SAD DEATHS.—Again we have to notice the sad demise of two more of our friends—Abel Hayward and Edward Doud. The former was a few days since, in Colusa county, kicked by a horse, which resulted fatally within two hours; and the latter was murdered a few days ago. Mr. Hayward was well and favorably known by a large portion of the traveling public, having for fourteen years managed Blood's Station, on the Big Trees' Road, Alpine county. On the 28th ult. the body of Mr. Doud was found in his cabin about three miles west from Double Springs, Douglas county, Ne. He had been murdered by being cut in the neck and head with an ax, the bloody weapon lying beside him. A blanket was spread over the body, showing by its appearance that the murderer had carefully covered his victim after the struggles were over. The crime was evidently committed two weeks previously. As he was a person of peaceable disposition, having for years lived almost the life of a hermit, and having hardly the means for living, the cause of the murder cannot be imagined. He was a Supervisor of Alpine county during the years 1866 and 67.

The Panama steamer South Carolina this week arrived at San Francisco with five shipwrecked parties, numbering 49 persons, whom she picked up, one of them having been 23 days in a boat.

At Watsonville a newsdealer has been found guilty of selling a copy of the S. F. Call on Sunday last. This is far-fetched, and such work will cause the repeal of the Sunday law.

Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee and Texas will construct more miles of railroad within the next ten years than any other four States in the Union—so says a New Orleans paper.

Business is reported to have said that if he were to remain in the Cabinet he would seek to annex Cuba by diplomacy. He thinks the island would be cheap of \$500,000,000.

The Channel Tunnel is being pushed, of 2,000 yards having been bored on the French side, and nearly a mile on the English side. One-tenth of the distance is completed.

On Tuesday the National Tariff Convention met at New York. Two hundred delegates from all sections of the country were present.

On Wednesday the Irish National Convention met at Chicago, the delegates numbering 300, many of the Eastern ones being Catholic clergymen.

The success of Mahone's movement in Virginia has emboldened some of the young Democracy of South Carolina to attempt to break the party in that State.

A Postal Telegraph line is to be constructed from New York to Chicago—an entering wedge for its extension over the whole country.

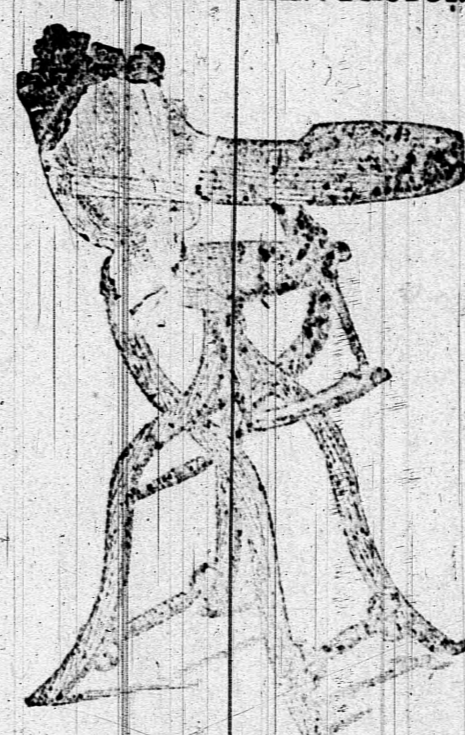
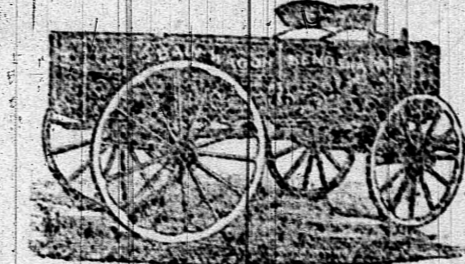
