ARNAUD'S TENTH ANNUAL EASTER PARADE

The parade of horse-drawn, flower-bedecked carriages, with ladies in Easter array, begins at ten o'clock Easter Sunday morning, from the historic Arnaud home at Esplanade and Chartres Streets. Touring the Vieux Carre and Canal Street, the parade arrives at the St. Louis Basilica for 12:30 noonday Mass. Church services ended, the parade continues to Arnaud's for the tenth day-long Easter at Arnaud's.
