SUBJECT:

Entry into Japan of Korean and Other Foreign Nationals Related to Japanese Nationals in Unregistered Marriage

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 000.5 (10 Dec 47)GC, (SCAPIN 1391), dated 10 December 1946, subject, "Suppression of Illegal Entry into Japan!"

- b. Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 053 (2 Apr 46)GA, (SCAPIN 852), dated 2 April 1946, subject, "Entry and Registration of Non-Japanese Nationals in Japan."
- c. Memorandum from Central Liaison Office, Tobyo, dated 5 August 1947, file C.L.O. No. 6150(RF), subject as above.
- 2. The Japanese Government is authorized to continue registering as Japanese those non-Japanese women married to Japanese men who enter Japan together with their husbands.
- 3. Korean men and men of nationalities other than Japanese married to Japanese women are not authorized entry into Japan because of such marriage. The Japanese Government, therefore, will not accept from these illegal entrants applications for registration of their marriage but will treat such non-Japanese males in accordance with the provisions of reference la above, unless written authorization for entry is granted by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- 4. The Japanese Government will be furnished the names of those non-Japanese nationals, not part of the Occupation Forces, granted permission to enter Japan, in accordance with the provisions of reference 1b above.
