The Guide: So You Want to Organize

The <u>Network of the National Library of Medicine (NNLM)</u> is a program coordinated by the <u>National Library of Medicine</u> (<u>NLM)</u> and carried out through a nationwide network of health science libraries and information centers. NNLM's mission is to advance the progress of medicine and improve public health by providing all U.S. health professionals with equal access to biomedical information and improving the public's access to information to enable them to make informed decisions about their health.

The objective of #citeNLM is to improve the credibility and content of information on medicine and health-related articles on Wikipedia.

This guide is intended to help you organize a #citeNLM edit-a-thon at your organization during our <u>fall</u> or spring campaign periods.

Checklist

Find a venue

All you need is access to the Internet and space to sit and work. If you can reserve laptops for participants, do so!

Secure the date and time

Select a day that falls within the #citeNLM campaign period. Consider finding an experienced editor from your <u>local</u> <u>Wikimedia group</u> or <u>WikiProject Medicine</u>. Learn to edit with these <u>training modules</u> and <u>videos</u>. Review the <u>article on</u> <u>How to Edit from WikiProject Medicine</u>, as the rules of editing medical articles are different.

- Create your Wikipedia username and password
- Add your program to the <u>#citeNLM campaign dashboard</u> (see our <u>how-to</u>)
- Enable account creation on your program dashboard

Promote your event

Use the hashtag <u>#citeNLM</u> on social media.

Post the event on online calendars and blogs for your library and institution.

Email your institutional listserv and reach out to institutions, organizations, and departments who might be interested.

- Share the *participant's guide* at least two weeks before your event
- Drop a pin of your event location on our <u>participant map</u>

Participant's Guide

Step 1: Create a free account on Wikipedia

Step 2: Register on our campaign dashboard

- Sign-up to independently participate in our one-day <u>virtual edit-a-thon</u> or find <u>another</u> <u>event</u> happening during the campaign period
- If you're a new editor, or new to <u>WikiProject Medicine</u>, complete the training modules on <u>Wikipedia Basics</u> and/or <u>Editing Medical Topics</u>

Step 3: Find an article that needs a citation. Here are some strategies:

- Choose one of the pre-selected articles on the program dashboard
- Find an article with <u>sourcing</u> or <u>other problems</u>
- Select an article while browsing pages related to the campaign theme

Step 4: Cite a source

- Find a source from an <u>NLM product</u> or other reliable website to support the article
- Add a citation using Wikipedia Style (<u>learn more</u> about adding citations)
- Add the project hashtag #citeNLM in the Wikipedia Edit Summary

Step 5: Share!

- Include the hashtag <u>#citeNLM</u> in your tweets about the event and follow the hashtag to interact with fellow Wikipedians
- Drop a pin of your location on our participant map
