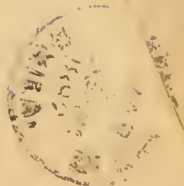
The survey I wrote

Calhoun" in relation there

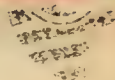
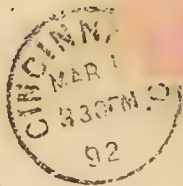

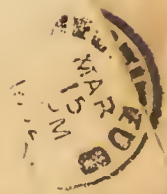
