Achievements

- Successful debut in Google Code-in: 273 tasks resolved by 46 students supported by ~30 mentors.
- Week by week, Tech News becomes the undisputed reference for Wikimedia technical information.
- Ongoing: PM tools, Bugzilla upgrade, Architecture Summit, OPW, tech writer hiring...
- All this with one person less and a reorganization of the team's way of working.

Lessons learned

- Pairing works in a team of specialized individuals working remotely.
 - ◆ Better quality, less hesitation, steady motivation.
 - ◆ Good for special tasks, less for business-as-usual.
- Monthly ECT Showcases contribute to short term planning and team collaboration.
- Hiring for short contracts demanding community engagement doesn't work.

- Transition of Sumana to a new tech writer role, consolidates the Architecture RfC process.
- OPW Round 7 sets a new benchmark for success in outreach programs: code merged, work deployed.
