Japanese Prefectural Government for notification to the contractors to proceed with the work. This is in direct violation of Eighth Army procurement procedure. This procedure does not allow the Procurement Section of this team to proceed in the processing of procurements as it is presently directed. Furthermore, this procedure leaves openings for the Japanese contractors to violate construction directives, inasmuch as the time lapse between their start of the work project and the time they receive the directives from the Osaka Prefectural Office Procurement Section to start the projects, many variations in construction creep in that are not contained in the procurement demand specifications.

Last month, by letter, I directed the Japanese authorities that all official communications between the Japanese authorities and the Army of Occupation of all nature would be channeled through this headquarters.

In order to clarify the official picture in regards to our contact with the Japanese authorities, it is believed best that you clarify the Military Government Teams' position in the matter of channels of communication, dealings with the Japanese authorities, and all

echelons of our own units. I think this will be necessary before we can make ourselves perfectly clear in all matters pertaining to the Japanese Governmental affairs in each prefecture.

1. The property secured by the subject demand is surrendered enemy property, and as such is not the subject of a procurement demand. The original demand, 6A-15, will be cancelled. 2. The real estate maintenance referred to in OD #33 does not contemplate maintenance of an entire military area. It is to be used only in buildings such as hotels, offices, theaters, etc., which remain under the control of the Japanese owner, subject to army supervision. 3. Electricity and water supply are procured under the indefinite quantity utilities demand which should have been issued in accordance with par. 5b, Inclosure 2 to OD#33.

SUBJECT : Procurement of Sewing Machines for Dependent Housing.**TO :** Procurement Division, Mil Govt Section, I Corps, APO 301

1. The following is a report on the procuring of 19 Singer Sewing machines requested by you in our telephone conversation July 29, 1946.

2. On Saturday 27 July three men from I Corps Procurement Division came to Hara for the purpose of obtaining a quantity of sewing machines that were stored in a warehouse. The only authority or identification that they had was a radio from Eighth Army and a CIC report giving the location of a quantity of sewing machines.

3. This office, after a telephone conversation with Dependent Housing Procurement Division, I Corps obtained a Prefecture representative and a CIC guide to take the detail to the warehouse where the machines were stored.

4. The history of these machines as known by the Prefecture is substantially as follows:

a. A large quantity of sewing machines were shipped by the Japanese Army to Japan presumably from Singapore and turned over to the Hara Prefecture.

b. A large quantity of these Sewing Machines were stored at Saidaiji Race Track which later became a Military Target. A smaller quantity was turned over to the Hara Girl's School where they were kept for quite awhile then taken to the warehouse at Saidaiji, and then later about 1 May 1946 were turned over to Mitsui Bussan Toyoda Warehouse to hold for the Prefecture.

c. This latter small quantity of machines was not inventoried as being on the Saidaiji Target, because at the time the Inventory was taken they were in the Hara Girl's School and removed to the former target subsequent to its being turned over to Home Ministry.

d. A Mitsui Bussan representative, a Mr. Kotake, reported to this office that the 19 machines procured by your office were not in a serviceable condition and would undoubtedly require considerable repair in order to make them serviceable. That the 19 machines were intended to be used for salvage purposes to repair other machines.
