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

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ABBREVIATIONS

(ABREVIATURAS)

Substantives.—In the Spanish-English section, substantives or nouns are indicated by the presence of their gender, thus *m.* or *f.* In the English-Spanish section, the letter *s* (substantive) is used to denote them, and the gender is indicated after the Spanish word.

Verbs, in all cases, are followed by the letter *v.*

Adjectives are denoted by the letter *a* or *adj.*

Adverbs are shown by the letters *ad.* or *adv.*

Pronouns are denoted by the letters *pron.* or *pn.*

Prepositions are shown by the letters *prep.* or *pr.*

Conjunctions are shown by the letters *conj.* or *c.*

Interjections by the letters *interj.* or *i.*

In the Spanish-English section of this dictionary, the sound of every Spanish word is imitated in English spelling. These imitations are given in brackets directly after the words to which they refer.

SHORT GUIDE TO SPANISH PRONUNCIATION

Much, of course, could be written regarding the sound values of the letters of the Spanish alphabet: but as a quick guide to pronunciation, the following will provide considerable help:

Vowels—A sounds like *a* in our word *car* or *jar*.

E, like *a* in *date*.

I, like *ee* in *see*.

O, like *o* in *often*.

U, like *oo* in *food*.

Y, when a vowel, like *ee* in *see*.

Consonants—The following consonants, B, D, F, L, M, N, P, S, T, V and X, are pronounced practically as they are in English.

C is pronounced in two ways.

(a) When placed before *e* or *i*, it is like *th* in *theory* or *theatre*.

(b) In all other instances, it is equal to our *k* in *king*.

CH is pronounced like *ch* in *church*.

G also has two sounds,—if not three.

(a) When placed before *a*, *o*, *l*, *n* or *r*, it is like our *g* in *garnish*.

(b) When placed before *e* or *i*, the nearest approach to its sound is provided by the Scotch word *loch*.

(c) When placed before *u*, followed by *e* or *i*, it sounds like the *g* in *guess*, while the *u* is not sounded.

H is silent, but people often register an intake of breath when the letter is present.

J is like the G, mentioned above, when placed before *e* or *i*.

LL—The double L has a particular sound of its own that is not found exactly in English sounds. The nearest approach is the trill in the word *pavilion*.

N is like the *ni* in *union*.

Q is like our ordinary *k*, and the *u* following it is not sounded.

R is hard and rolling when at the beginning of a word or when *l*, *n* or *s* are placed in front of it. It is not so hard when coming between two vowels or when placed at the end of a word.

RR is harder than the single *r*.

Y, as a vowel, is dealt with above. As a consonant it has the force of the *y* in *you*.

Z is like *th*, as in *thread*.

THE SPANISH ALPHABET

The Spanish alphabet consists of the following 29 letters :

From the above, it will be noticed that the letter W does not exist in the Spanish language : and it may be added that K is rarely found and then only when connected with words of foreign importation.

But the Spanish alphabet has certain letters of its own. These are CH, LL and RR, and Ñ with the tilde sign may be placed along with them. These additions may cause slight confusion when consulting the dictionary, as the order of words is unusual for English-speaking people. Briefly, it may be explained that CHa follows Cz, LLa comes after Lz, Ña follows Nz and RRa follows Rz. If this sequence is remembered, there will be no trouble in finding any required word.

GENDER OF SPANISH NOUNS

There are certain rules for recognising the gender of Spanish nouns : but there are so many exceptions to these rules that the only safe way of determining the gender of a particular noun is to consult a dictionary which indicates the gender of every noun. In this dictionary, every noun has its gender given beside it.

The gender of Spanish nouns depends either on their signification or their termination.

- (a) Names of men and males are masculine gender.
- (b) Names of women and females are feminine.
- (c) Trades, occupations and work of men are masculine.
- (d) Trades, etc., of women are feminine.
- (e) Apart from the above, nouns ending in E, I (accented), O, U, J, L, N, R, S and T are masculine.
- (f) Nouns ending in A, I (unaccented), Ion, D and Z are feminine.
- (g) But, as indicated above, there is a vast number of exceptions which follows no rule and which makes it necessary to consult a dictionary when the information is required.
