**In-Service Education Enforcement Plan at
Kyoto Gakugei University for 1950**

1. Purpose and the name of the training institute

In accordance with provisions of the License Law and its Enforcement Law, for the benefit of teachers of kindergarten, primary school, lower secondary school who are desirous of obtaining upper class license, this license accreditation training institute is to be carried into practice by the name of Kyoto Gakugei Daigaku Menkyoho Mintei Koshu (Kyoto Gakugei University's License Accreditation Training Institute).

2. Place

3. The first term

July 17th - August 13th 1951, for four weeks
August 21st - September 17th 1951, four weeks

Number of trainee and classification of classes

1. Trainee 450 persons for each two terms total 900.

3. Curriculum, text book and reference book

a. Curriculum

General Education: Elective study for one subject per term (2 unit).

Former term - Philosophy, Language Art, Toyo-shi (Oriental History), Economics, Botany, Physics.

Latter Part - Language Art, Sociology, Descriptive Geography, Chemistry and Zoology, Physical Geography.

Professional curriculum concerning with subject unit, compulsory subject one (2 units).

Former term - Language Art, Sociology A (Jurisprudence), Economics, Philosophy, Ethics, Sociology, Sociology B (Geographical Philosophy, Mathematics, Science 1 (Physics), Science 2 (Chemistry), Science 3 (Biology), Science 4 (Physical Geography) Music, Art, Hygiene Physical Education, Home Science, English Literature, Vocational Education.

Latter Term - The same as above. Except as to Science 3 (Biography), for the former term Botany, and for the latter will be zoology.

4. Distribution of hour and unit regarding every subject.

a. Curriculum for General Education

Former term - July 17th - July 30th

Latter part - August 21st - September 3rd

40 hours lecture 2 units per subject will be allotted in every term.

b. Professional curriculum in connection with subjects.

Former term - July 31st - August 13th

Latter term - September 4th - September 17th

2 units for a subject per term will be allotted.

By lecture per unit 20 hours

By practice per unit 33 hours

By experiment per unit 45 hours

As to Music, Physical Education, Home Science one unit by Lecture another unit by experiment, practice, experimental demonstration will be provided.

Music, Physical education, English Literature will be provided by lecture 1 unit, practice 1 unit.

All other subjects will only be provided by Lecture constituting 2 units.

5. Distinction of all-day-system (Daytime) or part-time system (night course) and scheme.

- a. All day system only. 5 school days per week.
- b. Time table - refer to attached list No. 2.
- d. Instructor - refer to attached list No. 3.

4. The second time

- 1. Term - from December 1st - March 3rd on the following year (1952) every Friday and Saturday (12 times). Exception December 29, 30, January 5, 6.

Upon finishing each lecture, subjects will be shown by lecturer, and they would point out study method on reference book and assign to trainees reviews and preparation by the time next lecture is opened.

Generally, after each 1 unit was finished, trainees are required to submit treatises or report on this institute.

With regard to preparation and review, they are supposed to do it at each workshop or home, beside, university library and research room may be available.

Total hour for preparation and review must be at least more than 6 hours per week.

9. Points necessary for further improvement.
 1. Necessity to divide trainee into groups according to making, process and experience of research, desired license etc.
 2. As this summer in-service training on university part has been planned out after the schedule of Kyoto Prefecture was shaped to some degree, it became that more or less discrepancy was brought about. We should consider the both within a big scheme unitarily in future.
 3. It should be planned to see that in-service service educational and correspondence education chair be unitarily be managed.
