RECOMMENDS HOME RULE

As a result of its survey of Springfield, Illinois, the Russell Sage Foundation, comes out strongly for home rule in taxation and annual appraisal of land values for taxation.

A new law requiring that land be assessed all over the state of Illinois at from 90 to 100 per cent of actual value is recommended.

Regarding the listing of personal property for taxation, the report says: The assessment of personal prop-erty in Springfield, as in many other places, has not been just or successful. It favors the perjurer at the expense of the conscientious, tends to make false swearing an accepted custom, and comes down heaviest on small investors with a narrow range of op-

portunities for placing their funds. Experience throughout this country indicates the impossibility of taxing personal property, especially entangible personality, at the same rates as those applied to real estate. The alternative suggested is the laying of a more moderate tax upon personal property, say about one-fourth or one-fifth . She wate applied to realty.—Ground Hog.

Why Colors Are Associated With Various Characteristics.

The association of colors with mental and moral characteristics is a mat. "A charge shall be collected from the owner, lessee, tenant, or occupant of all ocenpied premises within the ecrporate limits of the City of Carmel by the Sea for services rendered in the removel of garbage and waste. The charges for such collec-tions shall be as follows:

For the removal of the contens of a single garbage. ash or waste receptacle, 15c. For one removal per week, garbage and waste, 50c. per

For two vemovals per week, garbage and waste, \$1 per month.

For three remov's per week, garbage and waste, \$1.50 per mouth,

For six removals per week. garbage and waste, \$3 per month."

ORDINANCE NO. 19

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CARMEL-BY-THE-SEA PRE-SCRIBING THE FORM AND MANNER OF GIVING NOTICE OF GENERAL AND SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS, IN THE CITY OF CARMEL-BY-THE-SEA, WHEN NOT OTHERWISE FIXEU BY LAW, AND REPEAL-IN 1 ALL CONFLICTING ORDI-

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF CARMEL-BY-THE-SEA DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1-Notice of General and Special Municipal Elections to be hereafter held in the City of Carmelby-the-Sea, County of Monterey, State of California, when not otherwise fixed by law, shall be given in the following manner:

Not less than thirty days preceding the day set for the holding of any General or Special Municipal Election in the said City of Carmel-bythe-lea, the Board of Trustees of said City shall, by resolution to that end adopted, require the City Clerk of said City to give notice of said election by po-ting copies of the natice hereinafter prescribed. - one on or near the door of the Council Chamber of said Board of Trustees. and one in each election precinct at the place designated by the said Board in each election precinct as the polling place for such precinct, and by causing a copy of such not ce to be published in a newspaper pub-Carmel-by-the-Ses.

The notice herein provided for must be posted and published not less than twenty-five (25) days preceding the day set for such election. The publication to be by three insertions in a daily or weekly newspaper published and circulated in said city. The last pub ication to be terprise must be the sense of at least one week before the day duty. An abandoned garden such election is to be held." Said notice shall contain:

1. A statement of the time of the election and whether the same is a general or special election.

2. The parter where and the layers during which the polls will be open. 3. A description of the voting

4. The names of the persons appointed to constitute the Boards of Election in the several precincts.

A statement of the municipal office or offices to be filled, if any.

6. A statement of any matter or proposition, if any; other than the election of officers, which is to be submitted to the voters of a municipality at such election.

Section 2 .- All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3.-This Ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the maintenance of the form of government provided for by the City of Carmel-by-the-Sea, and therefore necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall take effect and If you read it in the Pine be in full force on and after its final
