# A BY-LAW.

To Authorize the Fale of Lands Within the City of Victoria Upon Which Taxes Have Been Due and in Arreat for Two Years.

Whereas it is expedient that all lands or improvements or reaf property within the limits of the Corporation of the City of Victoria, upon which municipal taxes have been due and in arrear for two years, shall be sold, and the proceeds applied is the reduction of such taxes:

8. If the taxes have not been previously collected, or if no one appears to pay the same at the time and place appointed for the sale, the Collector shall sell at public anotion so much of the hand or improvements or real property as may be sufferent to discharge the taxes and all lawfur charges incurred in and about the sale and the collection of the taxes, sailing in preference such part as he may consider


